Joseph likes it so much he wants to stay here the whole day, and he'll be back soon, I'm sure. But I'd like the Senate to give us a warm welcome for Joseph Thomas Jones.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Welcome to the Senate, Joe. You're looking very handsome today. Thank you very much and welcome to the Senate and enjoy your day. And also, hello to your brother Jack back there. Hi, Jack. Nice to have you here today. Senator Delgado, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DELGADO:

Thank you, Madam President. On a personal privilege. I'll be very brief.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Sure. State your...

SENATOR DELGADO:

Thank you. I just want to point out, that beautiful young family happens to live in the 2nd Legislative District, and that's the future, and that's -- we're so proud. So we want to welcome not only the children, but the mother and, of course, that great looking young man there is growing up in the 2nd District. We have such a beautiful area there.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

We all agree. And thank you -- and welcome to the Senate, to the whole family. Now we're going to, with leave of the Body, go to page 5 and return to Senate Bill 1292. Senator Lightford. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1292.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

...there been any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. On Senate Bill 1310, Senator Lightford. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1310.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Have there been any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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3rd Reading. With leave of the Body, we'll go to page 6. On the top of the page, Senate Bill 1342. Senator Lightford. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1342.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. With leave of the Body, we'll turn to page 12. On Senate Bill 1587, Senator Muñoz. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1587.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Have there been any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. And on Senate Bill 1589, Senator Muñoz. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1589.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments

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reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. With leave of the Body, we'll turn to page 14. On the bottom of that page, Senate Bill 1794. Senator Lightford. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1794.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. On Senate Bill 1795, Senator Lightford. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1795.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Education adopted Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Have there been any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. We're now going to proceed to Senate Bills 3rd Reading on page 66. Senate Bill 1862. Senator Harmon. Senator Harmon, do you wish to proceed? Madam Secretary, read the bill.

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Senate Bill 1862.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Senate Bill 1862 amends the Data Security on State Computers Act. We created this Act in 2003. At the time, there was a change in the Executive administration and some concern over the handling of State computers. There were also news reports that surplus State computers were discovered with data remaining on their hard drives. In response, we adopted fairly dramatic standards for the erasure of data. In practice, we have determined that it can be done more efficiently and effectively and this language would authorize those alternative methods of protecting the data on State computers. I'm not aware of any opposition and I ask for your Aye votes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, Senator, to close? The question is, shall Senate Bill 1862 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 54 Ayes, no Nays, none voting Present. Having thirty votes or more, Senate Bill 1862, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Koehler, on Senate Bill 1865. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

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Senate Bill 1865.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. Senate Bill 1865 changes the definition of "construction purposes" under the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Act to include alterations, enlargements, and replacements that add appreciably to the value, utility, or useful life of administrative buildings and authorizes the district to issue bonds for this purpose. I know of no opponents and I would appreciate an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, will Senate Bill 1865 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 45 Ayes, 5 Nays, and 1 voting Present. Senate Bill 1865, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 1869. Senator Pankau. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1869.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Pankau.

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SENATOR PANKAU:

Thank you, Madam President. CMS currently maintains a job board on the State website. This would allow any unit of local government to post their job openings on this website also. In this day and age, when we're trying to get as many people hooked up with jobs as we possibly can, to have one more area in which they can find out about jobs, whether they're State jobs or in any other unit -- unit of local government, I think is a good thing. If we can get one more person employed, it'll be a good bill. I ask for your approval of Senate Bill 1869.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, will Senate Bill 1869 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. And the voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 55 Ayes, no Nays, no voting Present. Senate Bill 1869, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Lauzen, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Thank you, Madam President. Point of personal privilege.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

State your point.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

On Senate Bill 1865, I would like the record to reflect my intention to have voted No.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The record will so show it. Senator John Jones, for what purpose do you rise?

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SENATOR J. JONES:

Thank you, Madam President. Point of personal privilege.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

State your point.

SENATOR J. JONES:

Up in the gallery, over there on the Democrat side, we have four students and -- and the instructor from Kaskaskia College Cosmetology Program and they're here in Springfield today visiting and I think they've even got a booth downstairs on the first floor. So if we could welcome the students and the instructor from Kaskaskia College in -- in Clinton County.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Will our visitors in the gallery please rise? And welcome to the Senate. Senate Bill 1894. Senator Hunter. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1894.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Hunter.

SENATOR HUNTER:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 1894 is a recommendation of the Health Care Council of Illinois and it amends the Nursing Home Care Act to eliminate the requirement that in nursing -- that in -- that in licensing any facility for persons with a disability that the Department of Public Health seek advice of the Department of Human Services in devising minimum standards for such individuals. I know of no opposition

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to this bill and I ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, -- shall Senate Bill 1894 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 51 voting Yes, none voting No, and none voting Present. On the question, there -- Senate Bill 1894, having required {sic} the constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1913, Senator Sullivan. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1913.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Thank -- thank you very much, Madam President, Members of the Senate. Previously we passed legislation and it's been signed into law, legislation that would allow a uniform speed limit on rural interstate highways. After the passage of that legislation, it was brought to my attention that there are rural four-lane highways that look like an interstate - they're divided, they have a grass median, two lanes going one direction, two going the other direction - that were not incorporated into the uniform speed limit. There's about fifteen of these roads throughout the State, many of 'em in my district. This would make a uniform speed limit on all four-

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lane highways as it -- it is currently done on rural interstate highways. Be more than happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, Senator, to close? Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Thank -- thank you very much. For the purpose of legislative intent, I just want to indicate that Senate Bill 1644 is cleanup language to Public Act 96-003 {sic}, which was the capital bill, which authorized eighty thousand pound -- eighty thousand pounds on all roads in Illinois. If Public Act 96-0034 is ruled unconstitutional, Senate Bill 1644 does not authorize eighty thousand pound on all roads in Illinois. Excuse me just one minute.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator, this is Senate Bill 1913. Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Thank you. It's been brought to my attention I was referring to a different bill, so please strike that last statement that I made for the purpose of legislative intent. Be more than happy to answer...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Thank you, Senator. Now, on Senate Bill 1913, the question is, shall -- shall Senate Bill 1913 pass. Although Senator Sullivan had his closing remarks, Senator Garrett, I'm sorry, did you have any questions? Senator Garrett.

