PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

SENATOR PHILIP:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I'd like the record to indicate that Senator Schuneman is in his district on legislative business. Senator Macdonald is absent because of illness in her family.
