CHAIRMAN WELCH: Good morning, everyone.
The hour of nine o'clock having arrived, the House
Special Investigation Committee shall come to order.
Before we call the roll, let me just make
a couple quick announcements with regard to
convening in the midst of a global pandemic.
Please be advised that there have been
several precautions taken to protect the
participants' health and safety during the COVID-19
pandemic, while allowing this to be an open and
transparent discussion. The number of in-person
participants have been limited to ensure social
distancing, with a number of spaces reserved for
members of the media, and other seating is available
for members of the public. In addition to live
streaming available on the ilga.gov website, a
public viewing room of live stream has been arranged
at the Bilandic Building in Chicago. And face
coverings are required of participants at all times
during this Committee Hearing, except while drinking
or eating. If someone doesn't understand while I'm
talking, I will I'm trying to commit to keeping

my mask on and adhering to this rule -- please let 1 2 me know. 3 So at this time, Madam Clerk, would you 4 please call the roll? 5 CLERK: Welch. 6 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Present. 7 CLERK: Demmer. MR. DEMMER: Present. 8 9 CLERK: Hernandez. MS. HERNANDEZ: Present. 10 11 CLERK: Manley. 12 MS. MANLEY: Here. 13 CLERK: Mazzochi. 14 MS. MAZZOCHI: Present. 15 CLERK: Wehrli. 16 MR. WEHRLI: Present. 17 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Ladies and gentlemen, this Special Investigating Committee was created 18 19 pursuant to House Rule 91. 20 Excuse me for a moment. All six members 2.1 are being present and answering the roll call. We 22 do have a quorum, so we may proceed. 2.3 Ladies and gentlemen, this Special 24 Investigating Committee was created pursuant to

House Rule 91 following the filing of the Petition 1 2 signed by Minority Leader Jim Durkin, who is present 3 here today with his counsel, Mr. Rod Safer, 4 Representative Spain and Representative Chesney. 5 For the most part, this Committee will 6 operate as any other House committee under the same 7 House rules, including, but not limited to, House 8 Rule No. 10. In accordance with House Rule 92, this 9 Committee is tasked with investigating the charges 10 alleged in the Petition and determining that reasonable grounds exist to authorize charges 11 12 against the identified member. It requires a 13 majority vote of those appointed to authorize a 14 charge. If a majority of the members vote in favor 15 of authorizing the charges, a subsequent committee 16 of 12 House Members would determine whether or not 17 to recommend discipline to the full House of 18 Representatives. 19 This is a political process, not a legal 20 proceeding. We are not a court of law. As such, 21 this Committee is not bound by traditional rules of 22 evidence. However, we are bound to adhere to the 2.3 rules of decorum.

This case is unique to previous special

1 investigating committees in that the member that is 2 the subject of the Petition has not been accused by 3 federal prosecutors of any criminal activity. For the record, the Committee will 4 5 determine the schedule and will provide the public and Speaker Madigan with notice of all hearings. 6 7 All hearings will be made publicly accessible and available on the General Assembly 8 9 website. This Committee will make all information 10 publicly accessible on the website of the General 11 Assembly. 12 Speaker Madigan is not required to attend 13 but will have the opportunity to be present with or 14 without his counsel. If he chooses, Speaker Madigan 15 and his counsel will have the right to review any 16 exhibits or evidence presented, question any 17 witnesses and provide this Committee with evidence. 18 At this time, before -- I would like to 19 ask the Committee Members who have been appointed to 20 this Committee if they would like to offer any 21 introductory remarks. I would ask that Committee 22 Members please try to limit your comments, if 2.3 possible, to three minutes. 24 I will start with my friend, fellow Cubs