SENATOR GARRETT:

Thank you very much, Madam President. I just have a question on the speed limit now for the four-lane interstate.

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Is that regional or is that southern Illinois? Tell me how that's going to work.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Absolutely. So, it -- as we did with the previous sixty-five mile per hour, this does not affect Cook and the collar counties, so it's only in the rural districts. There are fifteen of these roads throughout the State of Illinois, I think six of which are in my district. So, these are rural four-lane highways outside of Cook and the collar counties.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Any further discussion? There being none, the question is, will Senate Bill 1913 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 54 Ayes, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 1913, having required {sic} the constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 1929. Senator Harmon. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1929.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Senate Bill 1929 amends the Environmental Protection

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Act. The Act permits facilities that recycle construction and demolition debris subject to a variety of requirements. We're updating those requirements. The most significant change is this: Today they are required to divert from the waste stream seventy-five percent of the material that comes into those facilities. In practice, they have been achieving that by using fine aggregate material repurposed at landfills for daily cover. This clarifies that that practice is permissible. There are a variety of other changes. This is a bipartisan effort. Senator Millner has been very helpful. And I wish he were here today, but in his absence, I believe Senator Steans is going to ask me some questions for legislative intent, though I'm not aware of any opposition to the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? Senator Steans.

SENATOR STEANS:

Thank you, Madam President and Members of the Senate. Senator Harmon, SB 1929 amends the Section of the Environmental Protection Act, Section 22.38, that governs sites that are permitted to exclusively accept general construction and demolition debris. Is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Steans.

SENATOR STEANS:

Senator Harmon, it is my further understanding that, under

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current law, these general construction and demolition debris sites are required to divert at least seventy-five percent of the materials received at these sites from the waste stream. Is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Yes, that is correct.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Steans.

SENATOR STEANS:

As I read Senate Bill 1929, am I correct that the purpose of this legislation is to clarify that certain uses and certain categories of the general construction and demolition debris received at these sites will be counted towards the calculation of that seventy-five percent diversion rate?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Yes. That is correct.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Steans.

SENATOR STEANS:

And this is my last question: Does Senate Bill 1929 in any way amend the definition of "waste" as that term is defined in the Illinois Environmental Protection Act?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

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No. Senate Bill 1929 does not, nor is it intended to, modify the definition of "waste" under current law in any way. Senate Bill 1929 pertains to, and only to, general construction and demolition debris as it relates to the calculation of the seventy-five percent diversion rate as required by Section 22.38 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Any other discussion? There being none, Senator Harmon, to close.

SENATOR HARMON:

I just ask for your Aye votes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The question is, shall Senate Bill 1929 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 52 Ayes, no -- no one voting Nay, and 1 Present. Senate Bill 1929, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1933, Senator Jacqueline Collins. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1933.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

Thank you, Madam President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This is an initiative of our former colleague and now

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State Treasurer, Dan Rutherford. And basically what the legislation does, it decreases the dormancy period for paychecks that come to the Treasurer's Office as unclaimed property from five years to one year.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 1933 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 52 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 1933, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1943, Senator Delgado. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1943.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Delgado.

SENATOR DELGADO:

Thank you, Madam President and Members of the Senate. Senate Bill 1943 expands the written statement concerning a hospital's patients -- a hospital patient's right to include the right not to be discriminated against by the hospital due to certain factors that are not relevant to the patient's medical diagnosis and treatment. Senate Bill 1943 also creates procedures for addressing discrimination grievances and authorizes every hospital to post its emergency room antidiscrimination policy. The intent of this bill is to protect

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the rights of patients and to improve the delivery of health care services. And the proponents were the Department of Public Health and neutral is the Illinois Hospital Association. And I would ask for your Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, Senator, to close? Okay. The question is, will Senate Bill 1943 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 52 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 1943, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1950, Senator Delgado. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1950.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Delgado.

SENATOR DELGADO:

Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. Senate Bill 1950 amends the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act to match penalties for filing false child abuse or neglect reports to those penalties already set in the Criminal Code. This legislation ensures a uniform penalty for filing false reports is an offense of disorderly conduct and is a Class 4 felony. And I would ask for your Aye vote. The proponents were DCFS and the Illinois Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 1950 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 53 Ayes, no Nays, 1 voting Present. Senate Bill 1950, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1962, Senator Millner. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 1967, Senator Maloney. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 1967.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Maloney.

SENATOR MALONEY:

Thank you, Madam President. What -- what Senate Bill 1967 does is it amends the Community College Act. It provides that provisions in a Section requiring the award of a contract to the lowest responsible bidder does not prevent the community college from complying with the terms and conditions of a grant. What this means is, is that grants come in for a specific purpose. Sometimes, when the grant is over twenty-five thousand dollars, it has to be put out to bid, but when the grant comes from, say, a private agency -- for example, IBM would want to donate computers and it was put out to bid and Mac won the -- won the bid, then IBM would not follow through with the grant. So, this is really a technical change, because there is an exemption in

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the Illinois Procurement Code for State agencies, including universities, and this adds community colleges to that list. Be happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 1967 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 55 voting Yes, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 1967, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 1968, Senator Clayborne. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 1972, Senator Althoff. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2007, Senator Dillard. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2007.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Dillard.

