1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

2. The hour of twelve having arrived, the Senate will come
3. to order. Prayer by Reverend Edward Davis of the Mt. Emory
4. Baptist Church. Will the guests in our galleries please
5. rise.

6. REVEREND DAVIS:

7. (Prayer given by Reverend Davis)

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

9. Reading of the Journal. Senator Johns.

10. SENATOR JOHNS:

11. Thank you, Mr. President. I move that reading and approval
12. of the Journals of Tuesday, June the 3rd, Wednesday, June the
13. 4th and Thursday, June the 5th, in the year 1980, be postponed
14. pending arrival of the printed Journals.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. Heard the motion. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye.
17. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. The
18. Senate will stand at ease until one fifteen. Senator Johns,
19. for what purpose do you arise?

20. SENATOR JOHNS:

21. Let me take care of a little technical matter here. Ask...
22. I have to ask leave of the Senate to be hyphenated cosponsor
23. of House Bill 3284. I'd like to get that into the record.

10. Senate Resolution 545 offered by Senators Jerome Joyce,
11. Rock and all Senators and it's congratulatory.

13. Consent Calendar.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Senate Joint Resolution 112 offered by Senators Hall,
16. Geo-Karis and Gitz.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Executive Committee. Senator Donnewald, for what purpose
19. do you arise?

20. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

21. Yes, for a series of motions, Mr. President. First I
22. would move that the Committee on Insurance be discharged from
23. further consideration of House Bill 2876 and that the bill
24. be assigned to the Committee on Finance. These are some
25. corrections that I...some oversights, so...and...next I move
26. that the Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections
27. be discharged from further consideration of House Bill 2941
28. and that bill be reassigned to the Committee on Judiciary I.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. You've heard the motions. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered.

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. Now...now, Mr...now, Mr. President, I have another motion. I move that the
33. following Appropriation, Emergency and Administration Bills be discharged from Committee

1. on Rules and be sent to the Committee on Assignment of Bills,
2. and they are House Bill 2544, 3004, 3007, 3197, 3487 and 3614.

14. Senator Donnewald, Chairman of the Assignment of Bills

21. All right. House Bills 1st reading.

22. SECRETARY:

23. House Bill 3614.

24. (Secretary reads title of bill)

25. 1st reading of the bill.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Committee on Reorganization. Senator Donnewald.

28. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

29. Just to keep the record straight, I would now make the
30. appropriate motion as far as that bill is concerned. I put
31. the cart before the horse.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. All right. That motion is in order. Is leave granted?
3. Leave is granted. So ordered. With leave of the Body we'll
4. move to the order of House Bills 3rd reading. There are some
5. bills with respect to the FY-'80 funding level. They are
6. supplementals and are of an emergency nature. I would direct
7. your attention to page 2 on the Calendar. If the sponsors
8. wish the bills called, we will certainly do so. 3030, Senator
9. Berning. On the Order of House Bills 3rd reading, is House
10. Bill 3030. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

11. SECRETARY:

12. House Bill 3030.

13. (Secretary reads title of bill)

14. 3rd reading of the bill.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Senator Berning.

17. SENATOR BERNING:

18. Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 3030 appropriates
19. General Revenue Funds to the Public School Teacher's Pension
20. and Retirement Fund of Chicago. It is to fund the obligations
21. that the State of Illinois imposed for the benefit of certain
22. retired teachers drawing less than a minimum annual pension
23. pursuant to the sections of the code. In 1975, as a matter of
24. fact, the General Assembly passed this Amendatory Pension Bill
25. providing these supplemental benefits to the retired teachers under
26. certain specific circumstances. This then, is the appropriation
27. bill for the ensuing year. It started in 1977 at nine hundred
28. seventy-five thousand dollars. It is now, this year, seven
29. hundred, fifty thousand dollars. It will gradually be eliminated
30. as these older people ultimately pass on.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall
33. House Bill 3030 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those

1. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted
2. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
3. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 42, the Nays
4. are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 3030, having received
5. the required constitutional majority is declared passed. On
6. the Order of House Bills 3rd reading, is House Bill 3039,
7. Senator Regner. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

9. House Bill 3039.

10. (Secretary reads title of bill)

11. 3rd reading of the bill.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Regner.

