     we're giving up a great many prerogatives of the General
12.
      Assembly over the setting the salaries of these Executive

      Branch individuals. While it might make some sense to say
14.
      that we can't vote objectively or dispassionate on our own
15.
      salaries, it seems to me that one of the jobs that we're
16.
      elected to do is to set the salaries of these members of
17.
      the Executive Branch, and I see no reason for it. And there-

      fore I rise in strong opposition and urge a No vote.

      SENATOR BERMAN:
22.
           Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
23.
      Senate. I rise in support of this Conference Committee Report.
24.
      Because of the...problems of gathering together the information
25.
      necessary, this amendment was not offered when the Compensation
26.
      Review Board Senate Bill 269 was before this Body. If this
27.
      had been before us, we would have offered it, as we did several
28.
      other amendments, to add or delete inclusions to the bill as
29.
      it passed in Senate Bill 269. The people included in this
30.
      Conference Committee Report are members of the Executive Branch
31.
      of State Government. Their posts, their responsibilities,
32.
      their duties, do not differ in...in principal from the other
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dozen or so members of the Executive Branch that we've already

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- 1. included in that bill. You know, we put a lot of amendments 2. on and people say, well these are technical changes. Well 3. let me...submit to you that these are technical additions. 4. These are people that the Governor has requested be included in the Compensation Review Board. And the purposes of that 5. board and the bill that we passed out of here, was to allow 6. public input in a blue ribbon commission to evaluate, by 7. five criteria, the duties that these people have. And I ġ. would suggest to you that the inclusion of these people in 9. that board makes more sense to include them in the...Compensation 10. Review Board Bill than to keep them out. Because too often, 11. many of us don't know the intricacies, the responsibilities, 12. the merit of the positions that these people hold. And yet, 13. this board will be holding public hearings, and will hear public 14. testimony, and will make recommendations which we will be the 15. ultimate deciders upon, in our vote, as to whether their 16. salaries should be increased or decreased. So, I would submit 17. to you that if this is the request of the Governor of the people 18. that he thinks should be included within the review of that... 19. twelve member blue ribbon Compensation Review Board, that we 20. ought to accede to his wishes and let the board review the 21. criteria of these people, just as they will of the Legislators, 22. of the judges and of other members of the Executive Branch. 23. And we will be the final word as to whether there are increases 24. or any changes in their salaries. I urge an Aye vote. 25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 26. Further discussion? Senator...Gitz. 27. SENATOR GITZ: 28. Well, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I don't
- Well, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I don't
 recall rising on this bill, on per diem, on the pension, on
 any other of these so-called hot potatoes that has come before
 the Body. But, I'm going to rise on this one, because I'm a little
 bit concerned. We are representing the fact that because of

      whatever that means. And I submit to you that we've heard all
8.
      day, in fact, the last forty-eight hours, about Christmas trees.
9.
      This is the Christmas tree to give away the General Assembly's,
10.
      not the right, but their obligation, to look at what directors
11.
      and assistant directors and boards and commissions and chairmans
12.
      should be paid. And if we are so incompetent and so cavalier
13.
      that we don't want to take that responsibility, then I don't
14.
      think we should be in business at all. Why should we take what
15.
     was alleged to be a board of proper and necessary addition,
16.
     and now, virtually expand it to everything in State Government
17.
     because the convenience, because it's the eleventh hour and
18.
     because the Governor wants this technical addition. This
19.
      is probably one of the reasons why many of us have been so
20.
      skeptical of this in the very beginning. It's up to, obviously,

      all of us that are still here to decide what to do, but I would

     urge everyone to think kind of long and carefully before

      I echo what both Senator Rhoads and Senator Gitz has added.

      If you think some of the department heads are arrogant now,
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can you imagine their arrogance and nonresponsiveness to the

General Assembly into the electorate of this State once you

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turn over the setting of salaries to a nonelected pay commission?

