Speaker Redmond: "Representative Friedland seeks recognition to announce that Representative Mahar, representative of the second greatest institution of higher education of the State of Wisconsin is here. Representative Friedland."

Friedland: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, you're here and I'm here and some of the Members are here and I'd urge you to consider taking action only on Senate Bills, Second Reading today of those Bills that the Members are here. Thank you."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Dunn."



Dunn, J: "Mr. Speaker and Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, I rise on a point of personal privilege. I don't think we've taken a Roll Call yet and I just wanted to indicate that when it is taken I do intend to indicate that I am present in spite of the headline in my local newspaper last night which on the front page reads, 'Dunn admits unauthorized use of state plane and resigns'. I am resigning and I am not that dumb."

Speaker Redmond: "That Dunn is what is known as an Irish Republican and we're really not surprised. I would like...I would like to assure all of the Members that regardless of what...of what the Attendance Roll Call will show that if anybody is not in attendance the likelihood of him getting the per diem is extremely remote. Is the message conveyed? Representative Kent."

Kent: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I am an Irish Republican and I want to tell you that I am here. I am sick and tired of being what you would call, taking bait or something. Where are the rest of the people? I want things to start because I'd like to be home, too, just like the rest of those that did leave. And I think those of us who are here should have at least the courtesy to begin, get started and get home."

Speaker Redmond: "In kind of a casual observation it appears to me that the Republicans in attendance outnumber the Democrats. Yes. Yes. Representative Yourell."

Yourell: "That'll make it about even then, won't it?"

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Polk."

Polk: "Mr. Speaker, there are a few of us here and I see all the gate guards are here this morning taking care of all the necessities to make sure that we're not stampeded by the constituents who are coming down to watch us. But I would, Sir, I would, Sir, seriously request that in case you have us back in here again next Saturday, would you alert the cafeteria so that we can have something to eat when we get here in the morning? They are my finest friends down there and they have been very nice to me but I think it's important that when we assume we can come here to go to work we'll be able to get something to eat."

Speaker Redmond: "I will do that. I would hope we don't have to meet next Saturday. Representative Keats is recognized to pay homage to the



service that the Speaker's Office renders to the Members."

Keats: "Well, Mr. Speaker, I would like to thank your office but I regrettably cannot tell what this is in this box. And besides, I would like to know who ate the other half of whatever this thing is."

Speaker Redmond: "That's the extent of our generosity."

Keats: "Yeah, well, if that's the generosity, might I have the bubonic plague instead? Thank you."

Speaker Redmond, "Is there objection? Representative Geo-Karis."

Geo-Karis: "Mr. Speaker and Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, I kind of echo the sentiments of Representative Kent but since we are here, I think we should get down to business at hand and let's get moving because we can't get a plane to get off and those of us who don't have a car, we're really stuck. Not me, kid, I pay my own way, thank you."

Speaker Redmond: "Roll Call for attendance. Senate Bills Second Reading. Senate Bills Second Reading appears Senate Bill 3."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 3. A Bill for an Act to amend the Waukegan Port District Act. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Mr. Speaker, I would suggest that we don't go ahead with any business of the House until we have a quorum here."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, I'm kind of torn here. Representative Geo-Karis and Representative Kent want me to proceed; Representative Ryan doesn't want me to proceed."

Ryan: "Mr. Speaker, I...I'm certain we had that agreement yesterday. I know that I did, I'm not sure whether you remembered it or not. I said I would be more than happy to be here if there were a quorum to do business with but if there wasn't, I'd be the first to question it. And that's what I'm now doing."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Friedland."

Ryan: "It really shouldn't come as a surprise to you."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, what may come later on may come as a surprise to you. Representative Friedland."

Friedland: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I noticed that Senate Bill 3, it's Sponsor, Representative Matijevich, is here and I'd urge you to proceed."



Speaker Redmond: "Is there any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "No floor Amendments."

