HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 450

Offered by Representative McDermed:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives are saddened to learn of the death of Olivia Kresach, who passed away on April 19, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Olivia Kresach was born on May 17, 1991; she was the daughter of Dan and Meg Kresach; and

WHEREAS, Olivia Kresach graduated from Lincoln-Way East High School in 2009; she was a lifelong dancer and a member of Willow Street Dance Company in Mokena; she was also a diver and an avid downhill skier in high school; and

WHEREAS, While at the University of Illinois at Chicago, Olivia Kresach took up yoga and became an instructor; she was also studying to become a registered dietician when she was diagnosed with glioblastoma, a highly aggressive and malignant type of brain tumor that ultimately took her life; and

WHEREAS, Olivia Kresach is missed by all who knew her; she had a contagious laugh and was always seen smiling; and

WHEREAS, After Olivia Kresach passed away on April 19, 2014, her parents, Dan and Meg, dedicated their lives to defeating not only glioblastoma, the killer disease that took their daughter and only child, but all kinds of brain cancer; and

WHEREAS, Dan and Meg have joined forces with the national organization Voices Against Brain Cancer, an organization dedicated solely to seeking cures for the toughest types of brain cancer; and

WHEREAS, Dan, Meg, and the Voices Against Brain Cancer organization are working together to advance scientific research, increase awareness within the medical community, and support the patients, families, and caregivers affected by this devastating disease; and

WHEREAS, The members of this body commend the State of Louisiana for the passage of House Concurrent Resolution 38, which established May 9 as Louisiana Gray Day to further progress brain cancer awareness; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we, along with her family and friends, mourn the passing of Olivia Kresach; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, in recognition of the work of Voices Against Brain Cancer and the continued need to recognize and bring awareness to brain cancer, we designate May 9, 2016 as Gray Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the family of Olivia Kresach as an expression of our sympathy.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 451

Offered by Representative Manley:

WHEREAS, In today's world, interstate travel has become both easier and more frequent, allowing for a more mobile workforce; and

WHEREAS, Many people are employed in industries that call for frequent travel, causing a more complex and arduous tax system; and

WHEREAS, In response to a multistate survey, 60% of employers indicated that complying with the State income tax withholding and reporting requirements for employees working in multiple states is currently a major issue or a growing concern; and

WHEREAS, It is very difficult to create a system by which an employer can physically identify when and where employees are traveling, in order to determine how much income tax to withhold and report for each state; and

WHEREAS, Only 44% of employers who responded to the survey currently have any mechanism in place to track and tax their employees based on location; and

WHEREAS, The federal government has introduced legislation that would create a federal threshold for nonresident filing for temporary employee work assignments in nonresident states in order to address the complexity of nonresident taxation; and

WHEREAS, The income of Illinois residents who work temporarily out-of-state is frequently taxed by Illinois and the other states in which they work, causing a double taxation of the portion of income earned out-of-state; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois only has reciprocal agreements with Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, and Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, Discussions have taken place among several groups in order to find a solution to this double taxation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Department of Revenue, the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, the Taxpayers' Federation of Illinois, the Illinois Manufacturers' Association, and the Illinois Retail Merchants Association to collaborate as a group during the summer and fall of 2015 to produce a solution to the current problem of double taxation of Illinois residents; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Department of Revenue, the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, the Taxpayers' Federation of Illinois, the Illinois Manufacturers' Association, and the Illinois Retail Merchants Association.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 455

Offered by Representative Unes:

WHEREAS, Stroke is a leading cause of death in the United States; hundreds of thousands of people suffer strokes annually; and

WHEREAS, Stroke is a brain attack that cuts off vital blood flow and oxygen to the brain; a stroke can happen to anyone at any time; and

WHEREAS, The National Stroke Association aims to reduce the impact and incidence of stroke through education and programs focused on prevention, treatment, rehabilitation, and support for those impacted by stroke, as well as their family and friends; and

WHEREAS, The month of May is National Stroke Awareness Month in the United States; the goal is to make people aware that they may be able to save a life of a person experiencing a stroke; and

