Advancing Informal STEM Learning (CFDA No. 47.076)

Purpose: To improve public, informal STEM learning experiences through six types of projects.

Eligibility: Unrestricted.

Funding: \$39 million; awards between \$150,000 and \$3 million.

Deadline: 1/12/2021.

AmeriCorps State and National Grants, FY 2021 (CFDA No. 94.006)

Purpose: To engage AmeriCorps members in evidence-based or informed interventions that will strengthen communities.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with or without the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: Not specified.

Deadline: 1/6/2021.

Collaborative Research (CFDA No. 45.161)

Purpose: To support groups of two or more scholars that seek to increase humanistic knowledge through meetings, research, manuscript preparation for collaborative publications, and the creation of scholarly digital projects.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$2.5 million; awards of up to \$250,000.

Community Health Access and Rural Transformation (CHART) (CFDA No. 93.624)

Purpose: To assess community healthcare needs and implement a healthcare delivery system redesign.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of

higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$75 million; awards of up to \$5 million.

Community Connect Grant Program (CFDA No. 10.863)

Purpose: To provide applicants with financial assistance that will enable them to provide service at or above the broadband grant speed to all locations in rural, economically-challenged communities without broadband service.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: Not specified; awards between \$100,000 and \$3 million.

Digital Humanities Advancement Grants (CFDA No. 45.169)

Purpose: To support innovative, experimental, and/or computationally challenging digital projects.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$2 million; awards of up to \$375,000.

Deadline: 1/15/2021.

H-1B One Workforce Grant Program (CFDA No. 17.268)

Purpose: To build “proof of concept” training models

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that can be replicated by the broader workforce system in order to respond to workforce challenges without duplicating existing programs.

Eligibility: Businesses; business-related nonprofit organizations such as industry and trade associations or organizations acting as workforce intermediaries serving industry needs; education and training providers, including community colleges, other community-based organizations, and for-profit educational and training institutions; entities involved in administering the public workforce system established under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act; and economic development agencies.

Funding: \$150 million; awards between \$500,000 and \$10 million.

H-1B Rural Healthcare Grant Program (CFDA No. 17.268)

Purpose: To reduce healthcare workforce shortages by creating sustainable employment and training programs in healthcare occupations (including behavioral and mental healthcare) that serve rural communities.

Eligibility: Partnerships of public and private sector entities where the lead applicant is a healthcare employer; healthcare industry and/or occupation association; nonprofit healthcare organization affiliated with hospitals or other medical facilities; an organization designed as a Primary Care Association by HRSA; Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act state and local workforce development boards; and Native American tribal governments and program entities.

Funding: \$40 million; awards between \$500,000 and \$2.5 million.

Lead-Based Paint Capital Fund Program (LBPCF) (CFDA No. 14.888)

Purpose: To evaluate and reduce lead-based paint and other housing-related hazards, such as mold and carbon monoxide.

Eligibility: Public Housing Authorities.

Funding: \$31 million; awards between \$10,000 and \$5 million.

Deadline: 11/2/2020.

Preservation Assistance Grants for Smaller Institutions (CFDA No. 45.149)

Purpose: To help small and mid-sized institutions improve their ability to preserve and care for significant humanities collections, particularly institutions that have never received an NEH grant.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$600,000; awards of up to \$15,000.

Deadline: 1/14/2021.

Public Scholars (CFDA No. 45.160)

Purpose: To offer grants to authors to fund activities leading to the creation of well-researched, nonfiction humanities books for the public.

Eligibility: Individuals.

Funding: \$1.5 million; awards between \$30,000 and \$60,000.

Scholarly Editions and Scholarly Translations (CFDA No. 45.161)

Purpose: To support collaborative teams that are editing, annotating, and translating humanities texts that are currently inaccessible or available only in inadequate editions or translations.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$4 million; awards of up to \$450,000.

Deadline: 12/2/2020.

Service Area Competition (CFDA No. 93.224)

Purpose: To provide primary healthcare services to medically underserved communities by ensuring continued access through the Health Center Program.

Eligibility: Public or private nonprofits, including faith- and community-based organizations, and Native American tribes and tribal organizations.

Funding: \$13.05 million.

Deadline: 11/16/2020.
