26. SENATOR REGNER:

Yes, Mr. President and members, this bill originally
provided 1.1 million dollars supplemental for gas purchases
for the State Police. The amendment put on in the House is
a transfer bill... no ...transfer amendment, no new dollars;
it's a hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars into a line
item for apprehension of fugitives. The reason for the
necessity, today, is the troop...the State Police are just

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1. running out of money to pay and buy gas, so they can protect

2. our highways. I ask for a favorable roll call.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Any discussion? Senator Buzbee.

5. SENATOR BUZBEE:

6. Thank you, Mr...thank you, Mr. President. I concur with
7. what Senator Regner has said and think that we ought to go
8. ahead and get this. There's only thirty dollars...remains to
9. the State Police of this State to apprehend fugitives, and
10. I suspect that we ought to hurry up and give them some more
11. money so they can start apprehending more fugitives. So, I
12. would think we ought to vote Aye on this.

13. PRESIDENT:

All right. If there's no further discussion, the question 14. is shall the Senate concur on House Amendment No. 1 to Senate 15. 16. Bill 1484. Those in favor will vote Aye.
