PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Johns.

SENATOR JOHNS:

Thank you, Mr. President. I move that the Journal just read by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Resolution Consent Calendar. The Senate will be at ease for a few minutes. Senator Bruce...for what reason does Senator Carroll arise?

SENATOR CARROLL:

Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the

Senate, on a point, I guess, of personal privilege. If I could have your attention for a moment. Today is an important day in Illinois' history. In addition to Audrey Hepburn's birthday, there are several illuminaries of Illinois' history who share this day of birth. Such greats as our Attorney General, Neil Hartigan, such fund-raisers of fame as W. Clement Stone and Charles Swibel, all share this day of birth. In addition, two of our own members...yes, and Clem Stone, one on each side, okay...we thought, to be fair, one from each side, Jerry. In addition, two of our members share this day of birth, and in order of age and seniority and number of days they have enjoyed this day, we celebrate with Senator Arthur Berman and President Phil Rock on their respective birthdays.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Congratulations. Senator Bruce, did you want to make an announcement?

SENATOR CARROLL:

Cake in the corner.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Cake in the corner. Right over here.

SENATOR CARROLL:

From Clem and Chuckie, I think.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. On the assumption that we will be adjourning so that committees can begin at two o'clock, the Revenue Committee is set to begin at two o'clock, and we will be beginning in terms of the new bills with Senator Philip's two proposals of the Governor's, the gas tax bill and the liquor tax. I did want to make clear one other thing, I'm not sure this is necessary, but there are a couple of bills that had been set earlier in Revenue Committee and

the sponsors were not available to get there to call them, and...they have an opportunity to present them this afternoon if they so choose. They include Senate Bills 99, 889, 1125 and, I think, 667, just so that the record is clear. Your bill is reposted already, Senator Hall, 542 I believe it was, that was reposted at your request so that's on the list. These, I believe, are not on the list which is why I just simply wanted to mention them. They had been set for Monday and we simply didn't get around to them, so they will be heard today.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Thank you...they've already been set so we don't have to list them. Thank you. Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Before we adjourn, and we will be adjourning until nine o'clock tomorrow morning. And I would remind the membership, nine o'clock tomorrow morning we have a Committee of the Whole for the purpose of hearing a very important piece of legislation. In the meantime, I have placed with the Secretary a motion in writing of a...concerning a subject matter that is of some importance, it is Senate Bill 1081. This is the bill, as...as I am sure you are aware, that would call for our State to enter into or be part of the Midwest Compact with respect to the disposal of hazardous and nuclear waste. This, frankly, is not a subject matter at this moment that we are prepared to deal with, it is of great importance to the administration and I am asking to suspend the rules and afford our committee, both the Chairman and the Minority Spokesman have agreed, I'm told, the opportunity to...to speak with the other states that are involved. So we will take it up next week or the week after or whenever the committee gets to it. But I am asking to suspend the rules for that purpose. If you'll read the motion, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Motion in writing. I move to suspend Rule 5-C so that Senate Bill 1081 may be heard in Senate Committee on Agriculture when the committee meets. Signed, Senator Rock.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Rock. You've heard the motion. All in favor...Aye. So carried and ordered. For what purpose does Senator Geo-Karis arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, on a...on a point of personal privilege. I'm very...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

State your point, Senator.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

...I'm very privileged to announce today that in the gallery to my right, upstairs, are eighty-two students from Central Junior High School, Zion, Illinois, accompanied by their teachers, Jim Taylor, who is also one of our new city commissioners of Zion, Theron Otterbacher, Richard Johnson, Jerry Zoepfel, Lue Lewis...Lewis, Cathy Miller. I'd like to have you join me in welcoming them here, and I'm happy to have them here because they're very nice students.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Will our guests please rise and be recognized by the Senate. Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The committee schedule again this afternoon is very heavy. We will try to meet on time and try to dispose of matters on time. I would move you, sir, that the Senate stand adjourned until nine o'clock tomorrow morning.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Chew, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CHEW:

When the President has finished, sir, before you take the action, I wanted to make an announcement.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Make it right now because we're going to take the action.

SENATOR CHEW:

The Committee on Transportation will meet May 5th, at 7:00 p. m. in Room A-1, Stratton Building.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd ask for leave to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor with Senator Carroll to Senate Bill 1200.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Berman has asked to be cosponsor with Senator Carroll on Senate Bill what? Hyphenated sponsor...1200. Any objection? You heard the motion. All in favor say Aye. So ordered. Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Mr. President, one last reminder, you had a note on your desk yesterday that if you want a ticket to the Governor's Prayer Breakfast see me today or tomorrow 'cause tomorrow, is the last day we're holding tickets in the reserved tables down front for the members of the Legislature. Please see me if you want to go or see my secretary so we will have your order in on time, tomorrow is the last day. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Senator Rock has moved that the Senate stand adjourned. Hold...Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. The...I talked to Senator Buzbee, the Appropriations Chairman, and he says Room 212 may be vacant earlier than we had talked about earlier. So we will start the Ag Committee at six o'clock, rather than seven

o'clock tonight, in Room 212. Six o'clock rather than seven.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

That's...Senator Holmberg.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I would like permission to add Adeline Geo-Karis as hyphenated cosponsor to Senate Bill 550.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

You've heard the motions. All in favor say Aye. So ordered. Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I would like to have permission to add as a hyphenated cosponsor Senator Vincent Demuzio at...on Senate Bill 1080, 1-0-8-0, and on Senate Bill 1209.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Bruce. Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, Mr...Mr. President, I, too, would like to have leave to add Senator Geo-Karis as a hyphenated cosponsor on Senate Bills 143 and 168 and 1260 and 1261.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALL)

Is...you've heard the motion. Is leave granted? ...leave is granted... Senator Rock has moved that the Senate stand adjourned...Senator Buzbee.

SENATOR BUZBEE:

The Appropriations II Committee will meet at two fifteen as opposed to two o'clock, we ought to be out by five.
