SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 140/7.5 625 ILCS 5/1-146.5 new 625 ILCS 5/11-408 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-408 625 ILCS 5/11-411 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-411 625 ILCS 5/11-412 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-412 625 ILCS 5/11-414 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-414 625 ILCS 5/11-417 new

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Removes provisions providing that a written motor vehicle accident report is privileged as to the Secretary of State and the Department of Transportation and shall be held confidential. Provides that the Department may provide for in-depth investigations of accidents involving Department employees or other motor vehicle accidents (rather than investigations of only motor vehicle accidents) by individuals or special investigation groups. Provides that an accident report required to be made in writing shall be made on an approved (rather than appropriate) form or in an approved electronic format provided by the Administrator. Provides that upon written request, the Department shall furnish copies of a written accident report or any supplemental reports to a federal, State, or local agency that is engaged in highway safety research and study and to any person or entity that has a contractual relationship with the Department or a federal, State, or local agency to complete a highway safety research and study for the Department or the federal, State, or local agency. Provides that upon written request, the Department shall furnish motor vehicle accident data to a federal, State, or local agency, the Secretary of State, the Illinois Commerce Commission, or any other person or entity that has a contractual agreement with the Department or a federal, State, or local agency to complete a highway safety research and study for the Department or the federal, State, or local agency. Defines "motor vehicle accident data". Makes conforming changes. Amends the Freedom of Information Act to exempt from inspection and copying information contained in motor vehicle accident reports and supplemental reports under Article IV of Chapter 11 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

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AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Freedom of Information Act is amended by 5 changing Section 7.5 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 140/7.5)

Sec. 7.5. Statutory exemptions. To the extent provided for
by the statutes referenced below, the following shall be exempt
from inspection and copying:

10 (a) All information determined to be confidential
11 under Section 4002 of the Technology Advancement and
12 Development Act.

(b) Library circulation and order records identifying
library users with specific materials under the Library
Records Confidentiality Act.

(c) Applications, related documents, and medical
 records received by the Experimental Organ Transplantation
 Procedures Board and any and all documents or other records
 prepared by the Experimental Organ Transplantation
 Procedures Board or its staff relating to applications it
 has received.

(d) Information and records held by the Department ofPublic Health and its authorized representatives relating

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to known or suspected cases of sexually transmissible disease or any information the disclosure of which is restricted under the Illinois Sexually Transmissible Disease Control Act.

(e) Information the disclosure of which is exempted under Section 30 of the Radon Industry Licensing Act.

7 (f) Firm performance evaluations under Section 55 of
8 the Architectural, Engineering, and Land Surveying
9 Qualifications Based Selection Act.

10 (g) Information the disclosure of which is restricted 11 and exempted under Section 50 of the Illinois Prepaid 12 Tuition Act.

(h) Information the disclosure of which is exempted under the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act, and records of any lawfully created State or local inspector general's office that would be exempt if created or obtained by an Executive Inspector General's office under that Act.

(i) Information contained in a local emergency energy
 plan submitted to a municipality in accordance with a local
 emergency energy plan ordinance that is adopted under
 Section 11-21.5-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

(j) Information and data concerning the distribution
 of surcharge moneys collected and remitted by wireless
 carriers under the Wireless Emergency Telephone Safety
 Act.

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(k) Law enforcement officer identification information or driver identification information compiled by a law enforcement agency or the Department of Transportation under Section 11-212 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

5 (1) Records and information provided to a residential 6 health care facility resident sexual assault and death 7 review team or the Executive Council under the Abuse 8 Prevention Review Team Act.

9 (m) Information provided to the predatory lending 10 database created pursuant to Article 3 of the Residential 11 Real Property Disclosure Act, except to the extent 12 authorized under that Article.

(n) Defense budgets and petitions for certification of
compensation and expenses for court appointed trial
counsel as provided under Sections 10 and 15 of the Capital
Crimes Litigation Act. This subsection (n) shall apply
until the conclusion of the trial of the case, even if the
prosecution chooses not to pursue the death penalty prior
to trial or sentencing.

(o) Information that is prohibited from being
 disclosed under Section 4 of the Illinois Health and
 Hazardous Substances Registry Act.

(p) Security portions of system safety program plans,
 investigation reports, surveys, schedules, lists, data, or
 information compiled, collected, or prepared by or for the
 Regional Transportation Authority under Section 2.11 of

the Regional Transportation Authority Act or the St. Clair
 County Transit District under the Bi-State Transit Safety
 Act.

