Speaker Hartke: "The House shall come to order. Members shall be in their chairs. We shall be led in prayer today by Lee Crawford, the Assistant Pastor of the Victory Temple Church in Springfield. The guests in the gallery may wish to rise and join us for the invocation and stay standing for the Pledge of Allegiance."

Pastor Crawford: "Father, we humbly come before You with an open mind, open heart and open will to serve You, a will to honor You, a will to trust You, a will to depend and to rely upon You. So Father, we speak as Your servant David spoke. He spoke of You as a shepherd and because of You he had no wants. I pray that You would be our shepherd today.
