PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I move that we immediately adopt the...suspend the rules and adopt the resolution.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

You've heard the motion to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration of...of the resolution. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. Senator Vadalabene now moves that the adjournment resolution be adopted. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Reso-

lutions.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Resolution No. 438, offered by Senator Donnewald and all members of the Senate.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

I would prevail...this is a resolution...Senator Joyce. It's a congratulatory resolution that needs to be passed immediately. Senator Joyce moves for the suspension of the rules for the consideration...the adoption of the amendment. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. Motion now is by Senator Joyce to adopt said resolution. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Senate...Senator Buzbee, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BUZBEE:

Thank you, Mr. President. If...if I could have the attention...if I could have the attention of my colleagues. On the Consent Calendar is Senate Resolution No. 437, which is a death resolution. I think we all...Mr. President, could I have some order, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Will the members please...please be in their seats.

SENATOR BUZBEE:

On the Consent Calendar is Senate Resolution No. 437. It's a death resolution, expressing our grief at the loss of the twenty-seven of the Illinois Air National Guard, in the plane crash last week. And, I would ask at this time that if the Secretary would please read that resolution.

PRESIDING OFFICER

Will the Secretary please read the resolution into the record?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Resolution 437, offered by Senators Buzbee, Rock and all members of the Senate.

(Secretary reads SR No. 437)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Senator Buzbee.

SENATOR BUZBEE:

I would just move for the adoption at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

You've hear the motion. Those in favor...it is on the Consent Calendar, I'm going to that order of business at this time. You have...you should have before you a copy of the Resolutions Consent Calendar. Is there objections to any of the resolutions thereon?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No objections have been filed.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

There being no objections filed, the motion is to adopt the resolutions on the said Consent Calendar. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. I...I'm advised that...that we have one of our...one, maybe two, of our members that have a birthday...I think they're both the same age, Senator DeAngelis and Senator Bruce. Is that right, Senator Bruce?

SENATOR BRUCE:

Same age. Right.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

But, Senator DeAngelis, one of your constituents said that you were inviting everybody over for a piece of cake. I'll be there. Is there further business to come before the Senate? Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I bring this up every year. Has anything been done for us, whose

birthdays are in July, August and September? I've brought this up, now, for sixteen years, and I'm wondering when you are going to get to that order.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

When we get to July, August or September. Senator Newhouse, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, on Senate Resolution No. 426, by Senator McLendon. The Senator isn't on the Floor now, but this relates to a personal friend of mine. I'd like leave to be included as a sponsor of that...resolution.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

Senator, there is no objection. The record...the record will so show. Is there further business to come before the Senate? There being none, the Senate stands adjourned until...just a moment, Tuesday, March 30th at 2:00 p.m. The Senate is adjourned.