4 5 (q) Information prohibited from being disclosed by the Personnel Records Review Act.

(r) Information prohibited from being disclosed by the Illinois School Student Records Act.

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(s) Information the disclosure of which is restricted under Section 5-108 of the Public Utilities Act.

10 (t) All identified or deidentified health information 11 in the form of health data or medical records contained in, 12 stored in, submitted to, transferred by, or released from the Illinois Health Information Exchange, and identified 13 or deidentified health information in the form of health 14 data and medical records of the Illinois Health Information 15 16 Exchange in the possession of the Illinois Health Information Exchange Authority due to its administration 17 of the Illinois Health Information Exchange. The terms 18 "identified" and "deidentified" shall be given the same 19 20 meaning as in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law 104-191, or any 21 22 subsequent amendments thereto, and any regulations 23 promulgated thereunder.

(u) Records and information provided to an independent
 team of experts under Brian's Law.

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(v) Names and information of people who have applied

for or received Firearm Owner's Identification Cards under 1 2 the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act or applied for 3 or received a concealed carry license under the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, unless otherwise authorized by the 4 5 Firearm Concealed Carry Act; and databases under the 6 Firearm Concealed Carry Act, records of the Concealed Carry 7 Licensing Review Board under the Firearm Concealed Carry 8 Act, and law enforcement agency objections under the 9 Firearm Concealed Carry Act.

(w) Personally identifiable information which is
exempted from disclosure under subsection (g) of Section
19.1 of the Toll Highway Act.

13 (x) Information which is exempted from disclosure
14 under Section 5-1014.3 of the Counties Code or Section
15 8-11-21 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

16 Confidential information under the Adult (V) 17 Protective Services Act and its predecessor enabling 18 statute, the Elder Abuse and Neglect Act, including 19 information about the identity and administrative finding 20 against any caregiver of a verified and substantiated 21 decision of abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation of an 22 eligible adult maintained in the Registry established 23 under Section 7.5 of the Adult Protective Services Act.

(z) Records and information provided to a fatality
 review team or the Illinois Fatality Review Team Advisory
 Council under Section 15 of the Adult Protective Services

1 Act.

2 (aa) Information which is exempted from disclosure
3 under Section 2.37 of the Wildlife Code.

4 (bb) Information which is or was prohibited from
5 disclosure by the Juvenile Court Act of 1987.

6 (cc) Recordings made under the Law Enforcement 7 Officer-Worn Body Camera Act, except to the extent 8 authorized under that Act.

9 (dd) Information that is prohibited from being 10 disclosed under Section 45 of the Condominium and Common 11 Interest Community Ombudsperson Act.

12 (ee) (dd) Information that is exempted from disclosure
 13 under Section 30.1 of the Pharmacy Practice Act.

14 (ff) Information that is exempted from disclosure 15 under Article IV of Chapter 11 of the Illinois Vehicle 16 Code.

2	Sec. 1-146.5. Motor vehicle accident data. Any information
3	generated from a motor vehicle accident report or supplemental
4	report, but shall not include a copy of the motor vehicle
5	accident report or supplemental report, personally identifying
6	information as defined in Section 1-159.2 of this Code, or any
7	other information disclosure of which is prohibited by law.

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9 Sec. 11-408. Police to report motor vehicle accident10 investigations.

11 (a) Every law enforcement officer who investigates a motor 12 vehicle accident for which a report is required by this Article 13 who prepares a written report as a result of or an 14 investigation either at the time and scene of such motor 15 vehicle accident or thereafter by interviewing participants or 16 witnesses shall forward a written report of such motor vehicle 17 accident to the Administrator on forms provided by the Administrator under Section 11-411 within 10 days after 18 investigation of the motor vehicle accident, or within such 19 20 other time as is prescribed by the Administrator. Such written 21 reports and the information contained in those reports required 22 to be forwarded by law enforcement officers and the information 23 contained therein are privileged as to the Secretary of State 24 and the Department and, in the case of second division vehicles 25 operated under certificate of convenience and necessity issued

by the Illinois Commerce Commission, to the Commission, but 1 2 shall not be held confidential by the reporting law enforcement officer or agency. The Secretary of State may also disclose 3 notations of accident involvement maintained on individual 4 5 driving records. However, the Administrator or the Secretary of State may require a supplemental written report from the 6 reporting law enforcement officer and such supplemental report 7 8 shall be for the privileged use of the Secretary of State and 9 the Department and shall be held confidential. Upon request, 10 the Department shall furnish copies of its written accident 11 reports to federal, State, and local agencies that are engaged 12 in highway safety research and studies. The reports shall be for the privileged use of the federal, State, and local 13 agencies receiving the reports and shall be held confidential. 14

