And I would like all of you to welcome my good friends here. They run a good city, and it's the largest one in my constituency, and I'm proud to have them here today.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR WEAVER)

Welcome to Springfield, gentlemen. Chair will recognize Senator Topinka.

And we have with us here the spokesman for the group, whose name is Russell Brown - he's with the U.S. Energy Association - who would like to address you first and foremost. And then we would like to introduce the individual members of these Eastern European governments, who are behind us in the President's Gallery. And if

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I may at this time, Mr. Brown.

MR. RUSSELL BROWN:

(Remarks by Mr. Russell Brown)

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Hosting them here in Illinois is the Illinois Commerce this time. I would like to introduce the -- the Commission. Αt individual members of this delegation, who will stand up as their names are called. And if you'll hold your applause until they're all standing, I think they'll all enjoy a big round of applause. Bulgaria, we have Plamen Denchev, Co-chairman of Parliamentary Committee of Energy; also from Bulgaria, Krassimir Naydenov, Co-chairman of the Parliamentary Committee of Energy; Youko Vladev, from Bulgaria, Head of the Division, Economy and Finances Committee of Energy; Radan Kanchev, Executive Director of the NEK, which is the Bulgarian Utility; Boris Ivanov, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Energo Project; Vladimir Milandinov, Senior Expert of Energo Projects, he -- these are all from Bulgaria. From the Czech Republic we have Lenka Danielisova, Attorney, Ministry of Industry, nominated to Chair the Regulatory Committee. If I could have your attention, Ladies and Gentlemen. These visitors have come a long way to visit with us. Josef Antos, Director of Regulatory Department, Ministry of Industry; Ministerial Counsellor, Regulatory Department, Vit Sponer, Ministry of Industry; Marta Ptackova, Financial Director, Ministry of Industry. They are all from the Czech Republic. Coming to us from Romania, we have Virgil Musatescu, we -- he is the Director of -- the Director General for Energy, Ministry of Industry; Alexander Popovici, he's the Deputy Director General for Pricing, Minister of Finance; Constantin Nedelcu, Deputy General Director for Legislation, Ministry of Industry; Stefan Ragalie, Senior Economist, RENEL, which is the Romanian Utility. From Slovakia we have Dusan Valo, Director of the Second Executive Division,

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Antimonopoly Office; Eugen Jurzyca, Deputy Director of the Third Executive Division at the Antimonopoly Office; Karol Gulcik, Head of the Unit of Price Regulation Division, Ministry of Finance; Stefan Herich, Director, Nationalization Energy Consumption and Environment Division, Ministry of the Economy; and Bernard Sestrienka, Head of the Department of Fuels and Energy, the Ministry of Economy.
