1 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: The House  
2 Redistricting Committee will come to order.

3 Clerk, please call the roll.

4 COMMITTEE CLERK: I believe since we  
5 took the roll yesterday, we should be able to run on  
6 a recessed roll.

7 CHAIRPERSON: Okay. We're on a  
8 recessed roll.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Representative  
10 Burke, I believe we do have a sub -- a subletter.

11 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Oh, that's correct.  
12 Thank you.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Representative  
14 Elik for Representative Spain.

15 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: I'm in receipt of a  
16 letter from Minority Leader Durkin replacing  
17 permanent member Spain with temporary member  
18 Representative Elik.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: All right.  
20 Thank you very much.

21 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Elik is here.

22 All right. We have a couple local  
23 legislators participating. I see Representative  
24 Stuart is here.

1                   Thanks for attending, Representative  
2     Stuart.

3                   And anybody -- Representative Severin,  
4     are -- forgive me. Are you visiting or are you on  
5     the committee?

6                   REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: He is on the  
7     committee.

8                   CHAIRPERSON BURKE: All right. Thank  
9     you.

10                  REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: But he does  
11     need to be added to the roll, because Demmer subbed  
12     in for him yesterday.

13                  CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Clerk, can you add  
14     Representative Severin to the roll?

15                  COMMITTEE CLARK: Will do.

16                  NANCY: I'm sorry. I accidentally got  
17     out of the -- I'm here for Representative Severin.  
18     He couldn't make it. I am his LA here in  
19     Springfield. Nancy.

20                  CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Oh. Well, we can  
21     add Nancy to the roll.

22                  COMMITTEE CLERK: Thanks, Nancy.

23                  NANCY: Sorry. Thank you.

24                  CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Okay. So no

1 Representative Severin. All right.

2 Well, good afternoon -- or good  
3 morning, everybody, and thanks to everyone who is  
4 taking the time to participate in today's hearing.

5 Earlier this year the House and Senate  
6 redistricting committees held approximately 50  
7 public hearings to gather input on redistricting in  
8 Illinois.

9 Based on the input from the public and  
10 the best population data available at the time, the  
11 General Assembly, in May, passed a legislative  
12 redistricting plan that was signed into law by the  
13 governor as Public Act 102-0010 on June 4 to comply  
14 with the Illinois Constitution's June 30 deadline.

15 At the time, the House Democrats  
16 indicated that we would review the 2020 census data  
17 when it was released this fall to determine if  
18 changes should be made to the remap -- to the map.

19 On August 12, 2021, approximately five  
20 months later than normal, United States Census  
21 Bureau released the 2020 census population data to  
22 Illinois as well as the other states.

23 Now that we have census data, we are  
24 fulfilling our commitment to review the data, seek

1 additional input from the public, and amend the  
2 redistricting plan to incorporate the latest census  
3 data as needed.

4 The House Democrats remain committed to  
5 providing the public with various ways to make their  
6 voices heard to ensure a fair map that reflects the  
7 broad racial and geographic diversity of Illinois.

8 Minority Spokesman, do you have a  
9 statement you would like to make?

10 REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: Sure. Thank  
11 you, Chair Burke.

12 And I just -- I know we talked a lot  
13 yesterday at the hearing in Chicago -- not to  
14 reiterate some of those things, but just to  
15 underscore today. Many of the concerns that the  
16 advocacy groups voiced yesterday, particularly about  
17 timing and notice of these hearings --

18 And Representative Elik and I are here  
19 in Collinsville in person. We are the only members  
20 here and, literally, there is no one from the public  
21 at this meeting, and I think that underscores the  
22 concerns that the advocacy groups have about length  
23 of time we have to discuss these things.

24 So I look forward to today's hearing.

1 I don't know if there is anyone in the waiting room  
2 that are witnesses, but there is certainly no one  
3 here at Collinsville as witnesses. So this may be a  
4 short hearing today. Thank you.

5 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Well, I believe,  
6 before we go to any witnesses, we do have a  
7 presentation from the House Democratic staff; so if  
8 we could proceed with that.

9 We have Darrin Reinhardt from the  
10 Democratic staff. I hope --

11 REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: He is trying to  
12 connect his audio.

13 MR. REINHARDT: Is this better? Can you  
14 hear me this way?

15 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: That's great.

16 MR. REINHARDT: Thank you.

17 I will go ahead and share my screen,  
18 and we will get started. All right.

19 So hello, everybody. My name is Darrin  
20 Reinhardt. I am an employee with the Illinois House  
21 of Representatives, and I am here to give a brief  
22 overview of the 2020 census data released earlier  
23 this month showed for the overall state as well as  
24 the local region.

