SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 deals with the required number of signatures for petitions again with respect to both Independent candidates and new political parties, but this amendment deals with the less than Statewide elections, that is district or other local elections. The...and it would change the five percent requirement to two percent. It also deletes the language that I believe had already been deleted in several other places in the Statutes before, and that was the no more than eight percent requirement. There are two additional places where that has been removed in this amendment, but the principal purpose of the amendment is to change the required number of signatures for Independent candidates and new political parties at the less than Statewide elections, from five percent of those who voted in the last general election to two percent. It seems to me that in most cases, two percent is adequate, and again, I think the real point of signature requirements is to make sure that someone or some party is serious enough to go to the effort of circulating petitions and getting a sufficient number, that it is not a completely frivolous process. I don't think it was ever intended, or at least it should not be intended

I think he has a responsibility to contacting people. If we want to start a new political party to further goof-up the United States, I think that they should be able to go out and get more signatures than anyone else. I have no...compunction or no feeling of putting some sort of a restriction on these people who want to pop up every year like mushrooms, and start another party. I think it's a bad amendment, and I'm going to vote No.

- 15. 3rd reading. That concludes the Order of 2nd reading for
- 16. the day. The next order of business...Senator Rock.
- 17. SENATOR ROCK:
- 18. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
- 19. Senate. We have provided what I think is a reasonable schedule
- 20. for this week. And it calls for, particularly tomorrow, to begin
- 21. at 9:00 o'clock in the morning and commence on 3rd reading
- 22. and just continue on. In the meantime there are a number of
- 23. members who have indicated to myself and the Secretary that they
- 24. have bills on 3rd reading which they wish to recall for the purpose
- 25. of amendment. It would help our operation in terms of Enrolling
- 26. and Engrossing if we could go to that order now. And there are,
- 27. I think, twenty-two bills. If the members wish them recalled,
- 28. I suggest that now is the time to do it. We will, again, accord-
- 29. ing to the schedule as Senator Shapiro and I have attempted to
- 30. work it out, get back to 2nd reading on Thursday. So that tomorrow
- 31. there will be neither 2nd nor recalls. Tomorrow we'll just go
- 32. on 3rd reading and attempt to plow through the Calendar. We
- 33. have some close to nine hundred bills on the Calendar and I'm
- 34. suggesting that we had better get to work.

- 1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- If the...if the membership will give me...Senator Graham.
- 3. SENATOR GRAHAM:
- 4. I'd like to remind the Republican members again, we're going
- 5. to have a caucus at 12:30 and Senator Shapiro has finally conceded
- 6. that he will furnish some sandwiches so don't go running to the
- 7. Black Angus. We'll have caucus, twelve-thirty in Shapiro's
- 8. office...with food.
- 9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 10. I might make it.
- 11. SENATOR GRAHAM:
- 12. You're invited, Senator Donnewald.
- 13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 14. If I may have the attention of the membership. There is a
- 15. request, if you...if the membership will please give me their
- 16. attention. Now, after awhile, when a bill is called back to the
- 17. Order of 2nd reading and the member says, I didn't request it,
- 18. don't blame me. I'm going to read a list of numbers that there
- 19. have been a request for a recall. So, if I could have your
- 20. attention, they are as follows: House Bill 14, 65, 211, 229,
- 21. 266, 273, 437, 441, 676, 751, 774, 884, 993, 986, 1160, 1186,
- 22. l196, 1382, 1966, 2226, 2750. All right, the...the plan of

- 33. SENATOR RHOADS:

- Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This is an amend-
- 2. ment which is identical to House Bill 154 which was sponsored
- 3. by Representative Bill Walsh over in the House, who is my
- 4. Representative. It is...it's designed primarily to assist the
- 5. Village of LaGrange Park, which is in my district. And it allows
- 6. them to become a part of a water commission if the municipality
- 7. receives ninety percent of its water from that system and if its
- 8. population exceeds by twenty-five percent the population of the
- 9. current aggregate participating municipalities. This was not
- 10. put on in committee because I didn't know about it at the time.
- 11. I've since shown it to Senator Joyce, the Chairman, and Senator
- 12. Grotberg, the Minority Spokesman, and they are in agreement that
- 13. we can put the amendment on now and if there's any problem
- 14. between now and 3rd reading, I'll be...happy to take it off.
- 15. I ask its adoption.
- 16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 17. Is there discussion? The question is shall Amendment No. 1
- 18. to House Bill 14 be adopted. Those in favor indicate by saying
- 19. Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it, Amendment No. 1 is adopted.
- 20. Are there further amendments?
- 21. SECRETARY:
- 22. No further amendments.
- 23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 24. 3rd reading. House Bill 65, Senator Keats has a...an amend-
- 25. ment to House Bill 65. House Bill 211, Senator Vadalabene. Is
- 26. the sponsor, Senator Davidson, with the amendment. You wish...
- 27. Senator Davidson.
- 28. SENATOR DAVIDSON:
- 29. Mr...excuse me, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This
- 30. amendment is agreed between Senator...Representative Sharp, who
- 31. has Senate Bill 494 in the House and this bill which Senator
- 32. Vada labene...put the bills in the same order. And I think actually
- 33. we have to reconsider the vote and Table the amendment, which was

- 1. adopted out of committee, which the sponsor objects to which
- 2. Senator Berman put on which put a cap on this transportation
- 3. formula. And I believe we have to take action and Table that
- 4. amendment first before we adopt this to make them track together.
- 5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 6. Now, Senator, is it your desire to Table Amendment No. 1?

- 26. Senator Berman. All right, the question is shall Amendment
- No. 2 to House Bill 211 be adopted. Those in favor indicate
- 28. by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment

- No. 2 is adopted. Are there further amendments?

- 3. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Maragos.
- 4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Maragos.
- 6. SENATOR MARAGOS:
- 7. 266, not 226, I'm sorry...
- 8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 9. It's 266 is the correct number.
- 10. SENATOR MARAGOS:
- 11. Just trying to get my file here, just one second, Mr. President.
- 12. Yes, there's an amendment that is desired by the Department of
- 13. Revenue and I ask for leave to...take this back from 3rd reading
- 14. to 2nd for amendment purposes.
- 15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 16. That...that has already been granted. We are on the Order
- 17. of 2nd reading.
- 18. SENATOR MARAGOS:
- 19. The amendment has been asked for by the Director of Revenue
- 20. and I have no objection to it and I ask for its adoption.

- 29. 3rd reading. House Bill 273, Senator Hall. Do you wish
- 30. the bill called? Senator Berning has an amendment. Senator Berning.
- 31. SECRETARY:
- 32. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Berning.
- 33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

- Senator Berning.
- 2. SENATOR BERNING:
- 3. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate. I've
- 4. had cause to be distributed on the desks of each of you a
- 5. little memorandum on House Bill 273. The amendment as
- 6. offered is a good government amendment and in my opinion will
- 7. go a long way toward steming somewhat the abuses of our
- 8. Public Aid System. In addition, this bill...this amendment
- 9. for House Bill 273 will assist eligible recipients in
- 10. finding employment and insure that only those who are in
- 11. need receive assistance from the State. The bill will
- 12. guarantee that everything possible is being done to only
- 13. provide assistance to those individuals who actually need
- 14. it. And not to those individuals who can work or are
- 15. fraudulently receiving aid. If there is any one thing,
- 16. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate which is aggravating
- 17. and galling to our fellow citizens, it is what they perceive
- 18. as abuses of our Public Aid System. Amendment No. 1 to
- 19. House Bill 273 will take one short step in controlling
- 20. some of the abuse and reestablishing the fact that the
- 21. recipient is truly qualified, truly eligible and is doing
- 22. everything that he or she ought to do in order to continue
- 23. to qualify. Mr. President, I would respectfully urge the
- 24. members of this Senate to adopt Amendment No. 2 to House
- 25. Bill 273.
- 26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 27. Senator Collins.
- 28. SENATOR COLLINS:
- 29. Question the sponsor.
- 30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 31. Indicates he will respond.
- 32. SENATOR COLLINS:
- 33. Senator Berning, you said failure to pick up the check in

