PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Vadalabene to explain Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you. Before I explain Amendment No. 1, I would like to have Senator Rupp listed as a hyphenated sponsor on Senate Bill 864.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

All right. Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 864 is an amendment by Senator Rupp which increases from ten to twenty years the maximum period over which installment payments may be made for real property of a construction project. And it also increases a portion of the cost of the real property purchases which may be paid in installments from fifty percent to seventy-five percent and I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Several...municipal libraries across the State have a cash flow problem created because the grants to the libraries come three months before the start of the new fiscal year. And currently, at the end of the fiscal year, any remaining funds cannot be spent except for payments on obligations incurred prior to the close of the fiscal year. This amendment also provides that only twenty percent of the total appropriation may be carried into the new fiscal year. This amendment would solve the cash flow problem without raising any taxes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, I am in favor of this amendment of Senator Fawell.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Well, I'd like to know again what the amendment does. I am....is this the substance of a bill which the committee deemed in its wisdom to hold in committee and now we're going to try to amend it onto something that got out?

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

No, sir,...I...I was at the Elementary and Secondary Education Committee that night with...Superintendent Love and I did not get to the committee hearing. There was no objection to the bill, they just...and so I...I was allowed to put it on as an amendment, that's all.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Well, the...the answer then is yes.

I have talked to the Secretary of State about this bill. This is a problem throughout the entire State. What...the way most libraries solve the problem is they can go their local treasurer and ask them to advance funds. In DuPage County, and I'm sure in Cook County especially in the...in the libraries where you are, sir, this is an impossibility because our counties are too big and our... our treasurers cannot advance funds like that. In the first place, I'm not even sure what they're doing is that legal.

With this amendment, a definite time frame is included and it is no longer up to the discretion of the Department of Transportation. I'd ask for a favorable consideration.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt. Discussion? Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, I don't have a copy of this amendment in front of me. Does this have anything to do with diversion of more water that...to be...to be emptied into the various...tributaries that trickle down our way?

And this amendment was...we agreed with this here, it has nothing to do with taking water out of Lake Michigan and spilling it downstate. It's something that's strictly for drinking water.

Senator DeAngelis has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 928. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SENATOR BUZBEE:

Thank you. The amendment cleans up the bill so that it is focused purely on encouraging the use of Illinois coal in power plants. It addresses Section 49-A of the Public Utility Act to require...the commerce commission to consider the employment...impact in the coal industry of any permits to modify or abandon any facilities or to discontinue any service. It also amends Section 55 of the Public Utility Act to require the commission to evaluate any proposed new generating facility in comparison with an alternative design to use Illinois coal and to consider the economic value to the

State of the direct and indirect employment impact relative to coal production. At present, the commission considers cost alone and does not attach any value to social and economic benefits to the State as a whole, and I would move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Buzbee has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 931. Is there any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Aye...Ayes have it, amendment...Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Macdonald.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

I didn't remember that there was an...an amendment
offered to that bill.

SECRETARY:

I'm sorry, Senator, it shows an amendment on the outside
but we don't have an amendment on the inside. No committee
amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Any other committee amendments?

SENATOR BLOOM:

Excuse me, Mr. President, I thought there was a Floor amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Is there leave to return Senate Bill 943 to the Order of 2nd Reading? Leave is granted.

SECRETARY:

Floor Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Bloom.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Bloom is recognized on Floor Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 943. Senator Bloom.

SENATOR BLOOM:

Yes, this Floor amendment to the foreign trade zone legislation would add the Illinois Valley Port District as well as the Waukegan Port District to this legislation. They are in different parts of the State and they're compatible and we're all seeking the same thing, so they're all blended together. Seek its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Bloom has moved the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 943. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further Floor amendments?

Read the bill, Mr...nope, hold that one. Senate Bill 9...49,
Senator DeAngelis. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 949.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Philip.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

On the Order of 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 949, Amendment No. 1. Senator Philip. Senator Philip. Can we have some order.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. This is a very serious amendment. It abolishes the general assistance funds some two hundred and seventy-five million dollars this year. As you know, downstate, in the downstate townships, we have our own tax rate and we pay for it ourselves almost completely. There is no Federal match. It would be a great savings to the State of Illinois. At this point it's rather questionable whether we'll have a tax increase or not. So I move the adoption of Senate Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIG)

All right. Senator Philip has moved the adoption of Senate...Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 949. Is there discussion? Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I rise in opposition to Amendment No. 1 and wish to point out to the members that this Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 941 is identical to Senate Bill 1292, which as I recall was either beaten or was not called. It would abolish, eliminate, general assistance, and I sure don't think this Body ought to go on record as abolishing or eliminating general assistance. There is obviously a financial savings, but the financial savings in terms of our overall public policy, frankly, are de minimus. We're talking about saving what, twelve million dollars? We are confronted, unfortunately, and we will deal with, I hope this week or next certainly, certainly no later than next, the question of the future destiny of this State and whether or not we are responsible enough to respond to the call of the Governor for a tax

increase, because this program and others like it that have put Illinois in the forefront of compassion and caring for those who are unable to care for themselves will otherwise be in jeopardy. An Aye vote on Amendment No. 1, frankly, turns the back of the people of the State of Illinois on a hundred and thirty-thousand of those in our State who are less fortunate than the rest of us. I urge a No vote. I urge strong opposition, absolute total rejection, of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 949.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR COLLINS:

Yes, thank you, Mr...President and members of the Senate. I think Senator Rock said it, I think this amendment...a Yes vote on this amendment would probably be the the most irresponsible, inhumane act that this Body has ever taken in the history of Illinois Government. We cannot afford to throw thousands of people on the street with no means to survive. I say that we have no choice but to vote...No on this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. I have in this order, Kelly, Schaffer, Newhouse and Netsch. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd just like to say, if you don't have general assistance you might as well not have township government, at least up in the County of Cook and other areas where this is one of the few responsibilities that the townships are administering. So I also am opposed to Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Mr. President and members of the Senate. I reluctantly

rise in support of this amendment, frankly, not because I think anyone is overjoyed at the prospect of eliminating the category of general assistance in the Public Aid Department, but I think, frankly, at this point we are down to talking about priorities, and in general assistance we have what has to be the lowest priority in the Illinois Department of Public Aid budget. We aren't talking about children, we aren't talking about the aged, we aren't talking about the disabled or the blind, we're talking about people who by definition are able-bodied men and women without children. It isn't a large stipend, it's a hundred and forty-four dollars a month. The program is fraught with problems. I think there isn't anyone here in either side of the aisle that's knowledgeable with the program that isn't aware that the program has needed a dramatic overhaul for years. Frankly, at this state, when one looks at the state of the State finances and no answer on the horizon, I think it's responsible for us to start talking about priorities. And I think even if we do pass a tax increase this program is one that should draw attention for reform and reduction. Hopefully, this is not a permanent overall withdrawal of support by the State, but at this time, unless one has the magic answer, I don't see how anyone can responsibly not respond to the state of the State's budget. I believe this is one area of public aid that could be reduced. I believe, by the way, it's the area of public aid that draws most of the attention from our constituencies in terms of frustrations because these are the people who, by and large, by definition could be out working. I don't think we have any choice at this stage but to tell people that we're serious that the General Assembly is capable of setting priorities and balancing the State budget and living within the means available to us.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

All right. Senator Newhouse.

SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

Thank you, Mr. President and Senators. I'd just like to point out two things about this move at this time. There are times, I think, when such a move could be accomplished and there would be very little opposition to it. The Legislative Advisory Committee held a hearing on the subject matter to get an idea from officials just what it would mean were general assistance reduced or cut out entirely. What we got was this; we got a group of township committeemen come before us to say this, that if you reduce or if you eliminate general assistance at this time, there will not be enough troops to preserve order in our townships. Let me read off from you four of the persons who stood at the desk and shook their heads at this. The township committee person from Mt. Vernon, from Decatur, from East St. Louis and from Schaumburg. The second thing I would say to you is this; because of the economy at this time, this would be an absolutely horrendous move. Who are we talking about? We're not talking any longer about the normal stereotypes of general assistance, what we're talking about, and if you'll look at most of your own districts, you're going to find that for a variety of reasons some people are no longer working in the factories that were there before. In some of your places the smokestacks have stopped smoking. We're talking about people who formerly had been working and productive, who have exhausted their unemployment benefits and for whom this is the only surviving safety net. Now let me tell you something about those people who are able-bodied. They are able-bodied and they're ready to work; yes, they are, they're ready to work, and there isn't any work for them to do. And I'm going to tell you that some of them are going to do the next best thing. They're going to try to survive and they're going to try to survive in a way that is absolutely antisocial. Let's build some more prisons because that's what we're going to

need. When we tell able-bodied people with dignity and who have previously supported themselves, that we, as a State, are no longer going to provide them with a last resort, then we might as well gear up to expect the kind of antisocial conduct that is going to cost this State an awful lot of money. I certainly intend to vote against this measure and I hope it fails. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you. Many of the points have been made, but I would like to ask the sponsor one question, and this is really a very serious question; it is not intended to be facetious. Right now most of the people who are on general assistance are people who have nowhere else to go; they have no other program which can help them; they have no income, and with all due respect, Senator Schaffer, it's very nice to say that they're the ones who...ought to be out working but working where? Where are the jobs that are going to take care of them right now? So, given that set of circumstances, Senator Philip, precisely what do you expect to happen to the people who are on general assistance right now if general assistance is wiped out?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Johns.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Hey...I'm sorry, Mr. Chairman. If you would pay attention, Mr. President, I was...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Your time is up.

