26. SENATOR GROTEBERG:

27. Yes, Mr. President. It was I who objected yesterday to the
28. technicality of this amendment. We have reached an agreement, and
29. there's no opposition on this side.

31. Is there any further discussion? Senator Nedza moves the adoption
32. of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2192. No further discussion. All in
33. favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The
Amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

21. SENATOR REGNER:
22. Yes, Mr. President, and members. This bill establishes separate
23. procedures relating to the general rule making, emergency rule
24. making...rule making for the Joint Committee of Administrative rules.
25. There is a slight problem with the Governor's Office...and the bill is
26. written, and this amendment will clarify the Governor's Office problem
27. and also a problem in House Bill 1196, which provided for economics
28. analysis and would cut the cost of the provision of 1196, and I'd
29. ask for the adoption of Amendment No. 1.
30. PRESIDENT:
31. Senator Regner has moved the adoption of Amendment No.1 to House
32. Bill 2226. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor signify
33. by saying Aye. All opposed. I beg your pardon, Senator Wooten.

2. Senator Regner, is this the amendment you showed me yesterday?

3. PRESIDENT:

6. Yes.

8. Senator Wooten.

9. SENATOR WOOTEN:

10. Why do you change..as I understand there's a schedule of 45
11. days, and then a 14 day period and then a second 45 day period. How
12. does this 30 day period articulate within that ?

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Regner.

15. SENATOR REGNER:

16. Well, Senator Wooten if you're on the Joint Committee Administrative
17. Rules, you'd realize that we've had problems with the Governor's Office
18. wanting,..really not wanting anything at all. I think without this
19. amendment we face a sure veto, and with the amendment, I think we
20. face a signing of the bill and it will resolve the problems within
21. the joint committee on the various analysis and hearings we have.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Wooten.

24. SENATOR WOOTEN:

25. Well, Senator, I certainly don't object to you putting the bill
26. in the shape you want, but it seems to me you're...when asking for
27. an analysis of the economics and budgetary effects of the proposed
28. rule, that those effects could go far beyond the individual agency
29. itself and I'm a little unclear as to just how they would be able to
30. provide such information. This whole...this whole concept in here
31. just appears to me to be anything but clear. If it's your desire to
32. amend the bill in this form fine and we can talk about it later, but
33. I think it's going to present you some problems in clarity and in
being able to carry out the things that you want.

2. Any further discussion? If not, Senator Regner moves the
3. adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2226. All in favor
4. signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The
5. amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?

9. 3rd reading. 2237. On the Order of House Bills 2nd reading,
10. House Bill 2237. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.
11. SECRETARY:
12. House Bill 2237.
13. (Secretary reads title of bill)
14. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.
15. PRESIDENT:
16. Any amendments from the Floor?
17. SECRETARY:
18. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Weaver.
19. PRESIDENT:
20. Senator Weaver. Senator Weaver.
21. SENATOR WEAVER:
22. Thank you, Mr. President. Floor Amendment No. 1 would put a
23. cap of three hundred thousand dollars for any one project on these
24. ...on these grants that might be given through the...to any county
25. fair for expansion or reconstruction or new buildings. And I'd move
26. its adoption.
27. PRESIDENT:
28. Senator Weaver moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House
29. Bill 2237. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor signify
30. by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is
31. adopted. Any further amendments?
32. SECRETARY:
33. No further amendments.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. 3rd reading. 2240, Senator Maragos. On the Order of House
3. Bills 2nd reading, House Bill 2240. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

4. SECRETARY:

5. House Bill 2240.

6. (Secretary reads title of bill)

7. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Any amendments from the Floor?

10. SECRETARY:

11. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senators Nimrod and Maragos.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Nimrod. Senator Maragos, for what purpose do you rise?

14. SENATOR MARAGOS:

15. I would like to state that this is not my amendment, it's
16. Senator Nimrod's amendment and I'm speaking against it. It was
17. originally agreed to but not now.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. All right. Senator Nimrod.

20. SENATOR NIMROD:

21. Yes, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
22. What this amendment does, I believe, is to have this bill which was
23. intended to be buy American, conform to that specific provision. What
24. seems to have happened to this bill, after talking to those who asked
25. for the bill to be introduced, and that is US Steel, that we buy
26. steel products, in building of public buildings and what's happened
27. is there is a series of amendments that have gotten on this bill and
28. the intent of this bill has been changed so badly that it includes
29. all products. It includes every item to be built in the area. It
30. has the problem of allowing a fifteen percent increase in the total
31. cost of the building. I think what's happened here is that we have
32. involved in a good concept that was presented by a company that wanted
33. to give some preference to Illinois firms and buy American steel
34. for our buildings that we have, in fact, taken a bill and made

1. it to do several...the labor union amendments on the bill and
2. provisions onto it, that is really complicated the bill and made
3. it really be something other than what it was intended. I would be
4. happy to answer any questions about this, but I think this bill
5. as it's...amendments being offered does have the approval and the
6. consent and desirability of US Steel who were the original ones who
7. introduced this particular concept.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Any discussion? Senator Maragos.

