8. SENATOR BERNING:

9. Pension credits will not be validated for any period during  
10. which no services are rendered because of a labor dispute.

11. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, if there is any one  
12. thing that has been distasteful to most of our taxpayers it is  
13. the understanding that when employees engage in a labor dispute  
14. their benefits don't suffer. This amendment surely ought to be  
15. acceptable to all of us as a gesture to our ever suffering tax-  
16. payers that we are not...aren't going to participate in any  
17. activity which will benefit people for not providing services.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

19. Senator Rock.

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. Thank you. Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
22. Senate, I rise in opposition to Amendment No. 1. I think that  
23. the denial of pension credit to one who is otherwise qualified  
24. under these circumstances is frankly something as a matter of  
25. policy we should not engage in and I would urge total opposition  
26. to Amendment No. 1.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

28. Senator D'Arco.

29. SENATOR D'ARCO:

30. Thank you, Mr. President. I also rise in opposition to  
31. the amendment. We heard this amendment in committee...we defeated  
32. the amendment on the basis that if they...an employer and the  
33. employees are involved in a legitimate labor dispute that's their  
business and no one has the right to attack whatever pension

1. credit the employees have accumulated and its a way to punish  
2. people for a legitimate right they are exercising and I also  
3. oppose this amendment.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

5. Senator Buzbee.

6. SENATOR BUZBEE:

7. Thank you, Mr. President. In discussing this amendment  
8. with the sponsor of the amendment a few weeks ago, I pointed  
9. out to him then that...that it seemed to me that we could be  
10. creating a tremendous amount of problems. Let me give you an  
11. example...a set of teachers maybe are on strike one day. State law  
12. requires 180 days attendance, 176 days of classroom attendance,  
13. and if they are on strike one day the calendar adjustment because  
14. of the snow days they are allotted and so forth during their  
15. winter calendar, they don't miss in fact one legitimate day's  
16. work because they simply teach one more day either during a  
17. snow day or in the spring, and yet the way this amendment is  
18. drawn, it is my opinion that that one day could somehow or other  
19. foul up their pension credits. I don't think that's what the  
20. sponsor intended...if there is a dispute of one day and so forth,  
21. or even two weeks, where they do not in fact miss legitimate  
22. classroom time, and I think you could get into the business of  
23. fouling up their complete pension credits for that year. And  
24. for that reason, I also rise in opposition to the amendment.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

26. Senator Egan...Senator Egan.

27. SENATOR EGAN:

28. Thank you, Mr. President. I certainly dislike opposing my  
29. good friend, Senator Berning, but Senator Berning, all you are  
30. doing here is trying to thwart a labor negotiation, in fact. The  
31. fact that...that you're using the pension law to do that is a  
32. disguise. In fact, what you're really doing is punishing those  
33. people involved in a legitimate labor dispute. That's a principle

1. that you, yourself, maintain. I do not. I am opposed to this  
2. amendment.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

4. Senator Wooten.

5. SENATOR WOOTEN:

6. Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment flies in the face  
7. of Article XII, Section 5 of the Illinois Constitution. It  
8. simply says that you shall not benefit...you shall not impair  
9. benefits of any pension or retirement system in the State.  
10. It's clearly unconstitutional.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

12. Is there further discussion? If not, the question is shall  
13. Amendment No. 1...Senator Berning.

14. SENATOR BERNING:

15. Thank you, Mr. President. I beg leave to respond. Let me  
16. remind all of you that there is nothing that authorizes or legalizes  
17. strikes by teachers and I remind you that there was a two week  
18. strike or longer in Chicago not long ago. Those days were never  
19. made up. Yes, they were paid finally by the school system, but  
20. they did not provide the service and I submit to you that there  
21. is no justification for compiling, adding to, adding on pension  
22. credits when an unauthorized, illegal strike is in occurrence,  
23. and I beg to differ with the speaker on the other side who says  
24. this is a legitimate labor negotiation issue. Striking is illegal  
25. and an illegal strike ought to carry a penalty with it and in  
26. my opinion does not violate the Constitution one iota. There  
27. isn't anything in this bill that says a teacher who is absent  
28. for a day or two or three cannot make that time up, and in that  
29. way, there would be no impairment of the pension system, but an  
30. extended absence, be it for two weeks or two months, is uncon-  
31. scionable, flies in the face of all that is reasonable and sensible,  
32. and certainly is a galling situation to the taxpayer. Not only  
33. are they subjected to an illegal walkout, but then have to face

1. the insult and added indignity of seeing their tax dollars taken  
2. away by increased tax...or pension benefits. I submit that is  
3. totally indefensible. There is nothing illegal or immoral about  
4. this amendment and I submit to you we could very well be on the  
5. fringe of a series...a series of serious disputes which could  
6. lead to extended period of strike and I intend ultimately to  
7. offer the same amendment to the other State employees' pension  
8. systems. I am not singling out the teachers, but this bill is  
9. available, offers an avenue for an amendment which I feel is  
10. absolutely defensible and I feel in the best interests and public  
11. welfare and I solicit your favorable vote. Thank you, Mr.  
12. President.