SENATOR NETSCH:

I posed a question to the sponsor of the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Yeah...thank you Mr...I didn't think it was much of a question either. But...you know what...and there's certainly a misidea of exactly what this bill does...or this amendment does. It does not abolish general assistance. It abolishes the State's participation in general assistance. What it does is, it allows the townships in ninety...over ninety percent of the downstate townships have a GA rate, we pay for it ourselves completely, totally locally. And all it says to Cook County and the City of Chicago, if we're paying it downstate locally why don't you pay your's. That's all it says, Senator.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Then this is not an anti-general assistance, anti-poor people amendment, this is simply an anti-poor people, anti-general assistance in Cook County amendment. Is that...is that what you're telling us, Senator Philip?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

It's certainly not, it's what we call uniformity. If it's good for the city, why isn't it good for the suburbs. Why should we pay for it all completely and you pay for less than...less than twenty percent. Of course, I know, the suburbs ought to get soaked like we always get soaked, right, Senator? We pay more than our share. You know, we've got our tax rate and my tax rate in my township is up to the maximum, and we're taking care of the people who can't work but you're not doing it, and I'm just saying, let's...it's time you did your share.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

I did not really intend to broaden the debate into the particular thing that you are raising now, but I'm perfectly willing to take it on. I think it ill-behooves you, Senator Philip, as the principal sponsor, albeit by request, of the income tax increase, to start raising the...the battle barriers between Chicago, Cook County and the rest of the State. There are some tables which would indicate that a good deal of the revenue that supports the State Treasury comes out of Chicago and Cook County, and we are quite willing to share it with the rest of the State because we feel we are all in this together and we are there to help one another. But an amendment which is designed to stick it in the eye of poor people, specifically, and Chicago and Cook County poor people, very specifically, is not exactly a constructive step in that direction. I strongly oppose the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Ladies and Gentlemen, we still have another seven speakers on this issue and I have them in Senator Johns, Darrow, Hall, Grothberg, Joyce, Smith and Senator Dawson. I will recognize Senator Johns.

SENATOR JOHNS:

Thank you, Mr. President. Our priorities are really gone astray in this State. You talk about priorities; what are our priorities in this State? I'll tell you what they are; one, is to build more and more prisons and fund these prisons, and the guards and everything are even underpaid, but we spent twenty thousand dollars plus a year to maintain an inmate, twenty thousand dollars a year better. What happens to cause the bursting of the prisons with population today? Poverty. What causes child abuse and the beating of wives? It's poverty. Men get frustrated and they come home with nothing to do and they take it out on their children and their families and then we throw them into prison. Any do

they steal when they have to? My son, Dane, works for the Williamson County Sheriff's office and he tells me of the enumerable people that are coming before the courts because they have to steal to survive. This is the last straw, you cut this out and you leave them nothing as...as Senator Newhouse said. What do they...do but turn to antisocial behavior. We've got to spend more and more for prisons. The middle-income families today that are out of work that used to have their homes and their pride are now a part of the soup lines. And we're going to take the general assistance away. And Senator "Pate" Philip said, well, this is just the State support. Well, look at my counties downstate, we're the highest unemployment in the...in the State and probably in the nation, some of them. Yeah, you raise your hand, Senator Rupp, but you got it, you got it too. We got miners by the thousands out of work. You cut off the unemployment, what have you got left? They've got to go to general assistance. And I'm telling you that if you do this, you're inhumane to vote for this...this action.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Darrow.

SENATOR DARROW:

Would the sponsor yield?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield, Senator.

SENATOR DARROW:

Yes, this has been portrayed as a Chicago versus the rest of the State issue. Does any general assistance funding for this item go downstate?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Yes, there are very few townships, but there are about...downstate township less than ten percent. They have

to qualify, there is some...of the two hundred and seventy-five million we're talking about, about ninety percent of it goes to the city, the rest is spread out through the rest of the State of Illinois.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Darrow.

SENATOR DARROW:

Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Kenneth Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. When the Governor was before us the other day, I specifically asked him...Senator, and before I go on to that, I want to say, Senator "Pate" Philip, you and I came here together some seventeen years ago, and I'm appalled to think that you would introduce something like this. Now you're talking about lives and people, and I specifically asked the Governor, it's great to talk about education, it's great to talk about roads, it's great to talk about all these other things, but the American way of life is what we should be concerned first. Are we going to feed the hungry, cloth the naked, take care of the indigents, take care of the elderly? That's what we're here for, not to try to turn around at this time and close the door on the people that are in need because you live up there and you doing well. That can all be wiped away. I want to tell you that the vote should be No. And I'm asking everybody to put a red light on that board.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Grotberg.

