15. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of
16. the Senate. This is...this Senate Joint Resolution, is the
17. adjournment resolution; it calls for us when we adjourn today,
18. shortly, I hope, to return to Springfield at three o'clock
19. on Tuesday; and I would remind the membership that Tuesday
20. night is kind of a special evening. We have invited...Senator
21. Shapiro and I have invited all the former members of the
22. Senate to join us for an evening of conviviality. So, I
23. would urge all our members to be present, but we will re-
24. convene at three o'clock on Tuesday; the Committee on Revenue

26. at four and we will repair to a place in Springfield to enjoy
27. the company of those who have preceded us at six o'clock. I
28. would move for the suspension of the rules and the immediate
