PRESIDENT:

PRESIDENT:

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

Senator Kent.

SENATOR KENT:

Yes, I'd like to make a motion or move to suspend the appropriate rules so we can consider this.

PRESIDENT:

If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Senator Vadalabene, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, on a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT:

State...state your point, sir.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

As you well know, there are many township officials across the State of Illinois that are here in the Springfield Capitol to witness some of the legislation that's going on today, and they are also having their conference. To the rear in the gallery here, there are quite a few township officials, and I would like particularly those from Madison

County to stand up and be recognized.

PRESIDENT:

Would our guests of township officials please stand and be recognized. Welcome to Springfield. If I can have the attention of the membership, the Chair will yield to Senator Kent.

SENATOR KENT:

Thank you. It gives me great pleasure to introduce to the Senate the second place girls champions from the Class A State Tournament. The coach is Vicky Green, they are from Rushville, they are the Rushville Rockets. Their record this year was twenty-nine and three, and they are just a super group of girls. May I introduce to you, the Rushville Rockets.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. Message from the Governor.

SECRETARY:

A Message for the Governor by John Washburn, Director of Legislative Affairs.

Mr. President - The Governor directs me to lay before the Senate the following Message.

To the Honorable members of the Senate, the 83rd General Assembly, I have nominated and appointed the following named persons to the offices enumerated below and respectfully ask concurrence in and confirmation of these appointments by your Honorable Body.

PRESIDENT:

Committee on Executive Appointments. Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KELLY:

Mr. President, I'd like to get leave of the Senate to have Senate Bill 694 transferred from the Executive Committee to the Judiciary II Committee. This bill was under review during the last Session by Senator Sangmeister, and he is chairman of Judiciary II. I have discussed this with him and with Senator Egan, who is the chairman of the Executive, and they both would concur on that. So, I would like to ask leave of this Body to have that accomplished.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Kelly has moved to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of Senate Bill 694 and asked that the bill be re-referred to the Committee of Judiciary II. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. It's so ordered. Senator Keats, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KEATS:

Thank you, Mr. President. I rise and I ask that Senate

Bill 423 be discharged from the Revenue Committee to be put into Labor and Commerce. I've talked to Senator Collins and I've talked to Senator Netsch. There is no problems with it, and I would request the approval of the Senate.

PRESIDENT:

There is objection. Senator Grotberg, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

Point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT:

Yes, if we can get some order, you may state your point. May we have some order.

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

My point is that right above...

PRESIDENT:

Senator Grothberg, wait just a minute. May we have some order. If need be, we can clear the staff off the Floor. We have more staff than members it appears. May we have some order, and if the staff has any conferences, would they please take them off the Floor. Senator Grotberg.

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

...thank you, Mr. President, and I respect highly your getting the attention of the Body for me because it impresses the dickens out of the people just above your head from Kendall County. The supervisors...township supervisors of Kendall County, Mr. Lament and...and all of the crowd, and we'll welcome them to the Body.

PRESIDENT:

Will our guests in the gallery please stand and be recognized. Welcome to Springfield. Senator Zito, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would ask leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated chief sponsor of Senate Bill 942.

I have permission from the sponsor.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Collins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR COLLINS:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I rise to Table Senate Bill 1215. It was filed by mistake under my name.

PRESIDENT:

Where...where is...where does the bill now reside, may I ask?

SENATOR COLLINS:

I don't even know where it's resided. Someone called it to my attention this morning, and I...

PRESIDENT:

Senator Collins moves to discharge the Committee on Judiciary I from further consideration of Senate Bill 1215 for the purpose of Tabling. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is now discharged. Senator Collins now moves to Table Senate Bill 1-2-1-5, 1215. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is Tabled. Senator Marovitz, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, Mr. President. Having checked with the appropriate parties, I would move to discharge the Committee on Executive from consideration of House Bill 1311 and have the bill re-referred to the Committee on Revenue.

PRESIDENT:

Well, that...that's a House bill, can we hold off on House bills?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

No, no, Senate Bill 1311.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Marovitz has moved to discharge the

Committee on Executive from further consideration of Senate Bill 1311 and asks that that bill be re-referred to the Committee on Revenue. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries, and it's so ordered, 1311. Senator Grothberg, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GROTHEERG:

I rise to Table a bill, Senator...Mr. President.

PRESIDENT:

That is always in order.

SENATOR GROTHEERG:

Always in order. Senate Bill No. 920, a duplicate filing. I request that it be Tabled. 920.

PRESIDENT:

Where is it residing currently?