SENATOR DILLARD:

Thank you, Madam President and Members. This is an initiative of our former colleague, State Treasurer Dan Rutherford. And it makes a change in the way that the State puts out into the public domain the prospectus for the State's 529 college savings programs, Bright Start. And the current law is that we have to, once a year in a circulation paper of general newspaper circulation, that's usually Springfield and

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Chicago, put out the -- the materials talking about the investment policies of the 529 plans. This would allow us to do it in an -- and still with a newspaper, but an online format. It saves a lot of money on printing costs. Importantly, if you have a child enrolled in these plans, like I do, you receive by U.S. Mail this material at home. But for the general public, they could get it on the Chicago Tribune or State Journal-Register's website. But we would not be required to spend literally tens of thousands of dollars to advertise these in the newspapers. And, again, it -- the information will be there. Parents still get it by U.S. Mail for those who are enrolled in the plan and it's a cost-saving measure of Treasurer Rutherford. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2007 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, 52 are voting Yes, none voting No, none voting Present. On the question, there -- oops! I'm sorry. Senate Bill 2007, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2009, Senator Frerichs. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

Senate Bill 2009.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

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Thank you very much, Madam President. Senate Bill -- 2009 amends the Agricultural Fair Act by providing each county fair State reimbursement for computer equipment used exclusively in conjunction with the organization of the fair. The reimbursement will be provided no more than once in a three-year period.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2009 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 53 voting Yes, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2009, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2010, Senator Frerichs. Madam Secretary, read the bill. Senator Frerichs seeks leave of the Body to return to -- Senate Bill 2010 to the Order of 2nd Reading for an amendment. Leave is granted. On the Order of 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 2010. Madam Secretary, are there any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

Floor Amendment 2, offered by Senator Frerichs.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

Thank you very much. I'd be happy to explain the amendment on -- on the -- on the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

There any discussion? There being none, Senator Frerichs,

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on your bill.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

Okay. Senate Bill 2010, this legislation provides a framework in the Fertilizer Act...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

One minute. On the Floor amendment - I'm sorry - all those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes carry, and the amendment is adopted. Senator -- Madam Secretary, are there any -- further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. Senator Frerichs, thanks for waiting.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

I'm happy to, Madam President. Enjoy being here today with you. This legislation provides...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs, one minute. Senator Frerichs, on Senate Bill 2012. Do you wish to proceed on Senate Bill 2012? Senator Frerichs. Senate Bill 2012. Senator Frerichs, do you wish to proceed? Senator indicates that he does. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2012.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs, for real.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

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For real. All right. Thank you much, Madam Chair -- Madam President. Senate Bill 2012 amends the Food and Agriculture Research Act and the State Finance Act to create the Food and Agricultural Research Fund. The bill specifies that appropriations for the purpose of the Act be made to the Illinois Department of Agriculture, which will allocate funds for research to Illinois public and non-public institutions of higher education. I know of no opponents - and I'm slowly coming into the frame here, move up a little bit - and would ask for a favorable vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill 2012 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. There being 51 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2012, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 2018. Senator Harmon. ...Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2018.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

I'm sorry. I'm a bill ahead of myself, Madam President. If you could take this out of the record.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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You don't have to apologize, Senator Harmon. Out of the record. Senate Bill 2025. Senator Kotowski. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2025.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Kotowski.

SENATOR KOTOWSKI:

Thank you, Madam Chair {sic}. Am I in here? The --perfect. Okay. Senate Bill 2025 extends the Business Location Efficiency Incentive Act until the year 2016. It is currently set to expire on December 31st, 2011. I -- I know of no opposition.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? Senator Lauzen.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Thank you, Madam President. This came through Revenue Committee and enjoyed unanimous support.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Thank you. Senator, to close? The -- the question is, -- shall Senate Bill 2025 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 53 voting Aye, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2025, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2027, Senator Kotowski. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

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SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2027.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Kotowski.

SENATOR KOTOWSKI:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 2027 is an initiative of the Attorney General's Office and it provides that a person commits the offense of forgery when he or she knowingly makes a false document. And for the purposes of the bill, a "false document" is -- includes, but not limited to, a document whose contents are false in some material way, or that purports to have been made by another or at another time, or with different provisions, or by authority of one who did not give such authority.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2027 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. There are 53 voting Yes, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2027, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2040, Senator Sandack. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2040.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Thank you, Madam President. I'm already being heckled. This is an initiative -- 2040 is an initiative of the Illinois State Bar Association, charitably given to me, with respect to the lawsuit of People versus -- Williams versus -- the People of the State of Illinois {sic} (People v. Williams). Essentially, it's a technical revision to our Criminal Code, which basically makes our State statute comply with the federal copyright provision. Essentially, our State antipiracy statute is now conforming with the federal law, so that all music and copyright music provisions from 1972 backwards are protected by our State statute. Everything forward has to comply with the federal copyright law. So this conforms our State statute to the federal law. I'm happy to take any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack, this sounds like it could be your first bill. Okay. And I just want to let you know, Senator, you do not have to take any questions. But, Senator Murphy, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR MURPHY:

Question of the sponsor, Madam President. Senator Kotowski, is this your first bill?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sotowski. Senator Sandack, we're both wrong. You're new here.

SENATOR SANDACK:

I -- I will yield to Senator Kotowski.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

You're not Senator Kotowski?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

No, but I play him on TV and I wish to aspire to be Senator Kotowski.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

Be careful. Be very careful. Senator, congratulations. Now, there's one question, though. I do have one issue and I -- I don't know if there's any representatives from the <u>Daily Herald</u> ed board here, but is it true that you currently are a double dipper?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Absolutely untrue. My mayoral position is gratis.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

And -- and, in fact, you'll be giving up those duties soon, correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

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On May 3rd, Senator.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

It was suggested to me that I ask that you spell the word "gratis". Is it anywhere in your bill?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

It is not. G-r-a-t-i-s. Latin.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

In -- in closing, Senator Luechtefeld, please note how smart that lawyer is, that he was able to spell the word "gratis". Congratulations, Senator Sandack. You are a welcome addition to this Chamber. In addition to being a longtime friend, I am very proud to now call you a colleague. This place is better for having you here. Good luck on your first bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack, I think everybody loves your bill. I -- there's a few more speakers. Senator Haine.