1 fan, Minority Spokesperson Leader Demmer. 2 REPRESENTATIVE DEMMER: Thank you, 3 Mr. Chairman and thank you to the Members of the 4 Committee who have convened today for a very 5 important duty. This procedure is seldom used. In fact, 6 7 there is only one true precedent in Illinois history 8 for us to operate based on. And because of that, I 9 think we all feel a sense of seriousness of attitude 10 and dedication to proceed with our business as 11 straightforwardly as possible. 12 This Committee's charge is to gather 13 information to help evaluate whether a reasonable 14 cause exists for charges to be filed. And this 15 Committee also is a good venue to hear information 16 from witnesses and in documents to answer many of 17 the questions that have been raised by members of both political parties in this House of 18 19 Representatives and across the State of Illinois. 20 So as members of a Special Investigating 21 Committee, we take our obligation to investigate 22 very seriously, to get to the bottom of all of these 2.3 admitted facts that have been presented in the 24 Deferred Prosecution Agreement and a part of the

Petition that is the reason this Committee was 1 2 convened. We take those duties very seriously and 3 look forward to working in a bipartisan way to assemble the clear picture of the facts and make a 4 5 determination going forward. 6 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 7 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Thank you, 8 Representative Demmer. 9 Representative Wehrli and then 10 Representative Mazzochi. 11 REPRESENTATIVE WEHRLI: I have no 12 comments. 13 CHAIRMAN WELCH: No comments. 14 Representative Mazzochi. 15 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: I don't have 16 any comments at this time, Chairman. Thank you. 17 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Thank you very much. 18 Representative Manley or Representative 19 Hernandez, any comments? 20 No comments? 21 The House Rules require that the 22 chairperson enter the Petition in the record. 23 Committee is in receipt of the Petition. It -- and 24 it is entitled dated August 31, 2020, Illinois House

- 1 of Representatives Special Investigation --
- 2 Investigating Committee Petition.
- I am going to mark this for the record as
- 4 Exhibit 1 here today.
- 5 The attachments to the Petition will be
- 6 marked as Exhibit 2 and Exhibit 3. Exhibit 2 is the
- 7 Deferred Prosecution Agreement between the United
- 8 States of America and Commonwealth Edison Company
- 9 and Exhibit 3 is a subpoena to testify before a
- 10 Grand Jury to the Custodian of Records Office of
- 11 Speaker Michael J. Madigan. That will be Exhibit 3.
- 12 All three documents that are being
- 13 entered here in the record here today will be
- 14 publicly available on the General Assembly's
- 15 website.
- 16 Unless there is any objections from this
- 17 Committee, the Petition will be entered into the
- 18 record. Any objection from Members?
- There being no objections, we will
- 20 proceed.
- 21 Leader Durkin is here. He is at the
- 22 table. I want to offer him an opportunity for
- 23 comment here.
- 24 REPRESENTATIVE DURKIN: Thank you,

- 1 Chairman Welch and ladies and gentlemen of this
- 2 Committee. Thank you for joining us today on this
- 3 very serious matter.
- 4 As was stated earlier, this is a unique
- 5 proceeding. It has been only invoked one time and
- 6 that was back in 2012 with a Representative of the
- 7 House of Representatives, Representative Derrick
- 8 Smith. And I believe for purposes of operations of
- 9 this Committee, that we should follow precedent
- 10 established in 2012 in the matter of discipline
- 11 regarding Representative Derrick Smith.
- 12 In that matter, Representative Derrick
- 13 Smith received a \$7,000 bride in United States
- 14 currency from a confidential informant in exchange
- 15 for legislative favors, which prompted initiation of
- 16 discipline.
- 17 If we look back at the transcripts of the
- 18 first day of proceedings, we -- I think there's much
- 19 to be gleaned from it and I would like to state the
- 20 following:
- 21 The House Rules for the 101st General
- 22 Assembly were adopted by a majority of the members
- of the House of Representatives on January 29, 2019.
- 24 Article VII of the House Rules -- Article XII of the

