Dialogues on the Experience of War (Opp. No. 20220901-AV)

Purpose: To support the study and discussion of important humanities war and military service sources to encourage U.S. military veterans and others to think more deeply about the issues they raise.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Purpose: To conduct research activities that support identification of barriers to equitable access to Child Nutrition (CN) programs and strategies to help overcome these barriers.

Eligibility: Public, private, and state institutions of higher education, nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education.

Funding: \$2 million.

Purpose: To support new organizational capacity to provide training and other technical assistance to

network or consortia members so they may become third-party SNAP E&T providers.

Eligibility: Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education.

Funding: \$3 million; awards between \$1 million and \$2 million.

FY 2022 Competitive Funding Opportunity: All Stations Accessibility Program (Opp. No. FTA-2022-009-TPM-ASAP)

CFDA No.: 20.533

Purpose: To assist recipients that operate or allocate funds to inaccessible pre-ADA (or “legacy”) rail fixed guideway public transportation systems, and states (including territories and Washington, D.C.) and local governments that operate or financially support legacy rail fixed guideway public transportation systems and corresponding legacy stations and facilities for (1) capital projects to repair, improve, modify, retrofit, or relocate infrastructure of stations or facilities for passenger use, including load-bearing members that are an essential part of the structural frame; or (2) for planning projects to develop or modify a plan for pursuing public transportation accessibility projects, assessments of accessibility, or assessments of planned modifications to stations or facilities for passenger use projects, or programs of projects in an eligible area.

Eligibility: State governments.

Funding: \$343 million; awards between \$1 million and \$25 million.

FY 22 Great Lakes Restoration Initiative – Joint Venture Habitat Restoration and Protection (Opp. No. F22AS00420)

Purpose: To target the most significant environmental problems in the Great Lakes ecosystem

by funding and implementing federal projects that address these problems.

Eligibility: City, county, state, special district, or township governments; Native American tribal governments; state, public, or private institutions of higher education; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education.

Funding: \$800,000; awards between \$25,000 and \$300,000.

Purpose: To identify multi-level solutions for patients on long-term opioid treatment who are exhibiting harmful opioid behaviors, but do not meet criteria for OUD.

Funding: Not specified; awards of up to \$50,000.