Speaker Redmond "Third Reading. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Mr. Speaker, I just questioned the quorum. I don't know how you can continue...."

Speaker Redmond; "Well, I hadn't...you didn't specifically question a quorum, now if you are questioning a quorum...."

Ryan: "I'm questioning a quorum."

Speaker Redmond: "Okay and I would like to...I would like to just point out that we made a very valiant effort to make sure that House Bill 820 was passed and the Sponsor was very interested in it and it would seem to me that maybe the courtesy that was extended to him could equally be extended to other people. There isn't anything except a...a... purely clerical and administerial thing we're going to do today, nothing is going to be done of any significance except moving things from Second to Third Reading. Now if you...persistent, I will ask the Clerk to ...to call...dump this and call for a Roll Call for attendance and question the quorum."

Ryan: "I'm obligated to persist, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Redmond: "Perfectly all right. Dump this one and we'll take a Roll Call for attendance."

Clerk O'Brien: "Take an oral?"

Speaker Redmond: "Might as well, yeah. Representative Roman Kosinski."

Kosinski: "Ten minute recess? I think that'll give us some time to get some bodies here."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, I would also like to point out that the chair, the Speaker has the authority to send the state police and get people here to compel a quorum attendance. Representative Kosinski."

Kosinski: "...State Office Building, I have a feeling there are some people still there. A ten minute recess, I think, might cover it."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Luft."

Luft: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. If we do not reach a quorum which I think is not too smart a political move to ask for right now, I would like to somehow...you inform me how you do send the police out to those people because I'll be glad to make the motion to do it at...."

Speaker Redmond: "I've never done it before but we're getting ready to



do it. Representative Deuster."

Deuster: "Well, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, I think Representative Ryan questioned the quorum and I would seek recognition and...and request that we have a verified Roll Call instead of pushing a lot of buttons. Now those of us who are here are here because presumably we're conscientious and want to get to work. There's no reason that we have to suffer and I think we ought to make sure that everybody is here. And if we don't have enough bodies, let's not have a farce or a fraud, let's simply adjourn. As I understand, there's nothing...I'm...I have my family in town, I'm going to stay over the weekend. I can be here but I'm thinking of the others and there's nothing that needs to be done that can't be done in a...in a ministerial manner in a Perfunctory Session."

Speaker Redmond: "Five minute recess."

RECESS

Speaker Redmond: "House will come to order. Senate Bills Third Reading. Senate Bill 600." Representative Farley moves Senate Bill 600 do pass. Are you ready for the question? Representative Murphy seconds that motion. Representative Matijevich, I think you gave a pretty good impression that....former Representative Hill, but how about Murphy? Can you give us one of him? Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Mr. Speaker, on this House Bill 600, I've been here... I've been here all Session and I haven't said a word. I voted for every Bill, every Bill you brought up to me, I voted for it. But now it's different. Every Roll Call, I'm going to verify every Roll Call from now on. I'm telling you, everything you do from now on I'm going to question. That's all there is to it and you...and if that doesn't work I'm going to get the state police."

Speaker Redmond: "How about Skinner, can you give us Skinner? Skinner."

Matijevich: "I'll tell you, Skinner changes so much, he's been such a good boy since he got married, it's pretty hard to give an impression of him. Aw shucks."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Geo-Karis."

Geo-Karis: "I think I'll do some justice to Skinner. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Speaker, I've been on the floor. Bring back Bob Blair. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Speaker, I want the floor. I give you a choice, verified Roll Call



or else verify quorum. Pick you choice."

Speaker Redmond: "How about Representative Tipsword for Some Enchanted evening? Have you got that in your system, Rollie? Some Enchanted Evening."

Tipsword: "I think we've had that all ready."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Geo-Karis. Oh."