- 1. person would render the person ineligible for assistance?
- 2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Berning.
- 4. SENATOR BERNING?
- 5. Yes, this is putting the responsibility on the individual.
- 6. And as you well know, Senator, there are some instances and
- 7. for...in all too many cases, too many instances where an individual
- 8. has more than one check coming to him or to her. By appearing
- 9. in person and claiming the check, there is certainly some element
- 10. of control and we hope there would then be less abuse in those
- 11. kind of cases.
- 12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 13. Senator Collins.
- 14. SENATOR COLLINS:
- 15. Are their any safeguards for person that for whatever
- 16. legitimate reason could not pick up a check? You're saying
- 17. failure to pick up the check would render the recipient ineligible
- 18. for further assistance.
- 19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 20. Senator Berning.
- 21. SENATOR BERNING:
- 22. Yes, we have in...in the amendment this provision, Senator.
- 23. If the parent or other person with whom the child or children
- 24. or living cannot personally collect a grant from the Public
- 25. Aid office for reasons of health, he my designate, in writing,
- 26. a person to collect the grant. In other words, I think we have
- 27. covered all the provisions that might arise.
- 28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 29. Senator Collins.
- 30. SENATOR COLLINS:
- 31. Are you allowing in addition dollars in...in the grant...
- 32. flat grant for car fare, cost of car fare?
- 33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

- 1. Senator Berning.
- 2. SENATOR BERNING:
- This in no way touches the grant figure itself.
- 4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Collins.
- 6. SENATOR COLLINS:
- 7. But it does touch the grant figure if the person has to
- 8. go, use...public transportation to and from the office to
- g. pick up the check twice a month or once a month.
- 10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 11. Senator Berning. We...our time has expired, Senator
- 12. Collins. Proceed.
- 13. SENATOR BERNING:
- 14. There...there ought to be some degree of responsibility
- 15. and initiative on the part of people who are expecting and
- 16. perhaps demanding, as well as being deserving of the largess
- 17. of the rest of society. Now, you and I both know that a good
- 18. many of our participants have adequate transportation, in
- 19. some instances more sumptuous than you and I have, but the
- 20. price of a CTA bus is not prohibitive and it seems to me that
- 21. that is something that could be absorbed without any hardship.
- 22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 23. Senator Buzbee.
- 24. SENATOR BUZBEE:

- Question of the sponsor. Senator Berning, I applaud
- 26. your efforts to try to cut down and stop Public Aid fraud.
- 27. I wonder if you would support an amendment that I would offer
- if yours goes on which would require all doctors and a...and
- a...all medical providers to also go down personally and pick
- 30. up their checks because they, by far and away, of course,
- that...that the area of medical...providers is where by far
- and away the massive Public Aid fraud comes in this State
- and across the country. As declared by the Director of the

- 1. Department of Public Aid, Director Qwern just the other day
- 2. when I asked him the question as to who is it that's stealing
- 3. the money, is it the poor or the rich. And he said, by far
- 4. and away, it's the rich that are stealing much, much more
- 5. money...in Public Aid than...than are the poor. And so if
- 6. your amendment goes on, it seems to me that we ought to also
- 7. ask all of those laboratories, all the dentists, optometrists,
- 8. doctors, hospitals and everybody to go down and pick up the
- 9. check themselves from the Public Aid Office when they have
- 10. a payment coming due because if we're going to stop fraud,
- 11. they provide the most fraud in this State.
- 12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 13. Senator Hall may close. Oh, I'm sorry, I thought that you had finished
- 14. your dissertation. You may...do you wish to respond, Senator Berning?
- 15. SENATOR BERNING:
- 16. That may not have been apparent to you, President, as a
- 17. question, but it was a question, in addition to a long dissertation.
- 18. The answer Senator, is, I will wholeheartedly support your amend-
- 19. ment and I wouldn't even predicate it upon the passage of
- 20. this amendment. You come in with an amendment or a bill that
- 21. does what you purport and I will be pleased to support it. I
- 22. am totally committed to attempting to plug any and all loopholes
- 23. in the Public Aid System and if you can devise an amendment
- 24. I'll support it. Now, I would respectfully urge a favorable
- 25. consideration of this amendment, since it works no real hard-
- 26. ship on anyone and it could conceivably eliminate some of the
- 27. abuse that we have been chagrined over.
- 28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 29. Senator Kenneth Hall.
- 30. SENATOR KENNETH HALL:
- Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
- 32. Senate. This is a bad amendment. Senator Berning you continually
- 33. complain about Public Aid. You try to beat people who are on Public