SENATOR HAINE:

Will the sponsor yield for a question?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

He says he does.

SENATOR HAINE:

So can you give us a list of the recordings that this bill is applicable to?

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

I -- I am absolutely unable to do that. It would be a filibuster. But I do understand that there was music recorded before 1972 which would -- this bill would cover.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Haine.

SENATOR HAINE:

So -- but you can't give us a list? You can't give us just a few names from the era of the sixties and the fifties and the forties? My era. You can't tell me that I will be violating the law if I take a cassette recorder, transform it into a CD - I'll be violating the law with this bill? Isn't that my right as an American citizen to keep the memory of Elvis alive? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Elvis is alive, sir. And -- and you are absolutely permitted to keep his memory alive in any way, shape or form you wish; you simply can't sell any recordings as if they were your own.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Think he's in the building. Senator Haine.

SENATOR HAINE:

And I can't record and sell to my children and grandchildren and great-grandchildren the Rolling Stones from the sixties? I...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Stones, Beatles.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Haine.

SENATOR SANDACK:

All that.

SENATOR HAINE:

To the -- to the bill. To the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

To the bill.

SENATOR HAINE:

I know the Rolling Stones are still alive and still recording. In fact, in twenty years, they'll still be recording and performing. The Speaker will still be Speaker of the House. We'll all be gone, however. And -- and we have this bill before us, which I believe, Senator, with all due respect, is a disgrace - to limit my ability to record and do whatever I want to with it as an American. Music is free. It's the American way to keep Elvis alive. And you say he's alive - he's probably serving as an alderman in Chicago. Or he's on trial in federal court, I heard, too. Thank you, Senator, for your work on this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Dillard, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR DILLARD:

Thank you. Question of the sponsor, if he'll yield.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

He says he'll yield.

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SENATOR DILLARD:

What year were you born, Senator Sandack?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

1964.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Dillard.

SENATOR DILLARD:

Thank you. Thank you. So, he's a lot older than I thought he was. I was going to -- I was going to say, you know, if -- if he was really, really that young, he ought to let old guys like Senator Haine and I handle recordings prior to 1972 for some of our favorites. Senator Sandack, another question. Since this deals with sound recordings and comes from the State Bar Association, have you consulted the attorneys for former Governor Blagojevich about their expertise in recording sounds? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

I have not, though it's a brilliant idea. And should this measure pass, I'm happy to try and go that route with additional information.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Dillard.

SENATOR DILLARD:

The last question, since he replaced the esteemed Senator Dan Cronin, who was known to want to always keep himself very healthy: Did you inherit, in your predecessor's desk, all the

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hand sanitizer and Echinacea tablets and everything that Senator Cronin used to keep in that desk? What happened to all of those?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Yes. It's still here. It's a constant reminder of my predecessor and his habits, which were pristine in all respects.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Dillard.

SENATOR DILLARD:

Just to the bill. You know, I agree with Senator Murphy, you're a great addition to this Body. And hopefully you're a member of the Bar Association, since they asked you to carry this great piece of legislation. And I'll decide over the next thirty seconds how I'm going to vote on your bill. But welcome, Senator Sandack.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

I think it'll be more than thirty seconds, Senator Dillard. Senator Hutchinson.

SENATOR HUTCHINSON:

Will the sponsor yield?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

He says he will.

SENATOR HUTCHINSON:

Senator Sandack, where are you from?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

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I am from the great Village of Park Forest, is where I was born. Your area.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Hutchinson.

SENATOR HUTCHINSON:

I -- I wanted to ask that because I detected a slight accent and I -- and I wanted to know exactly what region of the State you originally came from. So I'd really like the record to reflect that I am responsible for Senator Sandack and all good things that he passes in terms of legislation as his -- as his Senator. I'm -- I'm his Senator. So I just wanted the record to reflect that, while I also stood to say, welcome to the Senate. Really gotten to -- enjoy getting to know you and I'm looking forward to the good things you're going to do.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack, I'll take all the bad 'cause I'm the other Senator in Park Forest. So, I'll carry the water for you. Senator Kotowski, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR KOTOWSKI:

For a couple of reasons, Madam President. My name was used in debate and I'm also the leader of the bald caucus on the Floor and I've taken on that title and I proudly wear it, or don't wear it, 'cause I don't really have much to wear. There are some people in this Chamber who cannot pull off bald and handsome, Senator Sandack. And one of them was the previous Senator who spoke from Palatine. I believe that -- was that Senator Sandoval? Or was that Senator -- it was Senator Sandoval. Senator Murphy. They -- they look very much alike. I cleared that joke with Senator Sandoval, so I will be driving

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home safely today. Everything's going to be fine. Don't worry. I just have a couple questions about the bill and the -- I want to know why you chose February 15th instead of February 14th. I don't know if it's -- you know, 'cause February 14th is Valentine's Day. It's a very important day for many of us here in this Chamber. And I just want to know why you chose the 15th instead of the 14th.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

...you. That's an excellent question. I -- I didn't choose it, Senator; our federal laws did, because the copyright statute, it becomes effective February 15, 1972. So all music recordings previous thereto would be still subject to our State antipiracy statute.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Kotowski.

SENATOR KOTOWSKI:

See, I don't understand what "previous thereto" means. Okay? I think that's confusing. I have a great deal of respect for the sponsor. I think you're just trying to obfuscate the fact that you are against romance, that you're anti-love, that you're against Valentine's Day, and you don't want to protect songs that inspire a sense of warmth and connection among other people. And I have a problem with that and I have a problem with phrases like "thereto" that are overly lawyerly. This Chamber is becoming too lawyerly. In fact, we are going to introduce a bill to abolish the word "thereto" henceforth. So, I would like you to respond to that. Thank you.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Oh, I feel a spelling bee coming on. Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

I shan't respond to that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Kotowski.