1 Rules details procedures for disciplinary 2 proceedings against a member of the House. House 3 Rule 91(a) specifies a mandatory creation of a 4 special investigation committee -- investigating 5 committee if a petition contains grounds for suggested charges signed by three or more members of 6 the Illinois House. 7 8 A petition signed by the three members of 9 the House was filed with the Office of the Speaker 10 of the House on Monday August 31, 2020, and contains 11 charges which, if true, may subject the member named 12 in the Petition to disciplinary action by the House. 13 And as Chairman Welch has stated, that 14 has been entered into the record as Exhibit No. 1. 15 Also what was important at that first 16 hearing with Representative Derrick Smith, at that 17 hearing, former Representative Jim Sacia formally introduced the charge or charges into the record. 18 19 Pursuant to House Rule 92(b), a list of 20 suggested charges is submitted to the Special 21 Investigation Committee for a thorough investigation 22 of all allegations and charges concerning Illinois 23 House Speaker Michael J. Madigan. 24 I will now state the charge which I will

- 1 ask for the Committee's consideration and ask that
- 2 it be entered into the record:
- Representative Madigan engaged in conduct
- 4 which is unbecoming to a legislator or which
- 5 constitutes a breach of the public trust as detailed
- 6 in the admissions by Commonwealth Edison in the
- 7 Deferred Prosecution Agreement, including engaging
- 8 in a bribery scheme, an extortion scheme, conspiracy
- 9 to violate federal and state laws, amongst other
- 10 misconduct and misuse of the office.
- In addition, we have also stated that a
- 12 Deferred Prosecution Agreement was entered into with
- 13 Commonwealth Edison and the United States Attorney.
- 14 It is submitted, I believe, as Exhibit No. 2 for
- 15 this Committee and it is relevant to the charges set
- 16 forth, which I just previously stated.
- 17 So at this time, we do have Exhibit No.
- 18 1, which has been entered, the Petition that was
- 19 filed by myself, Representative Ryan Spain,
- 20 Representative Andrew Chesney. Exhibit 2, which is
- 21 the Deferred Prosecution Agreement that has been
- 22 entered. Exhibit 3, which is a subpoena that was
- 23 issued which Representative Chairman Welch
- 24 referenced. And Exhibit 4 I will ask, which would

1 be a specific charge, which I just stated, which is consistent with the hearing of 2012 in where 2 3 Representative Sacia formally introduced the charge 4 into the record. I would ask that Exhibit 4, which 5 is -- which we will pass out, which will be made 6 available, be entered into the record, as well. 7 CHAIRMAN WELCH: We have all received an Amended Petition from Leader Durkin which includes 8 9 one charge against Speaker Madigan. Any objection 10 to receiving and entering this Amended Petition into 11 the record as Exhibit 4? 12 There being no objection, this matter 13 will be entered into the record as a matter of -- as Exhibit 4 and will also be made available on the 14 15 General Assembly website for public viewing. 16 REPRESENTATIVE DURKIN: Chairman Welch, I have nothing else at this moment, but again, I would 17 like to introduce counsel for the Petitioners. 18 19 is Mr. Ron Safer from Chicago who will be assisting 20 myself and also Petitioners during this process. 21 Thank you, Leader CHAIRMAN WELCH: 22 Durkin. 2.3 Representative Demmer. 2.4 REPRESENTATIVE DEMMER: Thank you, Mr.

- 1 Chairman.
- 2 Just a point of clarification. I believe
- 3 you referred to the document as an amended petition.
- 4 I believe it is simply a formal charge, not an
- 5 amended petition. I don't believe it -- I don't
- 6 believe this amends the underlying Petition.
- 7 CHAIRMAN WELCH: I stand corrected.
- 8 Exhibit 4 is entered into the record as the charge,
- 9 not an amended petition. Exhibit 4 is the charge
- 10 signed by Representative Durkin and not an amended
- 11 petition. It is entered into the record and, again,
- 12 will be made available for public viewing.
- 13 Thank you for that correction,
- 14 Representative.
- I want to note for the record, everyone,
- 16 that Speaker Madigan was informed of the filing of
- 17 this Petition and received notice of this hearing.
- 18 His attorney did confirm receipt of such on Friday,
- 19 September 4, 2020, via email to both counsels for
- 20 the Committee.
- 21 Next -- and I've spoken with
- 22 Representative Demmer about this this week -- this
- 23 Committee must be cognizant that the U.S. Attorney
- 24 for the Northern District has publicly stated that