WHEREAS, The National Stroke Awareness program places emphasis on programs to make people recognize symptoms of stroke and encourage them to act FAST if someone is suffering a stroke; and

WHEREAS, National Stroke Awareness Month is a timely reminder of stroke survivors and organizations that support stroke survivors through their lifelong journey of recovery; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois encourages efforts to promote education about symptoms of stroke and the efforts to better education the public regarding stroke; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate the month of May as Stroke Awareness and Prevention Month in the State of Illinois and recognize the work of advocacy by the National Stroke Association; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Marylee Nunley, Executive Director of the Retreat and Refresh Stroke Camp, and the dedicated staff of the Stroke Camp for their work to improve the quality of life for stroke survivors, their families, and caregivers.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 457

Offered by Representative Williams:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has adopted policies to ensure the health of all Illinoisans with strong stances on smoke-free policies; and

WHEREAS, Tobacco use is the number one cause of preventable death in Illinois, killing 18,300 annually; annual health care costs in Illinois directly caused by smoking is \$5.49 billion, and productivity losses in Illinois caused by smoking amount to \$5.27 billion; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Tobacco Quitline has been funded by the Master Tobacco Settlement Agreement since 2001; the Master Tobacco Settlement Agreement is the result of a lawsuit settlement between 46 states and the 4 largest United States tobacco companies; the settlement was to be used to help states recoup the billions of dollars spent on tobacco-related health care costs and to provide tobacco prevention and cessation services to prevent future tobacco-related health care costs; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Tobacco Quitline has been the cornerstone of cessation programs in Illinois to help Illinois residents quit smoking in order to comply with new smoke-free policies across Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Tobacco Quitline is the only statewide cessation program that is available to all residents regardless of location or socioeconomic status; and

WHEREAS, In Fiscal Year 2014, the Illinois Tobacco Quitline answered over 96,000 calls; projections for Fiscal Year 2015 are significantly higher, with 110,000 calls projected; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 25% of these calls came from Medicaid recipients; tobacco-related disease treatment for Medicaid recipients costs the State nearly \$2 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Tobacco Quitline has a very high quit success rate of 43%, with average cessation programs having a quit success rate of around 20%; smokers who attempt to quit on their own have only a 4% to 5% success rate; and

WHEREAS, On July 1, 2015, over 60 public college campuses will become smoke-free across their entire campuses pursuant to Public Act 98-985; the Illinois Tobacco Quitline is the number one cessation service offered at each of these campuses to help faculty, staff, and students to quit; and

WHEREAS, Smoke-free policies are second only to cigarette tax increases in encouraging smokers to quit; and

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's "Tips From Former Smokers", a nationwide media campaign that drives calls to state tobacco quitlines, is currently running ads that increase the number of calls to the Quitline by 240%; and

WHEREAS, All 92 local public health departments across the State promote the Quitline and refer smokers to the program on a daily or hourly basis; they also purchase local media to promote the Quitline; and

WHEREAS, Over 500 partners across the State, including hospitals, doctor's offices, and federally qualified health centers, refer patients to the Quitline on a daily or hourly basis; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we show our support for the Illinois Tobacco Quitline as the cornerstone of cessation tools for the State of Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 460

Offered by Representative Conroy:

WHEREAS, Community colleges in the State of Illinois are public institutions that receive State funding; and

WHEREAS, The College of DuPage is governed by a Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, The College of DuPage Board of Trustees recently approved a \$763,000 severance package for its current President; and

WHEREAS, The College of DuPage Board of Trustees is under scrutiny for its spending on meals, beverages, and alcohol for Trustees, spending nearly \$20,000 on meals over a 16-month period from September of 2013 to December of 2014; and

WHEREAS, The DuPage County State's Attorney's Office is currently investigating spending by the College of DuPage Board of Trustees in response to media reports and citizen concerns regarding the improper use of funds; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the College of DuPage is urged to report all administrative expenses for Fiscal Year 2015 and all forthcoming years to the General Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Trustees of the College of DuPage are urged to participate in professional board development training to enhance their knowledge of board governance and of the duties of a Trustee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the College of DuPage Board of Trustees is urged to establish a finance committee to evaluate and implement best practices in accounting, transparency, and budgeting.