Geo-Karis: "I just heard, Mr. Speaker, that Tom Laue, who is one of the most handsome, most articulate, nicest reporters of the world is the new Chief of the Springfield Bureau of UPI and I'd like to congratulate Tom. I think we all do. Tom Laue. The best looking guy with the whiskers."

Speaker Redmond: "How would you know he was handsome?"

Geo-Karis: "Well, I've been looking at him ever since I've been here but he doesn't give me a tumble."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Well, I...I agree with everything....said about Tom Laue but she didn't mention that Bob Kieckhefer got a promotion also. He's head of the Chicago Bureau, I believe."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Geo-Karis."

Geo-Karis: "Larry Green who is an articulate, brilliant writer for the Daily News, I just got the news from another reporter that his dog killed his neighbor's cat this morning."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Peters."

Peters: "Well, now, Mr. Speaker, all of these compliments to the members of the press, it's a little bit trying at 9:30 in the morning. After all, we all know how much we suffer under what they write. Today is a day, kind of day I think we ought to lay it on the table. They're...they're all a pain the rear and we'd....better off if they weren't here."

Speaker Redmond: "You've cleaned your act up pretty well. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Well, Mr. Speaker, we've been here now for an hour and we haven't done anything. I think you either ought to fish or cut bait and decide what we're going to do and do it. Let's go. We either got 89 or you haven't and if you haven't and you want to get them here, do what you have to. If you haven't, let's adjourn."



Speaker Redmond: "Well, I understand that there's quite a number of people in town that have called and indicated that we...that they will be over here very shortly. So we will...we will have the Roll Call for attendance and leave it open and if...if we don't have the 89 why we'll wait and let these other people come here. Mr. Clerk, Roll Call for attendance."

Ryan: "Mr. Speaker, how long do you intend to wait?"

Speaker Redmond: "Long enough so that .....the people who say that they're in town get a chance to get over here. Clerk will take the record. Senate Bills Second Reading. Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Would the record show that Representative Kornowicz is excused because of illness? That Representative Giglio is excused because of a death in the family? And that Representative Chapman and Young are excused?"

Speaker Redmond: "Hearing no objection the record will so show. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "I would like to have the record show that Representative McAvooy is absent due to illness. Representative Schoeberlein is absent due to illness in the family. Representatives Dyer and Catania are absent due to legislative duties in Bloomington."

Speaker Redmond: "The record will so show. Representative Boucek."

Boucek: "Mr. Speaker, you closed the board before I pushed my 'present' button. I've been here since a quarter to nine this morning."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Boucek's attendance is verified, so will you put him on the Roll Call."

Boucek: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Redmond: "Incidentally, Representative Lee Daniels was here a few minutes ago, would there be any objection to him being on the Roll Call? I know where he is, he's at the Republican County Chairmen's Meeting. He's there for about four minutes and he'll be back. I wish he wasn't there but.....he was here before. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Well, Mr. Speaker, if he's going to come back he can certainly get on the Roll when he gets back can't he?"

Speaker Redmond: "Okay."

Ryan: "I mean, is that permissible or...."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, I just wanted to call attention to the fact that



he had been here, that he was here on time and he went out for a few minutes. And when he does come back I assume there'll be no problem. I don't know why I'm arguing his case for him but.....

Senate Bills Second Reading. Senate Bill 3, did we move that one? 21."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 21. A Bill for an Act authorizing the Director of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities to convey land in Alton. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. 39."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 39. A Bill for an Act relating to tax on the severance of coal. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. 61."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 61. A Bill for an Act to amend the Civil Administrative Code. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. 79."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 79. A Bill for an Act to amend the Children and Family Services. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. 85."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 85. A Bill for an Act to make an appropriation to the Capital Development Board. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "None."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Well, Mr. Speaker, Senate Bill 89 is an appropriation Bill that's exempt from any deadline you're trying to meet and I would suggest you



don't call appropriation Bills today."

Speaker Redmond: "89?"