SENATOR KOTOWSKI:

This is a conundrum. I was wondering if, per chance, per chance, we would like to have this discussion at a future date. I -- I would like to say, I'm not going to shower you with compliments as some of my other compliments -- other -- my colleagues. I'm -- I'm glad that you're here and it has nothing to do with your talent and your capability and your reputation and your history. It has everything to do with the fact that, like I said, there are people who can -- they work their whole lives to try and pull off the fact that they're follicly challenged. They don't do a good job of it. And I'm insulted by that when I walk down the street and I see bald people who are not handsome. You, my friend, you pull it off. All right? You pull it off and it gives me something -- gives me hope, something to strive for. I wake up, in the mirror -- look in the mirror and I say, "Maybe Sandack someday. Maybe like him." You know. So, God bless you. Congratulations to you on your first bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Jacobs, for what reason do you rise? SENATOR JACOBS:

Thank you, Madam Chairman. To the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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To the bill.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Senator, is it true you are a registered solicitor in the State of Illinois?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Thought the Senator said to the bill. But I will answer nonetheless. I am a member of the Bar in the State of Illinois. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

When you were running for a prestigious office, such as the Senate, did you ever find the occasion where a fellow member of the Bar contributed to your campaign?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

I have not heretofore, for my Senator Kotowski's friends, run for the Senate, so I've never had anyone contribute to a Senate campaign.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Do the lawyers contribute to your family household in providing coverage for your family and -- and bills and those kind of things?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

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SENATOR SANDACK:

By lawyers in the plural, I assume you just mean me, and yes, I cover much of the family overhead at the Sandack household.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

And therein lies the rub. I looked at this bill and it seems that the only proponent for this bill is the Illinois Trial Lawyers. Is this a simple case of pay to play?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sandack.

SENATOR SANDACK:

Pay to play, no, sir. Play music before 1972 and sell it without attribution, yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Raoul, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR RAOUL:

I just rise because baldness was used in the debate. And to my good friend who's part of the follicly challenged caucus, I rise in great support of your bill, notwithstanding the fact that 1960's music is known to make your hair grow. I rise in strong support of the gentleman with the similar hairdo. It's much more handsome than Senator Kotowski. Welcome to the Senate.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Koehler, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Thank you, Madam President. I want to correct the record,

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because my name was used in debate as well. I've had two occasions now when people have talked about being follicly challenged. I am follicly liberated, and any time you want to use my comb, you get it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Oh, is there any other discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2040 pass. The -- all those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. And the voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. I had to -- oh! I... Oh! There -- on that question, there are 50 voting Yes, 3 voting No, and none voting Present. Senate Bill 2040, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Congratulations. Senator Schmidt, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR SCHMIDT:

I rise to the -- the prior vote. I don't want this guy against me, you know. I'd like to record a Yes vote on that. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The record -- the record will reflect your intention. Senator Rezin, why did -- for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR REZIN:

A point of personal privilege, Madam President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

State your point.

SENATOR REZIN:

I have a young gentleman here today with me. His name is David Welter. This past November, he ran for and was

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successfully elected to the county board. He is the youngest county board member in Grundy County. He was born in 1991. At the ripe age of nineteen, he now chairs the technology committee at the county level and also is vice chair of the cost benefit analysis. He is working on increasing transparency in county government by also putting our budget online. And David is a student at Joliet Junior College. I would like to extend a warm Springfield welcome to David Welter.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Welcome, David, to the Senate. Senator Raoul, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR RAOUL:

I guess I'm challenged in more than one way. On Senate Bill 2040, I was a little bit slow and inadvertently pushed the wrong button. I'd like to be recorded as a Yes, or my intent was to be a Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The record will reflect your intention. On -- Senator Sandoval, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR SANDOVAL:

Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. I'd like to welcome to the Illinois Senate some high school students who are from the Pilsen Wellness Center in Pilsen who are -- been mentoring to get ahead in life and get to college at some point. And they are -- they are joined by and mentored by my -- none other than my daughter, Angie, who is a junior at the University of Illinois at Chicago, who is a political science major in Chicago. Like to welcome them, in the gallery today, to Springfield.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Will our visitors please rise in the gallery? Welcome to the Senate. Now on page 68. The top of the page is Senate Bill 2042. Senator Millner. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2056, Senator Sullivan. Madam Secretary, read the bill. SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2056.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Thank you, Madam President and Members of the Senate. Senate Bill 2056 removes the length limit for the distance between the kingpin and the center of the rear axel on semitrailers. The kingpin is the pivot point where the semi and the trailer connect. It namely -- mainly affects livestock trailers that do not have adjustable rear axels. I'd be more than happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2056 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed, vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 54 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2056, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Now on Senate Bill 2062, Senator Harmon. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

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SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2062.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Senate Bill -- 2062 is an initiative of a constituent. A -- a new business in my district in Oak Park that does computer forensic services came to me with the -- the troubling realization that the Department of Professional Regulation was attempting to regulate them as private detectives, primarily because it wasn't clear that they shouldn't be. This bill would clarify that computer forensics services companies are not private detectives subject to regulation so long as they don't hold themselves out to be private detectives. I'm not aware of any opposition and I ask for your Aye votes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2062 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 55 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2062, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Now on Senate Bill 2073, Senator Link. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

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Senate Bill 2073.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Link.

SENATOR LINK:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 2073 amends the Property Tax Code and requires that the Property Tax Appeal Board to -- decide appeals with -- within three hundred and sixty-five days of filing. PTAB can -- cannot complete its work on time. The huge backlog of cases continues and almost twenty-three percent of cases filed since 2000 remain undecided. Be more than happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? Senator Lauzen.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Thank you, Madam President. Just want to report to the Body that this bill came through Revenue Committee and enjoyed unanimous support.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

So the question is, shall Senate Bill 2073 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 52 voting Aye, 1 voting Nay, and none voting Present. Senate Bill 2073, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 2083. Senator Pankau. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

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Senate Bill 2083.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Pankau.