SENATOR GROTBERG:

Thank you, Mr. President and fellow Senators. Just a...a brief reflection of sobriety into this issue. The township

people and the township officials have been meeting off and on all winter. I know they met up at St. Charles, they met here, they met there, there's a real movement among the township officials of Illinois and the supervisors in general who administer this program that they would be glad to take it over provided they had some flexibility on their own tax rate, those that are taxing now and are contributing townships. And that movement is very much afoot, there resides in the House on 2nd reading a bill to...for instance, to allow DuPage County to move their...their township assessor's fund up somewhat. But I...the...I think it would not hurt to put this amendment on, in all seriousness, regarding how you feel on that issue, to let us then advance the program for those townships, and I'll be glad to sponsor any amendments that it takes over here and Sam Vadalabene or I can handle that anytime to allow...there he goes...to allow...to allow the townships to meet the responsibility locally. The only thing wrong with...with...with this going through without that would be that for some townships it could be a penalty. But that movement, if you...those of you who have been to the township official meeting, Gene, I realize what you're saying and how excited everybody is, but in all seriousness, the township officials in Illinois in general would take this if they had some levity back home to do something with their own rate and that could be forthcoming just as easily as this. I would suggest we put it on and let it sit on 3rd for awhile while that issue cooks.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

...Senator Jerome Joyce. Senator Smith. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you, Mr. Speaker and to the Ladies and Gentlemen here of the Senate. I've sat here and I've listened to my colleagues on the other side, especially Senator Schaffer when he spoke about people who do not need general assis-

tance. I wish he could travel with me just one day in my neighborhood that I represent and see how the people are lined up there, young able-bodied young men and women who do not want to be on public aid, but they said that if I can root, let me root and if I can't root, then let me die. And all they have is an opportunity to get this general assistance even though it's a hundred and forty-four dollars, not much that you can do with it. And I'm so happy that you live in an environment that you don't see people who are losing their pride because they cannot, as you ask, find anything to do. Why can't they go out and find a job? There are no jobs. One of the predications of getting this GA is that they're supposed to be out job hunting and there are no jobs to be found. And then I heard our learned colleague on the other side speak about the townships and that...why don't Chicago pay their own part of the bill. When I'm on my way coming down here to Springfield and I ride the train station there at the Union Station, and as I'm...in route to go to the train, I see droves of people, in droves, coming from the suburbs into the City of Chicago to work and then they come into Chicago to make their monies and then what do they do? They take their monies right out of the City of Chicago. Tell me which is right and which is wrong. But I'm asking you out of the mintage of your heart, if you have any heart at all, please vote No for this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dawson.

SENATOR DAWSON:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, we had this fine amendment of Senator Philip's in committee, the Public Welfare Committee, and we called for it two different times and he didn't see fit to come there so we could kill it in committee for him, so I just ask everybody here to vote against it here on the Floor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Coffey.

SENATOR COFFEY:

Well Mr. President and members of the Senate, I rise in favor of this amendment and I don't rise in favor of this amendment because I don't care about the people that is needy and in need of welfare. For four years I was township supervisor and I administered that fund in my township. I think basically all we're saying here, we have one of two choices, either we put a tax increase through this State to fund programs like this or we pass amendments like this and give the authority to local townships, at least in my area, that would accept this amendment if they had the authority to raise those taxes needed for that assistance. And I think that's what we're doing here, we add this amendment on and we also give them the authority to raise those dollars locally needed to take care of the needy in our given townships and our given communities. I think this is a good amendment. I think along with this amendment they also need the authority, the taxing authority, to raise the revenues necessary and I think we ought to address that also. If that is not addressed I would be in opposition to this amendment, but I think we ought to put this amendment on, send it to third and see if we're also going to allow the revenues to...to those locals and allow them the authority to raise the revenues necessary to take care of those needy people. But some of us are going to vote against this amendment, we'd vote against giving the authority to the locals and we'll also vote against coming up with the State revenues to fund these programs. And I think that's hypocritical if we don't try to stand up and fund the...fund the taxes to take care of the needs that we have here in this State or at the local level. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Senator Philip, I'd like to ask you a question.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Philip.

SENATOR LEMKE:

This particular amendment...if we don't get the money from the State in Cook County then where will the money come from in general assistance?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

In...in suburban Cook County you have a GA rate for each township and the townships are doing it there now, just like they are downstate. So this is not a...nobody seems to understand it, it's not abolishing general assistance. What it is doing is saying that the State of Illinois is not going to provide funds for it, so the funds will have to be collected locally, like they are down in ninety percent of the...downstate townships, we pay for it completely.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Talking about then, in these local townships, like Evanston and Lyons or Palos or Cicero or Berwyn or that, if they don't get this money from the State to pay for the general assistance, where will they get the money from...these particular townships, to make the general assistance payments?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Well, in the first place, Senator, most of the suburban townships are not receiving any money from the State, you

don't understand that. They have a local tax rate, they are using that money and that's all the money they're using. Like my townships, all nine of my townships in the county that I reside in have a local tax rate that pays for all the general assistance, we get nothing. The...overwhelmingly the majority of the townships in suburban Cook County are under the same...exact same circumstances.

