HOUSE RESOLUTION 1181

Offered by Representative Phelps:

WHEREAS, Charity fraud is widespread, and perpetrators of the crime prey on consumers across the State of Illinois, especially seniors citizens; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Attorney General's Office has received approximately 3,000 inquiries since 2000, which include complaints about instances of charitable donation fraud; and

WHEREAS, An increase in fraud attempts occurs after major national or natural disasters, including the attacks of September 11, 2001, and Hurricane Katrina in August 2005, and around the Christmas season, when fraudulent and illegitimate persons and groups feel people are more willing to donate; and

WHEREAS, The Attorney General's Office provides tips for consumers on how to identify potential charitable donation fraud, including requesting written information detailing the organization's mission and never paying in cash; and

WHEREAS, The Attorney General's Office encourages consumers to ask questions of individuals and organizations soliciting for donations to determine if they are legitimate, including how much of the contribution will go to the charity and how the donation will be distributed; and

WHEREAS, Over 25,000 legitimate charitable organizations are currently registered with the Illinois Attorney General's Office; the Attorney General's Office can inform consumers if a charitable organization is registered and current in its reporting requirements; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we proclaim May 2006 as Charitable Donation Fraud Awareness Month in the State of Illinois and we urge consumers throughout the State to be aware of charitable organization fraud and help in its prevention.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1184

Offered by Representative Cultra:

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) initiated the implementation of a National Animal Identification System (NAIS) in 2004; and

WHEREAS, The NAIS is a cooperative State-federal-industry program administered by USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS); and

WHEREAS, The ultimate long-term goal of the NAIS is to provide State and federal officials with the capability to identify all animals and premises that have had direct contact with a disease of concern within 48 hours after discovery; and

WHEREAS, The NAIS will be established through a phased-in approach; and

WHEREAS, There are 3 main components of the NAIS that include premises identification, animal identification, and animal tracking; and

WHEREAS, All states became operational on premises registration by mid-2005, with 160,000 premises registered as of December 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, The NAIS program is currently voluntary; and

WHEREAS, The system is still under development and there are many issues still being considered; and

WHEREAS, Industry working groups have been established for different types of livestock to determine what type of identification system would work best for each given type of livestock; and

WHEREAS, The current goal is to have a mandatory system in place in 2009; and

WHEREAS, Many livestock producers are concerned about the impact this system may have on them and what they may have to do to comply with the system; and

WHEREAS, Livestock producers are also concerned about the confidentiality of their information and ownership of database information; and

WHEREAS, Some farmers are concerned about the financial cost that may be associated with the NAIS; and

WHEREAS, Concerns exist that the NAIS may have more of an effect on small farmers than large livestock producers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Department of Agriculture to consider small producer and farm animal owner concerns in the development of the National Animal Identification System; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the United States Department of Agriculture to provide additional information to farm animal owners on the current status of the National Animal Identification System and what is being considered for the system; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the United States Department of Agriculture to consider the diverse differences between different livestock industries and allow for flexibility for different types of livestock in the development of the National Animal Identification System; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the United States Secretary of Agriculture.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1188

Offered by Representative Acevedo:

WHEREAS, Members of the House of Representatives are aware of the illegal sale of false forms of identification, such as fraudulent driver's licenses, green cards, State identification cards, social security cards, and matricula cards; and

WHEREAS, These illegal sales cause major problems for businesses in this State, as well as for federal, State, and local governmental agencies; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the False Identification Task Force is created, to consist of 15 members appointed as follows: one member of the House of Representatives, to serve as chairperson, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one member of the House of Representatives appointed by the House Minority leader; 5 members, one from each of 5 different community-based organizations determined by the Task Force chairperson; and 8 additional members, of whom one member is to be appointed by each of the following officials: the Governor; the Secretary of State; the Attorney General; the State's Attorney of Cook County; the Director of the U.S. Office of Citizenship and Immigration Services; the U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security; the Commissioner of the Chicago Police Department; and the Director of the Illinois State Police; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study the problem of the illegal sale of false forms of identification and shall determine the most effective methods for combating these illegal sales; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the House of Representatives no later than December 31, 2006; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to the following officials: the Governor; the Secretary of State; the Attorney General; the State's Attorney of Cook County; the Director of the U.S. Office of Citizenship and Immigration Services; the U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security; the Commissioner of the Chicago Police Department; and the Director of the Illinois State Police.

Offered by Representative Flider:

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the 2006 report of the Compensation Review Board is hereby disapproved in whole in accordance with Section 5 of the Compensation Review Act; and be it further

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 122

Offered by Representative McCarthy:

WHEREAS, There are 39 public community college districts serving all 102 counties within the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Within the 39 community college districts, there are 48 community colleges, serving nearly 1.2 million Illinoisans annually; and

WHEREAS, Over the past decade, enrollment at the 48 community colleges has increased by more than 20% and the role of the community college has expanded dramatically; local communities and businesses have become reliant on community colleges as the primary provider of worker education and training; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Labor estimates that by the end of this decade 85% of all jobs in the State of Illinois that are capable of sustaining a middle-class lifestyle will require access to post-secondary education; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Labor also reports that 75% of all current workers will require re-skilling or retraining during the current decade in order to maintain the jobs they presently hold; and

WHEREAS, The reimbursement rules that are currently in place for community colleges are, in some instances, more than 30 years old and do not reflect the vast diversity of the structure and operation of the community college model of today; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there is created a Joint Task Force on Community Colleges, to be facilitated by the Illinois Community College Board, for the purpose of reviewing the present community college system and making recommendations to the General Assembly pertaining to whether the mechanisms that are in place will handle the expanded role and demands on the system in the future; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint Task Force on Community Colleges shall consist of the following members: 2 co-chairpersons, each a member of the General Assembly, with one appointed by the Speaker of the House and one appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 spokespersons, each a member of the General Assembly, with one appointed by the Minority Leader of the House and one appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; 3 community college presidents appointed by an organization representing public community college presidents; 3 community college trustees appointed by an organization representing Illinois community college trustees; 2 community college faculty members appointed by the Chairperson of the Illinois Community College Board; 2 community college students appointed by the Illinois Community College Board Student Advisory Committee; and 2 members appointed by the Chairperson of the Illinois Community College Board, one of whom is a nationally recognized community college expert; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint Task Force members shall serve on a voluntary basis and shall not be responsible for any costs associated with their participation in the Joint Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint Task Force shall meet initially at the call of the Chairperson of the Illinois Community College Board and thereafter as necessary and shall report its findings to the General Assembly by filing copies of its report with the Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate no later than December 31, 2006; and that upon filing its report the Joint Task Force is dissolved; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Chairperson of the Illinois Community College Board and to the Illinois Community College Board Student Advisory Committee.