Ryan: "85, the one you just did. 85. That should be held."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, I have no objection to that, leave that on Second Reading. We'll take 152...may have some...better leave that one where it is. How about 153, Representative Rigney, do you want to hold that one or do you want to move?"

Rigney: "...Speaker."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Rigney."

Rigney: "153 is not out of Committee yet."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, then we better not move.... 160. It was on a Committee Report that we had. We'll take 153 out of the record, get the Committee Report..... 160."

Clerk O'Brien: "House Bill 160. A Bill for an Act to create the crime of Aggravated Arson. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor? Representative Lechowicz. Lechowicz."

Lechowicz: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, there is an Amendment being drafted, an Agreed Amendment Bill...."

Speaker Redmond: "Okay, we'll hold this on Second. 166. Representative Geo-Karis."

Geo-Karis: "I...I didn't hear you earlier, did you start with House... Senate Bill 1?"

Speaker Redmond: "No, on 3."

Geo-Karis: "Well, I talked with my colleague on the other side on Senate Bill 3 and he agreed to hold it on Second Reading. Yeah, but you said you'd keep it on Second Reading, John."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Mr. Speaker, it was already on Third and I was unaware of that when you talked to me. I'd be happy to move it back except, Adeline, I think what you're trying to do with the Bill is...is...to expand the jurisdiction and I'm not sure that ought to be done in that Bill. But if...you and I will work it out together, be happy to...on that."

Geo-Karis: "Well, I had hoped you would hold it. It's on Second Reading today and it was just moved to Third, John."



Matijevich: "Well, I had just heard that they moved it to Third...."

Geo-Karis: "Well, will you keep it on Second till Monday at least?"

Matijevich: "It...it...it's on Third and we'll get it back if we have to."

Geo-Karis: "All right, John."

Speaker Redmond: "Third Reading. I don't believe that Representative Byers, Winchester, Lauer and Daniels were on the Roll Call. Am I correct, Mr. Clerk? Lauer, Byers, Winchester and Daniels. Wait a minute. Are they all on? Somebody misled me. Representative Dan Houlihan, was he on? Brady? Brady on? And Bradley? Representative Bradley."

Bradley: "Mr. Speaker, I'm going to do something I rarely do. I'm going to rise on a point of personal privilege. Today we're in a Plenary Session and Mr. Rigney, Representative Rigney and I are both on the floor of the House, and I assume we're going to move Bills on Second Reading. And we have a Bill we've been waiting for over a week to move that Bill to Third Reading and there are eight Amendments on the Bill. Five motions are filed to table. Five different Amendments. There are only three other Amendments that we could address ourselves to and the Sponsor of two of them is not here. Now I assume that that's his problem and not Mr. Rigney's and not mine. The only Amendment that's there that we would like to move puts the Bill in the shape that Members of the Revenue Committee suggested to us that it should be in. So we could move that Bill to the posture of Third Reading and address ourselves to it along with all the rest of the Bills that have been moved this morning. Many Bills have been moved without even the Sponsors being here. And that's putting them, I think, and giving them a great advantage over Mr. Rigney's Bill and my own. And I hate to say that I object to that kind of action but I...I guess that I have to. I think it's unfair. We've got the Members of the floor of the House here to do the business of the work of the House and move that Bill to Third Reading. And I waited until you've gone through completely the list of House Bills on Second...or Senate Bills Second Reading. And I wish you would reconsider and go back to Senate Bill 493. And we'll table all those Amendments and go ahead and see if we can move the Bill to Third Reading."



Speaker Redmond: "Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I certainly concur in the previous Gentleman's comments and I think that the courtesy ought to be extended to he and Representative Rigney to hear the Bill and move it."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Skinner."