SENATOR GROTHEERG:

It is residing currently in Insurance and Pensions.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Grothberg has moved to discharge the Committee on Insurance and Pensions and Licensed Activities from further consideration of Senate Bill 920 for the purpose of Tabling. All in favor of the motion to discharge indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The bill is discharged. Senator Grothberg now moves to Table Senate Bill 920. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries, the bill is Tabled. Senator Savickas, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Yes, Mr. President, I move to have Senate Bill 423 re-assigned from the Committee on Revenue to the Committee on Labor and Commerce.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Sangmeister, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

While there's a little lull, as you know, there are a lot of township officials down here and I'm sure we all get some down here, and I have some from various townships. Right now in the President's gallery are the township supervisor from Lockport Township, and the assessor and a lot of the other officials from Lockport Township in the garden spot of the State, Will County. And I'd like them to rise and be recognized by the Senate.

PRESIDENT:

Will our guests from Will County please stand and be recognized. Welcome to Springfield. Turn to Page 2 on the Calendar. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading. Senator...Senator Joyce on the Floor? Senator Netsch on the Floor? On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 66. 87 is a hold. 123, Senator Berman. 139, Senator Zito. 149. 176, Senator Schaffer. 182, Senator Joyce. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 182. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 182.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Joyce on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 is a clarifying amendment that was asked for by the Department of Agriculture.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Joyce has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 182. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 195, Senator Jones. 209, Senator D'Arco. 239, Senator Darrow. 245, Senator D'Arco. 272, Senator Kustra. 279, Senator Buzbee. 280, Senator Buzbee. 284, Senator Smith. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, the top of Page 3, is House Bill 284. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 284.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Labor and Commerce offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Smith on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment addresses some of the problems that came up in committee. This Senate bill...

PRESIDENT:

284.

SENATOR SMITH:

...this is a format that was adopted in committee, and...thank you.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Smith has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 284. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2, by Senator Smith.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH:

This amendment addresses some of the problems that came up in committee. My intention with this bill was to ensure that those handicapped persons, especially...usually impaired are paid the same wages for work done under the same or similar conditions. This amendment strengthens the language affecting handicapped workers, and my intention was not to hurt any handicapped person or group. This amendment reflects that. This amendment will restore all of Section 5 and 10 and leave the prohibition of discrimination on the basis of sex, age, mental or physical handicap.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Smith has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 284. Any discussion? Senator Weaver.

SENATOR WEAVER:

I wasn't in committee but I've had some correspondence, Senator Smith, about paying less than minimum wage, and if they were not able to, probably ninety-five percent of the people in this rehabilitation center would be out of a job. Does this allow them to pay less than minimum? Thank you.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Smith has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 284. Any further discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 285, Senator Smith. 304, Senator Demuzio. 305, Senator Dawson. 322, Senator Sangmeister. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 322. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 322.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 335, Senator Kustra. 337, Senator Hudson. 338, Senator Berman. 341, Senator Darrow. On the Order of...Senate Bills 2nd Reading, the bottom of Page 3, is Senate Bill 341. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 341.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Darrow, Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR DARROW:

Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1

merely eliminates Cook County from the affect of this bill. This is somewhat of a pilot project, and so we thought we'd start with this...with the State of Illinois excluding Cook County.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Darrow has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 341. Discussion? Senator Mahar.

SENATOR MAHAR:

Thank you, Mr. President. I rise in objection to this particular amendment because I think that the bill is permissive, and while it may have some merit, the fact that it takes out Cook County, which is a major portion of the bill, it's going to destroy the bill. It seems to me that the bill is being destroyed by the fact that Cook County is being taken out of it, 'cause that's where a great deal of the unemployment is. And if there's ninety-nine counties with over ten percent, Cook County is a major portion that we should be included. So, I would object to this amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Further discussion? Senator Darrow has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 341. Roll call has been requested. Members please be in their seats. Senator Darrow, you wish to close?

SENATOR DARROW:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. What this amendment does is eliminate Cook County from the affects of the bill. The bill itself allows the county board to...to allow some tax relief in counties where there is ten percent or more unemployment. It's somewhat of a pilot project. Cook County is a very complexed area with a number of units of local government. We felt it best to start downstate. It's that...for that reason that we have offered this amendment in committee. I would ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Darrow has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 341. A roll call has been requested. Those in favor of the amendment will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 27, the Nays are 23, none voting Present. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Top of Page 4, 354, Senator D'Arco. 365, Senator Marovitz. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, the top of Page 4, Senate Bill 365. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 365.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary I offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Marovitz on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I would move to Table Committee Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 365. We have a substitute amendment that is being offered, it is Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Marovitz has moved to Table Committee

Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 365. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Marovitz.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, very much, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I would move that the members do adopt Senate Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 365. It takes out school psychologists, that is not intended to be in this bill, they are not qualified to treat the kind of...for the kind of treatment for crime victims that...that is anticipated here, and I...I would ask that Amendment No. 2 be adopted. Just taking out school psychologists, leaving in registered clinical psychologists and certified social workers.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Marovitz has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 365. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Senator D'Arco, on your series of bills...507, Senator Luft. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, the bottom of Page 4, Senate Bill 507. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 507.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 511, Senator Darrow. 514, Senator Netsch. 526, Senator Nedza. 532, Senator Luft. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, top of Page 5, Senate Bill 532. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 532.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 537, Senator Holmberg. 568, Senator Holmberg. On...on the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 568, do you wish the bill read? Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 568.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Insurance, Pensions and Licensed Activities offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Holmberg on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I wish to Table the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Holmberg has moved to Table Committee Amendment No. 1. Any discussion? Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

I, you know, was under the impression that we adopted that committee amendment in good faith. Now, if she wants to Table it, maybe she can discuss it with me and work it out.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator Davidson. Alright. Well, why don't we just take it out of the record and then we can...I understand that, just...it's always good that...we'll take it out of the record for the moment. With leave of the Body, we can get back to it once you get the matter straightened out. 571, Senator Fawell. 576, Senator Joyce. 582, Senator Bloom. 583, Senator Berman. 586, Senator Vadalabene. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, the bottom of Page 5, is Senate Bill 586. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 586.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Now that Senators Fawell and Netsch have returned to their respective chairs, we can get back to their business. 571, Senator Fawell, you wish that read? On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 571. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 571.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Fawell.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Fawell on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you, sir. All this amendment does...it's...it...it's a cleanup language that the Press Association asked me to put in. All it says is, "Such book or pamphlet shall not relieve a county board of a county with a population of six hundred thousand or more from publication of notices as otherwise required by Statute or court order." That's all it is.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Fawell has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 571. Any discussion? Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Yes, if the Senator would yield to a question.

PRESIDENT:

Indicates she'll yield, Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

How many counties does this apply to?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Yours and mine, sir. Cook County and DuPage.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Thank you, Mr. President. If I may, I...I would like to know why we're just excluding DuPage and Cook from this great bill if it's such...such a great bill, why don't we do it for

everybody?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

This is a bill that was requested by the county board. All it is trying to do is, we are...we have a number of attorneys in our county that have been playing games. Every time we have a...a...an ordinance that is brought up in court, we have to run our county clerk and a half a dozen other people to prove that this is indeed an ordinance. All we're saying is, that if this ordinance is published that, indeed, according to the courts it's de facto that it is a...an ordinance of the county. That's all it is. I have talked to Roy Sandquist and he has absolutely no problem with the...with the bill.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Well, I'd be concerned why Senator Fawell wanted to include Cook County, which obviously doesn't have this problem that we know of. If she has this problem, why not just make it relative to her own county?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

This is permissive legislation, it doesn't say that you have to do it. The county board can decide whether they want to do it or not.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Well, if it's permissive for our two counties, why not make it permissive for the whole hundred and one counties?

PRESIDENT:

It's already been done.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Thank you. Secondly, I want to announce a Republican caucus immediately after adjournment. Please come in immediately, we'll be cut in less than a half an hour so committee can start on time. In Senator "Fate's"...Philip's office, immediately on adjournment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Zito, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR ZITO:

For an announce...for an announcement, Mr. President, that Local Government Committee will meet at 2 p.m. in Room A-1 of the Stratton Building.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Savickas, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Mr. President, I rise for the purpose of reassigning some

bills. I would move that the Committee on Local Government be discharged from further consideration of Senate Bill 1203 and ask that the bill be re-referred to the Committee on Revenue. Also, that the...I would move that Senate Bill 543 in the Committee on Judiciary I be discharged from further consideration and ask that it...it be reassigned to the Transportation Committee. Also, on the Senate Bill 1331 that it be discharged from further consideration of the Insurance Committee and be reassigned to the Committee on Revenue. Senate Bill 1159 be discharged from further consideration of the Executive Committee and re-referred to the Committee on Agriculture. And that Senate Bill 905 be discharged from further consideration of Jud. I and be reassigned to the Executive Committee.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, you've heard the motion. Senate Bill 1203 from Local Government to Revenue; 543 from Jud. I to Transportation; 1331 from Insurance to Revenue; 1159 from Executive to Agriculture and 905 from Jud. I to Exec. Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

1331, from Insurance to Transportation. I think I heard it say from Insurance to Revenue. It should be Insurance to Transportation on 1331.

PRESIDENT:

1331, I beg your pardon, from Insurance to Transportation. You've heard the motion. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motions carry, and it's so ordered. Senator Collins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR COLLINS:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President, for the purpose of announcement. I would like to announce that the Prairie State Two Thousand package of bills listed for tomorrow will be heard next Wednesday, May 4th, at 10 a.m. in Room A-1. We

will hear all of those bills at the same time. As a matter of fact, the committee hearing will focus on those Prairie State Two Thousand bills.

PREESIDENT:
