24. in the State, Holy Family School in Decatur, Illinois.

26. Please rise and be recognized. Members of the Senate,
27. we have with us today Mr. Thomas Togetski of Highland,
28. the V.W....V.F.W. Commander of Highland Post which is in my district,
29. Verla Guigor V.F.W. Auxiliary President, Colum Poss of the V.F.W.
30. Auxiliary in Highland and Mr. Frank Rice, the State Senior
31. Vice-Commander of the V.F.W. But, today, I...I want and I do
32. present with pride, Miss Merla Hansel of Troy, Illinois, which is in the
33. fifty-fifth district, the greatest district within the confines of

1. great State of Illinois and Miss Hansel is the National Winner of the
2. essay Contest sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars on the
3. Voice of Democracy. She won the State Championship as well
4. as the National and she is going to make a recitation now on...
5. on the very...on the very essay that she did present to win that
6. award. I take great pleasure at this time in presenting Miss
7. Hansel.

8. MISS HANSEL:

9. While I was preparing this speech, I started to wonder why
10. the question was phrased the way it was, why it was Why I Care About
11. America and not Why I Care About the United States or Why I Care About
12. the Northern Hemisphere. It was then that I realized the name
13. America stands for much more than a country. America was
14. worth fighting for in the Revolutionary War and the Civil War
15. but America is also why we fought the Viet-Nam War, the Korean
16. War, the world wars. America is not a group of states united
17. by one central government. America is not a geographic location.
18. No, it's much more. For America, people die. America is a name,
19. a word with almost a sacred ring to it. It stands for people,
20. for freedom, for blood and sweat and tears and for victory.
21. It is for America we sing of its praise, for its ideals we pledge our
22. allegiance. It's for those same ideals that people have given
23. their lives in service. People who have traveled in this world
24. say that we live in the most wonderful country in it. I haven't
25. been anywhere, but I say that, too. You know, I didn't choose
26. to be an American. I didn't ask. I didn't tell anybody
27. to put me here. My citizenship was granted to me long before
28. I was even able to realize what I was getting into. It wasn't until
29. I started school that I realized what an honor I had been
30. entrusted with. Here I was learning of people who fought, escaped,
31. who risked their lives, took special classes and tests to legalize
32. something I had taken for granted. I had assumed it was one of
33. my inalienable rights. Our forefathers have been credited with
doing an excellent job as far as writing our American Bill of Rights.

1. Oh, it's needed amending from time to time, but on the whole,
2. it's served its purpose quite well for the last
3. hundred and eighty-seven years. I think, though, that they
4. shouldn't have stopped with the Bill of Rights but gone on and
5. written a bill of responsibilities for you can hardly have one
6. without the other. Had they, I think the number one responsibility
7. would have probably been that we, as Americans, must care.
8. We must take enough pride in this country, have enough will
9. to serve truly as citizens. Then, and only then, are we entitled
10. to our title as an American. Where else in this...in this country
11. can a person find a country so...so diversified, so bountifully
12. blessed with everything. In America we have farmland and cities,
13. we have forests and deserts, we have lakes and oceans and rivers.
14. We have snow and rain and droughts. We have schools and churches.
15. We have freedom and love and hope and the future and people,
16. citizens, Americans. These are why I care. Small, though
17. my role in this country is, I have been given a title. I am
18. an American. I was thinking about this fact and I realized American
19. ends in ICAN and I can. It's my right and my responsibility. I
20. can, I do, I always will, I care.

1. Mr. President...Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is
2. a bill for the Department of Law Enforcement. It transfers a million
3. seven hundred thousand dollars within various line items
4. from the FY '79 budget and also provides a supplemental
5. appropriation of six hundred and ninety thousand five hundred
6. dollars for the department and I'd ask for a favorable roll call.
7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Is there discussion? Senator Carroll.

9. SENATOR CARROLL:

10. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of
11. the Senate. While there are many members not happy with the final
12. form of this, I think we could make the appropriate corrections
13. in their FY '80 budget and at this time, I think, unfortunately,
14. we have no choice but to support this, although I think the new
15. director knows that he will be the former director if he
16. continues to practice.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Further discussion? Senator Rhoads.

19. SENATOR RHOADS:

20. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. I rise in
21. opposition to the bill. Senator Carroll, for your benefit and for all
22. the benefit of the members of the Appropriations II Committee,
23. with all due respect to both the Chairman and the Minority
24. Spokesman, it's really high time we stopped posturing. It's time
25. that we said what we mean and mean what we say. I think that this
26. might have been an acceptable bill before Senator Regner moved
27. to Table Amendment No. 1. There was a lot of posturing on the
28. Democratic side of the aisle on that. The Minority Spokesman
29. was saying that he was voting no and urging everyone to vote
30. Aye on the motion to Table Committee Amendment No. 1 and it's just
31. a question of crying wolf a few times too often. The department
32. heads might as well learn from the experience of the Department
33. of Law Enforcement, the Appropriations Committee, the Appropriations
II Committee never means what it says. So, don't worry about any

1. proposed cuts that Senator Buzbee might offer or Senator Regner
2. might offer. These are just posturing on their part. They
3. just want to get your attention. They will never cut a single
4. dime from any appropriation that ever comes in. So,
5. let's...let's have an end to the game playing. This is a
6. terrible bill.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Further discussion? Senator Regner, do you wish to close?
9. The question is shall Senate Bill 485 pass. Those in favor
10. vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.
11. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
12. who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are
13. 35, the Nays are 18, none Voting Present. Senate Bill
14. 485 having received a constitutional majority is declared passed.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Rhoads, do you question the presence of any member?
6. The roll call has been verified. On that question the Ayes are
7. 36, the Nays are 18. Senate Bill 485 having received
8. a constitutional majority on a verified roll call is declared
9. passed. Senate Bill 586 on page twenty-three of your Calendar.
10. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

