Offered by Representative Williams:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has failed to consistently budget in a way that provides fiscal stability and employs a long-term approach to Illinois' financial health; and

WHEREAS, The State lacks the fiscal stability necessary to adequately attract and retain new jobs at the levels necessary to support robust economic growth; this lack of stability drives up costs of providing critical services and programs for Illinois residents; and

WHEREAS, The lack of consistent long-term budget strategies, combined with the recent fiscal downturn, have led to a perpetual cycle of crisis budgeting; and

WHEREAS, Crisis-driven budgeting has led to a focus on short-term needs, rather than the long-term needs of the State; and

- (1) set an annual revenue estimate, after examination of the estimates of the Governor's

- (2) allocate non-discretionary items "off the top" of the estimate of available revenues
- before dividing the rest of the revenue proportionately among the appropriations committees; and
- (3) create an "Executive Appropriations Committee" comprised of the chairs and minority spokespersons of each appropriations committee as well as the chair of the Revenue Committee, which shall be charged with setting the amounts to be allocated to each appropriations committee and any subsequent reallocation of such funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the General Assembly to not approve the expenditure of funds for new programs and services without providing an examination of the cost/benefit analysis of said program or service and a finding that the addition of the new program or service provides significant long-term benefit to the State's fiscal health by realizing cost savings or meets an overriding public policy need; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the General Assembly to conduct such an analysis at the committee level, with each substantive and appropriations committee creating a working subcommittee to consider such measures and evaluate the aforementioned criteria.

- (1) the Illinois General Assembly should apply any revenues which exceed expenditures to the payment of any old bills that are more than 45 days past the due date, including General Revenue Fund and non-General Revenue Fund expenditures, at the close of each fiscal year; and
- (2) if there are no pending bills over 45 days past the due date at such a time, such revenues should be directed to the Budget Stabilization Fund (30 ILCS 122 et seq.), also known as the "Rainy Day Fund"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois General Assembly to provide for the use and maintenance of the Budget Stabilization Fund, to be funded as follows:

- (1) should the growth in the annual revenue estimate exceed 3% from the previous year's estimated revenues, such excess amount should be appropriated "off the top" of estimated available revenues to the Budget Stabilization Fund; and
- (2) should no unpaid bills remain due over 45 days at the close of each fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly should apply any revenues which exceed expenditures to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

- (5) a member of a Winnebago County legal association appointed by the Governor;
- (6) a member of the Winnebago County Violent Crime Task Force appointed by the members of the Winnebago County Violent Crime Task Force;
- (7) two members of the Illinois House of Representatives chosen by the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives, one of whom shall serve as co-chair;
- (8) two members of the Illinois House of Representatives chosen by the Minority Leader of the Illinois House of Representatives;
 - (9) the President of the Student Government Association at Rock Valley College;
 - (10) the Director of Corrections or his or her designee, who must:
 - (A) be from the Division of Parole;
 - (B) be an active field agent; and
 - (C) possess at least a master's degree in criminal justice or criminology;
- (11) a faculty member of the Sociology Department at Rock Valley College appointed by the President of Rock Valley College;
- (12) a faculty member of the Criminal Justice program at Rock Valley College appointed by the President of Rock Valley College; and
- (13) a representative of an organization representing Rockford-area businesses appointed by the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives; and be it further

RESOLVED, That all appointments shall be made no later than 45 days following the adoption of this resolution; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study and determine the causes of violent crime in Rockford and nearby affected communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study and determine the feasibility of deploying the Illinois State Police to Rockford and nearby affected communities and neighborhoods; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall develop a comprehensive long-term solution to the effect of violent crime in Rockford and nearby affected communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall recommend a plan of action to substantially reduce the incidents of violent crime in Rockford and nearby affected communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall draft any necessary legislation and make any necessary recommendations for appropriations for the General Assembly to pass and the Governor to sign to place the plan of action into immediate effect; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations and submit any and all proposed legislation to the Governor and General Assembly on or before December 31, 2016; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be presented to the Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the Illinois House of Representatives, the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the Director of State Police.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 560

Offered by Representative Bradley:

WHEREAS, Illinois has been a leader in energy production within the United States, in large part due to Illinois' vast coal resources; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the largest recoverable bituminous coal reserves in the United States, a reserve base larger than all but 6 countries in the world, and the ability to produce all of America's electricity needs for 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is a net exporter of electricity, the largest electricity exporter in the Midwest, and one of the largest in the United States; nearly 45% of Illinois' energy comes from coal-burning plants within the State; and

WHEREAS, Coal power plants in the United States have met the environmental challenges of the past 4 decades while meeting the low-cost energy needs of the nation; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois coal industry is currently responsible for over \$2,500,000,000 in annual economic activity within the State, including employing approximately 5,000 miners with an average salary of \$85,000 a year, higher than both the United States and Illinois median household incomes; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois coal industry has faced increased environmental regulations in the last 2 decades that resulted in coal production going from 62 million tons of mined coal in 1990 to a low of 31 million tons in 2003 and a loss of 6,500 direct jobs during this time period; and

WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 imposed strict sulfur dioxide (S02) emission standards, making coal mined in Illinois unusable without flue gas desulfurization (FGD) equipment, often referred to as "scrubbers"; and

WHEREAS, Technology can be deployed that allows high-sulfur Illinois coal to be burned efficiently while meeting strict State and federal air emission standards; specifically, the State of Illinois should be encouraging the retrofitting and use of advanced clean coal technologies such as flue gas desulfurization, wet electro-static precipitators (wet ESPs), and oxy-combustion; and

WHEREAS, Illinois currently exports coal to 18 states that utilize advanced clean coal technologies; and WHEREAS, Illinois power plants currently use Wyoming coal despite the fact that advanced clean coal technology would allow the utilization of Illinois coal, saving Illinois consumers hundreds of millions of dollars; and

WHEREAS, It is costing Illinois consumers more than \$1,000,000,000 annually to import coal from other states, primarily from Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, Using Illinois coal within Illinois would lead to substantial economic benefits by saving \$1,000,000,000 in transportation costs and creating thousands of new jobs in mining and ancillary industries in currently economically depressed counties in central and southern Illinois while creating more State and local tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, Using Illinois coal within Illinois benefits the environment as well as the economy by reducing C02 emissions through the use of higher rank coals; and

WHEREAS, Switching to Illinois coal through the retrofitting and use of advanced clean coal technologies would reduce CO2 emissions by at least 4% annually because Illinois Basin Coal has a lower CO2 content than Wyoming coal, and an additional 20% reduction in CO2 emissions would result from the reduction in transportation related emissions annually; and

WHEREAS, The recent growth in Illinois coal production has been due to approximately \$10 billion in new investment in the past 10 years in the Illinois coal fields producing low-cost coal and the retrofitting of pollution control technology in power plants throughout the United States in response to changes in the Clean Air Act mandating reduced air emissions; and

WHEREAS, The switch to Illinois coal will improve the competitiveness of Illinois power generation as Illinois coal has a lower delivered cost, stable pricing, and higher heat content; once retrofitted with advanced technology, Illinois power plants fired with Illinois coal should be more competitive in electricity markets, thereby helping to insure the continued generation of competitive power for both in-state customers and the out-of-state electricity market; and

WHEREAS, Much of the State of Illinois overlays the Mount Simon Sandstone, a saline-filled, porous, deep geological formation of enormous capacity that has been determined to be one of the most significant carbon resources in the United States, and its development could result in expanded use of Illinois coal in a carbon-constrained world; and

WHEREAS, It is vital that Illinois coal be considered part of an "All of the Above" approach to energy production in order to keep Illinois as a leader in energy production, job creation, economic growth, and environmental protection; and

WHEREAS, Illinois coal must be part of the solution to reducing the State's carbon emissions and complying with federal carbon emission requirements; and

WHEREAS, Sufficient studies have taken place, and the data is clear that Illinois power plants should be using Illinois coal; and

WHEREAS, Dynegy should offer to the people of the State of Illinois an explanation of its plans for its 10 coal-fired plants in Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, the Illinois Commerce Commission, the Illinois Power Agency, the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, and the Illinois Department of Revenue to take action to implement the use of Illinois coal; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all agencies and stakeholders developing strategies to comply with new federal carbon emissions requirements to utilize Illinois coal to reduce carbon emissions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge Dynegy to provide an explanation of its plans for its 10 coal-fired plants in Illinois to the General Assembly and Governor Rauner prior to June 14, 2015; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Bruce Rauner, the Illinois Congressional delegation, and all the members of the General Assembly.

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Health and Human Services' Administration on Aging was created by the Older Americans Act of 1965; the agency has been empowered to act as an effective advocate for the concerns and needs of older individuals; and

WHEREAS, The Older Americans Act of 1965 serves as a model for the development of community-based services, including services that provide alternatives to the institutionalization of older individuals; and

WHEREAS, Some of the programs authorized under the Older Americans Act of 1965 were created to address the specific concerns of those older Americans with the greatest social and economic needs, especially minority older Americans; and

WHEREAS, Many services under the Older Americans Act of 1965, including long-term care ombudsman and legal services providers, have acted as powerful advocates for older individuals; and

WHEREAS, Services authorized under the Older Americans Act of 1965 have also provided important part-time community service employment opportunities for low-income older individuals; and

WHEREAS, Many older individuals, and those who serve them, have benefited greatly from the research, training, and education that programs established under the Older Americans Act of 1965 have provided; and

WHEREAS, During Fiscal Year 2015, Illinois Area Agencies on Aging will serve an estimated 515,700 persons 60 and over, accounting for 22% of the 2.3 million seniors in Illinois; the agencies will also develop and coordinate comprehensive systems of home and community-based services to enable older adults with chronic illnesses and disabilities to live in the least restrictive setting and avoid unnecessary hospital readmissions and placements in long term care facilities; and

WHEREAS, Thirteen Area Agencies on Aging in Illinois collaborate with 179 provider agencies to provide a myriad of home and community-based services for older adults and their caregivers, including information and assistance for older adults to help them make informed decisions about programs, benefits, and services and live independently for as long as possible, transportation programs, in-home services, homedelivered meals, congregate meals, Multi-Purpose Senior Centers, recreation programs, legal assistance, health promotion and disease prevention, and evidence-based health promotion programs; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of the changing needs of a rapidly aging society, the Older Americans Act of 1965 has been periodically amended and reauthorized; and

WHEREAS, The Older Americans Act of 1965 served as the foundation for an effective human services policy for millions of Americans as the United States entered the 21st century; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we affirm our support for the Older Americans Act of 1965 and the primary goals of the Act of providing services to maintain the dignity of older Illinoisans and promoting the independence of those individuals; and be it further
