9	(a) The Office of the Sec	retary of State and the State
10	Board of Elections, pursuant t	o an interagency contract and
11	jointly-adopted rules, shall	establish an automatic voter
12	registration program that satis	sfies the requirements of this
13	Section and other applicable law	r <b>.</b>
14	(b) If an application, an ap	plication for renewal, a change
15	of address form, or a recert:	ification form for a driver's
16	license, other than a temporary	visitor's driver's license, or

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a State identification card issued by the Office of the
 Secretary of State meets the requirements of the federal REAL
 ID Act of 2005, then that application shall serve as a
 dual-purpose application. The dual-purpose application shall:

5 (1) also serve as an application to register to vote in
6 Illinois;

7 (2) allow an applicant to change his or her registered
8 residence address or name as it appears on the voter
9 registration rolls;

10 (3) provide the applicant with an opportunity to 11 affirmatively decline to register to vote or to change his 12 or her registered residence address or name by providing a 13 check box on the application form without requiring the 14 applicant to state the reason; and

15 (4) unless the applicant declines to register to vote 16 or change his or her registered residence address or name, 17 require the applicant to attest, by signature under penalty of perjury as described in subsection (e) of this Section, 18 19 to meeting the qualifications to register to vote in 20 Illinois at his or her residence address as indicated on his or her driver's license or identification card 21 22 dual-purpose application.

(b-5) If an application, an application for renewal, a change of address form, or a recertification form for a driver's license, other than a temporary visitor's driver's license, or a State identification card issued by the Office of 10000HB4749ham001 -3- LRB100 19105 MJP 36906 a

the Secretary of State does not meet the requirements of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, then that application shall serve as a dual-purpose application. The dual-purpose application shall:

5 (1) also serve as an application to register to vote in
6 Illinois;

7 (2) allow an applicant to change his or her registered
8 residence address or name as it appears on the voter
9 registration rolls; and

10 (3) if the applicant chooses to register to vote or to 11 change his or her registered residence address or name, then require the applicant to attest, by a separate 12 13 signature under penalty of perjury, to meeting the qualifications to register to vote in Illinois at his or 14 15 residence address as indicated on his or her her 16 dual-purpose application.

(b-10) The Office of the Secretary of State shall clearly 17 18 and conspicuously inform each applicant in writing: (i) of the qualifications to register to vote in Illinois, (ii) of the 19 20 penalties provided by law for submission of a false voter registration application, (iii) that, unless the applicant 21 22 declines to register to vote or update his or her voter 23 registration, his or her dual-purpose application shall also 24 serve as both an application to register to vote and his or her 25 attestation that he or she meets the eligibility requirements 26 for voter registration, and that his or her application to

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register to vote or update his or her registration will be transmitted to the State Board of Elections for the purpose of registering the person to vote at the residence address to be indicated on his or her driver's license or identification card, and (iv) that declining to register to vote is confidential and will not affect any services the person may be seeking from the Office of the Secretary of State.

8 (c) The Office of the Secretary of State shall review 9 information provided to the Office of the Secretary of State by 10 the State Board of Elections to inform each applicant for a 11 driver's license or permit, other than a temporary visitor's driver's license, or a State identification card issued by the 12 13 Office of the Secretary of State whether the applicant is 14 currently registered to vote in Illinois and, if registered, at 15 what address.

16 (d) The Office of the Secretary of State shall not require an applicant for a driver's license or State identification 17 card to provide duplicate identification or information in 18 19 order to complete an application to register to vote or change 20 his or her registered residence address or name. Before 21 transmitting any personal information about an applicant to the 22 State Board of Elections, the Office of the Secretary of State shall review its records of the identification documents the 23 24 applicant provided in order to complete the application for a 25 driver's license or State identification card, to confirm that 26 nothing in those documents indicates that the applicant does

not satisfy the qualifications to register to vote in Illinois
 at his or her residence address.

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(e) A completed, signed application for (i) a driver's 3 4 license or permit, other than a temporary visitor's driver's 5 license, or a State identification card issued by the Office of the Secretary of State, that meets the requirements of the 6 federal REAL ID Act of 2005; or (ii) a completed application 7 under subsection (b-5) of this Section with a separate 8 9 signature attesting the applicant meets the qualifications to 10 register to vote in Illinois at his or her residence address as 11 indicated on his or her application shall constitute a signed application to register to vote in Illinois at the residence 12 13 address indicated in the application unless the person 14 affirmatively declined in the application to register to vote 15 or to change his or her registered residence address or name. 16 If the identification documents provided to complete the dual-purpose application indicate that he or she does not 17 18 satisfy the qualifications to register to vote in Illinois at 19 his or her residence address, the application shall be marked 20 as incomplete.

21 For each completed and signed application that (f) 22 constitutes an application to register to vote in Illinois or 23 provides for a change in the applicant's registered residence 24 address or name, the Office of the Secretary of State shall 25 electronically transmit to the State Board of Elections 26 information needed to complete the personal person's

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registration to vote in Illinois at his or her residence address. The application to register to vote shall be processed in accordance with Section 1A-16.7.

4 (g) If the federal REAL ID Act of 2005 is repealed, 5 abrogated, superseded, or otherwise no longer in effect, then the State Board of Elections shall establish criteria for 6 reliable personal 7 determining information indicating 8 citizenship status and shall adopt rules as necessary for the 9 Secretary of State to continue processing dual-purpose 10 applications under this Section.

11 (h) As used in this Section, "dual-purpose application" means an application, an application for renewal, a change of 12 13 address form, or a recertification form for driver's license or 14 permit, other than a temporary visitor's driver's license, or a 15 State identification card offered by the Secretary of State 16 that also serves as an application to register to vote in Illinois. "Dual-purpose application" does not mean 17 an application under subsection (c) of Section 6-109 of the 18 Illinois Vehicle Code. 19

20 (i) This Section shall be implemented no later than 90 days
 21 after the federal Real ID database is certified by the
 22 Secretary of State.