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Aid that they cannot have the dignity. People, contrary to
l.
     what you feel and believe, that most people do not feel that
2.
     and...want to be on Public Aid. But the reason that we introduce
3.
     this bill is that it provides that the Department of Public
4.
     Aid shall assist fathers or dependent children with respect
5.
     to employment counseling. We're making an effort to try
6.
     to find some type of employment. We're trying to do exactly
7.
     what you are complaining. As Senator... Buzbee has so ably
8.
     stated, it's not the poor little recipients, it's the one
 9.
     that's magnified. We know who is the big abusers of Public
10.
     Aid. This is a bad amendment. If you're going to take these
11.
     people who...and force them to go down to pick up their checks.
12.
     Senator Berning, you know yourself, that it's not the little
13.
     people that are really the great abusers of this. Now we're
14.
     trying to do something. We're trying to encourage people
15.
     to help get off of Public Aid and you try to put this...
16.
     on. This is a bad amendment and I urge a No vote.
17.
     PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

         Senator Berning may close if you so desire.
19.
     SENATOR BERNING:
20.
         Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Hall, I am in no way
21.
     attacking your bill, if fact I think it's a laudable bill and
22.
     I wholeheartedly support it, with or without the amendment.
23.
     It is my intention simply to, as I mentioned before, provide
24.
     a little additional protection. Now the Department of Public
25.
     Aid is currently utilizing a direct delivery system in Cook
26.
     and Will Counties. Recipients in these areas can pick up
27.
     their checks at a neighborhood financial institution, mostly
28.
     currency exchanges and it's done mainly for the convenience of
29.
     the receipent, but not to monitor who's receiving the grant.
30.
     Six states currently have direct delivery programs utilizing
31.
     financial institutions as the distribution point and we pattern
32.
     the original direct delivery program after Pennsylvania's.
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- 1. In other words, this is merely a small extension of what we
- 2. are now currently authorized to do and to a great extent, are
- 3. already doing. But it would preclude, it would preclude those
- 4. individuals, and I admit that it's probably a small percentage,
- 5. those individuals who are taking advantage. It is not directed
- 6. at making it more difficult for the little individual, that's
- 7. not my objective and I assure you I do not want to be punitive.

- 15. SECRETARY:
- 16. Amendment No. 1 offered by...
- 17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 18. No...just a moment...just a moment, it's indicated to the Chair
- 19. that there is no amendment by Senator Lemke. Take it out of the
- 20. record. The Secretary indicates that you have filed an amendment
- 21. on this bill, Senator Lemke. Well, we'll advance it back to
- 22. the Order of 3rd reading. House Bill 676, Senator Vadalabene,
- 23. is the sponsor and sponsor of the amendment.

- 3rd reading. House Bill 751. Senator Vadalabene's bill.

- 3. Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Knuppel.
- 4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 5. Senator Knuppel on the Floor? Take it out of the record,
- 6. it will be advanced to the Order of 3rd reading. Oh, I'm sorry,
- 7. just a minute.
- 8. SECRETARY:
- Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Vadalabene.
- 10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 11. Senator Vadalabene.
- 12. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- 13. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No...this will
- be...Amendment No. 1 now?
- 15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 16. That's correct.
- 17. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- Okay, what we do with Amendment No. 1, we increase the
- 19. penalities for the railroads from...from after the ten minute
- to the fifteen minute an additional five...five hundred dollars 20.
- every five minutes. And I move for the adoption of Amendment
- 22. No. 1 to House Bill 751.
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Knuppel. Senator Knuppel.
- 25. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- Mr. Chairman and members of the Body. Amendment No. 1 is
- a different...now is this your...your amendment, Sam?
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- Senator Vadalabene.
- 30. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- Yes, they were trying to locate you so that you could go
- with yours first, but evidently they couldn't get ahold, so.
- PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

- Senator Knuppel.
- 2. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- 3. I was off the Floor, I had to go into... Chambers. Now, what
- 4. do you want to do, you want...you want to try mine first or you
- 5. want to go ahead with yours?
- 6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 7. Senator Vadalabene.
- SENATOR VADALABENE:
- Well, since we're on mine, let's try mine, but what I want
- 10. to do is try to kill Senator Knuppel's amendment.
- 11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 12. That's rather obvious. Senator Knuppel.
- .. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- 14. All right. What happened is this bill came into committee,
- 15. the House sponsor was there, he made an agreement to, get this bill
- out of committee that he would amend the bill in the order of
- the amendment that I had offered as Amendment No. 1. That amend-
- 18 ment, with that proposed amendment, the bill was passed out of
- the committee. It would have been held in committee, but for
- 20 his assurance. After the bill was out of committee, an amendment
- 21. was drawn which was Amendment No. 1 and this amendment was drawn
- 22. by our staff in accordance with his agreement. I'm not...referring
- 23. to Senator Vadalabene, I'm referring to Representative Steele.
- Representative Steele subsequently changed his mind after the
- 25. bill was out on 2nd reading. Therefore, this amendment, he had
- this amendment drawn which does not reflect his agreement in
- committee. Now, I've been here for ten years and it's always
- been my understanding that if a man agreed to something, his
- word was good in this Body. Representative Steele backed up
- on his word, Senator Geo-Karis and many other people who were in
- 31. that committee know this. He went back on his word, he decided
- he'd made what he considered an improvident arrangement to get 32.
- his bill out of committee. It's for this reason that I oppose
- 34. this amendment, more so than for the content, is...is the purpose.

- 1. I have a memo from the staff and this man came over here and
- 2. stood beside my desk and I don't like that from any Representative
- 3. or any other individual. He stood here and said that...that the
- 4. railroad industry had gotten ahold of Vicky Thomas, and that's
- 5. a goddamn lie and I told his so...and I told him so right here.
- 6. Now, that kind of a man doesn't even belong in the Illinois General
- 7. Assembly that backs up on his word in that manner. This...this
- 8. amendment should be defeated.
- 9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)
- 10. Senator McMillan. Senator McMillan.
- 11. SENATOR McMILLAN:
- 12. Mr. President and members of the Senate. I would not in
- 13. any way quarrel with Senator Knuppel's statement about what happened
- and I think he has every reason and I would support him in defending
- the staff person that he...he mentioned. From the standpoint of
- 16. trying to look at the bill and what the bill does, however, it
- 17. seems important to me that we take a look at what's needed. In
- 18. fact, railroads do cause considerable problem and considerable
- 19. delay in particularly a lot of rural communities. And it was
- 20, my feeling that if we were to do anything legislatively that
- 21. would, in fact, provide them with some pressure to get the rail-
- 22. road track cleared so that the traffic could go over it, we would
- 23. need stronger penalties than those which are included in Senator
- 24. Knuppel's Amendment. So I don't quarrel with his statement about
- 25. procedures and so forth, but I do strongly support Senator Vadalabene's
- 26. amendment because I feel, in fact, the penalties in it are what we
- 27. need in order to move the railroad.
- 28. PRESIDENT:
- Further discussion? Senator Geo-Karis.
- 30. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- 31. Yes, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
- 32. I was at the committee hearing. I think what's happened, there
- was a miscommunication of understanding. I don't think anyone

- 1. deliberately tried to hurt anyone or do something they didn't
- 2. say they were going to do. I understood it to be stronger, myself,
- 3. and it isn't that I take issue with the...Senator Knuppel at all,
- 4. I think it was just a matter of misunderstanding. I too, concur
- 5. with Senator McMillan that we should have stronger safeguards,
- 6. cause I have errors in my district, frankly that if the...crossing
- 7. is blocked, no one can go to a hospital, no one can take care of
- 8. an emergency. And there have been times when they blocked
- 9. it unnecessarily just to save money for the railroad company and
- 10. I think it's more important to save lives. And in that...in that
- 11. spirit I support Senator Vadalabene's amendment.
- 12. PRESIDENT:
- 13. Further discussion? Senator Maragos.
- 14. SENATOR MARAGOS:
- 15. I rise in support of this amendment because of the fact
- 16. that we need it very badly, expecially in the 30th District.
- 17. PRESIDENT:
- 18. Further discussion? Senator Knuppel.
- 19. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- 20. Well...well, fellows I...I'm not debating the merits. There's
- 21. no misunderstanding about what the...what the people agreed to in
- 22. committee and...and if we're going to start running this ship around
- 23. here this way, I had bills held in committee because I refused to
- 24. agree to a certain thing and Senator Sangmeister knows this. If
- 25. we're going to have people that agree to things to get them out
- 26. of committee and there was no misunderstanding, Vicky Thomas
- 27. went upstairs and immediately drafted that amendment in accordance
- 28. with what the understanding was. Now, Senator McMillan may have
- 29. been unhappy with what that agreement was and Senator Geo-Karis
- 30. may be unhappy with what that agreement was, but that agreement
- 31. was made and there's no doubt about what it was. There was no
- 32. misunderstanding, in fact, Senator McMillan told Vicky Thomas
- 33. that there was no misunderstanding, but that he didn't agree

- 1. with the thing that was made. Now people can back up and welsh
- 2. on agreements made in committee and there was no misunderstanding
- 3. and I won't have anybody stand here and say that there was.
- 4. If anybody in the this Body says there was a misunderstanding
- $^{5}\cdot$ with me, I'm going to tell them they're a goddamn lier. There
- 6. was no misunderstanding. Now, you vote anyway you want to vote
- 7. on the bill, but if this is the way we're going to run committees,
- 8. there was no misunderstanding because Vicky Thomas went right
- 9. upstairs, drew that amendment, there might have been a misunder-
- 10. standing on an individual's part, but there was no misunderstanding
- 11. on what Steele said, there was no misunderstanding on what Vadalabene
- 12. said. You might have had a personal misunderstanding, I didn't
- 13. have one and the staff didn't have one. You may not like the
- 14. way it was agreed to get it out of committee, but anybody here
- 15. whose word is good should stand behind it. This is one Body
- 16. that Senator Graham tells me something, Senator Regner tells me
- 17. something, Senator Vadalabene tells me something, anybody...
- 18. Senator Maragos tells me something to get a bill out of my
- 19. committee, then by God they ought to stand behind that agreement.
- 20. PRESIDENT:
- 21. Further discussion? Senator Ozinga.
- 22. SENATOR OZINGA:
- 23. Mr. President, I've been around here a long time. As you
- 24. all recall, over the years, this particular amendment was sponsored
- 25. by Romie Palmer. We went all over the State of Illinois with
- 26. regard to it. But at this particular time, I've got to agree
- 27. with Senator Knuppel. A word's...a man's word in this Chamber
- 28. should be his bond and that I agree with wholly and consistently
- 29. because there are other bills that are going to be coming up
- 30. that some of our Senators whether we agree or whether we disagree,
- 31. this should be an honorable Body to live by his word.
- 32. PRESIDENT:
- 33. Further discussion? Senator Geo-Karis.

- 1. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- 2. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The
- 3. misunderstanding was mine, I've not tried to attribute it to
- 4. Senator Knuppel or anyone else, but this is what I misunderstood
- 5. and I'm being honest about it and I certainly have no inference
- 6. of change to the staff...lady, Vicky Thomas, I think she's a
- 7. very honorable, very competent person. Nor was it an intention
- g. to...to cast the aspersions on her or Senator Knuppel. I want
- q to make it clear the misunderstanding was mine, not that it
- 10. was Senator Knuppel's.
- 11. PRESIDENT:
- 12. Any further discussion? Senator Vadalabene may close.
- 13. SENATOR VADALABENE:
- 14. Yes, just in closing, in support of this amendment. I've
- 15. been around here a little bit longer than ten years and I know
- 16. that...that a committee word is...is justified, but I've also
- 17. found out since I've been around here that a sponsor has a
- 18. right to get the bill into the shape he would like to have it in.
- Now, the bad thing about the amendment was that the thousand
- dollar cap. That was that the Knuppel amendment has. Now,
- this means if you want, for a little information, that a railroad
- 22. can block a crossing when it reaches a thousand dollar fine
- 23. for the next three weeks and doesn't have to move the railroad,
- 24, and this is what the objection was. And just one little question
- 25. about Vicky Thomas, who we all adore and love. I know that
- Everett Steele is an honorable man and I also know that Representative
- 27. Steele also apologized to Senator Knuppel for that slip of the tongue
- 28 remark and he didn't mean it in the way that Senator Knuppel took
- 29. it and I would appreciate a favorable vote on this amendment.
- 30. PRESIDENT:
- 31. Senator Vadalabene has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1
- 32. to House Bill 51. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. All those
- opposed. Roll call has been requested. Those in favor of the

- 1. adoption of the amendment will vote Aye. Those opposed will
- 2. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have
- 3. all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes
- 4. are 21, the Nays are 29, none Voting Present. The amendment fails.
- 5 Further amendments?
- 6 SECRETARY:
- 7. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Knuppel.
- 8. PRESIDENT:
- 9. Senator Knuppel.
- 10. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- Mr. President, this amendment puts...puts much more severe
- 12. penalties on railroads blocking crossing than are now on rail-
- 13. roads and is in accordance with the arrangement which was reached
- in committee to release this legislation. I move the adoption of
- Amendment No. 1.
- 16. PRESIDENT:
- Senator...Amendment No. 2. Senator Knuppel has moved the
- adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 751. Is there any
- discussion? Senator Vadalabene.
- SENATOR VADALABENE:
- Yes, I just want to alert the membership, now that we put
- a thousand dollar cap on the blocking of railroads by the
- railroads themselves that they can block them now all day long,
- they are happy, they are extremely happy. The lobbyist for the 24.
- railroad industry came to me and said we will gladly pay a
- thousand dollars. I just want to let you know what you're doing
- with this amendment.
- PRESIDENT:
- Senator Knuppel has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2...
- SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- Mr. President...
- PRESIDENT:
- Oh, wait just a minute. Senator Knuppel has moved the ${\bf 33.}$

