Senate Resolution 1628, by Senator Fitzgerald.

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Senate Resolution 1629 is offered by Senator Hawkinson.

Senate Resolution 1630 and 1631, also 1632, all by Senator Lauzen.

Senator Demuzio offers Senate Resolutions 1633 and 1634.

And Senate Joint Resolution 179, offered by Senators Dillard and Raica.

They're all congratulatory resolutions, Mr. President. PRESIDENT PHILIP:

SECRETARY HARRY:

Senate Bill 1595, with House Amendments 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21. PRESIDENT PHILIP:

Senator Fawell.

Thank you very much, Mr. President. I would like to non-concur in Amendments No. 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21.

PRESIDENT PHILIP:

Any discussion? If not, Senator Fawell moves to non-concur in House Amendments 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21 -- to Senate Bill 1595. All those in favor will signify by saying Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion carries, and the Secretary shall -- shall inform the House. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

The intent of the Chair is to now proceed to the Order of Secretary's Desk, Non-concurrence. On page 11 of today's Senate Calendar is that Order. The Chair shall take up those motions to

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refuse to recede from Senate amendments and request a committee of conference be appointed. Senator Shadid, on House Bill 742. Mr. Secretary, please read the bill.

SECRETARY HARRY:

I move to refuse to recede from Senate Amendments 1 and 2 to House Bill 742 and request that a conference committee be appointed.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Any discussion? Senator Shadid.

SENATOR SHADID:

It's still there. I still refuse to recede, Mr. Chairman. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Any discussion? Senator Shadid moves that the Senate refuse to recede from the adoption of Senate Amendments No. 1 and 2 to House Bill 742 and that a conference committee be appointed. All those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say Nay. The motion carries, and the Secretary shall so inform the House. Senator Dunn, on House Bill 3518. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY HARRY:

I move to refuse to recede from Senate Amendment 1 to House Bill 3518 and request that a conference committee be appointed. Signed by Senator Ralph Dunn.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Senator Dunn.

SENATOR R. DUNN:

Thank you, Mr. President, Members of the Senate. I move that we refuse to recede from Senate Amendment No. 1 and that a conference committee be appointed on House Bill 3518. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Any discussion? Senator Dunn has moved that the Senate refuse to recede from the adoption of Senate Amendments No. 1 to House

Senator Karpiel, on Senate Bill 1326. Madam Secretary, please read the bill. Out of the record. Senator Madigan, on 1479. Senate Bill -- out of the record. On page 12 of today's Senate Calendar - page 12 - is the Order of Conference Committee Reports. On that Order there is House Bill 1915. Madam Secretary, do you have on file on -- do you have on file a Conference Committee Report on 1915? ACTING SECRETARY HAWKER:

First Conference Committee Report on House Bill 1915. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Chair recognizes Senator Demuzio. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Thank you -- thank you, Mr. President. On -- on the Conference Committee Report on House Bill 1915, we'd like to go back to a conference, and therefore, I would ask that the requisite number of votes, whatever that may be -- let's not get confused here. And if you can't vote for this thing, why, I understand. I'd like to go to another conference committee. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

The question is, shall the Senate adopt the Conference Committee Report on House Bill 1915. Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, vote No. The voting is open. All voted who wish? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

For what purpose does Senator Demuzio rise? For what purpose does Senator...

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Thank you, Mr. President. With leave of the Body, I'd like to go to a congratulatory resolution, Senate Resolution 1633. It is, in fact, congratulatory in nature, and I need it as soon as I can possibly get it, and that's why I'm asking for this extraordinary action.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Senator Demuzio moves to suspend the rules for the purpose of the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 1633 - congratulatory. Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, vote Nay. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio, explain the resolution. Senator Demuzio has moved for the adoption of Senate Resolution 1633. Those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say Nay. The Ayes have it, and the resolution is adopted. For what reason does Senator Fawell seek recognition? SENATOR FAWELL:

I was just curious what we passed. That's all.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

It was a congratulatory resolution, Senator Fawell. Resolutions.

ACTING SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senate Resolution 1635 and Senate Resolution 1636, offered by Senator Madigan.

They're congratulatory.

And Senate Resolution 1637, offered by Senator Dudycz and all Members.

It is a death resolution.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Consent Calendar. Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. For purposes of an announcement. There will be a Judiciary Committee meeting at 3 o'clock in Room 400. We have two bills.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Any other Chairmen having meetings this afternoon wish to make the announcement right now? Senator Dunn.

SENATOR R. DUNN:

Thank you, Mr. President. State Government and Executive Appointments will meet in the morning at 8:30 in Room 212. Few bills.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Senator Donahue.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Thank you, Mr. President. I rise on a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

State your point.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Thank you, sir. I'd like to have an opportunity to -- to have

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the Senate recognize Craig Pierce, who is McDonough County Republican Chairman, and he's here spending the day. And I'd just like to have the Senate recognize him.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Please stand and be recognized. Welcome to Springfield. Senator Demuzio. For what purpose do you rise, Senator Demuzio? SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Thank you very much. I have an inquiry. I notice on the Calendar it indicates that we are here on Tuesday, the 21st and Wednesday, the 22nd.
