HOUSE RESOLUTION 396

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, Illinois has a proud legacy as the home of the world's first juvenile court; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has another proud legacy from its first peoples -the practice of restorative justice; in the First Nation justice systems, healing and reintegration of individuals is the primary goal, rather than reliance on prisons and punishment; and

WHEREAS, The principle of restorative justice was included within the Purpose and Policy Section of Article 5 of the Illinois Juvenile Court Act in 1999; and

WHEREAS, To date, there have been multiple pilots throughout the State of restorative justice practices in the juvenile justice system, both as diversion from court and as sentencing alternatives, however there is no uniform statewide practice of restorative justice in the juvenile justice system; and

WHEREAS, As prison costs prove increasingly burdensome for taxpayers, and as studies reveal high repeat offending rates by prisoners who have little education or vocational skills upon release, states are increasingly examining restorative justice practices as effective diversion and sentencing alternatives; Northern Ireland, Finland, New Zealand, and other jurisdictions have successfully revamped their juvenile justice systems through the system-wide implementation of restorative justice practices and these nations serve as models of system reform through restorative justice practices; and

WHEREAS, Restorative justice practices in other nations have been implemented along with full due process and human rights protections for children in conflict with the law, including respect for confidentiality and use of dispositions that represent the least restrictive alternative; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Juvenile Justice Commission, working in partnership with the Illinois Balanced and Restorative Justice Project and the Illinois Juvenile Justice Initiative, community groups, and schools, review the current practice of restorative justice in juvenile justice systems in the State of Illinois and review restorative justice practices in juvenile justice systems in other states and cultures and nations, and report back to the Illinois General Assembly with recommendations to expand the practice of restorative justice in the juvenile justice system in Illinois with the goal of restoring public safety through restoration of the child in conflict with the law, within a system that incorporates the full range of due process and human rights protections, maximizing community based responses and utilizing incarceration only as a last resort for as short a time as possible; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Juvenile Justice Commission.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 397

Offered by Representative Ford:

BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge community college districts to waive 50% of the tuition and other necessary fees of teachers licensed under Article 21B of the School Code who are employed by a school district within an area designated as a poverty area by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity and who are enrolled in a community college program to obtain additional course credit or an additional degree; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a community college district may condition the partial tuition and fee waiver on the teacher agreeing to teach for an additional number of years in the school district in which he or she was employed at the time of the waiver; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Community College Board and all community college districts in this State.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 398

Offered by Representative William Davis:

WHEREAS, More than 15% of Illinoisans struggle to provide enough food for their families and more than 22% of Illinois children are food insecure, meaning they do not have consistent access to adequate food; and

WHEREAS, In the 2013-2014 school year, Illinois dropped from 36th to 40th in the nation in school breakfast participation; the State provided only 36.2% of Free and Reduced Price eligible children with federally-funded school breakfasts and left \$90.4 million in unclaimed federal funding for school breakfast; the State also achieved school breakfast participation rates of 70% or higher in only four of the 100 largest school districts; and

WHEREAS, Children in food-insecure households are less likely to have access to nutritious food that supplies the nutrients required for healthy brain development; and

WHEREAS, Low-income children who eat school breakfast have better overall diet quality than those who eat breakfast elsewhere or skip breakfast; and

WHEREAS, School breakfast participation is associated with a lower body mass index (BMI, an indicator of excess body fat), lower probability of overweight, and lower probability of obesity; and

WHEREAS, Eating breakfast at school is associated with positive behavioral outcomes, such as lower rates of chronic absenteeism, fewer classroom disruptions and less frequent visits to the nurse; and

WHEREAS, Alternative breakfast models, such as Breakfast in the Classroom or Grab N' Go breakfast, are proven models to boost school breakfast participation and related positive outcomes; and

WHEREAS, States across the nation have introduced legislation requiring schools with high Free and Reduced Price eligibility to provide an alternative model breakfast service; and

WHEREAS, The 1,376 schools throughout Illinois with 70% or higher Free and Reduced Price eligibility provided breakfast to only 45% of eligible students in the 2013-2014 school year; and

WHEREAS, If all Illinois schools with at least 70% Free and Reduced Price eligibility implemented alternative breakfast models and increased school breakfast participation to 70% of their students, an additional 106,726 students would receive breakfast every day; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage schools participating in the School Breakfast Program, and schools with 70% or higher Free and Reduced Price meal eligibility in particular, to utilize alternative delivery models such as Breakfast in the Classroom and Grab n' Go to provide alternative breakfast models to all students at no cost; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we acknowledge the importance of increasing participation in school breakfast in Illinois schools and recognize that establishing State requirements for schools to participate in alternative breakfast models are the most effective means to increase school breakfast participation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Commission to End Hunger's No Kid Hungry Working Group to provide the General Assembly with a report showing the impact of providing alternative breakfast models at all schools with an emphasis on schools that have 70% or higher Free and Reduced Price eligibility by November 4, 2015; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Commission to End Hunger.