15 (b) The Department at its discretion may require a 16 supplemental written report from the reporting law enforcement 17 officer on a form supplied by the Department to be submitted directly to the Department. Such supplemental report may be 18 used only for accident studies and statistical or analytical 19 20 purposes under Section 11-412 or 11-414 of this Code , and shall be for the privileged use of the Department and shall be 21 22 held confidential.

(c) The Department at its discretion may also provide for
 in-depth investigations of <u>accidents involving Department</u>
 <u>employees or other</u> a motor vehicle <u>accidents</u> accident by
 individuals or special investigation groups, including but not

limited to police officers, photographers, engineers, doctors, 1 2 mechanics, and as a result of the investigation may require the submission of written reports, photographs, charts, sketches, 3 graphs, or a combination of all. Such individual written 4 5 reports, photographs, charts, sketches, or graphs may be used only for accident studies and statistical or analytical 6 purposes under Section 11-412 or 11-414 of this Code , shall be 7 8 for the privileged use of the Department and held confidential, 9 and shall not be used in any trial, civil or criminal.

10 (d) On and after July 1, 1997, law enforcement officers who 11 have reason to suspect that the motor vehicle accident was the 12 result of a driver's loss of consciousness due to a medical condition, as defined by the Driver's License Medical Review 13 Law of 1992, or the result of any medical condition that 14 15 impaired the driver's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle 16 shall notify the Secretary of this determination. The 17 Secretary, in conjunction with the Driver's License Medical Advisory Board, shall determine by administrative rule the 18 19 temporary conditions not required to be reported under the 20 provisions of this Section. The Secretary shall, in conjunction 21 with the Illinois State Police and representatives of local and 22 county law enforcement agencies, promulgate any rules 23 necessary and develop the procedures and documents that may be required to obtain written, electronic, or other agreed upon 24 25 methods of notification to implement the provisions of this 26 Section.

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1 (e) Law enforcement officers reporting under the 2 provisions of subsection (d) of this Section shall enjoy the 3 same immunities granted members of the Driver's License Medical 4 Advisory Board under Section 6-910 of this Code.

5 (f) All information furnished to the Secretary under 6 subsection (d) of this Section shall be deemed confidential and 7 for the privileged use of the Secretary in accordance with the 8 provisions of subsection (j) of Section 2-123 of this Code. 9 (Source: P.A. 96-1147, eff. 7-21-10.)

11 Sec. 11-411. Accident report forms.

12 (a) The Administrator must prepare and upon request supply 13 to police departments, sheriffs and other appropriate agencies 14 or individuals, forms for written accident reports as required 15 hereunder, suitable with respect to the persons required to 16 make such reports and the purposes to be served. The written reports must call for sufficiently detailed information to 17 disclose with reference to a vehicle accident the cause, 18 19 conditions then existing, and the persons and vehicles involved 20 or any other data concerning such accident that may be required 21 for a complete analysis of all related circumstances and events 22 leading to the accident or subsequent to the occurrence.

(b) Every accident report required to be made in writing
 must be made on an <u>approved appropriate</u> form <u>or in an approved</u>
 <u>electronic format</u> <u>approved or provided by the Administrator and</u>

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1 must contain all the information required therein unless that 2 information is not available. <u>The Department shall adopt any</u> 3 <u>rules necessary to implement this subsection (b).</u>

4 (c) Should special accident studies be required by the 5 Administrator, the Administrator may provide the supplemental 6 forms for the special studies.

Sec. 11-412. Motor vehicle accident reports confidential.

10 (a) All required written motor vehicle accident reports and 11 supplemental reports shall be without prejudice to the 12 individual so reporting and shall be for the confidential use 13 of the Department and the Secretary of State and, in the case 14 of second division vehicles operated under certificate of 15 convenience and necessity issued by the Illinois Commerce 16 Commission, of the Commission, except that the Administrator or the Secretary of State or the Commission may disclose the 17 identity of a person involved in a motor vehicle accident when 18 19 such identity is not otherwise known or when such person denies his presence at such motor vehicle accident and the Department 20 21 shall disclose the identity of the insurance carrier, if any, 22 upon demand. The Secretary of State may also disclose notations 23 of accident involvement maintained on individual driving 24 records.

