WHEREAS, The benefits of positive youth development include success in school, but extend beyond that to include healthy development, positive relationships, and civic engagement; and

WHEREAS, Positive youth development opportunities are critical to the future success of children and young people, and of the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate April 13, 2016 as Positive Youth Development Day in Illinois as a sign of our collective commitment to providing children and young people with the support, experiences, and opportunities they need to be connected, educated, healthy, thriving, safe, and employable; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we show our commitment to positive youth development and to achieving a vision of success for children and youth that ensures that they are connected, educated, healthy, thriving, safe, and employable.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1132

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Article VIII of the Illinois Constitution provides, "The Governor shall prepare and submit to the General Assembly, at a time prescribed by law, a State budget for the ensuing fiscal year"; and

WHEREAS, Social services serving the homeless and senior citizens have been forced to either halt services or find creative methods to obtain funding to continue operations; and

WHEREAS, Youth employment services are without funding, exacerbating a crisis of unemployment among younger workers; and

WHEREAS, Mental health programs have been cut across the State, causing an increase in violence; and

WHEREAS, A lack of funding for services for children with autism has forced families to go without treatment for their children or other support; and

WHEREAS, The impasse has also affected State universities; and

WHEREAS, The continued impasse could lead to the closure of State universities, including Chicago State University and Eastern Illinois University, leaving students of these institutions and citizens of this State without affordable higher education; and

WHEREAS, Other institutions of higher education have received lower credit ratings because of the uncertainty surrounding future State funding of the universities; and

WHEREAS, The budget impasse threatens Chicago Public School students as well through the refusal to help relieve the fiscal crisis, putting almost 400,000 children at risk; and

WHEREAS, State credit ratings have continued to drop since the onset of the budget impasse, making it more expensive for the State to borrow money on the financial markets; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that Democrats and Republicans work together toward a responsible budget that is fiscally sound; and be it further

RESOLVED, That both parties agree that the General Assembly must craft, agree to, and pass a budget; and be it further

RESOLVED, That every community should have a say in passing a State budget; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, Speaker of the House, the Minority Leader of the House, President of the Senate, and Minority Leader of the Senate.
