11. For what purpose does Senator Friedland arise?

12. SENATOR FRIEDLAND:

13. Thank you, Mr. President. Concerning Senate Resolution  
14. 179, my name appears on that resolution without my permission. I'd  
15. like it stricken please. Senate Resolution 179 has my name  
16. on it and I'd like it removed. It was placed on there with-  
17. out my permission.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Alright. Is there leave to strike his name as a sponsor?  
20. Leave is granted. For what purpose does Senator Berning arise?

21. SENATOR BERNING:

22. Mr. President, yesterday I discussed with the...with  
23. President Rock the...advisability of moving to the Secretary's  
24. Desk. He indicated that there would be no problem whatsoever with...  
25. considering Senate Resolution 68, which is just one of those  
26. routine time extension resolutions for the reporting by  
27. Legislative Investigating Commission. The original resolution  
28. under which they have been functioning had a termination date  
29. of April 30th, so that this should be adopted to continue the  
30. authority for them to carry out their investigation and I would  
31. like leave of the Body to...go to that item and move for the  
32. adoption.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1.           Alright. On page 64 of your Calendar, Senator Berning's  
2. resolution. Is there leave to go to that order of business?  
3. Leave is granted. Senator Berning moves the adoption of Senate  
4. Resolution 78. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes  
5. have it. Senate Resolution 68. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed  
6. Nay. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. For  
7. what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

8.           SENATOR ROCK:

9.           Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
10. Senate. While we're awaiting...certain of the sponsors who  
11. will be next in line on 2nd reading, we will start where we  
12. left off yesterday and hopefully go right on through. I would  
13. announce for the benefit of the membership that having just  
14. conferred with Senator Shapiro and Senator...I mean...Rep-  
15. resentative Ryan, Speaker Ryan, I'm happy to inform you that  
16. Senator Shapiro and I hopefully will get you out of here  
17. by twelve or twelve-thirty. The Speaker intends to work until  
18. eleven o'clock tonight, reconvene and work tomorrow and re-  
19. convene and come in on Sunday. So, I commend you for the  
20. work you have done thus far and hopefully we can go home and  
21. enjoy the weekend. We have...I have a couple of technical matters.  
22. There are two rereferrals from the...as a result of...an error  
23. on my part on the Committee on Assignment of Bills. I'd ask  
24. leave of the Body to rerefer House Bill 260 from Judiciary II  
25. to Agriculture and House Bill 143 from Judiciary I to Trans-  
26. portation.

27.           PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28.           You've heard the motion. All in favor say Aye. Opposed  
29. Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion to transfer prevails.  
30. Senator Rock.

31.           SENATOR ROCK:

32.           Yes. Thank you. Under Rule 4, as you probably are aware,  
33. the House sponsor of a bill originating in the House may remove

1. or substitute or otherwise change the Senate sponsor by notifying  
2. the President in writing. I have received and wish to make  
3. official the fact that I have received three letters in writing  
4. from the House sponsors with respect to three House Bills re-  
5. questing a change in sponsorship. And I will, obviously, as  
6. I have in the past, honor those requests. House Bill 843, the...  
7. the request is for Marovitz hyphen Dawson. House Bill 895,  
8. Senator Buzbee is the requested Senate sponsor. And House  
9. Bill 1127, Senators D'Arco hyphen Nash are the requested  
10. sponsors. I would ask that the Secretary make the appropriate  
11. changes.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. For what purpose does Senator Rhoads arise?

14. SENATOR RHOADS:

15. A point...a question of Senator Rock. Senator, is there a  
16. time...a time frame on when those letters have to be filed or  
17. do we honor them at any time? For example, if a bill was  
18. already referred to committee, would it still be honored a  
19. week later?

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Senator Rock.

22. SENATOR ROCK:

23. We have in the past...unfortunately, some of the House  
24. members are not as aware of what goes on around here as we  
25. might like them to be and they catch up with things a little  
26. late. I have in the past, and unless it's some circum-  
27. stance that's unforeseen, I will certainly honor the re-  
28. quest of the House sponsor at any time.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Our rules don't reflect any time limit on that, Senator.  
31. It just says once received he shall transfer the sponsorship  
32. in the Senate. We...we had concluded business...we had con-  
33. cluded business...and we'll start again on Senate Bill 426.

