HOUSE RESOLUTION 968

WHEREAS, Over 40 years after Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA), promising every worker the right to a safe job, the protections in OSHA have saved hundreds of thousands of lives and prevented millions of workplace injuries; and

WHEREAS, Despite current safety laws, more than 4,000,000 workers are injured and thousands of workers are killed due to job hazards each year; and

WHEREAS, On April 28, 2014 organized labor will observe Workers' Memorial Day all across the country to remember those who have suffered and died on the job and to renew the fight for safe workplaces for all workers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize that as long as there are workers seriously injured or killed on the job, there will be a need to support stronger safety and health laws in our State and country and will work to that end; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the Illinois congressional delegation and President Barack Obama to continue to revise, revamp, and strengthen federal workplace safety laws and to properly fund OSHA programs and staff; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we offer our deep-felt sympathy and understanding to the families of workers who have been seriously injured or killed on the job; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we officially declare April 28, 2014 as Workers' Memorial Day in Illinois.

- 1) one member appointed by The Speaker of the House of Representatives, and this member shall act as the chair;
 - 2) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives;
 - 3) one member appointed by the President of the Senate;
 - 4) one member appointed by the Senate Minority leader;
- 5) one representative from the Department of Veterans' Affairs, chosen by the Director of Veterans' Affairs;
 - 6) one representative from the Department of Military Affairs, chosen by the Director of Military Affairs;
 - 7) one representative from the Department of Public Health, chosen by the Director of Public Health; and
- 8) one representative of the Department of Human Services, chosen by the Secretary of Human Services; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall meet periodically at the discretion of the chair to investigate and form recommendations concerning the issue of suicides among Illinois veterans; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Veterans' Affairs shall provide administrative and other support to the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Task Force on Veteran' Suicide shall present a report of its findings, which shall include its recommendations for legislation, if any, to the Illinois House of Representatives and the Senate on or before January 1, 2015.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 966

Offered by Representative Golar:

WHEREAS, The initiative that was to become Grow Your Own was started by the Logan Square Neighborhood Association, a community organizing group working in a low-income Latino neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, After launching a Parent Mentor program in the 1990s, the Logan Square Neighborhood Association observed that many of the participating parents wanted to become teachers but could not afford college; the Association recognized this as an opportunity to further develop community-parent-school relations; and

WHEREAS, The Logan Square Neighborhood Association partnered with a faculty member from Chicago State University and was awarded a federal Teacher Quality Enhancement grant to launch Nueva Generacion, the precursor to Grow Your Own; the goal of the new program was to prepare teachers who knew the language and culture of the students in Logan Square's classrooms; and

WHEREAS, At the same time, Action Now, formerly Illinois ACORN, began to realize that their problem was not only recruiting teachers to the North Lawndale schools but also retaining good teachers; Action Now decided to tackle the goal of improving teacher quality and retention by creating a new coalition, the Chicago Learning Campaign; and

WHEREAS, The Logan Square Neighborhood Association was the first of many community organizations to join the campaign to "grow" teachers from local residents, including paraprofessionals, community leaders, and parents, thus creating the solution to the high rates of teacher turnover in their community; and

WHEREAS, The campaign was later joined by the TARGET Area Development Corporation in the Auburn Gresham neighborhood, Kenwood Oakland Community Organization from the mid-South Side, and Southwest Organizing Project in the Gage Park/Chicago Lawn neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, In 2004, the organizers successfully advocated for a Grow Your Own Teacher Education Act; in 2005, the program received State funding and became Grow Your Own Illinois, a non-profit organization; and

WHEREAS, Grow Your Own Illinois partnered with the Illinois State Board of Education to develop the initiative statewide; the organization was also responsible for brokering additional partnerships among community organizations, local school districts, and 4-year degree-granting universities; and

WHEREAS, In 2010, Grow Your Own Illinois was transferred to the Illinois Board of Higher Education, where the organization has been diligently working with the agency to improve the program; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we show our continued support for Grow Your Own Illinois' commitment to providing quality teachers from high-need communities who want to remain in their community; and be it further