1                   According to the 2020 census, the  
2 state's population is 12,812,508. This is a decline  
3 of 0.14 percent or 18,124 people over a ten-year  
4 period.

5                   The state's total population according  
6 to the final 2020 census numbers was approximately  
7 0.3 percent above the 2015-2019 American Community  
8 Survey five-year estimates.

9                   Statewide, population shifts over the  
10 past decade reflected overall increases in urban and  
11 suburban communities and declining population in  
12 rural and downstate areas.

13                   The state's northern counties, Cook,  
14 DuPage, Lake, Will, McHenry, Kane, Kendall, and  
15 Grundy Counties, all saw increases in population,  
16 with Kendall County seeing the largest population  
17 increase in the state.

18                   While much of downstate lost  
19 population, some areas did see noteworthy increases,  
20 such as Carroll County, McLean County, Champaign  
21 County, Effingham County, Monroe County, Williamson  
22 County, and Johnson County.

23                   Counties that saw the biggest declines  
24 were located downstate. Alexander County saw the



1 state's largest loss in population, while Calhoun  
2 County, Coles County, Gallatin County, Greene  
3 County, Hardin County, Henderson County, Jackson  
4 County, Mason County, McDonough County, Pike County,  
5 and Pulaski County saw double-digit losses in  
6 population.

7 Overall these rural areas were  
8 generally overestimated by the 2015-2019 American  
9 Community Survey five-year estimates, while many  
10 urban areas were underestimated.

11 I do apologize. I appear to have the  
12 wrong presentation that -- for the local population.  
13 So I can switch those now or I can proceed with  
14 the -- with these slides if it's all right, and I  
15 can just say the information.

16 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Go ahead.

17 MR. REINHARDT: Okay.

18 So Madison County's population declined  
19 by 2.5 percent over the last decade, St. Clair  
20 County's population declined by 4.7 over the past  
21 decade.

22 Regionally, many downstate counties  
23 incurred significant population losses. Alexander  
24 County, Jackson County, Gallatin County, Hardin

1 County, and Pope County were among the hardest hit.

2           However several downstate counties did  
3 see population growth. Monroe, Williamson, Johnson  
4 all saw -- Counties all saw increases.

5           Many population losses in Southern  
6 Illinois were larger than projected in the American  
7 Community Survey five-year estimates.

8           House Districts 108 112 from the 2011  
9 map saw an increase in population while House  
10 Districts 95, 100, and 116 saw a decrease in  
11 population over the decade.

12           Across the region, the 115th, 116th,  
13 117th, and 118th House Districts lost significant  
14 population.

15           Regionally, while population and  
16 African-Am- -- white population and African-American  
17 populations declined while Hispanic population  
18 increased.

19           Thank you so much for your attention  
20 and for coming out to share your thoughts today. As  
21 the chair mention -- or as mentioned, there will  
22 be -- you will be able to find hearing information  
23 and testimony from this and other hearings on  
24 ILGA.gov and on ILhousedems.com/redistricting and on

1 slash ILsenateredistricting.com.

2 You can send further written testimony

5 Thank you so much.

6 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Thank you, Darrin.

7 We now have an opportunity to go to  
8 witnesses. We did have one group slip in. That is  
9 MALDEF, but then we were notified that they slipped  
10 into this hearing by mistake. So they won't be  
11 testifying at this hearing. I don't see any other  
12 witnesses.

13 Is there anyone seeking recognition as  
14 a witness?

15 All right. I don't see any hands  
16 raised. All right. I think that's it. Seeing no  
17 witnesses, I think we are going to adjourn to the  
18 call of the chair.

19 REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: I hope there is  
20 more at the ones this weekend.

21 CHAIRPERSON BURKE: I don't have -- I  
22 don't have my schedule with me. I know we have  
23 hearings tomorrow. Can someone prompt me with the  
24 time?

1                   REPRESENTATIVE BUTLER: Sure. We have  
2 a 10:00 a.m. hearing in Peoria, in person and  
3 virtual.

4                   We have a 12:00 p.m. virtual hearing  
5 regarding the Champaign region, I guess. And then  
6 we have a Sunday 10:00 a.m. hearing, which maybe we  
7 will adjourn to the local Catholic church in Aurora  
8 at 10:00 a.m., but those are the ones that we have  
9 left for the House.

10                  CHAIRPERSON BURKE: Thank you,  
11 Representative Butler.

12                  So we will see everyone, then, tomorrow  
13 at 10:00 a.m. We will recess -- we won't adjourn.  
14 We will recess to the call of the chair.
