Dear Members of the Illinois General Assembly:

Thank you for taking the time to hold hearings on the critical issue of redistricting in Western Illinois.

To quote former President Barack Obama, "In America, politicians should not pick their voters; voters should pick their politicians." I want to add my voice to the multitude of voices throughout the state that want new maps guided by community – and not partisan – interest.

To accomplish that, I urge you to conduct a well-publicized process – in every region of the state – that allows for significant public input.