Skinner: "Mr. Speaker, I have no idea where Representative Schneider is today. He is probably at the same place he was yesterday because I don't believe he was here, at least, in the afternoon or evening. It would seem to me that the talk that Representative Madigan gave before we adjourned last night indicated to everyone that nothing significant was going to happen on the floor today and to the best of my knowledge that's the case. I really believe this is a very important Bill. I have some personal opinions about its constitutionality which I'll address on Second or Third Reading. But it seems to me that if this is the most important Real Estate Tax Reform Bill, so-called Reform Bill that's going to be considered by the House that the entire Membership should be allowed to hear a full debate. And that can't be had today because there just aren't enough people here."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Tipword."

Tipword: "Mr. Speaker, I think that Representative Bradley and...and the Minority Leader are absolutely correct. Now when...when we got to the point of deciding...finding that we were absolutely going to be here today, there were some of us that tried to protect those who had taken off and were not here yesterday afternoon and might not be here today. But it was decided at that time that we were to proceed. And that if we had a quorum here we were to proceed with the business of the House including Bills on Second Reading to be moved to Third. And the Sponsors of these...this Bill is here, both of the Sponsors of this Bill is here. I think it is unfortunate if we cannot move their Bill but we can move every other person's Bill simply because some people do not choose to be on the floor of the House today. I think it is our duty, after the experience we went through last night, that we move the Bills of the Sponsors that are here. The people...."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Rigney...."

Tipword: "That are interested aren't here that's their own tough luck."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Rigney."



Rigney: "Well, Mr. Speaker, I certainly recognize that there may be some controversy concerning Senate Bill 493. But I can assure you, however, that I don't believe there's any controversy concerning Amendment #8 that becomes a significant part of this Bill. It is incorporating some changes that a number of people have asked for. It's a good technical Amendment and I certainly want to go on record to say and I think we would have absolutely no problem or any objection in moving this Bill to Third Reading."

Speaker Redmond: "What was the number of the Bill? Senate Bill 493."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Bill 493. A Bill for an Act to amend Sections of the Revenue Act. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendments #1 and 2 were adopted in Committee."

Speaker Redmond: "Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "There is a motion to table Committee Amendments 1 and 2 by Representative Gerald Bradley."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Bradley."

Bradley: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, I...the Amendments will be incorporated into one Amendment, #8, that's been distributed. And so I move to table Amendments #1 and 2. One of them was a Hold Harmless Amendment and the other Amendment was removing the home from the farm so that the home would be taxed at the thirty-three and a third (33-1/3) value, the same as homes in the urban area. And I move to table both Amendments 1 and 2."

Speaker Redmond: "Is there any discussion? Representative Keats."

Keats: "Mr. Speaker, no, I was not discussing the Bill. I'm sorry. I was just trying to ask who C. L. was."

Speaker Redmond: "C. L. McCormick."

Keats: ".....There's a Happy Birthday C. L. sign up."

Speaker Redmond: "C. L. McCormick used to be here. The delegation of the roads are so bad down in Lawrence County that they couldn't get here till now and he hasn't been here for two terms. Who is C. L.?"

Keats: "I would remind the House that the...that the...."

Speaker Redmond: "What's the 'L' stand for? Lawyer, is it?"

Keats: "I think Loudmouth. I would merely say that the Happy Birthday C. L. was put up by the other half of the Skinner clan and as charming a lady as she used to be it's amazing what just a little time with Cal



could have done to such a pleasant, charming girl."

Speaker Redmond: "Question's on the Gentleman's motion. Is there any discussion? The motion is to table Amendments 1 and 2, is that correct, Representative Bradley? Those in favor say 'aye', 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it. The motion carries and the Amendment's tabled. Any Amendments from the floor?"

Clerk O'Brien: "Floor Amendment #3. Schneider. Amends Senate Bill 493 on page 6 and so forth."

Speaker Redmond: "Who is the Sponsor of...."

Clerk O'Brien: "Representative Schneider."

Speaker Redmond: "What's your pleasure, Representative Bradley? Representative..... Bradley."

