"Section 5. The Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail Technology Act of 1985 is amended by changing Section 3-1 and adding Article IIIE as follows:

(225 ILCS 410/3-1) (from Ch. 111, par. 1703-1) (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2006)

Sec. 3-1. Cosmetology defined. Any one or any combination of the following practices constitutes the practice of cosmetology when done for cosmetic or beautifying purposes and not for the treatment of disease or of muscular or nervous disorder: arranging, braiding (except as provided under Article IIIE), dressing, cutting, trimming, curling, waving, chemical restructuring, shaping, singeing, bleaching, coloring or similar work, upon the hair of the head; cutting or trimming facial hair of any person; any practice of manicuring, pedicuring, decorating nails, applying sculptured nails or otherwise artificial nails by hand or with mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or in any way caring for the nails or the skin of the hands or feet including massaging the hands, arms, elbows, feet, lower legs, and knees of another person for other than the treatment of medical disorders; any practice of epilation or depilation of any person; any practice for the purpose of cleansing, massaging or toning the skin of the scalp; beautifying, massaging, cleansing, exfoliating the stratum corneum of the epidermis, or stimulating the skin of the human body by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, body treatments, body wraps, the use of hydrotherapy, tonics, lotions or creams or any device, electrical or otherwise, for the care of the skin; applying make-up or eyelashes to any person, tinting eyelashes and eyebrows and lightening hair on the body and removing superfluous hair from the body of any person by the use of depilatories, waxing or tweezers. The term "cosmetology" does not include the services provided by an electrologist. Nail technology is the practice and the study of cosmetology only to the extent of manicuring, pedicuring, decorating, and applying sculptured or otherwise artificial nails, or in any way caring for the nail or the skin of the hands or feet including massaging the hands, arms, elbows, feet, lower legs, and knees. Cosmetologists are prohibited from performing any procedure that may puncture or abrade the skin below the stratum corneum of the epidermis or remove closed milia (whiteheads) which may draw blood or serous body fluid. The term cosmetology includes rendering advice on what is cosmetically appealing, but no person licensed under this Act shall render advice on what is appropriate medical treatment for diseases of the skin. Purveyors of cosmetics may demonstrate such cosmetic products in conjunction with any sales promotion and shall not be required to hold a license under this Act. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit the shampooing of hair by persons employed for that purpose and who perform that task under the direct supervision of a licensed cosmetologist or licensed cosmetology teacher. (Source: P.A. 91-863, eff. 7-1-00.)

(225 ILCS 410/Art. IIIE heading new) ARTICLE IIIE. HAIR BRAIDING SHOPS

(225 ILCS 410/3E-5 new) (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2006)

Sec. 3E-5. Requisites for ownership or operation of hair braiding shops.

(a) No person, firm, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation shall own or operate a hair braiding shop without first applying on forms provided by the Department for a certificate of registration. All hair braiding shops in operation on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly shall register with the Department within 30 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

(b) The application for a certificate of registration under this Section shall set forth the name, address, and telephone number of the hair braiding shop; the name, address, and telephone number of the person, firm, partnership, or corporation that is to own or operate the shop; and, if the shop is to be owned or operated by an entity other than an individual, the name, address, and telephone number of the managing partner or the chief executive officer of the corporation or other entity that owns or operates the shop.

(c) The Department shall be notified by the owner or operator of a shop that is moved to a new location. If there is a change in the ownership or operation of a shop, the new owner or operator shall report that change to the Department along with completion of any additional requirements set forth by rule.

(d) If a person, firm, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation owns or operates more than one shop, a separate certificate of registration must be obtained for each shop.

(e) A certificate of registration granted under this Section may be revoked in accordance with the provisions of Article IV and the holder of the certificate may be otherwise disciplined by the Department in accordance with rules adopted under this Act.

(f) The owner or operator of a hair braiding shop must be a licensed cosmetologist who works on the premises of the hair braiding shop, except as provided in subsection (h).

(g) Each person employed as a hair braider at a hair braiding shop must (i) have completed 500 hours of cosmetology instruction in the areas of health, safety, and hygiene and (ii) have passed an examination as determined by the Department, except as provided in subsection (h).