- 1 there is an ongoing investigation related to the
- 2 information included in the Deferred Prosecution
- 3 Agreement between the government and ComEd.
- 4 Furthermore, one of the Petitioners,
- 5 Leader Durkin, has stated publicly that he did not
- 6 intend for this Petition or investigation to
- 7 interfere with the work of the federal government.
- 8 Additionally, the integrity of the
- 9 Committee requires an unbiased investigation and due
- 10 process to the named member.
- 11 Thus, it is imperative that this
- 12 Committee communicate and consult the U.S.
- 13 Attorney's Office.
- 14 Based on discussion with Minority
- 15 Spokesperson Demmer this week and a review of the
- 16 practices of past special investigating committees,
- 17 as Leader Durkin mentioned here earlier, before we
- 18 take any substantive action, we must consult with
- 19 the U.S. Attorney for the Northern District. This
- 20 Committee must avoid taking any action that can be
- 21 interference with an ongoing federal investigation
- 22 or investigations.
- 23 So at this time, I would like to suggest
- 24 the Committee contact Mr. Lausch in order to ask his

- 1 quidance on whether any independent investigation
- 2 undertaken by this Committee would be considered an
- 3 interference with the federal investigation.
- 4 Representative Manley moves that the
- 5 Committee, through the Chair and Minority
- 6 Spokesperson Demmer and our respective staffs,
- 7 contact Mr. Lausch. Is there any discussion on that
- 8 motion?
- 9 Representative Mazzochi.
- 10 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Thank you,
- 11 Chairman Welch.
- I just wanted to make clarification that
- 13 the only -- the only part -- the only thing that is
- 14 being asked of in the motion is simply for you and
- 15 Representative Demmer to reach out to the U.S.
- 16 Attorney's Office; is that correct?
- 17 CHAIRMAN WELCH: The motion is that the
- 18 Chair and Minority Spokesperson Demmer and our
- 19 respective staffs -- I would imagine that would be
- 20 our respective attorneys -- contact Mr. Lausch.
- 21 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Okay. Thank
- 22 you.
- 23 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Any other discussion
- 24 from Committee Members?

1 Seeing no other Committee Members seeking 2 recognition, Representative Leader Durkin. 3 REPRESENTATIVE DURKIN: Just briefly. 4 Chairman, thank you. 5 I just wanted to reiterate that you had stated that it is not the intention nor will this 6 Committee nor myself interfere with the ongoing 7 8 federal investigation. But I also want to make it clear for the record, before the filing of the 9 10 Petition, my office did consult with the U.S. Attorney's Office about our intentions here. And so 11 12 they are aware -- they were aware of my Petition at 13 the time of filing. So I'm glad and I encourage you 14 to work with the U.S. Attorney's Office, as we have 15 done in the past with proceedings similar to -- as 16 we stated, Derrick Smith. Not so similar, but when 17 we had a very, very, very sad time in the State of Illinois history where we were involved in an 18 19 impeachment process, where we worked quite well with 20 the U.S. Attorney's Office to make sure that there 21 was no interference with what our -- what our job is 22 with theirs. 2.3 So thank you for making that clear and I 24 encourage you to speak with them as soon as you can

