HOUSE RESOLUTION 360

Offered by Representative Barbara Wheeler:

WHEREAS, The 20th Century has witnessed unspeakable acts of murder and chaos, from the Holocaust, to the massacres in Rwanda and Bosnia, the genocidal campaign against the Armenian people symbolizes one of the first in our modem age; and

WHEREAS, Between the years 1915-1923, nearly one and a half million Armenian men, women, and children were massacred by the Ottoman Turkish government; and

WHEREAS, The United Nations defines the term genocide as any of the following acts committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnic, racial, or religious group, including killing members of the group; causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of the group; deliberately inflicting on the group conditions of life calculated to bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part; imposing measures intended to prevent births within the group; or forcibly transferring children of the group to another; and

WHEREAS, The segregation and degradation of the minority Christian Armenian population by the Turkish government began with Ottoman rule in the mid-l800s; the brutality escalated during the reign of the Young Turks, immediately following the First World War; and

WHEREAS, In 1939, the monster, Adolf Hitler, cited the Armenian genocide as justification for the genocide he himself was about to lead, asking, "Who after all, speaks today of the annihilation of the Armenians."; and

WHEREAS, The attempted extermination and forced displacement of the Armenian people not only extinguished precious lives, but also uprooted a centuries-old culture from their ancient homeland; and

WHEREAS, The people of Armenia have witnessed the eastern conquests of Alexander the Great, fought the legions of Rome and Sassanid Persians, halted Arabian expansion, supplied emperors to the throne of Byzantium, became the first nation to adopt Christianity in 301 CE, and established their language's alphabet barely a century later in 406 CE; and

WHEREAS, A century ago this year, Armenian heritage came under threat once more, as thousands of their monasteries and churches were desecrated or destroyed, national institutions and schools, razed to the ground, and the surviving Armenian people, scattered across the world; and

WHEREAS, Despite the wreckage, the Armenian people endured, building a new and sovereign nation in the eastern half of their homeland; and

WHEREAS, The 21st Century world continues to face terrifying crimes against humanity even at this very hour, as forces of repression and barbarism seek to roll back the progress of our age; and

WHEREAS, These forces of terror include the Islamic State, Boko Haram, the regional tentacles of al-Qa'ida, al-Nusrah Front, al-Shabaab, Hizballah, and Hamas, along with far too many more; and

WHEREAS, The great champion and prophet of liberty, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. powerfully noted that, "He who passively accepts evil is as much involved in it as he who helps to perpetrate it. He who accepts evil without protesting against it is really cooperating with it."; and

WHEREAS, We must learn and boldly speak of, the often heartbreaking but invaluable lessons of our common human past, as well as teach them to our children and our grandchildren in order for this world to finally be free of hostility and violence; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we, and all other people of human decency, who speak today of the near annihilation of the Armenian people, and indeed of all those who continue suffering under the heel of tyranny across the world; and be it further

RESOLVED, That on this lOOth anniversary year of the Armenian genocide, we commemorate the nearly one and a half million precious lives lost and honor the rich, ancient heritage of the Armenian people by dedicating April 24th, 2015 as the Day of Remembrance for the Holy Martyrs of the Armenian Genocide of 1915.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 367

Resources public education campaign that informs the public about the exact steps to take if a sick, injured, or orphaned animal is encountered in the wild; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support the Department of Natural Resources increasing public education outreach in the spring months when many baby animals are mistaken as orphaned and should be left as they were found; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support the Department of Natural Resources entering into public-private partnerships for the purpose of developing and sharing educational materials such as posters, videos, programs, advertisements, and public service announcements; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support public-private collaboration in the dissemination of said educational materials to places such as schools, public and private newsletters, public and private websites, and television and radio stations.

