The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 921

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Despite nearly 25 years of the Americans with Disabilities Act, people with disabilities continue to face barriers to equal opportunity in employment; in 2011, the employment rate of adults with disabilities was 33.4%, as compared to 75.6% for others; the full-time/full-year employment rate for people with disabilities was 20.7%, as compared with 55.5% for others; and

WHEREAS, On August 27, 2013 the United States Department of Labor's Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs announced a final rule to the regulations implementing Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; and

WHEREAS, Section 503 prohibits federal contractors and subcontractors from discriminating in employment against individuals with disabilities, and requires these employers to take affirmative action to recruit, hire, promote, and retain these individuals; and

WHEREAS, The final rule strengthens the affirmative action provisions of the regulations to aid contractors in their efforts to recruit and hire individuals with disabilities, improves job opportunities for individuals with disabilities and makes changes to the nondiscrimination provisions of the regulations to bring them into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008; and

WHEREAS, The final rule sets a workforce goal of 7% for individuals with disabilities; this requirement is not a quota, but a way to ensure that contractors include disability in their strategies around recruitment and hiring; and

WHEREAS, The final rule also includes provisions to invite applicants and existing employees to voluntarily self-identify as a person with a disability at both the job-application stage and after a job offer has been made; and

WHEREAS, The final rule requires that contractors document and update annually several qualitative comparisons for the number of individuals with disabilities who apply for jobs and the number of individuals with disabilities they hire; having this data will assist contractors in measuring the effectiveness of their outreach and recruitment efforts; and

WHEREAS, The final rule also brings the Section 503 regulations into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 which expanded the definition of disability, and calls for employers to review their policies and practices to ensure they are in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has continually been a leader in ensuring that individuals with disabilities have access to job opportunities and full-time employment with an employment rate of working age individuals with disabilities continually higher than that of the national average; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we commend the U.S. Department of Labor for its rule changes to Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State of Illinois will encourage and assist federal contractors and subcontractors in the hiring of individuals with disabilities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be sent to U.S. Department of Labor Secretary Thomas Perez.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 922

Offered by Representative Sommer:

WHEREAS, Communities across the State of Illinois were devastated and 8 people were killed in tornadoes which struck the State on November 17, 2013; and

WHEREAS, Hundreds of homes and businesses were damaged or destroyed by the storm; and

WHEREAS, Local governments incurred millions in storm-related costs, including damage to public facilities, overtime, equipment rental, emergency sheltering and protective measures, and additional costs relating to cleanup and recovery; and

WHEREAS, On November 26, 2013, the President declared that the storms were "of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant a major disaster declaration under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act"; and

WHEREAS, The federal government subsequently disbursed more than \$23.5 million in aid to assist individuals and businesses hit hardest by the storms; and

WHEREAS, On March 4, 2014, the federal government declared that the costs incurred by first responders and other State and local government agencies were not sufficient to warrant federal help under the Public Assistance section of the Stafford Act; and

WHEREAS, The formula for determining eligibility under the Stafford Act is based on the population of a state, thereby setting Illinois' threshold much higher than the threshold of most other states in the nation; and

WHEREAS, This exceptionally high threshold has caused Illinois to be denied federal assistance for disasters striking in primarily rural areas frequently during the last decade; and

WHEREAS, Members of the Illinois congressional delegation have introduced legislation to correct this unfair federal disaster assistance threshold formula; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the members of the United States House of Representatives to correct this outdated and unfair system by passing H.R. 3925, the Fairness in Federal Disaster Declarations Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the members of the United States Senate to pass S. 1960, the Fairness in Federal Disaster Declarations Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.

RESOLVED, That the Auditor General is directed to seek the cooperation of all of the grant-making entities of the State to which sums of money are appropriated to from State funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the compiled list shall be presented, no later than May 15, 2014, to Governor Pat Quinn, Speaker of the House Michael Madigan, Senate President John Cullerton, Senate Minority Leader Christine Radogno, and House Minority Leader Jim Durkin; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be presented to Auditor General William G. Holland.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS FIRST READING

Representative Madigan introduced the following:

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 51

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 11 to Article IX of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE IX REVENUE

SECTION 11. TAX FOR EDUCATION

Notwithstanding subsection (a) of Section 3 of this Article, and in addition to any other tax, a tax shall be imposed on individuals in an amount equal to 3% of income greater than \$1,000,000 for the taxable year. All revenue collected pursuant to this Section shall be distributed to school districts solely on a per pupil basis. The General Assembly by law shall provide for the implementation and enforcement of this Section.

SCHEDULE

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act and applies to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2014.

The foregoing HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 51 was taken up, read in full a first time, ordered reproduced and placed in the Committee on Rules.