14. SENATOR REGNER:

15. Mr...Mr. President and members of the Senate. House Bill
16. 3039 transfers 5.4 million dollars among Federal labor project
17. funds to complete FY-1980. This includes summer youth and
18. public service CETA employment. No new funds are appropriated
19. and I ask for a favorable roll call.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall
22. House Bill 3039 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those
23. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted
24. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
25. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 44, the Nays
26. are 2, none Voting Present. House Bill 3039, having received
27. the required constitutional majority is declared passed.
28. 3063, Senator Regner. On the Order of House Bills 3rd reading,
29. middle of page 2 on the Calendar is House Bill 3063. Read
30. the bill, Mr. Secretary.

32. House Bill 3063.

33. (Secretary reads title of bill)

1. 3rd reading of the bill.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Regner.

4. SENATOR REGNER:

5. Mr. President and members. This bill establishes an
6. arson control program within the Department of Law Enforcement
7. in the amount of five hundred seventy-eight thousand, four
8. hundred dollars. I ask for a favorable roll call.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Any discussion? If not, the question is shall House Bill
11. 3063 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will
12. vote Nay. The voting is open. (Machine cut-off)...all voted
13. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
14. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 49, the Nays
15. are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 3063, having
16. received the required constitutional majority is declared
17. passed. All right, with leave of the Body, we will move to
18. the Order of Secretary's Desk. If you'll turn...to the Calendar,
19. top of page 5, there are Senate bills with respect to supplemental
20. appropriations that have come back with House amendments and the
21. sponsors have indicated they are ready to proceed. 1634, Senator
22. Davidson...is Senator...Senator Davidson on the Floor? 1852,
23. Senator Buzbee. Mr. Secretary, on the Order of Secretary's
24. Desk, Concurrence is Senate Bill 1852, Mr. Secretary.

25. SECRETARY:

26. With House Amendments 2 and 3.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Buzbee.

29. SENATOR BUZBEE:

30. Thank you, Mr. President. House Amendment 2 adds the
31. Pension Laws Commission FY-80 appropriation to transfer four
32. thousand dollars from travel to Contractual Services. House
33. Amendment 3 adjusts the transfer request to the Energy Resources

1. Commission. It transfers eight hundred dollars from Contractual
2. Services to Telecommunications. And I would move its adoption.
3. I would ask for a favorable roll call, rather.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall
6. the Senate concur in House Amendments 2 and 3 to Senate Bill
7. 1852. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will
8. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have
9. all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.
10. On that question the Ayes are 49, the Nays are none, none Voting
11. Present. The Senate does concur in House Amendments 2 and 3
12. to Senate Bill 1852 and the bill having received the required
13. constitutional majority is declared passed. On the Order of
14. Secretary's Desk, Concurrence, is Senate Bill 1983. Mr.
15. Secretary.

16. SECRETARY:

17. Senate Bill 1983 with House Amendment No. 1.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Regner.

20. SENATOR REGNER:

21. Yes, Mr. President and members. What House Amendment No. 1
22. does is change the seventeen thousand, five hundred dollar
23. appropriation to a transfer...to a supplemental appropriation
24. rather than a transfer. When the bill went out of the Senate,
25. it went out as a transfer bill. We did not feel we had enough
26. information to authorize a supplemental, however, since then
27. the department...the Fire Marshal's Office has gotten the Senate
28. Appropriations Committee the correct information and we do concur.
29. I ask to concur with the amendment that makes it a supplemental
30. rather than a transfer bill.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall
33. the Senate concur in House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1983.

1. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.
2. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
3. who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that
4. question the Ayes are 49, the Nays are none, none Voting Present.
5. Senate Bill 1983, having received the required constitutional
6. majority is declared passed. Further business to come before
7. the Senate? We have delayed the committees at least a half
8. an...Senator Buzbee, for what purpose do you arise?
9. SENATOR BUZBEE:
10. Yes, Mr. President, to...I would request to be allowed
11. to be shown as a hyphenated sponsor on House Bill 3106, a
12. hyphenated principal sponsor along with Senators Vadalabene
13. and Mitchler.
14. PRESIDENT:
15. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is
16. granted. So ordered. 3106 is the House Bill number. Further
17. business to come before the Senate? Are there any announcements?
18. If not, Senator Donnewald moves that the Senate adjourn until
19. Tuesday, June the 10th at the hour of noon, twelve o'clock, noon.