10. SENATOR MARAGOS:

11. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. The sponsor...in the
12. House of this bill, does not want the amendment. We do the same
13. thing in the general bill without the amendment. It will cover the
14. steel industry which I have a very high regard for in my area, but
15. we also want other manufacturers to be covered, and I don't know why
16. we haven't instructed them, and Mr. Nimrod made his point in committee
17. and the bill got out 8 to 1, out of committee without...and he was
18. the only objector to it. It's a bipartisan protest and has nothing
19. to do with the partisanship and I would like to honor the sponsor's
20. request to leave it as is and ask that this amendment be defeated.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Further discussion? Senator Grotberg.

23. SENATOR GROTBORG:

24. Yes, Mr. Chairman, and members of the Senate. Who's bill
25. is this?

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Maragos.

28. SENATOR GROTBORG:

29. Senator Maragos...

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Grotberg.

32. SENATOR GROTBORG:

33. This is the bill that you and I agreed to accept and amend
for buy Illinois, right?

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Maragos.

3. SENATOR MARAGOS:

4. Yes, but the amendment that Senator Nimrod is going on it doesn't
5. ...have to do with the buy Illinois aspect it has to do that it only
6. restricts it to the steel industry, and I think it should be other
7. industries as well to be protected in Illinois. That's what I'm
8. saying. And that's why I have objected to his amendment.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Further discussion? Senator Keats.

11. SENATOR KEATS:

12. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
13. Senate. As Minority Spokesman on Labor and Commerce when this
14. bill came out on roll call of 8 to 1, we did agree that the bill
15. would be amended...amended to be a buy Illinois amendment, and I
16. don't know if there's a second amendment coming up, but if there
17. isn't, this bill was lead out of committee under a false pretense.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Senator Maragos.

20. SENATOR MARAGOS:

21. Senator Keats, there is a 2nd amendment, it should be on the
22. Clerk's Desk. There is a 2nd amendment which I'm going to approve,
23. but not the 1st amendment which restricts it only to steel. We
24. have a 2nd...2nd amendment to be put on as soon as this one is
25. defeated. If you will help me defeat it, which says that every
26. public agency...purchase products and materials...manufactured and
27. located in the State. So we have that amendment ready to go. That
28. was my promise to you and I'll keep it.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Any further discussion? Senator Nimrod may close.

31. SENATOR NIMROD:

32. Yes, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I call your attention
33. to the fact that this bill, in fact, is going to cost us 15 percent
more, at least 15 percent more, in cases to build any public

1. buildings in the future. I think that what we're saying here
2. is all products that are used in the construction of any building
3. will have to be made in the United States. That means that all
4. contracts will have to be here. This will put us in...in totally an
5. unfavorable tenure, and what it does, is allow us see...we don't
6. care how high our labor prices go. Let your contracts for labor
7. and negotiations be increased, just go ahead and we'll still...going to
8. have to pay the money. Now that's not the approach that has been
9. done in the other states. That was not the original intent of this bill,
10. by US Steel, and all I'm saying is that there's presently a process,
11. for example, let me tell you what happened that was related to me.
12. There was a contract issued on a building not long ago in Arkansas,
13. and what...what happened the bids came in and anyplace, by the
14. way, anyplace any...contracts that are let, if there's a difference
15. of more than 10 percent...less than 10 percent of the cost you must
16. use the US Steel, even though it's 10 percent higher. What's
17. happening is Japan is dumping their steel, and jumping...dumping
18. it in here at 12 and 15 percent lower than what we're doing. We
19. are addressing a subject that is presently being addressed on the
20. Federal Government, and here we are trying to set policy within our
21. State. This is the wrong approach to solve a problem. We are trying
22. to say buy American and yet we have introduced a total labor bill
23. here, that is totally restricted any kind of free kind of enterprise,
24. which is what our whole country is built on. We, in fact, are going
25. to limit and restrict the kind of buildings, the kind of designs
26. that can be built in the future and the kind of materials that can
27. be used. Now, my bill is simply, remove those provisions that say all
28. products and materials purchased by the public agencies shall be
29. manufactured. That means everything has to come from there. That
30. means we can't even buy new and modern...methods, saving methods
31. involved in this whole program. It calls for contract. It says
32. any building that's repaired or remodeled, in fact, has to meet these
33. qualifications. This bill does not meet the request of those who
introduced it, and has become a tool of the labor organizations, and

1. I would caution us, before we take this kind of action, in passing
2. a bill that is camouflaged on the basis of saying buy American, when
3. in fact it hurts American.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Nimrod moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House
6. Bill 2240. Roll call has been requested. Those in favor of the
7. amendment will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting
8. is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have
9. all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes
10. are 23. The Nays are 26. None Voting Present. The amendment fails.
11. Any further amendments?