PRESIDING OFFICER:

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

My...my understanding is that these particular suburban townships get so much money for the State to...add to their assistance and so much money from local taxes which comes out of real estate taxes. And in these townships, I understand that they are readily...ready over-assessed and are overly taxed on burdens because their tax base have been eroded because of the loss of industry in those areas. So if we do not get the money from the State, then the burden shifts to local people and local taxpayers. I think, Senator Philip, what we should be doing here, if there is counties in...and townships in the State that don't get State general assistance money, then I think we should amend the State laws to give local people the revenue from the State, because we keep extracting money out of local people but we fail to return it to them. And I think the biggest objection whether we talk about public aid or general assistance or we talk about education or anything else, the biggest objection is, they want to know where all the State money...the money they're paying in income tax, the money they're paying in all these State taxes is going because their local taxes are going up and it's not coming back. We keep hearing of cuts and cuts and cuts and we...pushing the burden onto the real estate person who's working which is probably in my area, we have very little general assistance, but the burden of areas like

Evanston Township or, I believe,...towns...well, like around Schaumburg and Elk Grove Village where have a high unemployment, they are getting...they are getting more and more general assistance people there. And I've...I've read to the northwest and to the north, you know, we haven't been affected yet in the southwest part of Cook County. But I'm telling you this, I am not the one who talks about general assistance because I believe people should work. And, Senator Johns, I'll tell...tell you something, crime has grown and grown more with the more and more social intervention of the government. It has not decreased. Because when people were starving in depression time, there was less crime percentagewise than there is now when we have more and more social interfering with the homes, social interferences. I and my conception of this, as a legislator from Cook County who represents township government, would say that I cannot support this because I do not want the burden of the people on general assistance shifted to my people who pay real estate taxes. We do not want this burden shifted from the State to the local people. We say that the State...this should be in reverse. Those townships that aren't getting their share from the State of general assistance money should yell and scream and get it back and be like everybody else in the other...in a hundred and two...counties, everybody should be equal and I agree with that. But I do not believe in shifting burden back onto local people. I believe in returning tax dollars back to where it's earned and we're not getting it. And we have not got it and we are still not getting it in anywhere in Cook County or anywhere in District 1 and especially in what's coming out of there and we went through that. And I'm saying to you this, anybody that represents people that pay real estate taxes should be against this because that burden is going to increase their local assessment and you're going to pay more real estate taxes in your

local area. Therefore, I urge you to vote against this.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Chew.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

I would point out that the timer is on.

SENATOR CHEW:

Thank you, Mr. President. In one of our publications in Chicago, The Chicago Sun Times, on Sunday, and I would bring this to the attention of the Body because the person it was directed to does not live in Chicago nor Cook County, and since the article stated that he has developed a hate for the city, I'm certain that hate is deep enough which would not permit him to read that publication. The Sun Times said that the sponsor of this amendment is, in fact, the overseer of DuPage County and he is also a salesman or an owner of Pepperidge Farm. I'll give you the article; Senator, because I know you hate Chicago so much till you even hate its publications. I'll furnish that to you. You know, when I first came down here, the hue and cry was that welfare was designed and distributed solely among black people in this State. Now that you have Reagan in the White House, who has cut these programs that would prevent people from going to work on honest jobs, he's created a climate of unemployment that this country has not seen. Maybe you can say now that other people must be on general assistance in order to survive. You know and I know that this amendment is not necessary. We should not have to waste each other's time debating it possibly so you can get in some local publication. We should...refuse to allow this amendment to become a part of a bill, because sometimes, ladies and gentlemen, we have to do what is right, not what we think is expedient for our own benefit.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Thank you, Mr. President. Everybody who is in this Body knows that, for the most part, when it comes to appropriations we don't make decisions, we make choices. I've heard the word thrown around, "appalled," "inhumane." Is it less inhumane to let mentally ill people walk the streets? Is it less inhumane to let elderly people die? Is it less inhumane to let our kids become uneducated? Is it less inhumane to not take care of abused children? Because, ladies and gentlemen, that is the choices we are facing. Now, everybody knows why this amendment was put in, at least general assistance could exist. It was put in because there is a good possibility that we will not...enact a revenue increase in this General Assembly. And I think what disturbs me more is the people that have gotten up and criticized this amendment, not one person among you who has done that criticizing has sponsored a tax increase bill. In fact, let me tell you that several of the speakers have publically campaigned for reelection in their brochures not to enact any type of tax increase whatsoever. Well, I submit to you, you cannot have it both ways.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Egan, the last speaker.

SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, I...I have some questions and I...I would like to know if the sponsor would yield.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Now, factually, I just want to make sure how much your local community contributes and how much does mine, can you tell me the difference or if there is a difference?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

My local community, by township, has a one-mill rate and we levy that and we...I'm not sure we spend it all, and I don't know how much it is. And you live in the City of Chicago or a township?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

I live in Chicago.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

I...I don't think that your...the city levies anything for general assistance. I think they do give money to the State of Illinois to the tune, either...somewhere between nine to twelve million dollars towards a...a...their contribution. But, of course, they receive ninety percent out of about two hundred and seventy-five million. So, I would suggest to you that they're doing a little better than I am in my township or any of the downstate townships are doing, to say the least. They're not even coming close to...to paying their share.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Well, in order to help you, why don't we suggest that you eliminate your qualifying amount and then take the burden completely away from your local people? I would suggest that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Senator, I might suggest this, that we feel that we have some local responsibility for people at each EA, and I, quite

frankly, don't mind paying for it. I think it's a responsible thing to do. But I kind of think it's irresponsible in the City of Chicago, when they don't even come close to paying it and they...and people get in it...on it so easily it's unbelievable. I mean, everybody knows the cheating that goes on, et cetera, et cetera. And I just say, it's time you pay your own...your own way, your own share, we're doing it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Well, but my suggestion is that we eliminate the local contribution entirely, and so that then you would satisfy your local constituent from what you consider to be a present burden. And it's a State-administered assistance, if there's any cheating, that's up to the present administration to clear up. And those of us who object to paying locally have satisfied our constituents. And let me suggest as an alternative to your amendment that we do that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

It's been my past experience, things seem to be handled better locally than they are on the State level, and they're handled better on the State level than the national level. And, you know, I have no problem with local control, and...I have more trust with my neighbors and the people in local government than I do in people on the State level. And I...I think we're going to the reverse, the bigger the government, the less effective.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

Alright, Senator Rock is recognized for a second time.

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the

Senate. I apologize for rising a second time, but in the course of the debate I've heard all the "buzz words," and I would ask everyone on this side of the aisle to vote No, or at least...at least lay off. We should not vote Aye on this, and for this reason, this is nothing more nor less than Reaganomics revisited. Times are tough, it'll trickle down. Cut out the cheaters. Where have you heard that? Sounds like an awful familiar ring. This is an attempt, a bald attempt, a bold attempt, to balance the budget on the backs of the poor and we ought not stand for it. I urge a No vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

A roll call has been requested. Senator Philip may close.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This is not a strike against general assistance, it's, hopefully, a saving of two hundred and seventy-five million dollars. I believe in local control, let local people do it, and I would ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Alright, Senator Philip has moved the...for the adoption of...of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 949. All those voting in favor vote Aye. All those opposed vote No. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 27, the Nays are 28, none voting Present. The amendment fails. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 950, Senator Schaffer. On the Order of 2nd Reading, Page 19, Senate Bill 949. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary...950, 9-5-0, 9-5-0.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 950.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. Senator Etheredge, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR ETHEREDGE:

Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I rise on a point of personal...privilege.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

State you point.

SENATOR ETHEREDGE:

In the President's gallery, we having visiting a group of students from Annunciation School in Aurora. They're here under the guidance of Ron Esposito and several members of the...Annunciation faculty. I would like for them to stand and be recognized.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Will they please rise and be recognized. Senate Bill 951, Senator Schuneman. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 951.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Schuneman.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment merely corrects a drafting error that occurred in the Reference Bureau, and the amendment complies with the agreement that we made when the bill was heard in committee. I move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Schuneman moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 951. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SENATOR FAWELL:

This...thank you, Mr. President. This is just a cleanup amendment. It clarifies that the eight-year period of time will be measured from the time of final discharge and allows the local governments to be charged.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Is there any discussion? If not, the question is, shall Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 953 be adopted. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 954, Senator Netsch. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 954.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Netsch.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you. Both of the amendments are amendments which I committed at the time the bill was called and voted on in committee, I would offer on the Floor, and both are designed to put the bill into the same form in which it was during the last Session of the General Assembly. Amendment No. 1, Mr. Secretary, is the longer amendment?

SECRETARY:

Yes.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Yes. Amendment No. 1 deletes the referendum provisions. What that means is that there will be left in the truth in taxation bill only a requirement for an extraordinary majority when property taxes levied go over a certain percentage, but the requirement of a referendum will be deleted by the adoption of Amendment No. 1. I would move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Is there further discussion? If not, Senator Netsch moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 954. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 changes the vote required when the tax levy exceeds one hundred and ten percent from three-fifths to two-thirds. This is offered at the request, in fact one might say the insistence, of Senator Sangmeister who pointed out that many of the...the township boards have only six members and that the three-fifths vote simply would not work satisfactorily and, therefore, it should be a two-thirds vote. I would move the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 954.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Mr. President and members of the Senate, Committee Amendment No. 1 merely requires that the notice be mailed rather than delivered in person by...by an officer. So, it would save money and, therefore, I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Kelly moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 961. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY:

On Amendment No. 1...No. 1, Mr. Secretary. Senator Maitland.