11. SECRETARY:

12. Senate Bill 586.

13. (Secretary reads title of bill)

14. 3rd reading of the bill.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

16. Senator Regner.

17. SENATOR REGNER:

18. Mr. President and members of the Senate. This bill amends
19. various sections of the State agency CETA grants to allow for
20. contributions to the University Retirement System and the
21. Teacher's Retirement System and it also provides for a transfer
22. of forty-nine hundred and twenty-two dollars from a grant line
23. to operations within the Department of Children and Family
24. Services. I ask for a favorable roll call.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. Is there...Senator Regner. Any discussion of the...of
 27. Senate Bill 586? The question is shall Senate Bill 586
 28. pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The
 29. voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who
 30. wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are
 31. 50, the Nays are 2, 1 Voting Present. Senate Bill 586 having
 32. received a constitutional majority is declared passed.
 33. Is there leave to go to the Order of Secretary's Desk to pick
- up two resolutions? Leave is granted. House Joint Resolution 16,

1. Senator Knuppel.

2. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

3. This resolution will have to be amended. I don't know if

4. you return it or how it's done.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. It...it...just amend it, Senator, if you will...

7. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

8. All right.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. ...if you would explain, there is an amendment and the

11. content of it.

12. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

13. Well, the amendment...

14. SECRETARY:

15. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Knuppel.

16. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

17. That amendment is designed to place the appointing

18. powers to the committee that...or the commission that's

19. being appointed back with the President of the Senate and the

20. Speaker of the House. It had been amended out over in the House.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Is there...Senator Knuppel moves the adoption of Amendment

23. No. 1 to HJR 16. Is there discussion? All in favor say Aye.

24. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. And the amendment is adopted.

25. Are there further amendments, Mr. Secretary?

26. SECRETARY:

27. No further amendments.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Senator Knuppel, can you explain the resolution as amended?

30. SENATOR KNUPPTEL:

31. All right. House Joint Resolution 16 is a resolution which

32. had its origin in the House and the purpose of it is to appoint

33. a...an eight member committee, four from the House and four from

the Senate, to study the proposals being submitted to the U.S. EPA

1. for Section 208 of the Clean Water Act of the United States
2. and that the particular concern in the extent to which the Federal
3. Government may be encouraging nonelected agencies within
4. the State to bypass the Illinois General Assembly. Be two
5. members from the Republican side and the Democratic side
6. of each the House and Senate, appointed by the Speaker and the...
7. and the President of the Senate and the Minority Leader. The
8. purpose is to have these people report back by June 30th in
9. light of the effective date of the Clean Air and Clean
10. Water Act of the United States.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. The motion is to adopt HRJ 16 as amended. Is there discussion
13. of the motion to adopt? All in favor say Aye. All in
14. favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it and HJR 16 is
15. adopted. State your inquiry, Senator Demuzio.

16. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

17. Mr. President, I'd...I'd like to make a parliamentary
18. inquiry on...on this House Joint Resolution 17, is Senator
19. Knuppel's name to be added to this resolution or are all
20. the Senators with the exception of Senator Knuppel on this
21. resolution?

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. I...I think our records will show only Senator Knuppel
24. on this resolution.

25. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

26. Thank you.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. Senator Knuppel, will this resolution require the expenditure
29. of any funds? Senator Knuppel.

30. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

31. No, Sir. This is a joint committee of the...from the House and
32. Senate. Nothing is provided in the way of funds.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

But will there be expenses paid?

1. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

2. Sir.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. Will any expenses be paid in regard to this travel?

5. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

6. Not as far as I know. I just don't know. If it did, it would
7. come out of Senate Operations. I didn't start this amendment.

8. They asked me to pick it up and pass it...resolution.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. All right. Senator...all right. The Chair was in error in
11. allowing a voice roll call. It will allow the expenditure
12. of funds and under our rules, it will require a roll call vote
13. of thirty affirmative votes. The question is on the adoption
14. of HJR 17. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will...16.
15. HJR 16. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay.

16. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
17. who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are
18. 48, the Nays are 2, none Voting Present. HJR 16 having received
19. a majority vote is declared adopted. Senator Knuppel on
20. HJR 17. Senator Knuppel.

21. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

22. HJR 17 is a resolution directed to the Congress imploring
23. them to postpone the dates of the...the effective date of the
24. Clean Air Act of 1977 until...until June 30th, 1980 instead of its
25. effective date which is now June 30th, 1979. The reason being that
26. it's been very difficult to get the necessary input from the State
27. with reference to the deadlines for submitting clean air plans.
28. This Act was passed last year and it's...there's been a special
29. committee working on it with the Governor, but it's...it's a very
30. difficult thing to get this altogether in the short time that was
31. allotted.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. Is there further discussion of the motion to adopt?
All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. HJR 17

1. is adopted. Senator Nash on the Floor? Senator Nash, you had
2. an announcement? Senator Nash.

3. SENATOR NASH:

4. Yes, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.

5. I want to announce that the Finance Committee meeting scheduled for
6. tomorrow night will be at 6:00 o'clock in room A-1. It
7. has been moved up from 7:00 to 6:00 p.m. in room A-1. That's
8. the Finance Committee.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. SENATOR EGAN:

12. Are we wrapping it up?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Senator, we're about to adjourn.