1. And that is on page 7 of your Calendar. Senate Bill 426 is  
2. on the Order of 2nd reading. Senator...for what purpose does  
3. Senator Gitz arise?

4. SENATOR GITZ:

5. Well, in vein with Senator Rock's suggestion,...House  
6. Bill 373...Senator Philip wished to be the sponsor of that and  
7. I had given the Secretary a note and he said it had been  
8. read into the record. So I'd like it to reflect the sponsor-  
9. ship. And in...

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. Senator Gitz, what...what sponsorship on 373?

12. SENATOR GITZ:

13. Senator Philip.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Is that House Bill, Senate...

16. SENATOR GITZ:

17. House Bill.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Okay. And it should reflect Gitz as the sponsor?

20. SENATOR GITZ:

21. No, it should reflect...Philip. And on House Bill 1237,  
22. that should reflect Senator Maitland as sponsor.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. Alright. And...and you're shown as sponsor on both of  
25. those? Senator Gitz asks leave...to be removed as sponsor  
26. on House Bills 373 and 1237, and that 373 be shown as sponsor  
27. Philip and that 1227 House Bill be shown as Maitland sponsor.  
28. Is there leave? 1237. Is there leave? Leave is granted.

29. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

30. SENATOR ROCK:

31. Thank you...thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentle-  
32. men of the Senate. I made another mistake, on House Bill 843,  
33. I received a request from Representative Josephine Oblinger

1. with respect to the sponsorship of House Bill 843. It should  
2. be Senator John Davidson as the prime sponsor and Senator  
3. Marovitz as his hyphenated co-sponsor. Davidson-Marovitz on  
4. House Bill 843.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6. Alright. Our records will so reflect. For what purpose  
7. does Senator Geo-Karis arise?

8. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

9. On House Bill 69 the prime sponsor is Jerome Joyce. I  
10. would like to be added on as a sponsor with Senator Joyce.  
11. And he knows...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Senator, we normally don't add...you know...thirty or  
14. forty sponsors of a House Bill in the Senate. We...we have  
15. in the past not allowed that. Under special circumstances  
16. we have added a second sponsor as a hyphenated, but we...

17. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

18. Yes.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. ...normally don't go beyond one sponsor.

21. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

22. I believe you'll find that it's cleared with Senator  
23. Joyce as a hyphenated sponsor.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Fine. Is there leave? Leave is granted. For what  
26. purpose does Senator Grotberg arise?

27. SENATOR GROTBORG:

28. Thank you, Mr. President. I gather we're kind of...waiting  
29. till the group gets here, but regarding Senate Bill 423, yester-  
30. day when I moved it to...3rd, I meant to mention to everyone  
31. present this is a bill that I will still take back and amend  
32. if anybody has any ideas of what kind of printed material you  
33. don't want to see delivered in your home office or here. We can

17. Senate Bill 426.

18. (Secretary reads title of bill)

19. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary I offers  
20. one amendment.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Senator Geo-Karis.

23. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

24. Committee...l states specifically that corporations can  
25. invest or loan money if authorized to do so by its charter.  
26. And this has been common practice for years, but...recently  
27. it was noted that there wasn't specific...Statutory author-  
28. ization. I move for the passage of this amendment.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. On the motion,  
31. all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amend-

23. Senator Lemke to explain the amendment.

24. SENATOR LEMKE:

25. This...we have another amendment filed from the Floor.  
26. Just...replace...

27. SECRETARY:

28. You have two identical amendments. The committee...

29. SENATOR LEMKE:

30. The last amendment is supposed to be...the good amendment.

31. SECRETARY:

32. It's the one...with the underline. So do you want to  
33. Table Committee Amendment No. 1?

1. SENATOR LEMKE:

2. Yeah.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4. The motion is to Table Committee Amendment No. 1.

5. Discussion of the motion to Table? All in favor say Aye.

6. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1

7. is Tabled. Further committee amendments?

8. SECRETARY:

9. No further committee amendments.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

11. Are there amendments from the Floor?

12. SECRETARY:

13. Amendment No. 2, by Senator Lemke.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Senator Lemke.

16. SENATOR LEMKE:

17. Yeah. That is the only amendment from the Floor, right?

18. Okay. I move to adopt Amendment...No. 1...2...Amendment No.

19. 2.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. Discussion of  
22. the motion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.

23. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Are there further Floor amendments?

24. SECRETARY:

25. Amendment No. 3, by Senator Lemke. That's the one with  
26. the child multiplies, multiplied...

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. Senator Lemke.

29. SENATOR LEMKE:

30. I move to adopt...Amendment No. 3. This is a...a clarifi-  
31. cation amendment that clears up the multiplication of the...  
32. inheritance tax...

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1.           Alright. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 3. On  
2. the motion, all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes  
3. have it. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Are there further  
4. Floor amendments?

5.   SECRETARY:

6.           No further amendments.

7.   PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8.           3rd reading. Is there leave to...go back one bill to  
9. Senator Collins? She was in the phone booth. ...leave?  
10. Leave is granted. Senate Bill 433, Senator Collins. Read  
11. the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

13.           Senate Bill 433.

14.                   (Secretary reads title of bill)

15.           2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Elementary and  
16. Secondary Education offers one amendment.

17.   PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18.           Senator Collins to explain Committee Amendment No. 1.

19.   SENATOR COLLINS:

20.           Yes. Committee Amendment No. 1 was to make sure that the  
21. school districts were not liable for any parts of operation  
22. of this program.

23.   PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24.           The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Discussion  
25. of the motion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes  
26. have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Are there  
27. further committee amendments?

28.   SECRETARY:

29.           No further committee amendments.

30.   PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

31.           Are there amendments from the Floor?

32.   SECRETARY:

33.           No Floor amendments.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

2. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 445, Senator Ozinga. Read the  
3. bill, Mr. Secretary, please. For what purpose does Senator  
4. Ozinga arise?

5. SENATOR OZINGA:

6. Senator Rock asked to have this held last time it was up.  
7. I was wondering if he was satisfied. This is the...Audit  
8. Commission Amendment.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. I...I think the signal is to hold.

11. SENATOR OZINGA:

12. What?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. I think the signal is to hold, but Senator Rock is in the  
15. phone booth. We'll...hold it, Senator, if you would. Thank  
16. you. Senator Demuzio, 449. Farm development. 450, Senator  
17. Rupp. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

18. SECRETARY:

19. Senate Bill 450.

20. (Secretary reads title of bill)

21. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. No committee amendments. Are there amendments from  
24. the Floor?

25. SECRETARY:

26. No Floor amendments.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. 3rd reading. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 451, Senator  
29. Schaffer. Senate Bill 455...we'll be skipping all the  
30. Appropriation Bills, too, Gentlemen and Ladies. 455, Senator  
31. Philip. Senator Philip. I couldn't see your hand, Senator.  
32. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

33. SECRETARY:

1. Senate Bill 455.

2. (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Amendments from the Floor?

6. SECRETARY:

7. Amendment No. 1, by Senator Vadalabene.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. Senator Vadalabene to explain...Amendment No. 1.

10. SENATOR VADALABENE:

11. Yes. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.

12. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 455, and I've discussed this

13. amendment with Senator Pate Philip, and...my conversation

14. with him is that...I don't think he's in agreement with this

15. amendment. However, the Legislative Committee...of the Illinois

16. Association of Chiefs of Police endorses the amendment to

17. Senate Bill 455. This amendment would give law enforcement

18. officers, in full time employment,...law enforcement officers,

19. in full time employment, of the State of Illinois or any

20. political subdivision the right to use instruments which

21. utilize voice waves for detecting deception without having to

22. be licensed as a polygraph examiner. Now, the chiefs of police

23. in the different districts in the State of Illinois have been

24. doing an outstanding job with this method. And to have licensed

25. polygraph detectors or examiners come in would be an additional

26. cost burden and also it would hamper the good job that the

27. chiefs of police throughout the State of Illinois are doing.

28. And all they are asking, in this amendment, for them to continue

29. to do what has been a successful practice. And I move for the

30. adoption of this amendment.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 455.

33. On that motion, is there discussion? Senator Philip.

1. SENATOR PHILIP:

2. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
3. Senate. And I have...I want to thank Senator Sam for his  
4. courtesy, but I might say this,...that trying to use a person's  
5. voice to determine whether they're telling the truth or not  
6. telling the truth is,...quite frankly, not a good practice.  
7. It's not a sound practice, there is no special education involved,  
8. no special qualifications involved. I certainly would resist  
9. this amendment. It's not a good amendment and I would ask  
10. the Senate...to turn this amendment down and...I'd ask for a  
11. roll call, Mr. President.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13. Is there discussion? Senator Collins.