Bradley: "The Gentleman is not on the floor and I believe it's been the policy in the past to go ahead with the Bill if the Sponsor requests and desires and I so desire."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, we all know that this is a highly controversial Bill. No one objects to anyone representing their district on this Bill. But for this House to consider these Amendments when we just barely had 89 votes, and I don't think we have them any longer, is a travesty of justice. If the Gentleman persists then we will proceed to a discussion and a debate of the Amendment and then to a Roll Call."

Speaker Redmond: "Are there any Amendments? The Sponsor of Amendment #3 is not here to offer the adoption of the Amendment, is that correct? Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, on his behalf I move the adoption of the Amendment."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative McClain."

McClain: "Mr. Speaker, I would point out the Gentleman had no objections to the motion to table Amendments #1 and 2 and now he's intervening in another Amendment because he has a personal interest in it. And I suggest that because... Sponsor of Amendment #3 is not here the motion to table that Amendment is in order and are...just fall that way. That's what...our usual procedure."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Robinson."

Robinson: "Mr...Mr. Speaker, is Representative Madigan a Sponsor of this Amendment?"



Speaker Redmond: "Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "My name is not listed as a Sponsor, Mr. Speaker."

Robinson: "Well, under the Lechowicz ruling when he was in the chair you have to be a Sponsor of the Amendment in order to handle it."

Speaker Redmond: "Parliamentarian...."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, if I might...."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Lechowicz, for what purpose do you rise?"

Lechowicz: "That was on the Bill, this is an Amendment."

Speaker Redmond: "That's what...the Parliamentarian advises me that that rule obtains with respect to a Bill and not an Amendment. Anyway, Lechowicz doesn't speak for Redmond. Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, I would like the opportunity to respond to Mr. McClain. It was explained by Representative Bradley that Amendments 1 and 2 were incorporated in Amendment #8. That, I presume, Mr. Bradley intends to offer and therefore that's the reason why I did not interject myself at that time. Mr. Speaker, it appears to me that we are persisting in moving with this highly controversial Bill at a very inopportune time and, accordingly, I question the quorum."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Madigan has requested a quorum, a quorum call. Representative Robinson."

Robinson: "I have a question, Mr. Speaker. Is it true that if there is not a quorum, on this quorum call, that no one gets their per diem for today?"

Speaker Redmond: "That would have been true earlier but we've all...there was a quorum at the time we had the Roll Call. Those that are on this Roll Call is in. Representative Bradley."

Bradley: "Mr. Speaker, I just would like to reply, I think that the Gentleman I know has every right to question a quorum but I think he's highly...he's certainly out of order in his request. We can go ahead with it but we've been doing the business of the House. I thought that's what we were here to do this morning and if he wants to...delay the Bill, I sat here yesterday waiting for the Bill to be called. And Mr. Schneider was not here at that time either. The Bill has been ready to move for the last three days. I don't think that...even though it's a controversial Bill, it may be to some, I think that there are many Members of the House would like to see the Bill moved to the



position that we can pass it on Third Reading. If he persists in the ...in the quorum call, that certainly he's entitled to do that. But I think that we've had a quorum, we've had a quorum all morning. We moved many, many Bills, as I've said,...Members who...Bills of Members who have not even been on the floor. And I think that Mr. Rigney and myself are certainly entitled to move this Bill. And I would ask respectfully that the Gentleman remove his request for the quorum call and we'll debate the Bill on Third Reading, we'll still have plenty of time to do it at that time and let it go up and down on its merits."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Waddell."

Waddell: "Mr. Speaker, I have a substitute motion that we proceed with the Bill and the Amendment as they were in order."

Speaker Redmond: "If he persists in the call for the question of the quorum that has to prevail. Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "That was my point, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Redmond: "Well, I haven't put it yet but.... Representative Bradley to lock the doors. Representative Bradley."