     We're never going to have any type of responsiveness to our
2.
     constituency. We are totally abrogating our legislative
3.
      responsibility and authority by setting the salaries, by setting
4.
      the salaries of those people that work in State Government.
5.
      There have been many on the Floor that have complained about
6.
      the AFSCME contracts, they've complained about other contracts,
7.
      but to vote for this Conference Committee on House Bill 547 is
 8.
      doing just the same thing, only worse, on a larger magnitude.
 9.
      There have been many times, in order to get responsiveness out
10.
      of departments, to get the responsiveness to respond to our
11.
      constituencies, it has taken the action of the Legislature,
12.
      in some cases, to reduce those salary levels to one dollar.
13.
      I remember a couple of years ago in Public Health, where one
14.
      individual had to be reduced to a nominal sum of a dollar,
15.
      in order to see that his services were no longer needed by the
16.
      State because of his incompetence in State Government. But
17.
      if you allow this pay commission to set those...salaries and
18.
      give away our legislative responsibilities, we're going to
19.
      be working for them instead of they working for us. We ought
20.
      to defeat this.

           I thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
15.
      Senate, I rise in support of the bill. And, you know, it...it's
16.
      fun to listen to this pocket populism once in a while
17.
      but let's get on with the business. When we're talking about...
18.
      this, number one, gives us some public input. For the first
19.
      time, you have a little bit of outside advice on salaries.
20.
      You know, we pay our Executive Branch garbage, you cannot get
21.
      some of the top executives we need to serve at these salary
22.
      levels. You see it constantly, we've got some good people, but
23.
      we could get a lot better if you started paying comparable to
24.
      the outside world. Our problem is, we're dealing in...at times,
25.
      a small fishbowl dominated by a few friends who own a couple of pens.
26.
      And what we're saying is, maybe we should get some advice from
27.
      the outside community, as to what is reasonable compensation to
28.
      make sure that we do...pay the senior State employees at...at an
29.
      adequate level. And to say we we don't vote on it, simply is
30.
      not accurate, of course we vote on it. This comes back to us
31.
      and then we have to finalize the report, whether or not we
32.
      accept it. So, it's easy to sail these things, but what we're
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saying is, for the first time the public has input and we still

- 1. vote and let's get a little outside advice, so at least we start
- 2. setting salaries at levels to draw the caliber of people we
- 3. need. I think we ought to vote Yes.
- 4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
- 5. Senator Netsch.
- 6. SENATOR NETSCH:
- 7. Thank you, Mr. President. I did not support the creation
- 8. of the Compensation Board, but obviously it is going to become
- 9. law and if it becomes law, there certainly is some justification
- 10. for including the top executive officials. But the problem
- 11. is, that this includes a great deal more than that. And I
- 12. would call attention to the fact, for example, there is one
- 13. group of employees, I assume they are members of the Police
- Merit Board, who shall receive the sum of a hundred and twenty-
- 15. five dollars per day, or whatever compensation is set by ... the
- 16. Review Board. That is a per diem kind of allowance. It is
- 17. not the same thing as allowing a Compensation Review Board
- 18. to decide the salary of the Director of the Department of Law
- Enforcement, which might be defensible. In addition, it includes
- the Chief Factory Inspector, the Superintendent of Safety
- 20. Inspection, and so on and so on. If there is a defensible
- 21. Inspection, and so on and so on. If there is a detension
- 22. element for the major executive officials, it is not in
- 23. this Conference Committee Report.

- 30. cases. The major executives of State Government are included

- obstacles to paying higher pay for other officers is that we
- cannot pay them more than the Governor. Well, he's going to
- 34. be raised, probably, with this pay commission. But I think

the biggest difficulty that we have with the proposal that is 1 before us in this Conference Committee Report is that the 2. original commission did not provide for dividing the question. 3 Now, we're going to have all the salary increases that were 4 in the original proposal that we passed, plus all the others 5. that are going to be added here, and you're going to have to vote on one report, period. There is no mechanism or 7. provision in the legislation to divide the guestion.
