I know that I would personally be indebted, and I can't speak for anybody else, but I'm sure my other colleagues who are of my faith, and those who are of different faiths as well, would be equally appreciative. I don't think that we need to have formalized procedures where that... imposed consent forms, or anything like that. I don't think that we need that, but I do think that we need to be respectful of each others faiths, each others religious traditions, and if you could just take a moment of your time to remind the clergy that you invite, that they should offer a prayer in a I'd certainly is all inclusive, manner that be
