2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 2545, AS AMENDED, by
3	replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4	following:
5	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Sections
6	10-22.39 and 34-18.7 as follows:
7	(105 ILCS 5/10-22.39)
8	Sec. 10-22.39. In-service training programs.
9	(a) To conduct in-service training programs for teachers.
10	(b) In addition to other topics at in-service training
11	programs, school guidance counselors, teachers, school social
12	workers, and other school personnel who work with pupils in
13	grades $3 - 7$ through 12 shall be trained <u>annually</u> to identify the
14	warning signs of mental illness and suicidal behavior in youth
15	adolescents and teens and shall be taught appropriate
16	intervention and referral techniques.

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1 (c) School guidance counselors, nurses, teachers and other school personnel who work with pupils may be trained to have a 2 3 basic knowledge of matters relating to acquired 4 immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), including the nature of the 5 disease, its causes and effects, the means of detecting it and preventing its transmission, and the availability of 6 appropriate sources of counseling and referral, and any other 7 8 information that may be appropriate considering the age and grade level of such pupils. The School Board shall supervise 9 10 such training. The State Board of Education and the Department 11 of Public Health shall jointly develop standards for such training. 12

(d) In this subsection (d):

14 "Domestic violence" means abuse by a family or household 15 member, as "abuse" and "family or household members" are 16 defined in Section 103 of the Illinois Domestic Violence Act of 17 1986.

"Sexual violence" means sexual assault, abuse, or stalking 18 19 of an adult or minor child proscribed in the Criminal Code of 20 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012 in Sections 11-1.20, 11-1.30, 11-1.40, 11-1.50, 11-1.60, 12-7.3, 12-7.4, 12-7.5, 12-12, 21 12-13, 12-14, 12-14.1, 12-15, and 12-16, including sexual 22 23 violence committed by perpetrators who are strangers to the 24 victim and sexual violence committed by perpetrators who are 25 known or related by blood or marriage to the victim.

26 At least once every 2 years, an in-service training program

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1 for school personnel who work with pupils, including, but not 2 limited to, school and school district administrators, teachers, school guidance counselors, school social workers, 3 4 school counselors, school psychologists, and school nurses, 5 must be conducted by persons with expertise in domestic and 6 sexual violence and the needs of expectant and parenting youth and shall include training concerning (i) communicating with 7 and listening to youth victims of domestic or sexual violence 8 9 and expectant and parenting youth, (ii) connecting youth 10 victims of domestic or sexual violence and expectant and 11 parenting youth to appropriate in-school services and other agencies, programs, and services as (iii) 12 needed, and 13 implementing the school district's policies, procedures, and with 14 protocols regard to such youth, including 15 confidentiality. At a minimum, school personnel must be trained 16 to understand, provide information and referrals, and address issues pertaining to youth who are parents, expectant parents, 17 or victims of domestic or sexual violence. 18

(e) At least every 2 years, an in-service training program for school personnel who work with pupils must be conducted by persons with expertise in anaphylactic reactions and management.

(f) At least once every 2 years, a school board shall conduct in-service training on educator ethics, teacher-student conduct, and school employee-student conduct for all personnel. 10000HB2545ham003

3 Sec. 34-18.7. Youth Adolescent and teen mental illness and

4 suicide detection and intervention. School quidance 5 counselors, teachers, school social workers, and other school personnel who work with pupils in grades 3 - 7 through 12 shall 6 be trained <u>annually</u> to identify the warning signs of mental 7 8 illness and suicidal behavior in youth adolescents and teens 9 and shall be taught various intervention techniques. Such 10 training shall be provided within the framework of existing in-service training programs offered by the Board or as part of 11 12 the professional development activities required under Section 21-14 of this Code. 13