SENATOR PANKAU:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 2083 amends the Limited Liability Company Act and reduces the expedited service fee for a limited liability company's articles of organization from a hundred dollars down to zero. This came about from a number of chamber of commerce meetings that I was at, where different businesses would tell me that the Department of Revenue encourages them to renew their LLCs online. But when they do that, they are charged an extra hundred dollars expedition fee. Now, anybody can understand an expedited fee when you're first forming your company and you want it done quickly and you want to get everything established, but just for ordinary renewals, there should not be an -- an additional expedited fee. And this takes that away. I urge your support of Senate Bill 2083.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? Senator Lauzen.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Madam President, it came through Revenue Committee, unanimous support.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

Will the sponsor yield for a question?

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

She says she will.

SENATOR HARMON:

Senator, I apologize to interrupt late in the discussion here. I just -- I want to clarify my understanding. Would people no longer be able to obtain expedited service or would they just not be required to pay for expedited service?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Pankau.

SENATOR PANKAU:

They absolutely will be able to have expedited service, but when they're renewing and it's not in an expedited manner, they will not have to pay that additional hundred dollars just because they renewed online. Which is what the -- the office is doing right now. They're requiring it when you just renew online.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Harmon.

SENATOR HARMON:

And if the renewal has to be done in an expedited manner in -- in part because the -- the business failed to do it in advance, would -- would they be able to accomplish that on an expedited basis and -- and pay for it if they need the expedited services?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Pankau.

SENATOR PANKAU:

Yes. This bill only applies to the annual renewals.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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Senator Harmon? Is there any other discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2083 pass. The voting is those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 52 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2083, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On a point of an announcement: Members who committed to hold their bills on 2nd Reading to negotiate language are advised that next week is the 3rd Reading deadline, so it is suggested that you should move negotiations along to be able to meet the deadline. Also, I'd like to inform the Members that when the Senate meets on Monday afternoon, we will take up the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading on the Calendar. It is the intention of the Chair that this will be the last time that we will go to that order on the Calendar before 3rd Reading deadline next Friday, April 15th. And if Members have Floor amendments they intend to be heard before the deadline, you should file those Floor amendments by the close of the business next Monday, April 11th. This will provide time for those bills to be assigned to the committee so that they can be heard during the 3rd Reading deadline week. I would also like to remind everyone that Friday, April 15th, is the 3rd Reading deadline for Senate bills. Thank you. Now on Senate Bill 2084. Senator Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2096, Senator Althoff. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2096.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

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3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Althoff.

SENATOR ALTHOFF:

Thank you very much, Madam President. And just so everybody knows, we're part of the redhead caucus. Senate Bill 2096 is a result of our Accessibility Task Force, which recommended the adoption of federal guidelines for press boxes, and that language says "An accessible route shall not be required to press boxes in bleachers that have points of entry at only one level provided that the aggregate area of all press boxes is five hundred square feet maximum." This bill incorporates the federal language and also dissolves the task force. I'd request an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2096 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 51 voting Aye, none voting Nay, and 1 voting Present. Senate Bill 2096, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2133, Senator Garrett. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2133.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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Senator Garrett.

SENATOR GARRETT:

Thank you very much, Madam President. Senate Bill 2133 amends the Block Grants for Chicago Article of the School Code to remove the provision that requires the educational services block grant to include the Bilingual Program. Under this legislation, CPS would be required to submit claims for bilingual education, as opposed to the current practice where they receive about fifty-five to sixty percent of the funding for the entire State for the entire Bilingual Program. I'd be happy to answer any questions and there is only one opponent and I'm not sure they really are, but CPS.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2133 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 52 voting Aye, none voting Nay, and 1 voting Present. Senate Bill 2133, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2138, Senator Garrett. Wish to proceed? Madam Secretary, read the bill. Senator Garrett seeks the leave of the Body to return Senate Bill 2138 to 2nd Reading. Leave is granted. On the Order of 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 2138. Madam Secretary, are there any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

Floor Amendment 3, offered by Senator Garrett.
PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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Senator Garrett.

SENATOR GARRETT:

Yes, thank you, again, Madam President. Floor Amendment No. 3 just adds one additional member to the Illinois Electric Vehicle Council. The additional member shall be a representative of any electric utility appointed by the Governor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted. Are there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ROCK:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

3rd Reading. Senate Bill 2143. Senator Sullivan. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2143.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Sullivan.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. 2143 amends the School Construction Law to allow reorganized school districts or cooperative high schools created in the past four years - it currently is two years - to utilize the school construction grant application. Legislation passed last year

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inadvertently omitted and should have included one school district in the State of Illinois - it happens to be in my district - Illini West 307. This would correct that -- that mistake. Ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2143 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 52 voting Aye, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2143, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On Senate Bill 2145, Senator Jacobs. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2145.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Thank you, Madam Chairman {sic}. This is a initiative of the State Fire Marshal. It simply takes the date and moves it from 2012 to 2022 for -- as an extension. I know of no opposition.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2145 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who

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wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 54 voting Yes, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2145, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Emil Jones, for what purpose do you rise? SENATOR E. JONES:

Thank you, Madam President. I'd like to be recorded as a Yes on Senate Bill 2096.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The record will so reflect your intention. Now on Senate Bill 2172, Senator Clayborne. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2185, Senator Cullerton. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2188, Senator Holmes. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

Senate Bill 2188.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Holmes.