14. SENATOR COLLINS:

15. A question of the sponsor, please.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17. Senator...indicates he will yield. Senator Collins.

18. SENATOR COLLINS:

19. Yes, Senator Vadalabene, what...for what purpose would  
20. they use the information?

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22. Senator Vadalabene.

23. SENATOR VADALABENE:

24. To see whether the person who is...is being tested, is  
25. telling the truth or not.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Senator Collins.

28. SENATOR COLLINS:

29. And...you are saying that you wouldn't want them to be  
30. trained or licensed to do that?

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32. Senator Vadalabene.

33. SENATOR VADALABENE:

1. Those who already having...these in use are already trained  
2. and licensed and there's no additional cost to our cities or  
3. to our counties.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

5. Senator Collins.

6. SENATOR COLLINS:

7. Then I don't understand what...what the problem is if  
8. they are already licensed,...

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senator Collins.

11. SENATOR COLLINS:

12. Trained by who?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Senator Vadalabene.

15. SENATOR VADALABENE:

16. They have...been trained by the people who have installed  
17. these devices into these different areas of the State of Illinois.  
18. What Senator...Pate Philip is doing, he wants to have this  
19. group who has these detectors...be...have sole control and  
20. have a licensing procedure so that they can sell this equip-  
21. ment and also come in and have their own people give these  
22. testings. Our chiefs of police have their own...their own  
23. staff and their own people who can give this without any cost.  
24. All we're doing is letting some association or some group...  
25. I forget...I don't know the name of the testing groups...and  
26. ...they're taking that authority away from our local police  
27. and giving it to someone else is the way I understand it.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Further discussion? Further discussion? Senator Philip,  
30. second time.

31. SENATOR PHILIP:

32. I...I'm sorry, Mr. President, but at...at the present  
33. time polygraph examiners are licensed by the State. They have

1. to have a college degree, they have to pass a test. What  
2. he is including, now...he wants to include with his amendment,  
3. is anybody who is a police officer, and you could...you don't  
4. even have to graduate from high school to be a police officer,  
5. to include them in regards to determining by voice...by voice  
6. whether you're telling the truth or not. And...and, quite  
7. frankly, it's...it's a...it's not dependable, it's not accurate  
8. and...we should not include this...in the bill.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. Senator Vadalabene may close the debate.

11. SENATOR VADALABENE:

12. Yes. All I want to say is that Senator Pate Philip is  
13. wanting to do the same thing that we're doing, only thing is

28. ...the reporting of the act, they go ahead and report to DLE, but  
29. it may report to the parent. Lacking this amendment, what the  
30. parent would find out...how he would find out about drug abuse  
31. involving his child is by a Sheriff knocking on the door saying  
32. here's a warrant for your child's arrest for drug abuse. It seems  
33. infinitely reasonable to say that school personnel may notify



1. the parent if they wish, that their child has been involved in  
2. drug usage. I know of no objection to the amendment.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Further discussion? Senator Bruce has moved the adoption  
5. of Amendment No. 4 to Senate Bill 865. If there's no further  
6. discussion, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed.  
7. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

8. SECRETARY:

9. Amendment No. 5 by Senator Bruce.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Bruce.

12. SENATOR BRUCE:

13. This amendment is designed to protect the identity of the  
14. student who voluntarily reports his own drug problem to a nurse,  
15. a counselor, or a teacher. By this amendment, students will be  
16. able to seek help from school personnel without any requirement  
17. that the school personnel report their efforts as self-help. It  
18. will allow the reporting of the incident of the drug usage to  
19. the Department of Law Enforcement, that would continue. They  
20. testified they wanted a statistical base, that would still go  
21. on, but it would protect the indentity of the student. It does  
22. not apply to non-student users, to dealers, or anyone else who  
23. operates on the school premises. It just says that if a person  
24. comes in and voluntarily says, I would like to have help from  
25. the school, they would report him, but they would not have to  
26. report his name.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Bruce has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 5 to  
29. Senate Bill 865. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify  
30. by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment...  
31. Senator DeAngelis, I'm sorry.

32. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

33. I'm sorry, Mr. President, I was trying to get a copy of the

1. amendment. Can I still ask a question, or...

2. PRESIDENT:

3. You certainly may.

4. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

5. Senator Bruce, what happens if there were to be a massive  
6. voluntary...voluntary turn in of all drug users in a particular  
7. school with this particular amendment?

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Bruce.

10. SENATOR BRUCE:

11. I think that that would be a great occurrence. If every  
12. student using drugs in the State of Illinois would voluntarily  
13. come forward and say that I, John Smith, am using drugs on the  
14. school grounds, we would be going a long way toward solving the  
15. drug problems in the State of Illinois. All this bill says, is  
16. that if you voluntarily submit your name, they don't have to sub-  
17. mit your name by identity to the DLE. But they will continue  
18. to give you the statistical base. I think it would be a great thing  
19. if they would all report.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator DeAngelis.

22. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

23. Well, I...I would agree with you, that if they turned them-  
24. selves in, in order to do something with themselves, but if they  
25. turn...turn themselves in for the purpose..and as I read this,  
26. essentially what you're doing, you're not only immunizing your-  
27. self against it, but you're remaining anonymous as well.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Senator Bruce.

30. SENATOR BRUCE:

31. Absolutely not. There...there is no immunity whatsoever  
32. having once disclosed that you are a drug user. Contained in  
33. this bill, all it says is, that...they still have to disclose the

1. fact that a report was made, the student voluntarily came in,  
2. and all of that will still...oh, sure. And DLE will be able to  
3. post their...their supervisors and other people on the school  
4. grounds. The...the whole operation of the Act comes into effect,  
5. absolutely there is no change with the Act. Once the student  
6. voluntarily...he's subject to prosecution like any other admitted  
7. criminal.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator DeAngelis.

10. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

11. With all due respect, Senator Bruce, I know your legal  
12. abilities are far greater than mine, but it says nothing contained  
13. herein shall require the reporting of the identity of any student  
14. who voluntarily reports, and then the second part it says, however, the  
15. identity of any person described in Section 3 of this Act, shall  
16. not be contained in any report required or permitted by this Act.  
17. Now, please tell me, if nobody's going to turn that in, and  
18. nobody even knows who it is, how in the heck...you are not im-  
19. munizing that person.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Senator Bruce.

22. SENATOR BRUCE:

23. You have to submit the report. The Department of Law En-  
24. forcement, the Director came and testified before our committee,  
25. that the major purpose, the major purpose for this bill was to  
26. create a statistical base upon which they could allocate manpower  
27. to stop drug abuse. They...they testified that it was not to  
28. catch individual students, but to find out exactly what the  
29. problem of drug abuse was, and where, in fact, it was occurring  
30. This bill will allow the student to voluntarily say, I'm using  
31. drugs. It does not in any way stop the...the absolute mandate  
32. upon school personnel to report that incident. They must, they  
33. must report the incident. They just don't put in the name of the

1. student. That's the only difference. It says we've had X number  
2. of...a student comes in voluntarily saying he's using these  
3. drugs and submit it to the DLE. It has to...all the other  
4. provisions of the Act apply, everyone of them. And you could  
5. still...there is no immunity in this amendment at all, you  
6. can still be arrested, you can still be prosecuted, there is  
7. absolutely no prohibition against prosecution and conviction.  
8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator DeAngelis.

10. SENATOR DeANGELIS:

11. Well, I'm not going to belabor the point. But, if you  
12. do not require the reporting of the identity of the student,  
13. I don't know...well, that's what it says, Senator Bruce. Oh.  
14. I don't know how you're going to accomplish what you say  
15. you're trying to accomplish by putting this amendment in. I...  
16. I just don't see it. I'm sorry.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Further discussion regarding Amendment No. 5 Senator  
19. Maitland.

20. SENATOR MAITLAND:

21. Not on that issue, no.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Thomas.

24. SENATOR THOMAS:

25. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Bruce, I appreciate your  
26. taking the time to bring the amendments by my desk, there have  
27. been other members on the Floor, however, wish that they would  
28. have had copies of this amendment as well. Are they being, or  
29. currently being circulated to...to the entire Body?