SENATOR MAITLAND:

Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1347 is...is partially technical with some clarifying language. And then, it also adds some language that really...really puts in the Statutes what the agreement already is on adult education, and says that, "They may elect," they meaning the...the nonaligned district...the nonaligned high school...the nonaligned district, "may elect to establish an area planning council which is not associated with the community college district with the approval of the State Board of Education." And that again, merely is putting into the Statutes the agreed to rules and regulations. And I move for the adoption.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Maitland has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill...Senate Bill 1347. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1349, Senator Bloom. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 1349. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

PRESIDENT:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Bruce...oh, I'm sorry, Senator Bloom.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bloom on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR BLOOM:

I'm the good looking one who doesn't wear horn rims. Thank you, Mr. President and fellow Senators. Essentially this language was given to me by the Department of Children and Family Services. It...it conforms with a...a House bill that it's involved in and does not change the intent of the bill. I'd answer any questions, otherwise, move its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Bloom has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1349. Any...any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Senator Schaffer on 1354. Senator DeAngelis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

For the purposes of an announcement, Mr. President. The Illinois Association of Rehabilitation Facilities is having their reception tonight between five-thirty and eight-thirty at Baur's. If you get there early, you can make both big things tonight.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the Chair...thank you...thank you, Senator. The Chair is happy to announce that we, today, moved a hundred and sixty-four bills, and I would caution the membership tomorrow is another day and we have an equal load, if not a heavier load. We will commence promptly at eleven and I do mean promptly. We will circulate...and I've asked the Secretary and the Assistant Secretary to prepare a list of recalls. Those are bills that are on 3rd reading that members wish to recall for purposes of an amendment. We will start at eleven o'clock sharp with the recalls, and I'd ask everybody to please be present, prompt and present. And caution the committee chairs that the bills we...you will be dealing with in committee tomorrow are merely House bills. And so, we will start promptly at eleven so that we can adequately deal with Senate bills. I've been asked to announce that the Teamsters Joint Council 25 will have a reception

tomorrow night. I don't know why they're announcing it today, but that's what they asked. And I would like to remind the Body that there are still tickets available for the Gridiron...available from any member of the press corps. Yours truly will give the rebuttal. Hopefully, it will be worth the price of a ticket so...they'll be available through tomorrow. With leave of the Body, we'll turn to page...and if I can have your attention, we have not yet concluded. If you'll turn to page 78 on the Calendar...78 on the Calendar. One of our members has filed a motion in writing with respect to an item veto; and as you know, under the rules, there are fifteen days within which those motions can be addressed. This is day fifteen. With leave of the Body, we'll go to the Order of Motions on the Order of Item Vetos, page 78 on the Calendar. Read the motion, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

I move that the item on page 271, lines 16 through 21, of Senate Bill 177 Do Pass, the item veto of the Governor to the...notwithstanding. Signed, Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, what this does is restores some four million dollars for grants to the developmentally disabled community based mental health programs in the State of Illinois. We know what the Governor did in Senate Bill 507 was to give Dixon four million dollars for some miscalculations in the program and the eventual closing of that facility. But the problem with that, and I'm not disputing that...

PRESIDENT:

Can we take the conferences off the Floor?

SENATOR D'ARCO:

...and I'm not disputing that that money may be needed,

but what he did, in effect, was take that four million dollars from the community providers; and those of us that have these community based facilities in our districts know that they are very vital and necessary for the mentally retarded and developmentally disabled persons that are being helped by these facilities. There's no question that this money must be restored; otherwise, these people will not be given the needed treatment that is so necessary for them to survive. Mr. President, I ask every member of this Body to examine his conscience and to vote affirmatively to restore this line item veto, the Governor's veto notwithstanding.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator D'Arco has moved that the item on page 271, lines 16 through 21 of Senate Bill 177, the item veto of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding. Any discussion. Senator Holmberg. Your light's on. Any discussion? Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Mr. President and members of the Senate, I think most people in this Body are familiar with my involvement in this area, and obviously, like Senator D'Arco, I'm quite concerned about the funding levels in the particular area he mentions. I would respectfully suggest to you, Senator, that on the Calendar is a...a supplemental and transfer bill, Senate Bill 407, which transfers some four hundred to five hundred thousand dollars into this line item which should allow us to address the needs that you've mentioned. The four million dollar figure, obviously, is...is a nice big figure, but frankly, with a very tight budget this year we...we do have that money available for those kind of levels of expenditure. I also question whether we could really spend four million in the last month and a half of this fiscal year. I think the more responsible course, quite frankly, is to pass the supplemental which does not unbalance the budget but does

provide the funds in this needed area to pay for the services that, in fact, need to be paid for.

