1. SENATOR ROCK:

2. The Senate will come to order. The members please be  
3. in their seats. Senator Egan.

4. SENATOR EGAN:

5. Thank you, Mr. President. I move that we disapprove  
6. the recording of the proceedings or the Journal of January  
7. 15, 1981, thereby declaring a vacancy in the Presidency of  
8. the Senate and move that we appoint a temporary Presiding  
9. Officer, a temporary President to preside and that we appoint  
10. a temporary Secretary to keep a record of the proceedings.

11. SENATOR ROCK:

12. All right, you've heard Senator Egan's motion to disapprove the  
13. Journal of January 15, 1981 and to...and ask for the appoint-  
14. ment of a temporary Presiding Officer. On that question the  
15. Clerk will call the roll.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. On that question, there are 30 Ayes, no Nays, none Voting  
28. Present. The Chair notes the presence of a constitutionally  
29. elected quorum and will appoint Senator Bruce as the temporary  
30. Presiding Officer and Senator Frank Savickas as the Assistant  
31. Secretary.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. It is duly noted by the temporary Presiding Officer that

1. a constitutional majority is present in the Chamber and prepared  
2. to do business. And that Senator Frank Savickas is the temporary  
3. Secretary to the Senate. The matter before the Senate is the  
4. election of a President. Are there nominations? Senator  
5. Donnewald is recognized.

6. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

7. Yes, Mr. Chairman, I nominate Philip J. Rock as President  
8. of the Illinois Senate for the 82nd General Assembly.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senate...Senator Donnewald has nominated Senator Phil  
11. Rock as President of the Senate. Senator Johns seconds that  
12. nomination. Are there further nominations for President of  
13. the Senate? The motion by...Senator Buzbee.

14. SENATOR BUZBEE:

15. Mr. President, I move the nominations be closed.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17. Senator Buzbee has moved that the nominations for President  
18. be closed. Is there discussion of that motion? All in favor  
19. will say Aye. All opposed will say Nay. The Chair declares  
20. that the motion to close nominations is passed.

21. ACTING SECRETARY: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

22. Becker.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. ...Hold on. The Chair rules that under the Constitution  
25. of the State of Illinois, the Statutes of the State of Illinois  
26. and the rules and proceedings and history of the Senate, that  
27. it would require thirty votes to elect a President. The Secretary  
28. will call the members' names on the nomination of Phil...Philip  
29. J. Rock as President of the Senate. Mr. Secretary. The...the  
30. members will answer by naming the person that they would wish  
31. to vote for after the Secretary has called your name.

20. On the question of election of a President to the Illinois  
21. State Senate, there...for Senator Philip J. Rock, there are 30  
22. Ayes, no Nays and the temporary Presiding Officer declares the  
23. election of Senator Phil Rock as President of the Illinois State  
24. Senate. Will Senator Rock please come to the podium for adminis-  
25. tration of the oath of office. Under the Constitution of the  
26. State of Illinois, it requires that a notary public at least  
27. issue the oath of office to the President. It is my honor to  
28. give the oath of office to Senator Philip J. Rock. I, state  
29. yourname - do solemnly swear - that I will support the Consti-  
30. tution of the United States - and the Constitution of the State  
31. of Illinois - and that I will faithfully discharge the duties -  
32. of the office of President of the Senate - to the best of my  
33. ability. Congratulations. Howard Carroll.

34. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Carroll, for what purpose do you arise?

2. SENATOR CARROLL:

3. For purpose of resolutions, Mr. President. I offer to  
4. the Secretary, Senate Resolution No. 1.

5. Resolved by the Senate of the 82nd General Assembly of  
6. the State of Illinois, the following officers are hereby elected  
7. for the term of the 82nd General Assembly: Mr. Kenneth A. Wright  
8. as Secretary of the Senate, Mr. Edward E. Fernandes as Assistant  
9. Secretary of the Senate, Mr. Joey Mack as Sergeant-at-Arms and  
10. Mr. Mario Costa as Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms. I move for the  
11. immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. The motion is to suspend the rules for the immediate con-  
14. sideration and adoption of Senate Joint...Senate Resolution 1.  
15. Is there discussion? All in favor on the motion say Aye. Opposed  
16. Nay. The Ayes have it, the resolution is adopted. Senator Rock.

17. SENATOR ROCK:

18. So that the record may be perfectly clear, Mr. Chairman, I  
19. would...or Mr. President, I would suggest that we have a roll  
20. call.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Senator Rock has requested a roll call. The Secretary will  
23. call the roll. Senator Rock, would it be permissible that we  
24. entertain the motions of Senator Carroll on six...roll call and  
25. take those all on one roll call? Six...no, all right. The question  
26. is on the election of officers to the Illinois State Senate and the  
27. adoption of Senate Resolution 1. The Secretary will call the roll.

8. Resolved by the Senate of the 82nd General Assembly of

11. Committee on Committees of the Senate for the 82nd General  
12. Assembly as the Democrats, Senators Rock, Donnewald, Bruce  
13. Savickas, Hall and Johns. As Republicans, Senators Shapiro,  
14. Walsh, Weaver and Philip. I move for the suspension of the  
15. temporary rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of  
16. Senate Resolution No. 3.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. The motion is to suspend the rules for the immediate  
19. consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 3. Is there
