1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3032
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3032 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic
5	Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
6	amended by changing Section 605-215 as follows:
7	(20 ILCS 605/605-215)
8	Sec. 605-215. <del>Interagency</del> Military <del>Base Support and</del>
9	Economic Development Committee.
10	(a) To coordinate the State's activities on and to act as a
11	communications center for issues relating to current and former
12	military bases in the State, the <del>Interagency</del> Military <del>Base</del>
13	Support and Economic Development Committee is created as an
14	entity within the Office of the Lieutenant Governor:
15	<del>Department.</del>

(1) To preserve, protect, expand, and attract new

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1	military missions, assets, and installations to the State
2	of Illinois.
3	(2) To encourage defense related businesses to expand
4	or relocate to the State of Illinois.
5	(3) To identify emerging trends and support the
6	long-term viability of the military and defense industry in
7	Illinois.
8	(4) To assist Illinois communities who have been or
9	could be impacted by federal Base Realignment and Closure
10	actions or other military realignments.
11	(5) To be an information clearinghouse by providing
12	military installation information and recommendations to
13	enhance the military value of Illinois defense
14	installations to the Governor, General Assembly,
15	congressional delegation, and State and federal government
16	officials.
17	(b) The Committee shall be composed of the following 7 ex
18	officio members or their designees: the Lieutenant Governor,
19	the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the
20	Secretary of Transportation, the Director of Natural
21	Resources, the Director of the Environmental Protection
22	Agency, the Director of Revenue, and the Adjutant General of
23	the Department of Military Affairs. In addition, 4 members of
24	the General Assembly shall be appointed, one each appointed by
25	the President of the Senate, the Senate Minority Leader, the

Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Minority

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Leader of the House of Representatives. The chair vice-chairs vice-chair of the committee, in consultation with the full Committee, shall appoint 10 8 public members to serve as representatives from the counties, or adjoining counties, of a current or former military base site as necessary to carry out the work of the Commission. The chair and vice-chairs of the Committee, in consultation with the other members of the Committee, shall also appoint up to 4 members having military veteran or defense industry backgrounds from across the State of Illinois. Public member appointees and veteran or defense industry appointees shall serve 4-year terms; however, for the initial terms of those members, half of them shall be appointed for terms of 2 years as the Lieutenant Governor shall determine.

(c) The Lieutenant Governor shall serve as chair of the and the Director of Commerce and Economic Committee, Opportunity and the Adjutant General of the Department of Military Affairs shall serve as vice-chairs of the Committee, serve as vice chair and shall oversee the administration of the Committee and its functions. Expenses necessary to carry out the function of the Committee shall be shared among the agencies represented on the Committee pursuant to interagency agreement and from funds appropriated for this purpose or from existing funds within the budgets of those agencies. General Assembly appointees shall serve for the duration of the General Assembly in which the appointee is

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1	appointed, but the appointee's term shall expire if the
2	appointee no longer remains a member of that General Assembly.
3	The Committee shall meet not less than quarterly. Any appointed
4	<pre>member of the Committee who fails to attend at least 3 meetings</pre>
5	in a year shall no longer be a member of the Committee, and his
6	or her replacement shall be appointed in the same manner as the
7	member being replaced for the remainder of that member's
8	current term.

- (d) Each member of the Committee must request reimbursement from his or her individual agency for actual and necessary expenses incurred while performing his or her duties as a member of the Committee. Public members shall be reimbursed from funds appropriated to the Department for that purpose.
- (e) The Committee shall provide advice and recommendations to the Department on the following:
  - (1) The formation of a strategic plan for State and local military base retention, realignment, and reuse efforts.
  - (2) The issues impacting current and former military bases in the State, including infrastructure requirements, environmental impact issues, military force structure possibilities, tax implications, property considerations, and other issues requiring State agency coordination and support.
  - (3) The status of community involvement and participation in retention, realignment, and reuse efforts

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- 1 and the community support for economic development before and after a military base closing. 2
  - (4) The State's retention, realignment, and reuse advocacy efforts on the federal level.
  - (5) The development of impact studies concerning the closing of a base on the community, housing, the economy, schools, and other public and private entities, including additional economic development ideas to minimize the impact in the event of the base closing.
- 10 (6) The development of future economic expansion plans for areas that are subject to closure or realignment. 11
- (f) The Committee, in cooperation with the Department, 12 13 shall keep the Governor and General Assembly informed 14 concerning the progress of military base retention, 15 realignment, reuse, and economic development efforts in the 16 State.
  - (q) The Committee shall serve as the central information clearinghouse for all military base reuse, retention, and realignment activities. This shall include: (i) serving as a liaison between the State and community organizations that support the long-term viability of military bases; (ii) communicating with the State's congressional delegation; and (iii) generally coordinating with the public, governmental bodies, and officials in communicating about the future of military bases in the State.
