To the Honorable Members of The Illinois Senate, 99th General Assembly:

Today I return Senate Bill 2822, which would give \$215,000,000 to Chicago Public Schools without having reached agreement on comprehensive pension reforms for the State and local governments.

In June we agreed on a six-month funding bridge to a balanced budget with structural and economic reforms. Democrat leaders were clear at that time that an agreement to end the budget impasse was not possible before the election. Although disappointed, we came together to fund schools and critical government operations until legislative leaders were willing to reengage in serious, good faith negotiations.

As a precondition to funding schools statewide, Democrats proposed a \$700 million State bailout of CPS. We eventually agreed to provide CPS with \$215,000,000 – the estimated amount of its Fiscal Year 2017 employer normal pension cost – but only if we came together to pass comprehensive pension reform. Without reforms to solve our structural problems, taxpayer money would continue to be wasted on bailout after bailout.

The agreement was clear: Republicans supported Senate Bill 2822 only on condition that Democrats reengage in serious, good faith negotiations; and President Cullerton and Leader Radogno filed motions to reconsider the bill, which would keep the bill in the General Assembly until a pension reform agreement was reached.

The election is over. Despite my repeated request for daily negotiations and hope to reach a comprehensive agreement by the end of next week, we are no closer to ending the impasse or enacting pension reform. Still, President Cullerton withdrew his motion to reconsider the bill, ruled that Leader Radogno's motion was inapplicable, and presented the bill to me for approval or veto – forcing me to take action. Then today, President Cullerton suddenly denied that the leaders had agreed that this bill would depend upon first enacting comprehensive pension reform. Breaking our agreement undermines our effort to end the budget impasse and enact reforms with bipartisan support.

The taxpayers of Illinois want a balanced budget. That can only be done if we address the structural imbalances that have bankrupted the State and CPS alike and drain resources that should be spent on other priorities, like improving schools and funding social services. The taxpayers of Illinois do not want just another bailout. Let's get back to work to end the budget impasse and put Illinois on the right track once and for all.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 9(b) of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return Senate Bill 2822 entitled "AN ACT concerning public employee benefits", with the foregoing objections, vetoed in its entirety.

WHEREAS, The United States and the State of Illinois should strive to foster inclusion, opportunity, and equality for all individuals regardless of race, gender, nationality, sexual orientation, or religion; and

WHEREAS, We are a nation built on an American dream, which has flourished due to hope, unity, and the acceptance and inclusion of immigrants in our society; and

WHEREAS, The greatest strength of our people and our society is our diversity; out of many, we are one; and

WHEREAS, Stephen Bannon is a known white supremacist who has fanned the flames of hatred and intolerance while editor-in-chief at Breitbart News; as a top advisor, he has brought the same hateful tactics to President-elect Donald Trump's campaign; and

WHEREAS, The deplorable headlines published during Mr. Bannon's tenure at Breitbart including: "Would you rather your child had feminism or cancer", "Hoist it high and proud: The Confederate flag proclaims a glorious heritage", "Gay rights have made us dumber, it's time to get back in the closet", "Bill Kristol: Republican spoiler, renegade Jew", reflect the frightening world view of the white-nationalist group, known as the "alt-right"; and

WHEREAS, An individual heralded by the "alt-right" and pushing a strong white-nationalistic, anti-Semitic, Islamophobic, and misogynistic agenda, who has used racial divisiveness for his own personal advancement has no place working in American government, much less in a leadership role within the White House; and

WHEREAS, Since the November 8, 2016 election, the Southern Poverty Law Center and the American Council on American-Islamic Relations have both documented an alarming surge in the number of reported hate crimes against marginalized Americans; and

WHEREAS, Since the November 8, 2016 election, calls to the suicide hotline in Illinois have increased by 200%, with experts attributing the alarming increase in part to marginalized communities fearing for their safety after the results of the election; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters of marginalized communities including women, people of color, immigrants, the LGBTQ community, and the disabled by condemning the appointment of Stephen Bannon as Chief Strategist to President-elect Trump and demand President-elect Trump to rescind the appointment and focus on uniting our country and serving as Commander-in-Chief for all Americans; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge Governor Rauner to stand with marginalized communities in Illinois and call for the rejection of hate speech and the immediate dismissal of Mr. Bannon; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor Rauner and President-elect Trump.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 168

Offered by Representative Kay:

WHEREAS, House Resolution 1101 (5/19/08), House Resolution 1428 (7/15/08), House Resolution 1517 (9/10/08), House Resolution 11 (2/11/90), and House Resolution 870 (2/11/10) formed the Illinois Family Law Study Committee; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Family Law Study Committee subcommittee on custody, aka POD 1, produced a report on April 10, 2010, which stated in the pertinent section that "Secondarily, the effect of the present system, in practice, has created "cottage industries" of GALs/child representatives, custody evaluators, and others, who have increased litigation costs and are not necessarily helpful in reducing conflicts between the parents"; and

WHEREAS, The House of Representatives, Judiciary I Civil Law Committee issued a May 15, 2012 letter signed by all 11 committee members to members of the Illinois Supreme Court Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission, voicing concern about the lack of attorney discipline "occurring in the area of

child representatives and guardian ad litems appointed under the Marriage and Dissolution of Marriage Act (750 ILCS 5/506) in various court systems throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois family court system participates in, and is otherwise subsidized by, a Federal Program involving child support enforcement State and federal funding under, inter alia, Social Security Act, Title IV-D (42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq), Title 45 Code of Federal Regulations Illinois Public Aid Code (305 ILCS 5/10-1 et seq), Title 89 Illinois Administrative Code; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' participation in the aforesaid Title IV-D Federal Program requires strict adherence to the State and federal laws and rules and regulations governing said program; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois budget impasse resulted in the March 2016 resurrection of a 1992 federal lawsuit involving the aforesaid Title IV-D Federal Program, the executive agency of the Governor responsible for the administration of said Federal Program, namely, the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS), and a certified class of Cook County parents; 2016 court proceedings disclosed costly intergovernmental agreements between HFS and circuit courts in 11 of the 102 counties of Illinois, among other issues of fiscal and legal concern involving the administration of the Title IV-D Federal Program and Illinois family court proceedings statewide; and

WHEREAS, The April 10, 2010 report of the Illinois Family Law Study Committee, subcommittee on custody, among other authorities, indicate an unaddressed systemic problem in the Illinois family court system which calls into question Illinois' adherence to the State and federal laws and rules and regulations governing Illinois' participation in the aforesaid Title IV-D Federal Program; and

WHEREAS, A majority of members of the Senate and House of Representative of the Illinois General Assembly are committed to the lawful participation of Illinois in the Title IV-D Federal Program; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Legislature has not passed an annual state budget since May of 2014; and
