PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Will all the Members who are in the general area of my voice hearing area of my voice - please come to the Chamber. The Senate is now convened in the Second Special Session. Mr. Secretary. SECRETARY HARRY:

Proclamation 94-339.

(Secretary reads Proclamation No. 94-339)

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Dated June 30th, 1994, and signed by Jim Edgar, Governor. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

This is the Second Special Session of the 88th General Assembly. The rules adopted by the 88th General Assembly and its officers and committees are in effect for the continuous period of the 88th General Assembly. Three organizational resolutions will be adopted today. These resolutions inform the House that the Senate is ready to conduct business, create a Senate committee of five to wait upon the Governor, and create a Senate Committee of three to approve the Journals. Resolutions.

SECRETARY HARRY:

Senate Resolution 1, offered by Senator Weaver. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

(Secretary reads SR No. 1)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Senator Weaver.

SENATOR WEAVER:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd move for the suspension of the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1, Second Special Session. SECRETARY HARRY:

Senator Weaver moves to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1. Those in favor, say Aye. Those opposed, say Nay. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Weaver now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1. Those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say Nay. The Ayes have it. Senate Resolution No. 1 is adopted. Thank you, Mr. President. I would move for the suspension of the rules for the immediate adoption -- consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 2, Second Special Session.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DeANGELIS)

Senator Weaver moves to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption Senate Resolution No. 2. Those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say Nay. The Ayes have it. The -- the rules are now suspended. Senator Weaver now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 2. Those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say Nay. Discussion? Senator Demuzio. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

You know, Mr. President, I -- you know, you have every right to do whatever you wish to do, because you have the votes requisite number of votes to do. But don't you think it's appropriate to at least give us copies of the resolutions that are being adopted? And -- that's number one. And secondly, can you cite to me under what ruling you have just decreed that the rules of the regular Session are in fact valid for the Special Session? I'm sure that you can point to some specific citing. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

You want me to read it in total? The Chair recognizes that under the administration of former Senate President Rock, the Senate would typically reorganize itself at the commencement of each Session by readopting the then-existing rules and reelecting and reappointing the then existing committees. During this administration, the Chair intends to utilize the procedure outlined in the 1972 Attorney General opinion S-548, which

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procedure was followed during the administration of Senate President Harris. And that procedure and that tradition is that the regular rules are in effect. Senator Demuzio. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Well that is indeed the proper citing. I was just wondering, you know, whether or not you would put that and enter that into the record, 'cause I have it in front of me as well. The question I now pose to you is that don't you think it's appropriate for us to at least have copies of the resolutions that we're going to adopt? I mean, just as a matter of common courtesy? And if you would do that, we would appreciate it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEANGELIS)

Your point is well-taken, Senator Demuzio. All right. We are now in the middle of adopting Senate Resolution No. 2. All those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, say No. The resolution is adopted. Further resolutions?

SECRETARY HARRY:
