WHEREAS, The current infant mortality rate is a significant and troubling public health issue, especially for African American families, Native American families, and Hispanic families; and

WHEREAS, The infant mortality rate among African American women is triple that of Caucasian women, according to the Illinois Department of Public Health; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Department of Public Health and other stakeholders in the Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network to Reduce Infant Mortality are committed to addressing infant mortality by focusing on preconception and interconception health, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, social determinants of health, early elective delivery, and perinatal regionalization; and

WHEREAS, A set of goals and objectives with 10-year targets designed to guide national health promotion and disease prevention, known as Healthy People 2020, include an objective regarding a decrease in the rate of infant mortality; and

WHEREAS, September 1, 2015 will begin a period of several months of national and state observances that relate to the issue of infant mortality, including the observance of October as Sudden Infant Death Awareness Month and November as Prematurity Awareness Month; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate September of 2015 as Infant Mortality Awareness Month in the State of Illinois and applaud the Illinois Department of Public Health's mission to reduce infant mortality; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Department of Public Health, the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services, the Illinois Department of Human Services, the Office of the Governor, and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.

WHEREAS, The average tuition rate per credit hour is nearly \$119.00 per credit hour; and

WHEREAS, Of the nearly 165,000 qualified MAP students who were turned away due to lack of funds in Fiscal Year 2014, almost 75% of them were community college students; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Community College System Economic Impact Study finds that, on average, all students who completed their community college education in Fiscal Year 2011 saw a gain of almost \$3,600, a 30% increase in earnings over their pre-enrollment wages; and

WHEREAS, In his first State of the State Address, Governor Bruce Rauner called for an end to "the era of cutting funding for technical training and community colleges"; and

WHEREAS, Governor Rauner's Fiscal Year 2016 budget provides for an investment in our future workforce through K-12 education and community colleges; and

WHEREAS, In January of 2015, President Barack Obama announced the America's College Promise initiative to provide a community college education tuition free to qualified students; and

WHEREAS, The America's College Promise of free community college tuition, partnered with proven strategies to support student achievement and increase degree completion, would provide the critical support structures needed to ensure that our State and our nation would have an educated workforce prepared for the jobs of the future; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge President Barack Obama and Congress to make federal funds available to the Illinois Community College System; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, and the members of the Illinois congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 531

Offered by Representative Welch:

WHEREAS, Illinois taxpayers spend hundreds of millions of dollars each year on fees for financial services, which contributes to the State's financial distress; and
