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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HENDON)

The Eighth Special Session of the 95th General Assembly will please come to order. Madam Secretary, Reading and Approval of the Journal.

Senator Crotty.

SENATOR CROTTY:

Eleven o'clock, in Room 212, Senate Education hearing. We need everyone there. Senator Risinger, for what purpose do you seek recognition, sir?

SENATOR RISINGER:

For a point of personal privilege, Mr. President.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HENDON)

Go right ahead. State your point, Senator.

SENATOR RISINGER:

I have a -- a five-year-old grandson that's watching these proceedings to see how things run so smoothly in the Senate, and I wanted to say hi to him. Thank you, Mr. President.

And can we have the young Risinger's first name, Senator? SENATOR RISINGER:

His -- his name is Garrett.