SENATOR HOLMES:

SECRETARY ROCK:

Thank you so much, Madam President. I would first like to say something, though. I have an issue with this bald caucus, because I think it sounds discriminatory to me, as I don't think there's any women on that, and I may need to find an attorney. I think I can find one without tripping over them in this Chamber, and I may be pursuing that. Just wanted to warn the caucus. Anyway, Senate Bill 2188 amends the -- Personnel Code by removing a paragraph requiring the Director of the Department of Central Management Services to conduct research and planning

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exercises regarding the total manpower needs of all offices, which includes the statewide elected officials, but not the colleges and universities, and to prescribe a method of reporting their needs and requests. There aren't the resources to do this and the constitutional officers have their own offices that conduct this.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2188 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 53 voting Aye, none voting Nay, and none voting Present. Senate Bill 2188, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Now on Senate Bill 2190, Senator Hutchinson. Out of the record. Senate Bill 2232. Senator Frerichs. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2232.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

Ready to go, Madam President. Thank you very much. Senate Bill -- 2232 mandates that a bill making General Revenue Fund appropriations be posted for four days on the General Assembly website before final legislative action by the General Assembly. It's similar to a bill that passed out of this Chamber last year

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unanimously, unfortunately it didn't get called for a vote in the House.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Will the sponsor yield, please, Madam President?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

States he will.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Senator Frerichs, you mentioned that -- that there was a bill that passed last year. Was it -- was it identical to this language or was the -- the sunset -- or sunshine time different? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

The four-day requirement was the same.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

...bill -- to the bill, if I might, Madam President. I simply rise in support of the bill. The bill did pass, I believe, the Executive Committee unanimously. Last year, as the sponsor noted, every Member of the Senate said we believe that the budget should sit for a period of days before being acted on, and then later -- I think that was in March of last year. And then in May, we waited for a couple, three hours before we passed a budget. Let's hope that this year this bill is taken more seriously. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

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Senator, to close?

SENATOR FRERICHS:

No opponents. Request a favorable vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

The question is, shall Senate Bill 2232 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. Take the vote. On that record, 55 are voting Yes, none are voting No, none are voting Present. Senate Bill 2232, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 2236. Senator Frerichs. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2236.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Frerichs.

SENATOR FRERICHS:

Thank you very much, Madam President. So, this bill clarifies educational requirements necessary to qualify for examination for Licensed Land Surveyor-in-Training. The Association's in support and I know of no opponents. Would request a favorable vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2236 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?

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Take the record. On that question, there are 54 voting Aye, none voting No, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2236, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Now on Senate Bill 2293, Senator Althoff. Madam Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 2293.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Senator Althoff.

SENATOR ALTHOFF:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 2293 authorizes the Illinois Comptroller, the Illinois Department of Revenue and the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States to enter into a reciprocal offset agreement to collect debts owed to the State and the federal government. Similar programs are under way in five other states, including Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Wisconsin and West Virginia. I would like to note that the initial startup costs to the Comptroller are estimated about seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars, but the Department of Revenue estimates that the program could bring to the State of Illinois an additional six to ten million dollars in unpaid debts. Be happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR CROTTY)

Is there any discussion? There being none, the question is, shall Senate Bill 2293 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take

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the record. On that question, Senate Bill 2293 -- on that question, there are 55 voting Aye, none voting Nay, none voting Present. Senate Bill 2293, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senate Bill 2299. Out of the record. Senator Cullerton. Senate Bill 2300. Senator Cullerton. Out of the record. Senate Bill 2301. Senator Cullerton. Out of the record. Okay, I've just been told that there was a sponsor change on Senate Bill Senator Dillard. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2302, Senator Cullerton. Out of the record. On Senate Bill 2303, Senator Cullerton. Out of the record. Senator Trotter in the Chair.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Page 23 of your Calendar. Top of the page. Back to 3rd Readings. It's Senate Bill -- Senate Bill 8. Cullerton. Senate President Cullerton. Senate Bill 16. Senator Collins. Wish to proceed? Madam Secretary, please read the bill. SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 16.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins, to explain the bill.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Senate Bill 16 creates a foreclosure prevention counseling program, which is to be administered by the Illinois Housing Development Authority. This program distributes grants to HUD-certified housing counseling agencies in order to support

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pre-purchase and post-purchase home-ownership education, along with foreclosure prevention counseling activities. The funds for counseling grants will be split with seventy-five percent going outside of Chicago and twenty-five percent going to the City of Chicago. This replicates a bill I sponsored in 2009. However, once it reached the House, it was amended for a different purpose. And I just ask for -- it is subject to appropriation. However, I have a bill in the House that will be the revenue stream for this fund.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Thank you. Is there any discussion? Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Thank you, Mr. President. Will the sponsor yield, please?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

She has mentioned that she will.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Thank you. Senator Collins, who would do the counseling as you -- under this bill?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

The counseling will be administered by HUD-approved housing counselors.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

What -- at what point in the foreclosure process would a person be eligible to receive this counseling? Is this if they're having trouble making their house payment and so they

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want to go get educated or they're already subject to foreclosure proceedings and so now they're going to get the counseling? I mean, at what point do -- do these people get educated, for lack of a better term?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

As far as the foreclosure - because it's also with prepurchase and post-purchase of home ownership - the foreclosure
counseling will be a part of the prevention -- foreclosure
prevention - so, if a family is having problems meeting their
payments. This does not replicate the HAMP program whatsoever
with the -- with the modification. This is prior to getting
actually into foreclosure. So this is trying to prevent them
from the foreclosure procedure.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Okay. The -- the -- and I -- I didn't catch it. There's another program that also provides counseling. Tell me about that one and at what point does that other program provide counseling?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

The federal government has a program called HAMP, where by all measurements has been a failure. Initially, when it was initiated by the Obama administration, it was to help at least four million people who might be facing foreclosure. To this