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Berman.

32. SENATOR BERMAN:

33. Well, on the question of other amendments, Senator Thomas

1. and I have discussed, along with Senator Bruce and others some

 7. adopts an ordinance which is at least within the range of this

5. My understanding...and I...I'd have to check again, I  
6. think we had already taken care of the fiscal provisions with  
7. Senator Donnewald. It turns out this one thousand dollar  
8. minimum has no effect because the problem is there's nothing  
9. that cheap. And it was put in because it matched...I think  
10. it was the farm machinery one. We're now taking it out because  
11. there isn't a printing press in the world that costs less than  
12. a thousand dollars. That was the reason it was removed, because  
13. it's just superfluous. Yeah...

17. ...that's what the line...line 13 or 14 had to do with

1. Further announcements? Any further business to come  
2. before the Senate? Senator Marovitz.

3. SENATOR MAROVITZ:

4. Thank you, Mr. President. I would ask leave of the  
5. Senate to add Senator Sangmeister as hyphenated cosponsor  
6. to Senate Bill 1051.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Grotberg.

9. SENATOR GROTBERG:

10. Thank you, Mr. President. On the Order of Resolutions,  
11. when the Secretary comes to Resolution 168, I would like to  
12. have it read with leave of the Body.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Senator, they've already gone, they're out of our  
15. hands.

16. SENATOR GROTBERG:

17. When did we do that?

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. About five minutes ago.

20. SENATOR GROTBERG:

21. Well, gee whiz, Mr. President, may I have a moment of  
22. your time?

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. Well, if...if you want...if you want to read it, if it's  
25. a good one, we...

26. SENATOR GROTBERG:

27. No, I won't read it, it just memorializes National  
28. Pickle Week, which starts next week and I think...

29. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30. Well, thank you...we would hate to have had to miss...

31. SENATOR GROTBERG:

32. Well, if...if you want to talk, ask leave, otherwise  
33. let me talk, Mr. President. You know, we started this week

1. on a serious note, I thought it would be nice to end it on  
2. a serious note, as God intended, it's been a tough week.  
3. And Pickle Week runs two weeks, it doesn't, you know, there's  
4. one day for Mother's Day, but two weeks for pickles and Saint  
5. Charles, the Pickle Capital of the World, invented that big  
6. pickle that every year gets given away by the Press Association.  
7. We want you to know that big pickles have now had little pickles  
8. and that we have a fiscal pickle. And I am now taking nominations  
9. to anybody...this one will travel only in the Senate of the  
10. State of Illinois. And nominations are now open for next week  
11. and the second week of Pickle Week, so everybody has in a  
12. ...democratic manner, options to tell me who you think should  
13. get the fiscal pickle of the year in the State Senate of Illinois.  
14. And the nominations will be open all week and I'll get back  
15. to you next time we close. Thank you, very much. Have a  
16. nice Pickle Week.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Thank you, Senator, your Pickle Week Resolution was  
19. for ten days, we were already confused about that. Senator Geo-Karis.  
20. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

21. All I can say, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of  
22. the Senate, that Senator Grotberg is in a pickle of a mess.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24. All right. Any further business to come before the Senate?  
25. Senator Shapiro says...Senator Rock.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the  
28. Senate. Before we place the motion to adjourn until Monday  
29. at the hour of noon, I would again encourage everyone to try  
30. to be here so that we can begin on time. We have, as you can plainly  
31. see an enormous amount of work to be done. And finally, in  
32. closing, I received a communication just this morning in which  
33. I was asked to please convey to the distinguished members of

6. All right. Any further business...Senator Johns.

7. SENATOR JOHNS:

8. Senator Bruce, Mr. President, you and I talked yesterday.  
9. For the...just for general information of the Senators, Represen-  
10. tative Don Brummett passed away about a week ago. Many of us  
11. wasn't aware of it, I just wanted to make you aware of it  
12. and ask for a moment of silent...reverence in his behalf.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Have a moment of silence for former State Representative  
15. Don Brummett who passed away on Monday of this week. Senator  
16. Rock moves that the Senate stand adjourned until noon on  
17. May 20...May 18th, at the hour of noon. All in favor say  
18. Aye. Opposed Nay. The Senate Stands adjourned.

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