12. SECRETARY:

13. Amendment No. 2...

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Hold it, hold it. Senator Nimrod, for what purpose do you rise?
16. Senator Nimrod has requested a verification of the negative votes.
17. Will all those members please be in their seats. All right, Senator
18. Nimrod's requested a verification. Will the members please be in their
19. seats. The Secretary will read the negative votes.

20. SECRETARY:

21. The following voted in the negative: Berman, Bruce, Buzbee,
22. Chew, Collins, D'Arco, Daley, Demuzio, Donnewald, Egan, Gitz, Hall,
23. Johns, Jeremiah...or Jerome Joyce, Martin, no, Maragos, Lemke, McLendon,
24. Merlo, Nash, Nedza, Newhouse, Sangmeister, Savickas, Vadalabene,
25. Wooten, Mr. President.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Nimrod.

28. SENATOR NIMROD:

29. Senator Lemke.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Lemke's on the Floor.

32. SENATOR NIMROD:

33. Senator Berman.

1. PRESIDENT:
2. Senator Berman is on the Floor.
3. SENATOR NIMROD:
4. Senator Collins.
5. PRESIDENT:
6. Senator Collins is in her seat.
7. SENATOR NIMROD:
8. Senator Daley.
9. PRESIDENT:
10. Senator Daley on the Floor? Senator Daley on the Floor?
11. Strike his name from the Roll.
12. SENATOR NIMROD:
13. Senator Demuzio.
14. PRESIDENT:
15. Senator Demuzio is in his seat.
16. SENATOR NIMROD:
17. Mr. President...
18. PRESIDENT:
19. The roll has been verified. The Ayes are 23, the Nays are 25.
20. None Voting Present. The amendment fails. Any further amendments?
21. Senator Nimrod.
22. SENATOR NIMROD:
23. Just one question. In this roll call, I just noticed that
24. there were not...the individual Senators were not answering the roll
25. call. And I was listening and ...some would raise their hands...it
26. makes it very difficult to follow that's why I had all these names down.
27. PRESIDENT:
28. I understand. Further amendments?
29. SECRETARY:
30. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Grotberg.
31. PRESIDENT:
32. Senator Grotberg. Senator Grotberg. Amendment No. 2.
33. SENATOR GROTBURG:

1. Yes, Mr. President, and members of...Senate. This is the
2. bill, that asks that the Capitol Development Board, give preference
3. to Illinois firms. It dosen't mandate. It says that they give
4. preference to Illinois firms in the purchase of materials for
5. building, and it's a good amendment. Something that was long needed.
6. I've had many personal experiences within the last two weeks where
7. we actually had the low bid, and it went out of State. I move the
8. adoption.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. All right, Senator Grotberg has moved the adoption of Amendment
11. No. 2 to House Bill 2240. Is there any discussion? Senator
12. Maragos.

13. SENATOR MARAGOS:

14. Mr. President, members of the Senate. This is the amendment
15. that I agreed to, and I agreed that we should have it, and I move
16. it for adoption.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Further discussion? Senator Keats.

19. SENATOR KEATS:

20. Yes, Minority Spokesman. This is the agreed amendment, and
21. I would just move it out...on a unanimous vote.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. All right, Senator Grotberg has moved the adoption of Amendment
24. No. 2 to House Bill 2240. Is there any discussion? If not, all
25. in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it.
26. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

6. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Geo-Karis.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Geo-Karis.

9. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

10. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. In

11. committee it was brought up that the utility companies that could

12. be fined up to a hundred dollars, should be utility companies that

13. are small companies and this amendment says as the utility collects

14. less than a hundred thousand dollars annually in gross revenue, then

15. they can be fined up to a hundred dollars instead of the maximum,

16. a hundred dollars, and I move its adoption.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Geo-Karis moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to

19. House Bill 2321. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor

20. signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amend-

21. ment is adopted. Any further amendments?

22. SECRETARY:

23. No further amendments.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. 3rd reading. 2322, Senator Geo-Karis. On the Order of House

26. Bills 2nd reading, House Bill 2322. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

27. SECRETARY:

28. House Bill 2322.

29. (Secretary reads title of bill)

30. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Any amendments from the Floor?

33. SECRETARY:
