We have That's the side of justice, of been on the same side. right, and we have succeeded indeed in rolling back an aggression that was meant to sew havoc in regional and international relations. The responsibility of the United States, the role of the United States, is very much welcomed as the only, the sole super power in the world today, and this role of the United States brings more responsibility on this country, this great country, to lead the worlds, the world, towards prosperity and justice. the region we intend to work with the United States order to solve the remaining problems because if we want stability and peace to reign then we will have to address other problems and conflicts, in particular the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians. It is our role, our responsibility, as Americans and Egyptians and the rest of Arabs, the rest of nations, to solve that intractible problem in order to have peace and stability returned to this very volatile area of the Middle East. It is also in the interests of the United States, economically, politically, and from points of view of democracy and human rights to help the people of that region regain their stability through justice and through peace. I do not propose to say more than what I have said. I wish to express my pleasure to be here and my honor to be afforded this opportunity to say a few words. Thank you very much."

When I first introduced this Bill, I sent it out to title companies, Chicago Bar Association, etc., in asking for their input. received...I received many good suggestions and input back from them, and but I was unable to get it in form of Amendment before it was passed out of Committee. So when I went to the Legislative Reference Bureau, they suggested that I completely rewrite the Bill after the So that's what this Floor Amendment deals with."

Speaker McPike: "Gentleman moves for the adoption of the Amendment, and on that Representative Dunn."

Dunn: "Will the Sponsor yield for a question?"

Speaker McPike: "Yes."

Dunn: "If this Amendment is adopted, how does it affect property rights today, how will it change the...the right to receive property in the event of a death?"

Persico: "If this Amendment is adopted, the...when a person dies, domiciled in Illinois, if it's in the form of a revocable trust or a cotton trust, it will be subject to claim just as if in probate."

Dunn: "So, if, if the Amendment is adopted, the property will be subject to claims or it will not? I had trouble hearing you."

Persico: "It will be subject to claims as if it were in probate."

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Dunn: "And, today the property would not be subject to claims.

Is that correct?"

Persico: "I couldn't...Would you repeat the question, please?"

Dunn: "What is...is property affected by this Amendment subject to claims today?"

Persico: "Not unless it's adopted. No, not unless this Bill is passed, no. Not today, it's not. It deals with revocable trust and cotton trust, this Amendment, in joint tenancy."

Dunn: "I...I don't...I don't, can't hear you. What?"

Persico: "This Amend..."

Dunn: "What...what will creditors be able to reach if this Bill's adopted that they cannot reach today?"

Persico: "Creditors and spouses, surviving spouses, will be able to reach revocable trusts and cotton trusts as well as some parts of the joint tenancies."

Dunn: "And...and can they do that today?"

Persico: "Not unless they are able to prove fraud. This...this

Bill deals with only certain cases where a person dies,
because of a revocable trust were they able to revoke this
trust at their very, you know, at any whim up to the
moment they die. This property is now...not now subject
to, you know, spousal claims or creditor claims. This Bill
here will change that."

Dunn: "All right. Thank you, I...I had trouble hearing. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Ewing."

Ewing: "Yes, would the Sponsor yield?"

Persico: "Yes."

Ewing: "Vince...if this, is this just for the grantor in the trust? If I set up a trust, does that mean that on my death it's subject to my creditors or what if a trust is set up for a child or a grandchild? Then does that trust become subject to his creditors when he dies?"

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Persico: "No, this will be dealt with just like any other area of probate. With the exception that right now it's very difficult to prove fraud. This Bill only deals with cases where there could be fraud involved. It's a very small percentage of the cases, and what it does it just allows creditors and spouses to, because it was a revocable trust, not an irrevocable trust, just a revocable trust, to subject...to be subject to those claims. Those assets would be subject to those claims."

Ewing: "But, I mean, what if a beneficiary dies, and that trust passes on to his heir, are you saying that his estate, his creditors can come in on this, his spouse? Is it only if there's fraud?"

Persico: "What it tries to do is, it'll do away with the intent to defraud since it's so very difficult to prove. If he sets it up in a regular manner where with a will and that, no. It will not touch those at all."

Ewing: "Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Lang."

Lang: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the Sponsor yield?"

Persico: "Yes."

Lang: "Representative, this side of the aisle's very confused about what you're trying to do here. Can you start from the top and tell us what this Bill intends to do in English?"

Persico: "Okay. Alright. The way my Bill was originally introduced, it's an Amendment to the Lifetime Transfer of Property Act. Its purpose is to subject the claims of creditors and a surviving spouse certain property that was transferred by the decedent during his lifetime but with respect that he had full control of this in revocation up to...to get the property back into his hands, up to the moment that he died, or she died, whatever the case may be.

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Some of these lifetime transfers are blatant techniques for evading one's legal obligation to his creditor and his spouse when he dies. The purpose of my Floor Amendment today is to add such technical improvements to my Bill first, one, making clear that the decedent had, had to the have the right to retain the power to revoke right the time of his death, two, making sure the scope of the Bill extended to intestate situations as well as in cases where the decedent left a will, accelerating interests if the surviving spouse elected to take a under the instrument of transfer and excluding which the transfer which the decedent had received full money consideration. and lastly excluding from the Bill's operation certain joint property and insurance proceeds. It also would change the effective date so it will apply only to transfers made after the effective date."

Lang: "Did you say earlier in response to some question that it dealt somehow with joint tenancy property?"

Persico: "The part that deals with joint tenancy is only the part that the decedent left in the will, or into the estate, not what the surviving spouse or whomever that he set up a joint tenancy with. It only deals with that person's share, would be subject to the Lifetime Transfer of Property Act."

Lang: "Well, I don't understand how you can do that with joint tenancy property. That's the purpose of joint tenancy property to...to make, to have the property immediately go to the survivors without creditors or anybody else getting in the way. I don't have any problem with the rest of your Bill, I don't think, because I think we're interested in making sure creditors get their money so that nobody can use some technique to avoid their debts. But there seems to be some problem with this section about joint tenancy,

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and unless...unless you can convince me that, that this, that you're not somehow defeating the purpose of joint tenancy, then I'm afraid I'm going to have to...to be against your Bill."

- Persico: "Maybe I can explain it. The part that...what I'm trying to get with joint tenancy is where they set it up for convenience only, where they say, you know, 'This is your pen until I want it back.'"
- Lang: "How is a creditor supposed to know whether it's for convenience only or otherwise? They don't list that on the deed. Can I suggest that you take this out of the record so that we can talk further?"
- Persico: "I will. I will take it out of the record and work with these Representatives on this Bill.
- Speaker McPike: "Alright. Thank you very much. Returning to

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bombing and Bill Keith is here with others. If there are others here who may be in the gallery, we...we want to extend, we want to extend them a welcome to Springfield. Bill wants to say 'Hello', and he wants to also thank all of us for allowing them to have the plates. Bill Keith."

Mr. Keith: "Thank you. Thank you, Ladies and Gentlemen, and on behalf of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association I would like to thank you all for the effort you have done to get us the license plates. Thank you very much."

Hartke: "Anyone buying specialty crop products, farm products, in Illinois, and we will define that in the Act; what are specialty crops. They will be required to buy this \$100 registration fee."

Wennlund: "So, the owner of a roadside farmer, who operates a roadside farm stand."

Hartke: "No, No, that is not required under the Act. You're saying if they are doing this...if they're farm manufacturing or further manufacturing for production such as pumpkins, say zucchini, if they are going to sell it through Delmonte or whatever. Individual roadside stands should be exempt, from this, because that is sold directly

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- to the consumer. This is for further manufacturing."
- Wennlund: "Is this a consumer protection type of legislation?"
- Hartke: "Yes, it can be and it can also be a protection for Illinois farmers. The Illinois Farm Bureau supports this concept wholeheartedly."
- Wennlund: "The Illinois Farm Bureau supports it. Does the Illinois Department of Agriculture also support it?"

Speaker Laurino: "Representative Giglio moves for the adoption of Amendment #1 to the House Bill 1483. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor indicate by saying 'aye', opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have .it. The Amendment is adopted. Further Amendments?"

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- Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."
- Clerk Leone: House Bill 2067 a Bill for an Act to amend the Illinois Vehicle Code. Second Reading of the Bill.

 Amendment #1 was adopted in committee."
- Speaker Laurino: "Any Floor Amendments?"
- Clerk Leone: "No Motions filed and no Floor Amendments."
- Speaker Laurino: "Third Reading. House Bill 2072.

 Representative Turner. Out of the record. House Bill 2074, Representative Currie. Out of the record. House Bill 2094, Representative Mautino. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."
- Clerk Leone: "House Bill 2094, a Bill for an Act to amend the Health Maintenence Organization Act. Second Reading of the Bill. There are no Committee or Floor Amendments."
- Speaker Laurino: "Third Reading. Back to House Bill 2072, Representative Turner. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."
- Clerk Leone: "House Bill 2072. A Bill for an Act to amend the Revenue Act. Second Reading of the Bill. There are no Committee Amendments."
- Speaker Laurino: "Floor Amendments?"
- Clerk Leone: "Floor Amendment #1 being offered by Representatives

 Churchill and Wennlund."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative Turner the Amendment has not been distributed. Representative Turner."
- Turner: "Mr. Speaker, I'd like to move to table Amendment # 1."
- Speaker Laurino: "Gentleman moves to table Amendment #1 to House
 Bill 2072. Is there any discussion? Representative
 Wennlund."
- Wennlund: "I'd ask for ruling of the Chair whether or not a

 Motion to table Amendment, Amendment that has not been
 printed and distributed, is in orde."
- Speaker Laurino; "The opinion of the Chair it's in order.

 Representative Wennlund."

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Clerk Leone: "No further Amendments."

Speaker Laurino: "Third Reading. The Chair will proceed to page
44 on your Calendar. Senate Bill, Second Reading. Senate
Bill 952 Representative McPike. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Leone: "Page 44 of the Calendar. Senate Bill 952, a Bill for an Act making appropriations to various agencies. Second Reading of the Bill. There are no Committee Amendments."

Speaker Laurino: "Any Floor Amendments?"

Clerk Leone: "Floor Amendment #1 is being offered by Representative Madigan, et al."

Speaker Laurino: Representative McPike."

McPike: "Thank you Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of The Senate sent this Bill over last week. It was read a second time and held on Second Reading. The added...has two provisions that the Senate put in at the Govenor's request, and...one was for the WIC program, the other is for the Department of Children and Family Services. The CFS moneys that's 10 million dollars for that and 29 million dollars for the WIC program. On to that, this Amendment will add a money for AFDC, Aid to the Aged, Blind, Disabled, General Assistance and Refugee Assistance that the Govenor has requested. For this fiscal year of 77,300,000. The Governor has requested all the items that I've just mentioned. In addition to that we are for FY92 a money for AFDC, Aid to the Aged, Blind and Disabled, General Assistance for AFDC and Refugee Assistance amounting to 942,700,000. This has requested by the Governor, in his Public Aid budget was introduced this year. In addition to this money that would, that I've just described, we've added 1 million dollars to the Department in order to process these checks. We've provided 25,000 to the Comptroller to process the

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checks. We provided 25,000 to the Comptroller so he can pay...so the Comptroller can pay her salary and she can pay the salary of the Director of the Department of Public Aid, so that these can be processed. We have no idea if we're going to be in Session in July, but if we are in Session in July there is no reason whatsoever why people on General Assistance...I'm sorry, why people on...that are receiving these checks AFDC and the others I mentioned, why these people should not be receiving these checks if we end up in an argument over the budget. The purpose of this is to try to avoid what happened in 1985, when we were here until July 8th and there were no checks being sent out. We think its the proper thing to do. We would encourage everyone to sponsor it and we would hope the Governor would sign it."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike moves for the adoption of the Amendment #1 Senate Bill 952. Any discussion? Seeing Representative Ryder's light. Representative Ryder."

Ryder: "Thank you Mr. Speaker. Would the Gentleman yield?"

Speaker Laurino: Indicates he will."

Ryder: "Representative, there are some parts of this budget that

Governor Edgar has requested as a Supplemental, is that

correct?"

McPike: "That's correct."

Ryder: "And those levels of that Supplemental are at the amount that the Governor has requested."

McPike: "Correct."

Ryder: "But, it also includes a rather peculiar part which is part of the Public Aid budget for the next fiscal year. Is that correct?"

McPike: "Correct."

Ryder: "Public Aid Budget if I am...if I remember correctly is in the Senate at this point, so we haven't had a chance to have a hearing on these portions of the budget in the

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House. Is that correct?"

McPike: "You're correct all four times."

Ryder: "Well I don't want to extend myself too long, because four out of four is pretty good, but it seems to me that that is a little peculiar way of going about the budgetary process to be avoiding the committee, and I wonder if you'd elaborate on that just a bit for me."

McPike: "I think I did. I was very forthright in explaining why were doing this. We are simply taking those checks that should be paid in July, and if we're here in August those checks that should be sent out in August and we're providing that money today. So that we don't end up on June 20th or June 30th or July 1st arguing about AFDC checks. There's no reason that someone that's blind should not be receiving their check on July 1st because we happen an argument over the budget, and I don't think in there's anyone on your side of the aisle that would want to see someone who's blind not receiving their check."

Ryder: "I would think that's probably correct, Representative.

But I guess the part that concerns me is why it is that you are at this point, not even the 1st of May, anticipating the confrontation in July, when we haven't even had our committee hearings yet, and we haven't had an opportunity to progress beyond that, however, I have to agree since you've selected the Governor's level, and I sincerely hope that you will continue to support the Governor with the other appropriations at the Governor's requested level in order to present a balanced budget so I have to compliment you on that portion of that which you wish to transact."

Speaker Laurino: "Further discussions. Representative Parke."

Parke: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
House. I would like to have a Roll Call and not a voice
vote on this. Electrical Roll Call, please."

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Speaker Laurino: "Further discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor will indicate by voting 'aye', those opposed voting 'nay'. The board is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Representative Wennlund wants to be recorded as 'aye'. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record, Mr. Clerk. 112 'ayes' 0 'nays', 2 voting 'present'. Amendment #1 is adopted. Further Amendments, Mr. Clerk?"

Clerk Leone: "There are no further Amendments."

Speaker Laurino: "Third Reading. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Leone: "House Bill 952, correction thats Senate Bill 952, a

Bill for an Act making appropriations to various agencies.

Third Reading of the Bill."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike."

McPike: "I would move for the passage of the Bill now, Mr. $\label{eq:speaker} \mbox{Speaker."}$

Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike, ask for Roll Call on Senate Bill 952. All those in favor will indicate by voting 'aye', opposed will vote 'nay'. Board is open. The question is, 'Shall this Bill pass.' Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record, Mr. Clerk. 113 voting 'aye', 0 voting 'nay', and 2 voting 'present'. The Bill having receiving the required Constitutional Majority is hereby declared passed. Page 13 on the Calendar House Bills, Second Reading. House Bill 375. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Leone: "House Bill 375, a Bill for an Act making appropriations. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment #1 is being offered."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike."

McPike: "Withdraw Amendment #1."

Speaker Laurino: "Withdraw Amendment #1. Further Amendments Mr. Clerk."

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Clerk Leone: "Floor Amendment #2 being offered by Representative Ryder."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative Ryder, Amendment #2."

Ryder: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Amendment #2 is in a complete total the Governor's request for Supplemental which does include some of the supplemental that was previously approved in the prior Bill, with the exclusion that it does not include any additional Supplemental requests for the constitutional officers."

Speaker Laurino: "Further discussion? Seeing none, Representative McPike."

McPike: "Thank you Mr. Speaker. I rise in opposition to Amendment. I rise in opposition to it because it contains the...General Assistance money that we already passed to the Senate...there's no point in putting that in here. And further it does not contain money for the Treasurer, who has requested 1.1 million or the Attorney General who has requested 399,000 or the Secretary of State George Ryan who has requested 1,114,100, and for the Court of Claims. I dont believe that is in here either is it? And for the Court of Claims. So since this does not...since the Amendment only accommodates the Governor, and does not accommodate the request of the other constitutional officers, I would ask the Democrats to vote 'no'."

Speaker Laurino: "Further discussion? Seeing none. The question is, 'Shall Amendment #2 House Bill 375 pass?' All those in favor indicate by voting 'aye', those opposed vote 'nay'. The board is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record Mr. Clerk. This Amendment having received 43 'ayes', 70 'nay' and 2 voting 'present', fails. Further Amendments, Mr. Clerk?"

Clerk Leone: "For Amendment #3 being offered by Representatives

LeFlore and McPike."

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Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike."

McPike: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Amendment #3 contains everything that the Govenor requested in the Supplemental with the exception of those 3 items that we put into the Senate Bill that just passed. General Assistance, the WIC program and the DCFS program in addition it also accommodates the requests of the constitutional officers that I read a minute ago the treasurer 1 million, the Attorney General, Secretary of State, Court of Claims, Legislative Audit Commission. I would move for the adoption of the Amendment."

Speaker Laurino: "Further discussion? Representative Ryder."

"Thank you for your courtesy, Mr. Speaker. Ryder: We stand opposed to this for the reason that the Supplemental request from the constitutional officers are accommodated in the budget as indicated by the Governor, although they as a percentage of the amount of the are not large...we don't believe that those are accommodated and given a tight fiscal amount of dollars that we have, we are unable to support those portions of it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Laurino: "Further discussion? Seeing none, the question is, 'Shall Amendment #3 House Bill 375 pass?' All those in favor indicate by voting 'aye', those opposed vote 'nay'. The board is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record, Mr. Clerk. This Amendment having received 70 'ayes, 44 'no', and 0 voting present is hereby adopted. Further Amendments Mr. Clerk?"

Clerk Leone: "Floor Amendment #4 being offered by Representative Yvetter Younge."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative Younge."

Younge: "Mr. Speaker, please withdraw Amendment #4."

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- Speaker Laurino: "Withdraw Amendment #4. Further Amendments, Mr. Clerk?"
- Clerk O'Brien: "No further Amendments."
- Speaker Laurino: "Third Reading. Question is, 'Shall House Bill 375...Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."
- Clerk O'Brien: "House Bill 375, a Bill for an Act making appropriations. Third Reading of the Bill."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike."
- McPike: "Thank you Mr. Speaker. I move for the passage of the Bill."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative McPike moves for the passage for House Bill 375. Any discussion? Representative Ryder."
- Ryder: "Thank you Mr. Speaker. For the reasons stated in opposition to Amendment #3 which now becomes the Bill, I stand opposed."
- Speaker Laurino: "The question is, 'Shall House Bill 375 pass?'

 All those in favor vote 'aye', those opposed vote 'no'.

 Board is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record, Mr.

 Clerk. This Bill having received 70 'aye', 44 'nay', 0 voting 'present'. Having received the required Constitutional Majority is hereby declared passed. Agreed Resolutions."
- Clerk O'Brien: "Agreed Resolutions. Senate Joint Resolution 44, offered by Representative Park. House Resolution 402, Speaker Madigan. 403, W. Peterson. 404, Manny Hoffman. 405, Matijevich. 407, Wojcik. 408, Phelps. 409, B. Pedersen. 410, McCracken. 411, Matijevich."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative Matijevich."
- Matijevich: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, we've examined the Resolution.

 They are all congratulatory. I move the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions."
- Speaker Laurino: "The question is, 'Shall the Agreed Resolutions

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- be adopted?' All those in favor indicate by saying 'aye', opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes have it, the Resolutions are adopted. Death Resolutions."
- Clerk O'Brien: "House Resolution 406, offered by Representative Edley, with respect to the memory of Clifford Jewelstrom."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative Matijevich moves the adoption of the Death Resolutions. All those in favor indicate by saying 'aye', opposed 'nay'. The 'aves' have it. Representative Munizzi, for what reason do you arise? House Bill 439, Representative Munizzi. Representative asks leave of the House to take this Bill back from the Consent Calendar to Second Reading. Does she have leave? In the Attendance Roll Call she has leave. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."
- Clerk O'Brien: "House Bill 439, a Bill for an Act to amend the Illinois Lottery Law. This Bill has been read a second time previously. No Committee Amendments. Floor Amendment #1 offered by Representative Munizzi."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative Munizzi."

Munizzi: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Bill orginally states that the Lottery requires that they're able to suspend the licenses of any sales agent or to refuse to issue any license to a person in violation of any state tax law. The Amendment allows this and prohibits those that are in compliance with agreement for payment of their bills and those that have cases pending. The Lottery department agrees with it and I ask for a favorable Roll Call on this...or a favorable Motion on this charming Amendment."

Speaker Laurino: "If you want a favorable Motion you got it, Baby."

Munizzi: "Thank you."

Speaker Laurino: "Representative Munizzi moves for the adoption of Amendment #1 House Bill 439. All those in favor

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indicate by saying 'aye'. Further discussion?
Representative Wennlund."

Wennlund: "Will Sponsor yield?"

Speaker Laurino: "She indicated she will."

- Wennlund: "With the level of noise on the House floor, I'm sorry

 I did not hear you, Representative Munizzi. What does the

 Amendment do?"
- Munizzi: "The Amendment will eliminate those that are in compliance with agreement for payment plan of the state taxes that they owe back or that they are currently cases that are pending litigation for those that owe back taxes, or some form of sales tax."
- Wennlund: "So It would then permit the Lottery to issue a Lottery license to an agent who owes taxes to the State of Illinois?"
- Munizzi: "Yes, if they're not under these other agreement procedures."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative, has this Amendment been cleared with the Republican side of the aisle?"
- Munizzi: "I believe it has, Sir. It's a technical Amendment."
- Speaker Laurino: "Thank you. All those in favor vote by saying 'aye' opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. The Amendment is adopted. Further Amendments?"
- Clerk O'Brien: "No further Amendments."
- Speaker Laurino: "Representative Balanoff, do you wish to discuss anything on this Bill or Amendment?"
- Balanoff: "Not on this one. No."
- Speaker Laurino: "Thank you very much. The Lady asks leave of the House to have this Bill moved to Third Reading and put on back on the Consent Calendar. Does she have leave? Representative Wennlund. Yes, Representative Wennlund gives his okay. So the leave is granted. The Bill will be put back on Consent Calendar, Third Reading.

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Representative Balanoff, for what reason do you arise now, Sir?"

- Balanoff: "I rise to report that House Bill 1588 was reported out of committee by under a unanimous vote of 21 to 0, when in fact, myself and a number of other Legislators voted 'no'. And so we'd like to have, as I said it was not only myself but there were a number of other legislators in that committee, it was the composting Bill that voted 'no'. And I don't believe it should have been got out of committee. We'd like to have the tape reviewed."
- Speaker Laurino: "We'll look into it and let you know, Sir.