(h) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Act, a person who is not a licensed cosmetologist but, on the effective date of this Section, owned or operated or was employed as a hair braider at a shop that registers under this Section within 30 days after that effective date may braid hair at that shop under the following conditions:

(1) for a period of up to 8 months after the effective date of this Section, while the person is engaged in completing 500 hours of cosmetology instruction in the areas of health, safety, and hygiene, provided that the act of braiding is performed under the direct supervision of a licensed cosmetologist who is on the shop premises at all times to perform the application of any chemicals, dyes, or colorings, the cutting of hair, and hygiene-related services; and

(2) in the case of an owner or operator who completes the 500 hours of cosmetology instruction in the areas of health, safety, and hygiene within the initial 8-month period in a manner satisfactory to the Department, then for an additional period of up to 16 months while the owner or operator continues to pursue the cosmetology instruction required for licensure, provided that the act of braiding is performed under the direct supervision of a licensed cosmetologist who is either on the shop premises or available on call to perform the application of any chemicals, dyes, or colorings, the cutting of hair, and hygiene-related services.

To become eligible to provide hair braiding services under this subsection (h), a person must register with the Department within the 30 days after the effective date of this Section. To remain eligible, a person must provide from time to time such documentation as the Department may require.

(i) The Department may promulgate rules for the administration of this Section and may establish additional requirements for owning or operating a hair braiding shop. (Source: P.A. 89-387, eff. 1-1-96; 89-706, eff. 1-31-97.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."

The motion prevailed and the amendment was adopted and ordered printed.

Sec. 37.1. Cease and desist orders. If the Department has reason to believe that a person has violated any provision of Section 8 or 12 of this Act, the Department may issue a rule to show cause why an order to cease and desist should not be entered against that person. The rule shall clearly set forth the grounds relied upon by the Department and shall provide a period of 7 days from the date of the rule to file an answer to the satisfaction of the Department. Failure to answer to the satisfaction of the Department shall cause an order to cease and desist to be issued immediately."

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was adopted and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 332 on page 1, immediately below line 25, by inserting the following:

"Section 10. The Illinois Certified Shorthand Reporters Act of 1984 is amended by changing Section 17 as follows:

(225 ILCS 415/17) (from Ch. 111, par. 6217) (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2004)

Sec. 17. Fees; returned checks; expiration while in military. (a) The fees for the administration and enforcement of this Act, including but not limited to, original certification, renewal and restoration, shall be set by rule.

(b) Beginning July 1, 2003, all of the fees and fines collected under this Act shall be deposited into the General Professions Dedicated Fund.

(c) Any person who delivers a check or other payment to the Department that is returned to the Department unpaid by the financial institution upon which it is drawn shall pay to the Department, in addition to the amount already owed to the Department, a fine of \$50. The fines imposed by this Section are in addition to any other discipline provided under this Act prohibiting unlicensed practice or practice on a nonrenewed license. The Department shall notify the person that payment of fees and fines shall be paid to the Department by certified check or money order within 30 calendar days of the notification. If, after the expiration of 30 days from the date of the notification, the person has failed to submit the necessary remittance, the Department shall automatically terminate the license or certificate or deny the application, without hearing. If, after termination or denial, the person seeks a license or certificate, he or she shall apply to the Department for restoration or issuance of the license or certificate and pay all fees and fines due to the Department. The Department may establish a fee for the processing of an application for restoration of a license or certificate to pay all expenses of processing this application. The Director may waive the fines due under this Section in individual cases where the Director finds that the fines would be unreasonable or unnecessarily burdensome.

However, any person whose license has expired while he has been engaged (1) in federal or state service active duty, or (2) in training or education under the supervision of the United States preliminary to induction into the military service, may have his license renewed, reinstated or restored without paying any lapsed renewal and restoration fees, if within 2 years after termination of such service, training or education other than by dishonorable discharge, he furnishes the Department with satisfactory proof that he has been so engaged and that his service, training or education has been so terminated. (Source: P.A. 92-146, eff. 1-1-02.)"