WHEREAS, The motorcyclists of Illinois have contributed extensive volunteer service and money to many national and community charitable organizations; and

WHEREAS, During the month of May, all roadway users should unite in the safe sharing of roadways within and throughout the great State of Illinois; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, plans on constructing the Grain Belt Express Line, a 750-mile overhead transmission line that would carry electricity produced by Kansas wind farms across portions of Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, and Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The central Illinois portion of the transmission line would span the entire width of the State, including Macoupin, Montgomery and Christian Counties in the 95th Legislative District; and

WHEREAS, The majority of the energy transported along the transmission line will benefit consumers on the East Coast and will not be used by rate payers in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The transmission line will likely have a detrimental impact on landowners in these areas, as the transmission towers will decrease the value of their land and will make it more difficult for them to farm their property; and

WHEREAS, Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC has, in the past, submitted to the United States Department of Energy an application for "Federal Siting Authority", which would grant the company the powers of eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, The powers of eminent domain would allow a private company to seize land from private landowners that refuse to grant easements to their property that would allow construction of the transmission line; and

WHEREAS, Anything that encroaches upon the property rights of individual land owners in Illinois needs to be carefully considered before being enacted; and

WHEREAS, On April 10, 2015, Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC submitted an application to the Illinois Commerce Commission for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Commerce Commission to carefully consider the application submitted by Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC for its Grain Belt Express Line, and to grant the application only if the company identifies clear and substantial benefits to the State of Illinois that definitively outweigh any deprivation of property rights or land value of the citizens of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Commerce Commission.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 66

Offered by Representative Batinick:

WHEREAS, Rising tuition costs in Illinois make it increasingly difficult for students to pursue secondary education; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Student Assistance Commission has reported that college costs have risen faster in recent years than any other sector of the economy - even faster than healthcare; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' public universities rank as the fifth highest average tuition costs of any state in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Average tuition costs for Illinois public universities have risen from \$6,494 in 2004 to \$12,770 in 2014; and

WHEREAS, There has been a 73% increase in average public university total cost of attendance from 2002 to 2014; and

WHEREAS, Increased costs have driven student enrollment downwards in Illinois public universities; and

WHEREAS, A study conducted by the State Higher Education Executive Officers Association found that there had been a 10% increase in public university enrollment nationwide from 2008 to 2013; in that same time however, there has been a 4.1% decrease in enrollment at public universities in Illinois, one of only 2 states to have a decrease during that time; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has been hurt with an increasing occurrence of "brain drain" in recent years; and

WHEREAS, According to a 2012 study conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics, Illinois was the 2nd highest exporter of college freshmen in the country; as these students leave, they are not likely to return to Illinois; and

WHEREAS, By 2018, experts predict that 64% of all jobs in Illinois will require post-secondary education, yet currently only 42% of working-age adults ages 25 to 64 in Illinois hold a 2 or 4-year college degree; and

WHEREAS, It has been shown that State assistance does not reflect the true cost of higher education in Illinois; the Illinois Student Assistance Commission has reported that the Monetary Award Program currently serves about half the applicants who are eligible and covers about 35% of tuitions and fees at a public university in this State; and

WHEREAS, In 2002, the State was able to meet the needs of all eligible applications and fully covered average public university or community college tuition and fees; and

WHEREAS, The average Monetary Award Program grant award covers only \$2,700 of tuition and fees; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Higher Education Affordability Task Force is created to study and make recommendations on higher education affordability and student retention, and to determine whether Illinois is doing an adequate job at capturing sufficient available federal grants for higher education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Higher Education Affordability Task Force shall consist of the following members:

- (1) one member appointed by the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives;
- (2) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Illinois House of Representatives;
- (3) one member appointed by the President of the Illinois Senate;
- (4) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Illinois Senate;
- (5) one member appointed by each President of every public university in the State of Illinois;
- (6) one member appointed by the Executive Director of the Illinois Student Assistance Commission; and
 - (7) one member appointed by the Illinois Board of Higher Education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Board of Higher Education shall provide administrative and other support to the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That That the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 2016.
