WHEREAS, Treatment models using behavioral science have shown a great deal of promise in many medical and mental health circles; and

WHEREAS, Countless loved ones have had to endure the pain and heartache associated with heroin addiction; and

WHEREAS, With 12-step programs having such low success rates action must be taken to save lives from heroin and other addictions; and

WHEREAS, A new treatment method that meets the needs of the addicted and that uses a behavioral methodology to better foster heroin addiction recovery is urgently needed; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage the Illinois Department of Human Services to address heroin addiction and implement new addiction protocols that meet the needs of the addicted in Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we designate November 4, 2016 as Heroin Addiction Awareness Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Governor Rauner, Secretary-designate of the Illinois Department of Human Services James T. Dimas, and Kari Karidis.

WHEREAS, The steel industry and manufacturing have been significantly undermined by low price steel imports from foreign nations; companies in places like China, South Korea, India, the Philippines, Vietnam, Thailand, Turkey, Taiwan, and Saudi Arabia are selling their products in the United States at predatory prices; some estimates state that certain Chinese steel firms retail their products in the United States at 75% of the domestic cost of production; a South Korean firm recently retailed its products even lower at 48% of the domestic cost of production; this unfair trade practice puts American mills, and the mines that feed them, at risk; and

WHEREAS, The economic consequences of steel dumping have begun and will have a lasting detrimental impact on the Illinois economy and the entire nation; across the Midwest, thousands of steelworkers have already been laid off in recent years, and as mills continue to operate well below their operational capacity, more steelworkers and miners are at risk; as the percentage of foreign steel used in the United States increases, the impacts on American manufacturing will only increase; this could lead to the erosion of enterprises that are critical to our economy and national defense; and

WHEREAS, The dumping of foreign steel into the United States is a violation of international trade agreements and must be halted; Article VI of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade 1994 states that products from another country shall not be introduced into the commerce of another country at a value less than the product's normal price in the destination country; the Department of Commerce has used the provisions of this article to investigate and take anti-dumping measures against nations in the past; however, this process is slow; while nations and companies are being identified, investigated, and punished, American workers are being laid off; action must be taken to more aggressively identify those violating international trade agreements and punish them accordingly; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge President Barack Obama and the United States Congress to take action to halt the illegal dumping of foreign steel into the U.S. market; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to President Barack Obama, United States Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives Paul Ryan, and the members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.

WHEREAS, Paper and plastic disposable bags consume valuable natural resources in their production, increase waste generation, and contribute to litter; and

WHEREAS, The impact of single-use retail plastic and paper bags imposes a high cost on citizens in terms of recycling, landfill space, sewer cleanup costs, and environmental damage; and

WHEREAS, One million birds and 100,000 mammals are killed annually from plastic in our environment; and

WHEREAS, Improper disposal results in plastic bags becoming windblown through our streets and parks, clogging our storm drains and sewers and degrading our soils and waterways; and

WHEREAS, Those plastic bags that are blown or washed into our waterways may threaten the lives of avian and marine species through entanglement, choking, and toxicity; and

WHEREAS, Plastic bags, when landfilled, do not biodegrade and remain intact for many decades; those that remain in the environment photo-degrade into very small particles that may be consumed by wildlife, diminishing and contaminating a part of our food chain; and

WHEREAS, Locally, plastic bags must be screened out of yard waste collections; they contaminate food scrap composting facilities and have jammed the mechanical parts of recycling balers and sewage treatment systems; and

WHEREAS, Single use plastics such as Styrofoam, clamshell containers, and plastic bags, are unsustainable products, manufactured from petroleum and natural gas; the energy used in the production and transportation of plastic bags results in unnecessary natural resource consumption and increased greenhouse gas emissions; and

WHEREAS, The impacts of plastic bag use and pollution have ignited a global movement to dramatically reduce the amount of disposable plastic bags distributed; and

WHEREAS, Many states have successfully enacted ordinances banning or restricting the use of plastic bags; and

WHEREAS, These measures will help educate schools that need to know about recycling waste; therefore, be it
