HOUSE BILL ON SECOND READING

Representative Madigan offered the following amendment and moved its adoption.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 3760 on page 4, by replacing lines 8 through 14 with the following:

- "(2) Projects designed to address population growth or to replace aging park or recreation unit facilities:
- (3) Replacement or reconstruction of park or recreation unit facilities determined to be severe and continuing health or life safety hazards;
- (4) Alterations necessary to provide accessibility for qualified individuals with disabilities; and".

The foregoing motion prevailed and Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

Perfunctory Session

MONDAY, MAY 23, 2005

At the hour of 3:36 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 473

Offered by Representative Stephens:

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2005, Governor Rod Blagojevich filed an emergency rule requiring pharmacies that sell contraceptives to fill prescriptions for birth control without delay; and

WHEREAS, As part of that emergency rule, if the contraceptive, or a suitable alternative, is not in stock, the pharmacy must order or obtain the contraceptive or, if the patient prefers, transfer the prescription to another local pharmacy of the patient's choice or return it to the patient; and

WHEREAS, The right of conscience is fundamental to the right of freedom of religious expression; and

WHEREAS, The Health Care Right of Conscience Act protects and respects a health care professional's right of conscience; under this Act, a pharmacist may refuse to issue prescriptions for abortifacients and contraceptives based upon his or her beliefs; and

WHEREAS, There are pharmacists who practice in Illinois only because the State has a Health Care Right of Conscience Act; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Governor to suspend the emergency rule filed April 1, 2005 requiring pharmacies that sell contraceptive to fill prescriptions for birth control without delay; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Governor.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 476

Offered by Representative Reitz:

WHEREAS, Members of the Illinois Army and Air National Guard are performing meritorious service for the Nation in support of the global war on terrorism; and

WHEREAS, This service reflects great credit upon the Illinois Army and Air National Guard and the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the State of Illinois to recognize the service and sacrifices of Illinois Army and Air National Guard members in support of the global war on terrorism; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we call upon Governor Rod Blagojevich, as Commander-in-Chief of the Illinois Army and Air National Guard, and through The Adjutant General of Illinois as the Governor's Chief of Staff for military affairs and as Director of the Department of Military Affairs, to establish the Abraham Lincoln Medal of Freedom to recognize the service of members of the Illinois Army and Air National Guard who are mobilized in support of the global war on terrorism; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recommend that the criteria and process by which award of the Abraham Lincoln Medal of Freedom is made to members of the Illinois Army and Air National Guard be determined by appropriate regulation issued by The Adjutant General as Director of the Department of Military Affairs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to The Illinois Adjutant General and Governor Rod

Blagojevich.