25 (b) Upon written request, the The Department shall may

1 furnish copies of its written accident reports or any 2 supplemental reports to federal, State, and local agencies that 3 are engaged in highway safety research and studies and to any person or entity that has a contractual agreement with the 4 5 Department or a federal, State, or local agency to a complete a highway safety research and study for the Department or the 6 federal, State, or local agency. Reports furnished to any 7 8 agency, person, or entity other than the Secretary of State or 9 the Illinois Commerce Commission may be used only for 10 statistical or analytical purposes and shall be held 11 confidential by that agency, person, or entity. These reports 12 shall be exempt from inspection and copying under the Freedom 13 of Information Act and shall not be No such written report shall be used as evidence in any trial, civil or criminal, 14 arising out of a motor vehicle accident, except that the 15 16 Administrator shall furnish upon demand of any person who has, 17 or claims to have, made such a written or supplemental report, or upon demand of any court, a certificate showing that a 18 19 specified written accident report or supplemental report has or 20 has not been made to the Administrator solely to prove a 21 compliance or a failure to comply with the requirement that 22 such a written or supplemental report be made to the 23 Administrator.

(c) Upon written request, the Department shall furnish
 motor vehicle accident data to a federal, State, or local
 agency, the Secretary of State, the Illinois Commerce

<u>Commission</u>, or any other person or entity under Section 11-417 of this Code.

(d) The Department of Transportation at its discretion may 3 provide for in-depth investigations of accidents involving 4 5 Department employees or other motor vehicle accidents. A 6 written report describing the preventability of such an 7 accident may be prepared to enhance the safety of Department employees or the traveling public. Such reports and the 8 9 information contained in those reports and any opinions expressed in the review of the accident 10 as to the 11 preventability of the accident shall be for the privileged use 12 of the Department and held confidential and shall not be 13 obtainable or used in any civil or criminal proceeding. 16 Sec. 11-414. Department to tabulate and analyze motor 17 vehicle accident reports. The Department shall tabulate and may 18 analyze all written motor vehicle accident reports received in 19 compliance with this Code and shall publish annually or at more 20 frequent intervals <u>motor vehicle accident data</u> statistical 21 <u>information based thereon as to the number and circumstances of</u> 22 <u>traffic accidents</u>. The Department:

<u>(blank);</u> shall submit a report of school bus accidents
 and accidents resulting in personal injury to or the death of
 any person within 50 feet of a school bus while awaiting or

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preparing to board the bus or immediately after exiting the bus
to the National Highway Safety Advisory Committee annually or
as requested by the Committee;

2. shall, upon written request, compile, maintain, and make
available to the public motor vehicle accident data that shall
be distributed under Sections 11-412 and 11-417 of this Code
statistical information relating to traffic accidents
involving medical transport vehicles;

9 3. may conduct special investigations of motor vehicle 10 accidents and may solicit supplementary reports from drivers, 11 owners, police departments, sheriffs, coroners, or any other 12 individual. Failure of any individual to submit a supplementary 13 report subjects such individual to the same penalties for 14 failure to report as designated under Section 11-406.

17Sec. 11-417. Motor vehicle accident report and motor18vehicle accident data.

19 <u>(a) Upon written request and payment of the required fee,</u> 20 <u>the Department shall make available to the public motor vehicle</u> 21 <u>accident data received in compliance with this Code. The</u> 22 <u>Department shall adopt any rules necessary to establish a fee</u> 23 <u>schedule for motor vehicle accident data made available under</u> 24 <u>Section 11-414 of this Code.</u> 25 (b) The Department shall provide copies of a written motor

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1	vehicle accident report or motor vehicle accident data without
2	any cost or fees authorized under any provision of law to a
3	federal, State, or local agency, the Secretary of State, the
4	Illinois Commerce Commission, or any other person or entity
5	that has a contractual agreement with the Department or a
6	federal, State, or local agency to complete a highway safety
7	research and study for the Department or the federal, State, or
8	local agency.
9	(c) All fees collected under this Section shall be placed
10	in the Road Fund to be used, subject to appropriation, for the
11	costs associated with motor vehicle accident records and motor

12 vehicle accident data.