PRESIDENT:

Any further discussion? Any further discussion? Senator D'Arco may close.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Mr. President, what Senator Schaffer is talking about is purchase care for developmentally disabled, not for community service programs. So that four hundred or five hundred thousand isn't going to sustain the burden that these people are facing today. There's no doubt in my mind, Mr. President, that the Governor is trying to juggle the budget in order to accommodate certain people, but it was he who made the fiasco at Dixon, not this General Assembly. It was he that got involved in a court fight over the closing at...Dixon, not this General Assembly. And it is he that is going to put the burden of that miscalculation on...on these community health facilities and we shouldn't allow that to happen, Mr. President. And I move to override the Governor's veto.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the question is, shall the item on page 271, lines 16 through 21, of Senate Bill 177, pass the item veto of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 31, the Nays are 26, none voting Present. The motion fails. With leave of the Body, we'll move to the Order of Resolutions. Resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

The following...the two resolutions are congratulatory. Senate Resolution 167 offered by Senator Berman. And, Senate Resolution 168 offered by Senator Egan.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. Senator Bloom, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BLOOM:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. On Senate Bill 943, I would like to add as a hyphenated cosponsor Senator Welch...joint sponsor, whatever you call it where we're yield together.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Bloom has asked leave to show Senator Welch as a cosponsor of 943. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Dawson, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DAWSON:

Mr. President, I ask leave to be the sponsor of House Bill 429 from the sponsorship of Senator Lemke.

PRESIDENT:

House Bill...what's the number? I'm sorry.

SENATOR DAWSON:

429.

PRESIDENT:

429, show Senator Dawson as the chief sponsor in lieu of Senator Lemke. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Holmberg, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I wish to have my name added as a hyphenated cosponsor to Senate Bill 762 and Senate Bill 618. I have the permission of both sponsors. I wish also...

PRESIDENT:

Wait a minute...wait a minute...wait a minute. Seven...

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

762.

PRESIDENT:

...762 and...

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

And 618.

PRESIDENT:

...618. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Holmberg.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I...I wish to add to my name as hyphenated cosponsors to House Bill 796, Senators Welch and Senator Luft.

PRESIDENT:

All right, House Bill 796 add, at the request of the sponsor, Senators Welch and Luft. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Sangmeister, for what purpose do you arise, sir?

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to remove myself as the Senate sponsor of House Bill 606 and Senator Netsch will be the sponsor of that piece of legislation.

PRESIDENT:

All right, House Bill 606?

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Yes, and then I have a further motion.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Sangmeister seeks leave of the Body to be removed as the Senate sponsor of House 606 and asks that Senator Netsch be his substitute. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. It's so ordered. Senator Sangmeister.

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Further, I would ask that the posting requirement be waived on House Bill 606 so that it can be heard in committee this week because we are planning on putting that bill into a subcommittee anyway, and it never got posted and it should have.

PRESIDENT:

All right, you've heard the request. Senator has asked leave to waive the posting requirement for House Bill 606,

which will hopefully meet the fate of a lot of House bills, it will go to subcommittee. Leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Hudson, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HUDSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. I rise for the purpose of asking leave to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor to House Bill 462.

PRESIDENT:

House 462, Senator Hudson seeks leave of the Body to be shown as a hyphenated cosponsor. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Joyce, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to change the designation on Senate Bill 5 from Senator Collins as a cosponsor to make Senator Collins a hyphenated sponsor.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the request. Senator Collins to be shown as a hyphenated cosponsor of Senate Bill 5. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Netsch, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you. To make a change in sponsorship. House Bill 347, at the request of Senator Vadalabene, I will be shown as the sponsor of the bill instead of Senator Vadalabene.

PRESIDENT:

All right, House 347. Leave has been requested to show Senator Netsch as the chief sponsor in lieu of Senator Vadalabene. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. It's so ordered. Senator Bruce, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BRUCE:

...with leave of the Body, I'd like to be removed as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 1236.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the request. Senator Bruce asks leave to be

removed as a cosponsor of Senate 1236. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. It's so ordered. Senator Demuzio, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, Mr. President, I ask leave of the Senate to have Senator Welch added as a hyphenated cosponsor of several bills; namely, Senate Bill 578, 659, 759, 801, 981, 1260 and 1261.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio, will you check the...check this list. Leave of the Body had been requested to add Senator Welch as a cosponsor of Senate 578, 659, 759, 801, 981, 1260 and 1261. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Mr. President, I would like leave that on House Bill 791, I'm shown as the House sponsor on this and it should show that Senator Jerry Joyce is the House sponsor. So, I'd like leave that that would be changed.

PRESIDENT:

What's the number again, Senator?

SENATOR HALL:

791...

PRESIDENT:

House...House 791...leave...leave has been...requested to show Senator Jerome Joyce in lieu of Senator Hall as the Senate sponsor. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Any further business to come before the Senate? I would ask again and remind you, eleven o'clock tomorrow morning, promptly we will commence. Senator Hall moves that the Senate stands adjourned until Wednesday, May 18, at the hour of 11:00 a.m. Eleven o'clock tomorrow morning. Senate stands adjourned.