- 1. adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 751. Is there any
- 2. discussion? Senator Geo-Karis.
- 3. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- 4. Could Senator Knuppel just tell me about the amendment?
- 5. PRESIDENT:
- 6. Indicates he will yield. Senator Knuppel.
- SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- 8. I'll be happy to answer...answer questions on...on the
- 9. amendment, yes.
- 10. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- What does it do, Senator Knuppel?
- 12. PRESIDENT:
- 13. Senator Knuppel.
- 14. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:
- I don't have it.
- 16. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
- 17. It...it makes the fine five hundred dollars mandatory for
- a blocking of at least fifteen minutes and advances that at the
- rate of two hundred fifty dollars for every additional two
- and one half minutes to a maximum of one thousand dollars for 20.
- each violation. Now, at the present time, there's...there's
- from nothing up to five hundred dollars and that's what people
- are complaining about. The railroads block the crossing, they
- go in and get a fifty dollar fine. Now the fine is a mandatory
- five hundred dollars at fifteen minutes, it goes at seventeen
- and a half...or at twenty minutes, it goes to seven, it goes
- up two hundred and fifty dollars, I was wrong a second ago, but
- for every five minutes, it goes up two hundred and fifty dollars 28.
- until it reaches one thousand dollars. I'll read it to you,
- obstruction in excess of ten minutes, but no longer than fifteen,
- duration exceeds fifteen minutes of violation shall be a business
- offense and the fine then would be five hundred dollars. If the
- duration is in excess of twenty minutes, but no longer than twenty-
- 34. five, it's seven hundred and if the duration of the obstruction is

- 1. in excess of twenty-five, but no longer than thirty, the fine
- shall be nine hundred and over thirty minutes, it's one thousand
- 3. dollars.
- A PRESIDENT:
- 5. Any further discussion? Senator Knuppel has moved the
- 6. adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 751. All those in
- 7. favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The Ayes have
- 8. it, the amendment is adopted. Further amendments?
- 9. SECRETARY:
- No further amendments.
- PRESIDENT:
- 3rd reading. Senator Donnewald, for what purpose do you arise?
- SENATOR DONNEWALD:
- 1...I intend to make a motion to adjourn at this time to
- 9:00 o'clock tomorrow morning, but prior to that, I assume that
- Senator Johns and Graham have announcements.
- PRESIDENT:
- Senator Graham.
- SENATOR GRAHAM:
- Republican caucus immediately in Senator Shapiro's office.
- PRESIDENT:
- Senator Johns.
- SENATOR JOHNS:
- Thank you, Mr. President. I now am calling a caucus in 24.
- Room 105 of the Democratic Senate. Please leave here and go 25.
- right there directly and let's get going cause we only got a 26.
- short amount of time. 27.
- PRESIDENT:
- All right. Senator Donnewald has moved to adjourn until...
- Senator Nimrod.
- SENATOR NIMROD:
- Yeah, Mr. President, I just might call attention to the Senators 32.
- that this afternoon for those that have a chance, Rockwell Inter-
- 34. national, the Technical Energy Resources Committee is holding

- 1. a presentation on the Coal Gasification Process. And since this
- 2. is important to several of the Senators from your districts, you
- 3. might want to see this new process. It's at Baur's, at two o'clock
- 4. and there is a reception at five to which all of you are invited.
- 5. Thank you.
- 6. PRESIDENT:
- 7. All right. Any further business, further announcements?
- 8. Senator Carroll.
- 9. SENATOR, CARROLL:
- 10. I was just curious if those Democrats who are hungry can
- 11. go to the Republican caucus instead.
- 12. PRESIDENT:
- 13. No. Senator Graham indicates in the negative. Any further
- 14. business? All right, if not, Senator Donnewald moves that the
- 15. Senate stand adjourned until Wednesday, June 20, the hour of
- 16. noon...at 9:00 o'clock in the morning.