Bradley: "Well, Mr. Speaker, I think the point's been well made that there are people on the floor of the House that desire to do the business of the House as the Speaker requested we be here and do. So I'm going to ask that the Bill be taken out of the record and I would like, though, I would like, I would like some assurance from the chair that regardless of who is here Monday that we go to this Bill and we put the Amendments on it one way or the other so that'll be in shape to pass it on Third Reading on Tuesday. And I respectfully request that, Sir, and I know that you will do that if you say that you will. And we can move it on... at least address ourselves to it on Second Reading so we can move it on. That Bill has been sitting on Second Reading for over a week and I kind of object to other Bills being moved along at a more rapid pace. And I think if we took a quorum call we might them this morning and I'd assure you we have the votes to move it, to adopt the only Amendment that's important and that's Amendment #8. At that time then we could debate the Bill on the merits, up and down, on Third Reading. But in due respect to you, Sir, we'll take the Bill out of the record. We've tabled Amendments #1 and 2 and we'll start at that point Monday if



it be the will of the chair...."

Speaker Redmond: "I'll...I'll assure you that we'll get back to it.

Representative Ryan. Out of the record. We'll hold it on Second Reading."

Ryan: "Well, Mr. Speaker, I now wonder if the Majority Leader persists in his good government question about....question the quorum. They're either here or they're not. If he doesn't think they are, I wonder if he persists in his motion or if this is going to be a tactic that we're going to use for the rest of the day to get the Bills out of the record that the Majority Leader doesn't want to hear today?"

Speaker Redmond: "Nor the Minority Leader. Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, in order to avoid the embarrassment of the Minority Leader being seen leaving the chamber I will withdraw my request for a quorum."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Rigney."

Rigney: "Well, it just seems to me that the Majority Leader in effect has intimidated us here this morning by suggesting that he was going for a quorum call as a means to beat down a Bill that legitimately should have been heard in its regular rotation. Now I am...a Cosponsor ...a Joint Cosponsor of this legislation. I had kind of hoped that my colleague on the other side of the aisle was going to fight a little more vigorously in behalf of hearing this thing. What we're talking about is an Amendment that was going to gut the Bill, going to completely ruin it and I...."

Speaker Redmond: "This Bill is out of the record, there's no point in discussing it any further. This Bill is out of the record, we're standing at ease for a few minutes till we see what we're going to do here. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "Well, when you decide to get back at attention, Mr. Speaker, I will question a quorum. If you're going to make a sham out of the process we've got going here this morning, I'm not going to be a part of it. You've either got 89 people here or you haven't and on the next...next question, I question...right now I question a quorum."

Speaker Redmond: "We're in recess. You have to wait till we get back before you do that. Representative Kane, we're in recess. Representative Kane."



Kane: "Parliamentary inquiry. How long is this recess going to last?"

Speaker Redmond: "How long what?"

Kane: "How long is this recess going to last?"

Speaker Redmond: "At the call of the chair. Not very long."

Kane: "Well, the last time you said five minutes and it was an hour."

Speaker Redmond: "Well...."

Kane: "And I would respectfully....."

Speaker Redmond: "A lot of people...a lot of people weren't here at nine o'clock, that's one of the reasons why we had to do it."

Kane: "I would suggest that this whole charade this morning has indicated that the leadership on both sides of the aisle is lacking."

Speaker Redmond: "Lacking attendance of the Members very frequently and in Committee also, particularly Appropriations."

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Speaker Redmond: "...The House is back in order. Representative Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, do we have Mr. Ryan's attention? Is he with us?"

Speaker Redmond: "I don't know. It depends on what the motion is."

Madigan: "Is he leaving? I move that we adjourn until 12 o'clock Monday."

Speaker Redmond: "The question's on the Gentleman's motion. Those in favor say 'aye', 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it, motion carries and the House stands adjourned until 12 o'clock Monday. Representative Ryan."

Ryan: "That now assures the...the departure time as scheduled for you and the Minority Leader and I think that's very kind of you to get us out of here on time."
