20 ILCS 3005/9.10 new

Amends the Governor's Office of Management and Budget Act. Creates the Youth Budget Commission is established within the Office with the goal of producing an annual youth budget fiscal scan. Sets forth the membership and terms of the Commission. Effective immediately.

- Section 5. The Governor's Office of Management and Budget

 Act is amended by adding Section 9.10 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 3005/9.10 new)
- 7 Sec. 9.10. Youth Budget Commission.
- 8 (a) As used in this Section:
- 9 "Adolescent" or "youth" means a person between the ages of
- 10 <u>8 and 25 years.</u>
- 11 "Commission" means the Youth Budget Commission established
- 12 <u>under this Section.</u>
- 13 "Service models" include the following tiers of service
- 14 <u>delivered to adolescents and their families:</u>
- 15 (1) Prevention: support for at-risk youth (deterrence,
- prevention of harm, extra supports);
- 17 (2) Treatment/intervention: respond to significant
- challenges in need of direct intervention to change,
- resolve or reverse behaviors, conditions, or both;
- 20 (3) Corrective/rehabilitation: correct or rehabilitate
- 21 <u>acute behaviors or conditions that pose a physical or</u>
- 22 psychological danger or threat to adolescents;
- 23 (4) Positive Youth Development: build individual

2	"Youth developmental goals" are defined as the outcomes of
3	stable, safe, healthy, educated, employable, and connected,
4	which align with the following Budgeting for Results goals:
5	(1) Stable: meeting the needs of the most vulnerable;
6	increasing individual and family stability and
7	self-sufficiency;
8	(2) Safe: creating safer communities;
9	(3) Healthy: improving the overall health of
10	<pre>Illinoisans;</pre>
11	(4) Educated: improving school readiness and student
12	success for all;
13	(5) Employable: increasing employment and attracting,
14	retaining and growing businesses;
15	(6) Connected: strengthening cultural and
16	environmental vitality.
17	(b) The Youth Budget Commission is established within the
18	Office with the goal of producing an annual fiscal scan. The
19	fiscal scan, under the direction of the Commission, shall be
20	used to advise the Governor and General Assembly, as well as
21	State agencies, on ways to improve and expand existing
22	policies, services, programs, and opportunities for
23	adolescents. For fiscal year 2019 and each fiscal year
24	thereafter, the Commission established under this Section,
25	shall complete an analysis of State budget items which directly
26	impact adolescents. This analysis will categorize budget items

1 by the 6 identified youth developmental goals and 4 service

2 models. The analysis will include State agency expenditures

associated with these categories. General State Aid and federal

funds such as Medicaid will be excluded from the analysis.

The Commission shall also be responsible for: (1) monitoring and commenting on existing and proposed legislation and programs designed to address the needs of adolescents; (2) assisting State agencies in developing programs, services, public policies, and research strategies that will expand and enhance the well-being of adolescents; (3) facilitating the participation of and representation of adolescents in the development, implementation, and planning of policies, programs, and community-based services; and (4) promoting research efforts to document the impact of policies and programs on adolescents.

(c) The Commission shall quide the efforts of and collaborate with State agencies, including the Illinois State Board of Education, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Children and Family Services, the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, the Department of Healthcare and Family Services, the Department of Public Health, the Illinois Community College Board, the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority, the Department of Military Affairs, the Illinois Arts Council, the Department of Corrections, the Board of Higher Education,

1	Illinois Guardianship and Advocacy Commission, Department or
2	Aging, and others.
3	(d) The Commission shall be comprised of 15 members
4	appointed by the Governor. Each member shall have a working
5	knowledge of youth development, human services, and economic
6	public policy in Illinois. One chairperson shall be a
7	representative of a statewide nonprofit children and family
8	services organization who has previously completed a similar
9	analysis of the Illinois State budget. The other chairpersor
10	shall be a member of the General Assembly. Of the remaining
11	members:
12	(1) at least one member representing an organization
13	that has expertise in the needs of low-income youth;
14	(2) at least one member representing an organization
15	that has expertise in the needs of youth of color;
16	(3) at least one member representing an organization
17	that has expertise in the needs of youth who are immigrants
18	or are children of immigrants;
19	(4) at least one member representing an organization
20	that has expertise in the needs of youth who identify as
21	LGBTQ, gender non-conforming, or both;
22	(5) at least one member representing an organization
23	that has expertise in the needs of youth who are
24	disconnected from traditional educational systems;
25	(6) at least one member representing an organization
26	that has expertise in the needs of youth who are

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- 2 (7) at least one member representing an organization
 3 that has expertise in the needs of youth and young adults
 4 involved with the justice system.
 - Commission members shall reflect regional representation to ensure that the needs of adolescents throughout the State of Illinois are met. Members will serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for Commission-related expenses. Of the initial members appointed under this Section: 5 members shall serve for a 3-year term; 5 members shall serve for a 4-year term; and 5 members shall serve for a 5-year term. Their successors shall serve for 5-year terms.
- (e) The Office shall provide administrative support to the Commission.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