and work with them, as we've done in the past. 1 2 Thank you. 3 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Thank you, Leader 4 Durkin. 5 There being no further comment on the 6 question, do we have a need for that to 7 pass unanimously? 8 Leave being granted on a vote of 6 vote 9 yes, none voting no, none voting present, that 10 motion will carry. 11 With that, Representative Mazzochi. 12 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Thank you, Chairman Welch. 13 14 Mr. Chairman, to ensure that the 15 Committee's work can proceed expeditiously while you 16 and Representative Demmer reach out to the U.S. 17 Attorney's Office, on behalf of members Demmer, Wehrli and myself, we have prepared letters seeking 18 19 voluntary production of various documents --20 (Representative Mazzochi turns on microphone) 21 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: 22 Mr. Chairman, to ensure that this Committee can proceed expeditiously while you and 23 24 Spokesman Demmer reach out to the U.S. Attorney's

- 1 Office, on behalf of Committee Members Demmer,
- 2 Wehrli and myself, we have prepared letters seeking
- 3 the voluntary production of various documents and
- 4 the voluntary appearance of various witnesses before
- 5 the Committee separate and apart from the U.S.
- 6 Attorney. We would like to have those -- copies of
- 7 those letters entered into the record as Exhibits 5
- 8 and 6.
- 9 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Just for the record, we
- 10 have voted unanimously as a Committee to reach out
- 11 to the U.S. Attorney before proceeding any further.
- 12 We will enter those letters into the record as
- 13 Exhibit 5 and 6. However, that will be the only
- 14 actions that we take here today.
- MS. MAZZOCHI: Well, Mr. Chairman,
- 16 respectfully, that's why I asked for the
- 17 clarification on the motion. The clarification on
- 18 the motion that you made was simply that you were
- 19 going to reach out to the U.S. Attorney, not that
- 20 you were going to have these proceedings come to a
- 21 halt while that outreach was pending. So because
- 22 the motion itself was limited to simply reaching out
- 23 to the U.S. Attorney's Office, that's why I think it
- 24 is appropriate for us to also continue to seek

- 1 additional discovery, because we do want to proceed
- 2 at a decent pace. And what we want to ensure is
- 3 that the individuals from whom we are going to be
- 4 seeking voluntary documents and testimony have the
- 5 longest opportunity to prepare as they can. I would
- 6 certainly --
- 7 CHAIRMAN WELCH: As the Chair of this
- 8 meeting, let me be clear on what we voted on. There
- 9 is nothing in the motion in the record that said we
- 10 were halting these proceedings.
- 11 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Correct.
- 12 CHAIRMAN WELCH: And as I have stated and
- 13 Leader Durkin has stated, we are going to follow a
- 14 precedent. That's all that we have to go on. This
- 15 has been a seldomly invoked rule in the history of
- 16 the House and we have very little precedent to go
- 17 by. I have studied the Derrick Smith transcripts
- 18 all weekend long and we're going to follow
- 19 precedent. Leader Durkin has agreed to doing that
- 20 today. And we had to make sure we contacted the
- 21 U.S. Attorney's Office and get a response before
- 22 this Committee can do any work further. No one said
- 23 anything about halting the work of the Committee,
- but we are going to reach out to the U.S. Attorney's

Office and make contact first. There will be 1 2 nothing further until then. 3 Representative Manley. 4 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Actually, if I 5 could continue, Mr. Chairman. 6 CHAIRMAN WELCH: You have not been recognized. 7 8 Representative Manley. 9 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: I apologize. 10 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: Mr. Chairman, is 11 it okay if I question Leader Durkin? 12 CHAIRMAN WELCH: You may proceed. 13 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: Welcome, Leader. 14 How are you? 15 REPRESENTATIVE DURKIN: Fine. 16 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: You are bringing 17 one charge that includes multiple elements of multiple crimes. They would have to prove each one 18 19 of these in order to find him quilty of 20 unbecoming? 2.1 REPRESENTATIVE DURKIN: I don't believe 22 that that is the case, but I'll defer to counsel on 2.3 this, who I have worked with. And if you don't 24 mind, I would ask that Mr. Safer respond to that