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point, they've only been able to help six hundred thousand. So, and standards all measurements and even by the administration, it has been admitted to be a failure. This program is based on the counseling that's available now. the statistics from the Illinois Department of -- Housing Authority, there are -- there are no housing counseling services in rural and downstate Illinois. That's why the distribution of the funding will be directed to seventy-five percent outside of Chicago. As we know now, the increasing of foreclosures are now in Will County, McHenry County. And many agencies -- nonprofit agencies don't have the capacity for -- to do the counseling at this point. So this would increase the capacity for those agencies, nonprofit agencies, to be engaged in foreclosure prevention and counseling.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Senator, what -- help me understand what it is that this program is going to teach people. I mean, someone is behind in their mortgage, I'm assuming -- that's kind of the -- that's kind of the scenario you've outlined, where someone is having trouble making their payments. The payments are too high. Their income isn't sufficient. What is it that they're going to be taught that will remedy their situation?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

That is the counseling under the HAMP program. This is counseling for pre-purchase and post-purchase of home ownership

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and the prevention of foreclosure. They might be just thirty days late or have a problem. So, this would direct them to agencies, because I passed legislation also, two years ago, that before the bank or a lender can close, they have to have counseling. And so this would just allow them to have the same capacity that I put in the statute; that before a lender can move on foreclosure, they need counseling, to go through approved HUD counseling agency. So, this really enhances the legislation I've already passed allowing counseling for people going forward in foreclosure.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Okay, I'm looking -- thank you. Senator, I'm looking at the language in the bill. This is for pre-purchase also. ...this -- so this would be also eligible for people who haven't even bought the home and signed the mortgage, is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

Many times, part of the problem that we face with the high rate of foreclosure, many people got into a loan situation and didn't understand what they were signing. So, I'm -- I was a first-time home purchaser maybe five years ago. So I went through a HUD-sponsored education program on -- it was administered by the neighborhood housing service - just to get an understanding of what I was encountering. So I think this is well -- helping those individuals to prevent them from even getting into a -- a situation where they sign a mortgage that

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they can't afford or they don't understand. So it's -- I think it's a well -- it's part of financial literacy, enhancing the education and the understanding of what people are actually getting into when they file or when they sign a mortgage.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Thank you, Mr. President. Okay, now we've covered the prepurchase. Now, let's talk about, again, the post-purchase.
What will be the requirement to qualify for one of these
programs? Do you have to be a -- a month late, two months late?
Do you have to make some kind of indication that you think
you're running into trouble on it? I mean, what's the -- what
is the gatekeeper for people to try to get into -- to the -- to
the post-purchase part of the program?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Collins.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

I think you're confusing the post-purchase home-ownership education with the foreclosure issue or the loan modification program.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Righter.

SENATOR RIGHTER:

Mr. President, to the bill, if I might. Thank you. Actually, Senator Collins, you may be right. I'm -- I'm probably confused about all the programs that we have on this issue. I would agree with that. This is -- this is one of those issues, Ladies and Gentlemen, about whether or not you

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think it is your constituents' and your taxpayers' responsibility to talk to someone to make sure before they sign a mortgage and buy a home that they -- what they get themselves into and whether or not you think that's their responsibility or you think that your taxpayers and the State's taxpayers should pay to create a program to walk them through that. That's not what my constituents want. That's not what my taxpayers want. In a day and age when we are talking about cutting money to schools, cutting from Medicaid, cutting to other services, do we want to now layer another burden on the General Revenue Fund and say we're going to create another - another, because we already have - another foreclosure counseling program. I would urge a No vote. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Seeing there's no further discussion, Senator Collins, to close.

SENATOR J. COLLINS:

I mentioned that this bill was subject to appropriation. I also mentioned that I have a bill that I'm working on negotiating with the banks. The taxpayers will not be paying for this counseling. The funding will come from an agreement that I'm working on - a housing bill, a foreclosure bill that I'm working on with the banks. So it will not be coming out of the General Revenue Fund. Thank you. I ask for a Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

The question is, shall Senate Bill 16 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On the question, there are 35 Yeas,

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17 Nays, none voting Present. Having received the required constitutional majority, the bill, Senate Bill 16, is declared passed. Proceeding along on page 23. Senate Bill 18. President Cullerton. Senate Bill 21. President Cullerton. Senate Bill 22. President Cullerton. Senate Bill 23. President Cullerton. Senate Bill 24. Senator Steans. Senate Bill 35. Senator Lauzen. Senator Lauzen, do you wish to proceed on Senate Bill 35? Seeing he does, Madam Secretary, please read the bill.

SECRETARY ROCK:

Senate Bill 35.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Lauzen, to explain the bill.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Thank you very much, Mr. President. Senate Bill 35 provides for the direct election of Republican State central committeemen. Proponents wish to have the right to vote for their leaders in the Republican parties {sic}, as we did for approximately fifty years and as the Democrat primary voters continue enjoying now. We passed this bill four years ago out of the Senate unanimously. We passed it two years ago by a vote of 44 to 13. I'm happy to answer any questions.

SENATOR LAUZEN:

Provides that, if a county maintains an Internet website, then the county must create and maintain on that website a centralized, searchable database, freely accessible to the public, of information concerning appointed county positions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Senator Martinez, to the bill.

SENATOR MARTINEZ:

Thank you, Mr. President, Members of the Senate. Senate Bill 153 amends the Massage Licensing Act. It requires Social Security numbers is on all applications for original, renewed, reinstated, or restored licenses. Permits applicants licensed as a massage therapist in other states to be licensed by endorsement for the State of Illinois. The Department may impose fines of up to ten thousand dollars for violation of the Act. Any formal complaint against the licensee filed with them may be made public record. And I'll be happy to answer any questions.

SENATOR DILLARD:

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informal opinion, and other communities have interpreted "zoning jurisdiction" to mean the area under the -- a -- a community's jurisdiction and not that they need to have zoning in place. This legislation codifies that interpretation and it levels the playing field for all communities. I'd be more than happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)

Is there any questions? Seeing none, Senator Sullivan, to close.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Just ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR TROTTER)
