SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/9-3

from Ch. 46, par. 9-3

Amends the Election Code. Modifies the requirements for political committee statements of organization to include the phone number and email address of a political committee and specified persons. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing Section 5 9-3 as follows:

(10 ILCS 5/9-3) (from Ch. 46, par. 9-3) 6

Sec. 9-3. Political committee statement of organization.

(a) Every political committee shall file with the State 8 9 Board of Elections a statement of organization within 10 business days of the creation of such committee, except any 10 political committee created within the 30 days before an 11 election shall file a statement of organization within 2 12 business days in person, by facsimile transmission, or by 13 14 electronic mail. Any change in information previously submitted in a statement of organization shall be reported, as 15 16 required for the original statement of organization by this 17 Section, within 10 days following that change. The Board shall impose a civil penalty of \$50 per business day upon political 18 committees for failing to file or late filing of a statement of 19 organization. Such penalties shall not exceed \$5,000, and shall 20 21 not exceed \$10,000 for statewide office political committees. There shall be no fine if the statement is mailed and 22 postmarked at least 72 hours prior to the filing deadline. 23

In addition to the civil penalties authorized by this Section, the State Board of Elections or any other political committee may apply to the circuit court for a temporary restraining order or a preliminary or permanent injunction against the political committee to cease the expenditure of funds and to cease operations until the statement of organization is filed.

8 For the purpose of this Section, "statewide office" means 9 the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, 10 Attorney General, State Treasurer, and State Comptroller.

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(b) The statement of organization shall include:

12 (1) the name, and address, and email address of the 13 political committee and the designation required by 14 Section 9-2;

15 (2) the scope, area of activity, party affiliation, and
16 purposes of the political committee;

17 (3) the name, address, <u>phone number</u>, <u>email address</u>, and 18 position of each custodian of the committee's books and 19 accounts;

(4) the name, address, <u>phone number</u>, <u>email address</u>, and
position of the committee's principal officers, including
the chairman, treasurer, and officers and members of its
finance committee, if any;

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(5) the name and address of any sponsoring entity;

(6) a statement of what specific disposition of
 residual fund will be made in the event of the dissolution

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or termination of the committee;

2 (7) a listing of all banks or other financial 3 institutions, safety deposit boxes, and any other 4 repositories or custodians of funds used by the committee; 5 and

6 (8) the amount of funds available for campaign 7 expenditures as of the filing date of the committee's 8 statement of organization.

9 For purposes of this Section, a "sponsoring entity" is (i) 10 any person, organization, corporation, or association that 11 contributes at least 33% of the total funding of the political 12 committee or (ii) any person or other entity that is registered 13 or is required to register under the Lobbyist Registration Act 14 and contributes at least 33% of the total funding of the 15 political committee.

16 (c) Each statement of organization required to be filed in 17 accordance with this Section shall be verified, dated, and 18 signed by either the treasurer of the political committee 19 making the statement or the candidate on whose behalf the 20 statement is made and shall contain substantially the following 21 verification:

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"VERIFICATION:

I declare that this statement of organization (including any accompanying schedules and statements) has been examined by me and, to the best of my knowledge and belief, is a true, correct, and complete statement of organization as required by

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Article 9 of the Election Code. I understand that willfully filing a false or incomplete statement is subject to a civil penalty of at least \$1,001 and up to \$5,000.

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(date of filing) (signature of person making the statement)".

(d) The statement of organization for a ballot initiative 6 7 committee also shall include a verification signed by the 8 chairperson of the committee that (i) the committee is formed 9 for the purpose of supporting or opposing a question of public 10 policy, (ii) all contributions and expenditures of the 11 committee will be used for the purpose described in the 12 statement of organization, (iii) the committee may accept 13 unlimited contributions from any source, provided that the ballot initiative committee does not make contributions or 14 15 expenditures in support of or opposition to a candidate or 16 candidates for nomination for election, election, or 17 retention, and (iv) failure to abide by these requirements shall deem the committee in violation of this Article. 18

(d-5) The statement of organization for an independent 19 20 expenditure committee also shall include a verification signed by the chairperson of the committee that (i) the committee is 21 22 formed for the exclusive purpose of making independent 23 expenditures, (ii) all contributions and expenditures of the 24 committee will be used for the purpose described in the statement of organization, (iii) the committee may accept 25 26 unlimited contributions from any source, provided that the

independent expenditure committee does not make contributions any candidate political committee, political party committee, or political action committee, and (iv) failure to abide by these requirements shall deem the committee in violation of this Article.

6 (e) For purposes of implementing the changes made by this 7 amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, every political 8 committee in existence on the effective date of this amendatory 9 Act of the 96th General Assembly shall file the statement 10 required by this Section with the Board by December 31, 2010. 11 (Source: P.A. 99-522, eff. 6-30-16.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