1 specific question. 2 MR. SAFER: Thank you. 3 Thank you. It is clear that not only would the elements of the crime, crimes, not need to 4 5 be proven, but that this is not, as the Chairman has said, a criminal procedure -- proceeding or even a 6 7 civil proceeding. There is conduct that is described that -- in the Deferred Prosecution 8 9 Agreement that certainly describes criminal conduct. 10 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: You are saying 11 crimes. What crimes? You are using a plural. 12 MR. SAFER: Yes. The crimes that are 13 described in the Deferred Prosecution Agreement are 14 a bribery scheme, an extortion scheme, a conspiracy 15 to violate state and federal law, among other --16 among other misconduct. But that is not for this 17 body to decide. This body is to decide the charge of whether or not the Speaker has acted in a manner 18 19 unbecoming to a Representative -- I don't have the 20 specific charge in front of me. This is taken, of 21 course, from the Illinois Statute, unbecoming to a 22 legislator or may constitute a breach of their 2.3 That does not require the proof of crimes 24 and it does not require the proof of each element of

each crime. 1 2 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: So the charge is 3 based on criminal activity, criminal activity that 4 has not been charged? MR. SAFER: It is based on criminal 5 activity that has not only -- that has not been 6 7 charged but has been admitted to. A charge, of course, is evidence of nothing. Indeed, in a court 8 9 of law, a jury is instructed that a charge is 10 evidence of nothing. This, in contrast, is direct evidence. The Deferred Prosecution Agreement 11 12 contains actual evidence, actual admissions by 13 Commonwealth Edison, agreed to by the United States 14 of America. That is quite different and more 15 substantial than a mere charge. 16 REPRESENTATIVE MANLEY: Thank you. 17 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Anything further, 18 Representative Manley? 19 Representative Wehrli. 20 REPRESENTATIVE WEHRLI: Thank you, 2.1 Chairman Welch. 22 So I would like to get back to the intent 2.3 and why we are submitting this voluntary letter. Ιt

is wholly appropriate for this body to seek not

24

1 approval but confirmation of awareness of this 2 Special Investigation Committee and I think we all 3 agree that it's appropriate that you and 4 Spokesperson Demmer reach out. But it is also to 5 give those individuals and corporations time to gather their information, but it is also to give 6 7 fellow members of this Committee the opportunity to 8 consider signing on that letter. If what we are charged with doing here is finding the truth and 9 10 facts, then that should be something that we all 11 participate in. And instead of going down the subpoena route, we thought it would be best if we 12 13 started with a voluntary request for these witnesses 14 and documents to be provided to this body post you 15 and Leader Demmer speaking with the U.S.A. out of 16 Chicago. So that was our intent. 17 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Thank you, 18 Representative Wehrli. 19 I do want to indicate, as I already 20 indicated for the record, that your letter of 21 preliminary voluntary witness list has been entered 22 into the record in Exhibit No. 4. 2.3 Representative Demmer. 24 Representative Mazzochi.

1 REPRESENTATIVE MAZZOCHI: Thank you, Mr. 2 Chairman. 3 And again, just so that we have a 4 complete record for the transcript, I do understand 5 that, in the Derrick Smith case, a letter was sent 6 on April 4, 2012 to the U.S. Department -- to the 7 U.S. Attorney's Office. And what was being sought 8 in that letter was, essentially, the investigative file for the Derrick Smith case. And in response, 9 10 the U.S. Attorney's Office declined to share that file. However, also in the Derrick Smith case, and 11 12 this was the Derrick Smith case SIC Exhibit No. 9, 13 along with others, there were letters sent out by 14 the Special Investigating Committee seeking the 15 voluntary appearance of individuals without need for 16 a subpoena. 17 So we were, in fact, attempting to follow the process that was already set forth in the 18 19 Derrick Smith case. 20 CHAIRMAN WELCH: Thank you, 2.1 Representative Mazzochi. 22 Thank you Members of Committee.
