By this amendment, students will be able to seek help from school personnel without any requirement that the school personnel report their efforts as self-help. It will allow the reporting of the incident of the drug usage to the Department of Law Enforcement, that would continue. They testified they wanted a statistical base, that would still go on, but it would protect the indentity of the student. It does not apply to non-student users, to dealers, or anyone else who operates on the school premises. It just says that if a person comes in and voluntarily says, I would like to have help from the school, they would report him, but they would not have to report his name.
