Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 1 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 2 1, 2017, if and only if Senate Bill 2063 of the 100th General
- 3 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- 4 in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
